CHRISTIAN WINS SEJM SEAT IN WARSAW JEWISH QUARTER

WARSAW, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Unofficial results of yesterday's elections to the Polish Sejm indicate that in the Jewish quarter the mandate went to a Christian, Francisze Urbanski. A second mandate may go either to Dr. Joshua Gottlieb, candidate of Group "B" General Zionists, or to former Deputy Wislicki, candidate of the Merchants' Association, and known to be a disciplined member of the government party.

This result is due to the small participation of Jews in the elections. Only 16 per cent of the Jews entitled to vote exercised their franchise, while 65 per cent of the Christians voted.

Yesterday's elections were boycotted by the Jewish Socialist parties and by the official Zionist Organization. The Agudath Israel extreme orthodox group, the Jewish merchants' association, artisans' union, and veteran's association, however, participated in the elections, and each had its own candidate.

In Wilno Rabbi Rubinstein was elected. In Lodz, the Agudah candidate Mincberg, and in Lwow Deputy Sommerstein were victorious, but in Krakow Leopold Spira the Jewish candidate failed to receive the necessary number of votes.

According to the new election regulations the final results of yesterday's elections cannot be known before Wednesday.

Voting yesterday was extremely light and peaceful, save for a few incidents in Warsaw where groups boycotting the elections turned over a few campaign autos injuring about a score of persons.

HOLD RITES FOR RABBI MARGOLIS, DEAN OF ORTHODOX RABBINATE

NEW YORK, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Funeral services were held today at Temple Adath Israel, 201 East Broadway, for its rabbi, Gabriel Wolf Margolis, dean of the American orthodox rabbinate, who died yesterday at the age of 87 after a two years' illness.

Orthodox leaders eulogized Rabbi Margolis as a scholar and religious leader. Burial was in the United Hebrew Community Grounds in the Montefiore Cemetery, Queens.

Rabbi Margolis is survived by his widow, Mrs. Sheima E. Margolis and eight children: Rabbi Menashe Margolis of Brooklyn, Leizer, Nehemia, Dr. Jacob Margolis, Mrs. Rachel Saland, Anna, Mrs. Neche Levine and Jean.

During the 24 years Rabbi Margolis was spiritual leader of Temple Adath Israel the membership grew to more than 10,000. Previously he had been chief rabbi of the Boston Jewish Community and rabbi of the Baldwin Place Synagogue there.

He was also president of the Assembly of Hebrew Orthodox Rabbis.

Born in Vilna, Russia, he was ordained rabbi at the relatively early age of 20. He participated in the 1899 Zionist Congress at Basle and four years later at the Krakow Congress was the Sabbath preacher.

He came to the United States just after the turn of the century and took up his residence in Boston. In 1910 Rabbi Margolis came to New York.

AFGHAN JEWS EXILED TO REMOTE VILLAGE

JERUSALEM, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- The Afghan Government has exiled all Jews from Kabul to a remote village Farah, in the western part of the country near the Persian border, Davar, Hebrew daily, reports.

The paper further states that the Jews of Kabul are in despair at having to live in a village with 600 fierce Afghans and no Europeans.

Only a few weeks ago dozens of Jews were reported to have been wounded in anti-Semitic outbreaks in Kabul. The situation of Afghan Jews is reported by the periodical as hopeless in face of the constant terrorism to which they are subjected.

MAGNES ASKS AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE BY 1937

LUCERNE, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Establishment by 1937 of a college of agriculture at the Hebrew University in Palestine was urged by Dr. Judah L. Magnes, chancellor, at the opening session here of the university's board of governors.

Dr. Magnes proposed that the board authorize the expenditure toward that end of approximately \$35,000 during the next two years for the construction of necessary laboratories and equipment so that the college might be opened at the beginning of the academic year 1937-38.

Establishment of such a college has long been sought by the student body of the university. Recently, after considerable campus agitation on the subject, students called a strike to dramatize their demands.

In making the proposal, Dr. Magnes pointed out that the entire Jewish and Arab population of Palestine is essentially an agricultural one and that the Jewish community has always looked to the university for research and scientific direction in this field.

Among the American members of the board present at today's session were Judge Julian W. Mack, Dr. Nathan Ratnoff, chairman of the American Jewish Physicians Committee, Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Israel S. Wechsler. Felix M. Warburg of New York is chairman of the board which is composed of prominent Jewish phil-
anthropists and educators throughout the world.

Among the other imperative needs of the university, Dr. Magnes listed the following:

Enlarged quarters to house the 50,000 volumes in the Jewish National and University Library, as yet uncatologued;

Additional space for the 270,000 volumes comprising the present college library;

A new building for the department of physiology;

A central building, and a students' house or dormitory.

Dr. Magnes disclosed that tuition fees at the university will be raised beginning with the opening on Nov. 12 of the eleventh academic year, from \$25 a term to double that amount. The fee, however, will include free medical service which will be inaugurated this Fall.

Resolutions commemorating the passing of Dr. Shmarya Levin, a member of the board of governors, and Baron Edmond de Rothschild, one of the university's founders, were offered by Dr. Magnes.

The sessions of the board of governors, which opened here yesterday, are being continued today and tomorrow.

NAZI MINISTER OF JUSTICE ASSAILS BRODSKY

BERLIN, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Describing him as a "foreigner who left his native land when still a young man," Reichminister of Justice Frank viciously attacked Magistrate Louis B. Brodsky in a special radio broadcast on the freeing of five men arrested in the riot on board the liner Bremen on July 26.

"That a Jew should dare to represent the sentiment of the United States," said the Nazi Minister of Justice, "is a highly regrettable thing."

Magistrate Brodsky, he said, as a Jew was naturally filled with hatred for Nazi Germany. "No Jew can understand what National Socialism stands for," he declared.

German newspapers today continue to fulminate against Magistrate Brodsky's decision, calling it a great insult to the Reich.

NEW ZIONIST ORGANIZATION REPRESENTS ALL JEWRY, CONSTITUTION DECLARES

VIENNA, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- "The New Zionist Organization is not a Jewish party, it represents Jewry itself," declared Oscar Rabinowich today, outlining the organization's constitution at its constituent congress being held in the Vienna Concert Hall.

The constitution recognizes every Jew and Jewess throughout the world, regardless of class or private views, as being automatically a member of the new organization, Rabinowich said.

Previously, the Zionist Revisionist leader declared the new organization would demand recognition from the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations and from Great Britain as the Jewish Agency for Palestine provided for in the mandate.

He disclosed the new organization, formed by right-wing Zionists who recently split away from the World Zionist Organization, will eventually seek a seat in the League.

The constitution, which was adopted today, recognizes observance of religious traditions and says the new organization will con-

sider Hebrew as the national language of the Jewish people. It will not, however, recognize class differences in Jewry, "until the final aim of establishing the Jewish state has been achieved."

The Jewish State, the constitution declares, must be on both sides of the Jordan and must serve as "a place for the repatriation of all Jews living in the Diaspora against their will."

Every Jew will be asked to contribute one pound (about \$5) a year towards capitalizing a new bank which the organization intends to establish in Palestine, Dr. Abraham Weinschal, president of the Palestine Zionist Revisionist Organization, said,

The purpose of the bank will be to help Jews migrate to Palestine by aiding them to liquidate their property in the Diaspora. It also intends to finance cooperative undertakings for artisans, industrialists and farmers in Palestine.

Dr. Weinschal denied the World Zionist Organization is in any way responsible for Palestine's present prosperity. "The prosperity which Palestine is now enjoying," he said, "is due largely to private initiative." He criticized the WZO for not combating land speculation in Palestine.

"The old organization," he said, "exists chiefly because it controls the distribution of immigration certificates to Palestine, which it is utilizing to create artificially in Palestine a majority holding special views which are in opposition to those of the majority of Jews in the Diaspora."

He accused the WZO of paying no attention to the justified demands of the farmers and industrialists. He denounced the proposed legislative council for Palestine and assailed the dearth of Jewish officials in the country.

A heavy police detachment guarded the hall following the arrest today of three Communists who attempted to distribute leaflets.

The Austrian government today invited all foreign journalists covering the congress to a tea arranged by the Foreign Ministry. Postal authorities have established a branch post-office in the congress building and are postmarking all mail sent from there with the NZO insignia.

Meanwhile, a daily congress newspaper in German appeared for the first time today.

Last night, M. Berchin, member of the World Central Committee of the Zionist Revisionist Organization, at a memorial meeting

eulogized Chief Rabbi Kook, Alfred Dreyfus, Baron Edmond de Rothschild, Marshal Pilsudski, and Queen Astrid of Belgium.

JABOTINSKY DECLARES WAR ON NAZIS

At yesterday's afternoon session, delegates heard Vladimir Jabotinsky, Zionist Revisionist leader, declare "a war for Jewish self-defence" against the Third Reich.

He announced the new organization would seek to coordinate Jewish anti-Nazi activity throughout the world and declared the organization would fight to "remove from Palestine the shame of the barter pact with Germany."

He struck a note of peace when he declared, "Ours is not a competitive organization. I send greetings to all organizations working for Palestine, and I wish them success."

An ovation was given to Col. John Henry Patterson British officer who during the war organized the Zion Mule Corps, an all-Jewish battalion which took part in the campaign at Gallipoli. This unit served as the nucleus of the famous Jewish Legion.

Col. Patterson declared that Jews are entitled to Transjordan because Jewish soldiers conquered it. "Seventeen years ago exactly this day," he said, they were fighting on three fronts with a large Turkish army. These soldiers weren't English and they weren't Scottish; they were Jewish soldiers. Had there been no Jewish Legion, I doubt whether there would have been any Jewish Palestine today."

Col. Patterson paid tribute to Jabotinsky as the organizer of the Jewish Legion, and emphasized that only Jewish soldiers fought in Transjordan. "You must remind England," he declared, "that Jewish soldiers conquered Transjordan."

He concluded his address with the declaration that "the Jewish flag is only flying at half-mast in Palestine today. It is your job to see that that flag is pulled to the mast-head!"

Yesterday morning Jabotinsky and Col. Patterson led all delegates and guests on a pilgrimage to the grave of Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of the Zionist organization who lies buried at the Jewish cemetery in Vienna.

JEWISH CULTURAL GROUPS IN GERMANY MUST SUBMIT PROGRAMS EVERY MONTH

BERLIN, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Jewish cultural organizations must submit their programs to the League of Jewish Cultural Societies the fifteenth of every month beginning this month, according to

an order issued by Hans Hinkel, Nazi commissioner for "non-Aryan" affairs.

Program changes must be submitted to the League eight days before the performance, it was announced, and the societies must also submit annual or monthly membership reports and pay the League a fee of three pfennigs per member.

Membership in the League is compulsory for Jewish theatrical, musical and artistic groups.

ORTHODOX RABBIS DECLARE FAST DAY FOR REICH JEWS

NEW YORK, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- The Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, has decided to designate Sunday, September 22, as the Day of Intercession on behalf of the Jews of Germany, Rabbi Joseph Konwitz, president of the Union, announced here today.

In accordance with this resolution, the Jews of this country and of Canada will be asked to go to their synagogues on the Day of Intercession, abstain from all foods until noon, and offer prayer.

VLADECK ASKS CONCERTED ACTION TO AID POLISH JEWS

LONDON, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- An appeal for the concerted action of all Jewish agencies to ameliorate the condition of the 3,500,000 Jews in Poland, was made by B. Charney Vladeck of New York, president of the People's ORT Federation in America and manager of the Jewish Daily Forward, at the first world conference of Polish Jews living outside the country.

Mr. Vladeck speaking at yesterday's session urged that constructive work be undertaken without delay to rehabilitate the so-called "declassed" Jews of Poland.

Benjamin Winter, president of the American Federation of Polish Jews and also head of the Conference presidium, pointed out that Jewish problems are also world problems in as much as the general world situation wherein Jewish problems are also included is in a state of chaos.

He assailed the anti-Semitic groups in Poland, declaring that Jews demand that the Polish government take rigorous steps against the anti-Semitic movement there. He urged that the conference create "an army for peace" which will fight for equality for Jews in Poland.

Z. Tygel, executive director of the American Federation of Polish Jews, pointed out that while the Jews have no guns or airplanes

they have a powerful weapon in the boycott.

The conference opened Saturday night with 72 delegates from 18 countries. It was greeted by O. Losky on behalf of the Polish Ambassador to London. Numerous messages were received from all parts of the world.

Benjamin Winter, president of the Federation of Polish Jews in America; Dr. O'Donovan, a member of Parliament; Hannen Swaffer, noted drama critic and Barnett Janner, laborite member of Parliament were speakers last night at a mass-meeting held in connection with the first world conference of federations of Polish Jews.

GREEK GENERAL PROBES AIDE'S ANTI-SEMITIC TALK

SALONICA, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- General A. Papagos, commander-in-chief of the Greek army left today for Serrai for an inquiry into the anti-Semitic speech delivered to the military forces there Thursday by General Popadopoulos, commander of the Serrai division.

In his speech, General Popadopoulos coupled Jews and Communists as the enemies of Greece. The Jewish communities of Serrai and Salonica protested vigorously.

JEWISH PAPERS IN SALONICA MERGE

SALONICA, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- La Prensa and Action, two Jewish news papers published here, merged today. They gave as their reason the economic depression which already has forced three other Jewish papers in Greece out of existence. The merged periodical will be the only remaining Jewish publication.

An ovation was given to Col. John Henry Patterson British officer who during the war organized the Zion Mule Corps, an all-Jewish battalion which took part in the campaign at Galipoli. This unit served as the nucleus of the famous Jewish Legion.

Col. Patterson declared that Jews are entitled to Transjordan because Jewish soldiers conquered it. "Seventeen years ago exactly this day," he said, they were fighting on three fronts with a large Turkish army. These soldiers weren't English and they weren't Scottish; they were Jewish soldiers. Had there been no Jewish Legion, I doubt whether there would have been any Jewish Palestine today."

Col. Patterson paid tribute to Jabotinsky as the organizer of the Jewish Legion, and emphasized that only Jewish soldiers fought in Transjordan. "You must remind England," he declared, "that Jewish soldiers conquered Transjordan."

He concluded his address with the declaration that "the Jewish flag is only flying at half-mast in Palestine today. It is your job to see that that flag is pulled to the mast-head!"

Yesterday morning Jabotinsky and Col. Patterson led all delegates and guests on a pilgrimage to the grave of Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of the Zionist organization who lies buried at the Jewish cemetery in Vienna.

JEWISH CULTURAL GROUPS IN GERMANY MUST SUBMIT PROGRAMS EVERY MONTH

BERLIN, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Jewish cultural organizations must submit their programs to the League of Jewish Cultural Societies the fifteenth of every month beginning this month, according to

an order issued by Hans Hinkel, Nazi commissioner for "non-Aryan" affairs.

Program changes must be submitted to the League eight days before the performance, it was announced, and the societies must also submit annual or monthly membership reports and pay the League a fee of three pfennigs per member.

Membership in the League is compulsory for Jewish theatrical, musical and artistic groups.

ORTHODOX RABBIS DECLARE FAST DAY FOR REICH JEWS

NEW YORK, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- The Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, has decided to designate Sunday, September 22, as the Day of Intercession on behalf of the Jews of Germany, Rabbi Joseph Konwitz, president of the Union, announced here today.

In accordance with this resolution, the Jews of this country and of Canada will be asked to go to their synagogues on the Day of Intercession, abstain from all foods until noon, and offer prayer.

VLADECK ASKS CONCERTED ACTION TO AID POLISH JEWS

LONDON, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- An appeal for the concerted action of all Jewish agencies to ameliorate the condition of the 3,500,000 Jews in Poland, was made by B. Charney Vladeck of New York, president of the People's ORT Federation in America and manager of the Jewish Daily Forward, at the first world conference of Polish Jews living outside the country.

Mr. Vladeck speaking at yesterday's session urged that constructive work be undertaken without delay to rehabilitate the so-called "declassed" Jews of Poland.

Benjamin Winter, president of the American Federation of Polish Jews and also head of the Conference presidium, pointed out that Jewish problems are also world problems in as much as the general world situation wherein Jewish problems are also included is in a state of chaos.

He assailed the anti-Semitic groups in Poland, declaring that Jews demand that the Polish government take rigorous steps against the anti-Semitic movement there. He urged that the conference create "an army for peace" which will fight for equality for Jews in Poland.

Z. Tygel, executive director of the American Federation of Polish Jews, pointed out that while the Jews have no guns or airplanes

they have a powerful weapon in the boycott.

The conference opened Saturday night with 72 delegates from 18 countries. It was greeted by O. Losky on behalf of the Polish Ambassador to London. Numerous messages were received from all parts of the world.

Benjamin Winter, president of the Federation of Polish Jews in America; Dr. O'Donovan, a member of Parliament; Hannen Swaffer, noted drama critic and Barnett Janner, laborite member of Parliament were speakers last night at a mass-meeting held in connection with the first world conference of federations of Polish Jews.

GREEK GENERAL PROBES AIDE'S ANTI-SEMITIC TALK

SALONICA, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- General A. Papagos, commander-in-chief of the Greek army left today for Serrai for an inquiry into the anti-Semitic speech delivered to the military forces there Thursday by General Popadopoulos, commander of the Serrai division.

In his speech, General Popadopoulos coupled Jews and Communists as the enemies of Greece. The Jewish communities of Serrai and Salonica protested vigorously.

JEWISH PAPERS IN SALONICA MERGE

SALONICA, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- La Prensa and Action, two Jewish news papers published here, merged today. They gave as their reason the economic depression which already has forced three other Jewish papers in Greece out of existence. The merged periodical will be the only remaining Jewish publication.

SETTLERS MARK 5TH YEAR IN STALINDORF REGION

MOSCOW, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- On the occasion of the fifth anniversary of Stalindorf Jewish region, the Jewish settlers today sent a message to Stalin declaring, "We found our promised land here in the land of the Soviets."

M. Khatayevitch, president of the Dneypropetrovsk Soviet, declares in a message of greeting to the Jewish settlers that, "The success of the Jewish settlers dispels the anti-Semitic slanders that Jews are unfit for agriculture."

SOVIET TO TRY RABBI FOR SPECULATION

MOSCOW, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- Rabbi Libertovski of Mizir, White Russia, will be tried for alleged speculation in Torgsin bonds, it was learned here today.
