CANADA URGED TO BREAK RELATIONS WITH GERMANY

HALIFAX, N.S., Sept. 21. (JTA) -- Severance of political and diplomatic relations with Germany was urged upon Canada in a resolution adopted here by the Canadian Trades and Labor Congress, representing 100,000 workers in the dominion.

The Congress, at its session last night, also called upon all local and affiliated unions to use every effort to discourage the sending of Canadian athletes to the Olympics in Germany next year as a protest against the anti-labor attitude of the Hitler regime. Refusal to purchase German-made products until labor in Germany is again set free and the persecution of workers has ceased was advocated along with the discouraging of raw materials sale to Germany.

A proposal that political refugees be admitted to Canada was defeated on the grounds that such action might open the door to "wholesale immigration."

SAYS REICH CITIES HAVE FREE HAND IN TREATMENT OF JEWS

BERLIN, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Every municipality in Germany is given a free hand to introduce any kind of limitations for its Jewish residents on the basis of the new Reichstag laws, it was revealed today by the German press.

Today's papers carry an article under the signature of Kurt Mueller, Reich's expert on municipal affairs, explaining for the benefit of German mayors and municipal authorities how the phrase in the German Constitution proclaiming that "All Germans are equal before the law" is applicable in the spirit of the Nazi program.

"Equality is not applicable to Jews," Mueller states, "because Jews are no longer considered Germans. Though Jews continue to pay taxes, they do not enjoy the privileges of non-Jewish taxpayers."

"Any municipality," Mueller further declares, "is fully entitled to prohibit Jews from entering municipal baths or other municipal institutions, or to issue anti-Jewish posters to deter Jews from entering the city."

At the same time, Mueller counsels against displaying signs "Jews enter this city on their own risk." Such signs, he says, are "apt to create the impression that the city is on the verge of terror, and besides, the ways of dealing with Jews are sufficiently unlimited so that it does not pay to display threats publicly."

REICH JEWS TAKE PRECAUTIONS AGAINST ROSH HASHONAH RIOTS

BERLIN, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Every possible precaution is being taken by Jewish communities all over the country to prevent possible provocation for anti-Jewish disturbances in front of the synagogues during the High Holidays which begin with Rosh Hashonah, the Jewish New Year, next Friday evening.

The Jewish Community of Cologne has issued an order that no Jew should wear a top hat on his way to the synagogue in order not attract special attention.

In Berlin and other cities, Jewish women were requested by the Jewish Community Councils not to dress estentatiously during the High Holldays.

Meanwhile, Count Wolf von Helldorf, president of the Berlin Police, and notorious leader of the anti-Jewish street attack on Kurfuerstendamm on Rosh Hashonah eve four years age, today notified the executive of the Jewish Community of Berlin that complete protection would be given by the police to Jews during Rosh Hashonah prayer hours.

In connection with this special notification, Dr. Heinrich Stahl, president of the Berlin Jewish Community, is issuing an appeal to all Jews of Berlin to maintain order when leaving the synagogues and not to crowd in front of the exits, thus avoiding any possible provocation. The appeal also requests Jews not to congregate in front of the synagogues and not to park autos there.

GHETTO LAWS! HELD NEW BAR TO PARTICIPATION IN OLYMPICS

BERLIN, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- What effect the "ghetto laws" of germany, by which German Jews are disenfranchised, will have on the participation of Jewish athletes in the Olympic Games was today the subject of considerable comment in athletic circles here.

The question arose when it was realized that in addition to the other obstacles that sports authorities have put in the path of Jewish athletes who might be eligible to participate in the games next year, there was this fact:

That a nation cannot be represented at the games by an athlete who is neither a subject or a citizen of that nation.

This question has given rise to the opinion that since the Jews are now classed officially as non-citizens as well as "non-Aryans," the Reich sports authorities will use this fact in explanation of the absence of Jewish athletes from the German Olympics squad when it is finally constituted.

Just what affect the laws will have in this respect, however, is not clear even to the authorities who were questioned on the matter today by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

A clear cut decision on the question is not expected before Minister of the Interior Wilhelm Frick works out complete regulations as to how the laws are to be carried out in the daily life of the country. The regulations are expected within the next few days.

Meanwhile, the difficulties put into the path of Jewish athletes are such that hardly any German Jew is likely to enter any Olympics event unless as a member of a foreign team-in which case he would have to be a citizen or subject of the nation he is representing.

"BRONX EXPRESS" BANNED IN BERLIN

BERLIN, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- The American-Jewish comedy "Bronx Express" by Ossip Dymov, was today banned by the Berlin authorities. It was to have been performed by the Jewish Kultur Bund theaters.

This prohibition is in direct violation of the Reichstag laws securing for Jews in Germany autonomy in their cultural and religious life.

The Kultur Bund theaters are recognized by the Reich Government as theaters for Jews only, and no "Aryans" may be admitted to them.

Simultaneously, the Nazi Party of Hamburg today reached an agreement with the owners of local theaters and concert halls rendering it impossible for Jews to enter general theaters. The agreement provides that theaters and concert halls must be managed "on the basis of German nationality."

The Nazi authorities of Hamburg are also starting publication of an "Aryan" trade directory in order to distinguish between Jewish and "Aryan" firms.

In Frankfurt-am-Main a number of Jewish men and "Aryan" women who had been civilly married for many years, were today arrested for "race pollution."

LEAGUE SHELVES NORWAY'S PROPOSAL ON REFUGEES

GENEVA, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- What amounts practically to a refusal of the request made by Norway that the League of Nations establis a special refugee organization under its aegis, was today adopted in the form of a resolution by the Political Commission of the League Assembly after it had been submitted by a special subcommittee appointed to study the question.

The decision to abolish the Nansen office at the expiration of its term in 1936, was confirmed.

The question as to whether or not the League of Nation's High Commission for German and Other Refugees, headed by James G. McDonald, will be placed under direct control of the League, will be decided by the League Council, which will appoint an expert committee of five members to study the question further. It was decided, however, that under no condition may the League's budget for this purpose be increased by special relief measures.

The final decision of the Council on this matter, it is expected, will not be made until the middle of 1936.
