AGENCY ASKS \$5,000,000 FOR COLONIZATION

LUCERNE, Sept. 5. (JTA) -- An appeal to the Jews of the world to raise \$5,000,000 in the next two years to finance the colonization of 2,000 workers' families in Palestine, was issued early today by the Council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, now in session here.

The appeal was issued following an address by Dr. Arthur Hantke of Jerusalem, head of the Keren Hayesod, Zionist colonizing fund, concerning the urgent colonizing needs in Palestine today.

Lady Erleigh, who was first speaker in the General debate, declared "our task in Palestine is not only to build up Palestine, but to raise the Jewish Spirit."

Sholom Asch, noted Jewish author, described the suffering of Jews in Eastern European countries, and demanded "the institution of hachshara training farms, not only for prospective pioneer workers for Palestine, but also for the so-called capitalist categories of Jews who can scrape together \$5,000."

Dr. Maurice B. Hexter of Jerusalem, member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency, also spoke.

The remainder of the day today will be devoted to committee sessions.

RABBI WISE HEADS JEWISH DELEGATIONS COMMITTEE

LUCERNE, Sept. 5 (JTA) -- World leadership of the fight for Jewish rights was bestowed upon Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of New York, at the conference here of the Committee of Jewish Delegations which elected him world president.

Representatives from eighteen countries participated in the conference, which considered the situation of Jews in the various countries, and adopted measures for fighting for Jewish rights.

The conference considered the convocation of a world Jewish congress to take up the problems of Jews all over the world.

In addition to Rabbi Wise, the conference elected a presidium of four consisting of Dr. Nahum Goldmann, former president of the Committee, Dr. Isaac Naiditch, A. Pollock and Myer Froykin, all of Paris.

A world executive of fifteen was also elected, including Judge Julian W. Mack, Louis Lipsky, Abraham Goldberg, and Joshua L. Goldberg of New York.

The Committee of Jewish Delegations was organized in 1919, to represent Jews at the peace conferences after the World War. Judge Mack and the late Louis Marshall, were among the many world renowned Jewish notables who have served as president of the Committee. The Committee's seat is in Paris.

NEW AMERICAN COLONY FOR PALESTINE

NEW YORK, N.Y. Sept. 5. (JTA) -- A new American colony of 100 families is to be established in Palestine, according to an announcement today by the officers of the enterprise. The new colony is to be known as "Achuzath Hazafon", and will be situated on Jewish National Fund land in the northern part of Palestine.

This is the first new American colony to be established in Palestine in the past two years. Unlike other American colonies

there, this new enterprise will not concentrate on orange plantations, but will rather engage in intensive and mixed farming, with special attention to fruits and vegetables not raised in Palestine.

The colony will be established on a ten-year plan. Every member family will pay \$600 and will receive about 25 dunams of land per year for about ten years. The temporary officers of the colony are A. Revusky, president; David L. Mekler, vice-president; Dr. S. Margulies, treasurer; and Sol Borenstein, secretary.

GREEK GENERAL MAKES ANTI-SEMITIC SPEECH

SALONICA, Sept. 5. (JTA) -- Greek Jewry was greatly upset today by the speech of General Popadapoulos, commander of the military division at Sorrai, in the course of which he declared: "Our country has two enemies,-- communists and Jews."

He charged the Jews with being enemies of Greece because "the churches in Russia have been converted into stables by Jews, while Jewish synagogues are untouched."

"Jews wish to destroy Christianity," he said. "I advise you not to let yourself be influenced by the Jews because they are enemies of Christianity."

Addressing the Jewish soldiers in the division, he said: "I regret that I have to make you suffer, but these facts are unhappily true."

The Jewish communities of Serrai and Salonica have lodged indignant protests with the authorities.

MCDONALD IN MOSCOW ON REFUGEE MISSION
