NEW LAWS SEEN COMPLETE STREICHER VICTORY.

BERLIN, Sept. 17, (JTA) -- While Jewish leaders abstained for obvious reasons from commenting on the new citizenship laws, decreed yesterday by the Reichstag, the general feeling among Jews here today is that Julius Streicher, Germany's No. 1 anti-Semite, has won a complete and resounding victory over his opponents as far as the Jewish question is concerned.

The feeling persists here that Jews will be held as hostages in event the anti-Nazi boycott makes further inroads into Germany's economic system.

Now that the Jewish status has been fixed, it remains to be seen whether individual acts of terrorism against the Jews, concerning which even Hitler found it necessary to comment, will be curbed or whether they will continue as heretofore.

Reports today indicate that the campaign to deprive Jews of food is progressing not only in the provinces, but is reaching into Berlin as well.

Jewish grocers are being refused certain foodstuffs when they seek to obtain these from wholesalers and cooperative marketing societies. Butter and eggs, of which there is an acute shortage in Germany, are systematically being denied Jewish grocers.

Details regulating the status of Jews under the new laws will be sent out this week by Wilhelm Frick, Nazi Minister of the Interior, it was officially announced. Instructions to make effective immediately the laws to protest "the honor of German blood" were already sent out yesterday, the announcement reveals.

The entire German press, including even Propaganda Minister Goebbels' own newspaper, Der Angriff, today featured Hitler's orders to Nazi party leaders at a special conference in Nuremberg yesterday following the Reichstag session, instructing them to refrain from individual acts of violence against the Jews.

The press generally hails the new laws relegating Jews to the mediaeval ghetto, and warns them not to make necessary Hitler's threatened revision. The newspapers point out that these laws give Jews local protection. They also hail them as a step towards protecting racial purity by law.

Jewish musicians may no longer be employed in hotels, restaurants or other public places owned by "Aryans," a new order issued today decrees. According to the order, beginning this week Jewish music teachers will also be prohibited from giving private lessons to "Aryans."

Documentary proof of Jewishness will be required from every patron attending a Jewish cafe in Berlin where a musical program is given, the local authorities announced today. The announcement also declares that "Aryans" will not be permitted to patronize these cafes.

Speaking in Frankfurt-am-Main last night on the Jewish question, Hans Hinkel, Nazi commissar of Jewish cultural affairs, declared that the Jewish Kulturbund, the cultural society to which all Jewish writers, artists and other intellectuals must belong, has over 180,000 members. The Nazi chieftain advised Jews "to honestly return to Judaism" and not to be "Jews only at home and shout 'Heil Hitler' in the streets."

REICH ZIONISTS FETE HENRIETTA SZOLD

BERLIN, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Henrietta Szold, 75-year old American woman Zionist leader and head of the Zionist Bureau for settlement of German-Jewish children in Palestine, was given an impressive reception yesterday by the German Zionist Federation, the Keren Hayesod, Zionist colonizing fund, and the Jewish National Fund, Zionist land redemption agency.

Miss Szold was also feted by the Reichsvertretung der Deutschen Juden, representative body of Jews in Germany.

Miss Szold came to Berlin together with Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the World Zionist Organization, on an important Zionist mission.

BRODETSKY HEADS WORLD MACCABI

PRAGA, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Prof. Selig Brodetsky, member of the World Zionist Executive, was yesterday elected president of the World Maccabi Organization at that body's congress here.

Lord Melchett was elected honorary president, and Dr. H. Lelewel, former president, was named honorary chairman.

POLISH LINES TO PALESTINE BOOKED SOLID

WARSAW, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- All steamship tickets to Palestine have been sold out for the months of September and October. The demand is so great that every available accomodation has been reserved until November.

Today 950 Jewish emigrants left for Palestine. Thursday an additional 600 will leave.

VAAD LEUMI QUILTS HAAVARAH

JERUSALEM, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- As a result of the new anti-Jewish legislation enacted by the German Reichstag, the Vaad Leumi, Jewish national council in Palestine, in a joint meeting with the anti-Nazi Boycott Committee, yesterday decided to withdraw its representatives from Haavarah, Palestine trustee office for the execution of the German-Palestine barter pact.

ISAAC GOLDBERG, ZIONIST LEADER, DIES IN ZURICH

ZURICH, Switzerland, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Isaac Loeb Goldberg, one of the founders of the Zionist movement and a prominent philanthropist, died here yesterday at the age of 75 after a long illness.

He had been taking the cure a month, coming here from Palestine where he had been living.

Goldberg was born in Szaki, Lithuania, of a poor family. While still a youth he helped organize the Chovivei Zion (Lovers of Zion), an organization that later became one of the most important forerunners of political Zionism.

He played a leading part in the convoking of the first World Zionist Congress in Basle in 1897 and was one of the leasing delegates. During the World War he exposed the secret army orders against the Russian Jews.

Later he founded the Jewish Colonial Trust, an important Zionist financial institution, served as editor of Haclom, official Russian Zionist publication during which period he was jailed several times for statements the paper printed, and held the presidency of the Russian Zionist Organization a term.

Goldberg was known for his large contributions to causes dear to him.

WILENSKY, 64, DIES IN JERUSALEM

JERUSALEM, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Judah Leib Wilensky, Zionist veteran, died here today. He was 64 years old.

OLYMPICS HEADS OUT TO "GET" MAHONEY FOR OPPOSITION TO BERLIN GAMES

NEW YORK, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Fearing that the Amateur Athletic Union's opposition to the Berlin Olympic Games would hurt fund-raising, leaders of the American Olympic Committee are gathering their forces to have Jeremiah T. Mahoney ousted as president of the A.A.U., the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned on unimpeachable authority today.

Failing this, it was learned, the Olympics czars will either set up a rump association or will take only college men, for whom the A.A.U.'s certification is not required.

This is the gist of plans brewing in high Olympics places as Mr. Mahoney, A.A.U. president, continues with his determined opposition to holding the games in Berlin because of Nazi discrimination against Jewish athletes.

All non-college athletes must be certified to the International Olympics Committee by the A.A.U. as things stand at present. But the A.A.U. is meeting in New York this December and if, with Mahoney's support, the organization decides against Olympics participation, there will be great difficulty in having athletes certified.

The Olympic "gods" are at present concentrating on forcing the A.A.U. to oust Mahoney by having him turned down when he comes up for re-election as president. But Mahoney is popular, and the Olympic heads do not entertain great hope of succeeding in this move.

Besides certification, another consideration which is giving Olympics heads no end of worry is funds. The money to finance the American team must come entirely from voluntary contributions.

The committee heads realize that fund-raising will be a difficult business this year because of the rising tide favoring a boycott of the games. Prospective coaches and officials of the American team have been informed they must be prepared to pay their own expenses, otherwise persons who can pay will be named.

On the public relations end, the committee heads are preparing to use the argument that so few Jews are likely to be named to American teams that it is unfair to ask the others to refrain from competing. There is not a word about Catholic opposition.

Meanwhile, the South Atlantic Association's delegates to the A.A.U. convention were under orders today to vote against participation in the games. The decision was taken at a convention being held in Baltimore.

LABOR CONGRESS IN HALIFAX URGED TO BOYCOTT OLYMPICS

HALIFAX, N.S. Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Boycott of German goods and abstinence from the Berlin Olympic games in 1936, was today demanded in a resolution introduced at the Canadian Trades and Labor Congress, in session here.

Presented to the Congress by W. G. Russell, delegate of the Typographical Union of Toronto, the resolution also urges that the Congress ask the Dominion Government to protest against the "Hitler atrocities."

HISTADRUTH MEMBERS JAILED FOR CLASH

TEL AVIV, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Three of the seven members of the Histadruth, General Federation of Labor in Palestine, arrested for complicity in yesterday's clashes with members of the National Labor Union, were today sentenced to jail for from three days to one week. One was also fined.

The clashes between the two rival unions broke out when Lampport, owner of one of the enterprises at Ramath Gan, dismissed the Histadruth workers and hired workers of the National Labor Union. The Histadruth declared a strike, but the National Labor Union men continued to work.

MARQUIS OF READING SERIOUSLY ILL

LONDON, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- The Marquis of Reading, former Viceroy of India, is seriously ill, it was learned here today. He is suffering from cardiac asthma.

The Marquis was the first Jew in England to hold the positions of Attorney-General, Lord Chief Justice and British Ambassador to the United States and, for a brief span in 1931, he was Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs in the first National Government. He is seventy-five years old.

HUNGARIAN LAWYERS OPPOSE DISCRIMINATORY BILL

BUDAPEST, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- The Hungarian Bar Association, at its conference here today, adopted a resolution voicing opposition to the clause in a new bill introduced last July which would tend to discriminate against members of the Bar Association on the basis of race.

Emil Nagy, former Minister of Justice in Hungary, declared that "Hungary, which demands justice for herself, must deal justly with its racial minorities."

The bill, published by the present Minister of Justice, Dr. Lazar, empowers the Ministry of Justice to limit the number of new lawyers in proportion to the numbers of the various racial and religious sections of the population.

The bill has met with considerable opposition, especially in view of the fact that a numerus clausus limiting the number of students from minority groups, has already been in effect in the universities since 1920. Repeated attempts of Jews, Catholics and other minority groups to have the numerus clausus rescinded have thus far met with failure.

REINHARDT PLANS DRAMATIC FESTIVAL AT TEL AVIV

SALZBURG, Austria, Sept. 17 (JTA) -- Max Reinhardt, noted German-Jewish impresario, today revealed that he is considering the organization of a peoples' dramatic festival in conjunction with the Levant Fair in Tel Aviv, Palestine next year.

In an interview with E.V. Zerow, one of the organizers of the fair, he declared that one of the features of this dramatic festival would be a performance by Habimah, world famous Hebrew dramatic group, of a dramatized version of Franz Werfel's "Forty Days of Musa Dagh," an historical novel taken by many to be a parable on present-day life of the Jews in Germany.

WISE BACK, SAYS "CRIME OF NUREMBERG" WAS EXPECTED

NEW YORK, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- Rabbi Stephen S. Wise returned here today on the Ile de France after a visit of several months in Europe, during which he attended the World Zionist Congress, and characterized the new anti-Jewish laws enacted by Germany as "the crime of Nuremberg, a crime that was to be expected."

"I warned the German delegation at the World Zionist Congress," he told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, that "you can silence me but you cannot halt the crimes of Hitlerism."

Rabbi Wise asked for world intervention in Germany on behalf of the Jews there.

"Why," he demanded, "doesn't the civilized world intervene and protest against its destroying enemies?"

Discussing the Committee of Jewish Delegations, of which he was named president at its meeting in Lucerne, Rabbi Wise said the committee would now assume new importance in view of the latest developments in Germany. He said the World Jewish Congress definitely will be held, but refused to say when it would be convened.
