STREICHER TO SPEAK IN BERLIN

BERLIN, August 9. (JTA) -- German Jews expected the worst today as a result of the announcement broadcast throughout Germany that Julius Streicher, Nazidom's Number One anti-Semite, has been invited for the first time to deliver an address in Berlin on the Jewish question. He is scheduled to speak on August 15 at the Sportspalast which has a seating capacity of 15,000.

Streicher's appearance in Berlin is taken as an augury of even stormier days for Jews throughout Germany and also here in the capital.

Addressing a congress in Nuremburg of German youth from abroad, including also a delegation from America, Julius Streicher declared "Germany will not rest until the Jews are exterminated."

Hundreds of uniformed storm troopers last night invaded the homes of Jews in Tiedersdorf, a resort near Berlin, shouting "Jews get out!"

Today the Nazi troopers ordered the Jews to leave the spa within twenty-four hours.

Intervention of the local non-Jewish population, including the mayor of Riedersdorf, with the Nazi authorities to stay the execution of this order proved futile. Fifteen Jewish families of Riedersdorf already arrived in Berlin today.

Berlin authorities today issued an order for the immediate closing of all Jewish ice-cream parlors, save those owned by Jewish citizens of foreign countries.

Following the example set by Berlin, Munich authorities today announced that Jews from the provinces are not permitted to move to Munich, and that all Jewish newcomers will be fined and sent out of the city.

Sixty-one more Jews were today deprived of their citizenship in Chemnitz.

In Parchim, Mecklenburg, the majority of the Jewish population which was arrested on Wednesday, were released today on condition that the Jewish merchants in the town do not reopen their stores.

It was also revealed for the first time today that the Jewish population of the town was placed under arrest because an "Aryan" maid working in a Jewish house allegedly insulted two storm troopers who attempted to flirt with her.

In numerous cities school children have been mobilized to picket before Jewish jobs.

In Reinikendorf a Jewish boy, Aaron Arendt, was sentenced to one year and his brother Walter to ten months in prison, for allegedly insulting Nazi authorities who forbade them to ride their velocipedes on the main street.

CAMELS GIVE WAY TO AUTOS

JAFFA, Palestine, August 9. (JTA) -- The native camel will have to give way to the imported automobile here, as a result of a new law passed today by the Municipal Council banishing the camel from the busy port area.

The leisureliness of Palestine's ancient beast of burden, it is stated, impeded considerably the flow of vehicular traffic in this rapidly modernizing city.

DANZIG NAZIS ATTACK, WOUND JEWS

DANZIG, August 9. (JTA) -- Twenty Jewish tradesmen were seriously wounded today, when a band of Nazi youths attacked the Jewish shops in the Rumelplatz market, forcing the Jewish tradesmen to leave the market.

Throughout the bloody attack the police refrained from intervening, and later when a few Nazis were arrested for participation in the riot, they were released by the authorities "because they did not commit any crime."

FIVE ARRESTED IN LABOR CLASH NEAR HAIFA

HAIFA, August 9. (JTA) -- One person was sent to the hospital and five were arrested as the result of a clash today between members of the Histadruth, Palestine labor federation, and unorganized workers in the Poel Hamizrachi colony in Emek Zebulun.

The riot was precipitated, according to eyewitnesses, when Histadruth members attacked employees of Hamakshir, a cooperative agricultural contracting company which was working the land.

The Histadruth members were incensed over the refusal of Hapoel Hamizrachi, an orthodox labor organization, to halt the work until the Histadruth could negotiate with the organization for the transfer of the contract to a company employing Histadruth members.

Moshe Bornstein, one of the non-union Hamakshir workers, was wounded. He was taken to the Hadassah hospital here. Five Histadruth members, charged with inciting to riot, were held in jail without bail.

The riot evoked considerable excitement here. Newspapers commented at length. Haaretz, conservative daily, published an editorial accusing the Histadruth members of acting hastily and confusing issues.

Davar, labor daily, laid the blame at the door of Hamakshir, declaring that it is competing with Histadruth and attempting to lower wages scales.

BUDAPEST JEWS MAY LEVY TAX

BUDAPEST, August 9. (JTA) -- The Jewish Community of Budapest was today granted permission by Minister of Education, Dr. Valentin Homan, to levy a special tax on its members for the maintenance of the Jewish schools here.

The Jewish Community is also empowered to levy the school-tax on Jews possessing businesses or factories in the city.

ALGERIA RIOT ON ANNIVERSARY OF EXCESSES

ALGIERS, August 9. (JTA) -- Rioting between Jews and Christians broke out in Sidi Bel Abbes yesterday when Jews tore down anti-Semitic posters that had been placarded all over the town on Tuesday and Wednesday.

The day marked the anniversary of the anti-Jewish riots of a year ago, during which scores were killed and many were wounded.

Several skirmishes took place in various parts of the town, natives joining the Christians against the Jews.

The police had a difficult time in restoring order, but finally brought the situation under control. An official proclamation was issued today warning that in event of further trouble the Foreign Legion will be called in.

ANTI-JEWISH DEMONSTRATION IN SOFIA

SOBIA, August 9. (JTA) -- Despite the assurances given Bulgarian Jews by Premier Andreja Toscheff and Minister of the Interior General Athanasov, uniformed detachments of Rodna Sashchita, recently legalized anti-Semitic organization, today conducted an anti-Jewish demonstration in front of the Ashkenazic Congregation here, and tore down the door-plate of the synagogue. The demonstration was led by the notorious anti-Semite Radeff.

Last week a special delegation of representatives of the Jewish communities in Bulgaria had an interview with the Premier and expressed their apprehension over the legalization of the anti-semitic Rodna Sashchita. The Premier, reassured the Jews declaring, "My government is very favorable to the Jews -- after all, we are all members of one big family."

BULGARIAN ZIONISTS NAME DELEGATES

SOBIA, August 9. (JTA) -- General Zionists received one mandate, and Labor one, as a result of the elections held here for the World Zionist Congress, it was announced today.

LONDON ANGLO-JEWISH DAILY SUSPENDS

LONDON, August 9. (JTA) -- The Jewish Daily Post, which besides the Jewish Daily Bulletin published in America, was the only other Jewish daily published in the English language, today suspended publication. The Post had appeared for six months. The Yiddish edition of the paper was likewise suspended.

IL DUCE SEES RABBI

ROME, August 9. (JTA) -- Benito Mussolini, Italian dictator, gave a long and cordial audience to Chief Rabbi David Prato of Alexandria, who is now in Rome, an official communique issued today, revealed.
