## BOSTON COLLEGE COACH FAVORS OLYMPICS WITHDRAWAL

BOSTON, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- Jack Ryder, coach of the Boston College track teams for more than 30 years and coach of the Boston Athletic Association for almost 30 years today reiterated a previously made statement that he favors withdrawal of the American team from the Berlin Olympic games.

"Of course, I cannot speak for Boston College," he stated, after William J. Bingham, Harvard athletics director, had announced opposition to the Olympics. "But I have already gone on record favoring withdrawal of the U.S. team because of Germany's racial and religious persecutions.

"It is hard to believe that a Jewish or Catholic athlete would receive fair decisions from officials saturated with the doctrine now prevalent; in Germany," he added.

Commenting on his own statement, Mr. Bingham, who was to manage the American track and field team in the Olympics, pointed out that he spoke more as a member of the American Olympic Committee than as the Harvard athletics head.

The outstanding Jewish athlete at Harvard at present is Milton Green, star hurdler and broad-jumper, who is a definite Olympic prospect.

## MIZRACHI TO OPERATE REFUGEE FARM IN FRANCE

NEW YORK, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- Renouveau, training farm for German-Jewish refugees in southern France established and directed by Dr. Dmitri Marianoff, has been turned over to the World Mizrachi Organization, Dr. Marianoff amounced here today. The Mizrachi Organization, through its French branch, will operate the farm as a training center for chalutzim before they are sent to Palestine. Refugees will continue to make up the bulk of Renouveau's student farmers, who will be trained in accordance with orthodox Mizrachi principles. Between 30 and 40 refugees are in training at Renouveau.

Dr. Marianoff, a son-in-law of Prof. Albert Einstein, announced that he had turned over operation of the farm to Migrachi because he is establishing his residence in the United States. He is retaining secretaryship of the project. Lord Melchett is president and Prof. Einstein honorary chairman of Renouveau.

## FORBIDS JEWISH ATHLETES TO WEAR REICH PIN

BERLIN, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- Following on the heels of the assurances given by Reich Sports Commissar Captain Hens von Tschammer und Osten to General Charles H. Sherrill, American member of the International Olympic Committee, that there would be no discrimination against Jewish athletes, Captain von Tschammer today prohibited Jewish athletes from wearing the Reich sports pin label, the insignia of the German sportsmen.

The sports leader's assurances were given in a letter to General Sherrill in which he said he had invited Miss Helene Mayer, Jewish fencing star, and Miss Greta Bergmann, Jewish high-jumper, to represent Germany in the Olympics. Miss Mayer is at present in Oakland, Cal. Miss Bergmann is in Stuttgart, Germany.

Last August 5 Miss Bergmann was barred from the Wuertemberg Olympic tryouts in Stuttgart because of her Jewish blood.

## STREICHER TO SPEAK AGAIN IN BERLIN

BERLIN, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- On the eve of the Jewish New Year, it was announced today that Julius Streicher, Germany's anti-Semite Number 1, would deliver another address in the Sportspalast under the auspices of the German Labor Front. The exact date of the rally has not yet been announced.

Every Berlin synagogue was crowded at New Year's services, which began tonight and will continue through Sunday night. Every effort was made to prevent provocations for anti-Semitic disturbances. Services, for the most part, were simple.

The intensest gloom that ever accompanied a German New Year's observance in recent times hung over Berlin tonight.

New Year messages issued by leading central Jewish organizations including the Patriotic Organization of Jewish War Veterans, pointed out that the year 5696 is commencing in the shadow of the new Reichstag citizenship laws and fears were expressed that even these laws might be revised.

The messages stress the seriousness of the situation and urge unity within Jewish ranks "in these hours of difficulty." A pall of pessimism was reflected by leading articles in German Jewish newspapers, which appeared today with special Rosh Hashonah editions. These editions are the last which can be sold on newstands, since the official order prohibiting public sale of Jewish papers goes into effect Oct. 1.

The C-V Zeitung, organ of the Central Union of Jews in Germany, reappeared today after three months suspension with a special 36-page issue, 13 of which contained solely advertising. The paper analyzes the prospects for the New Year and expresses the hope that the Jews will at least be given the opportunity to live respectably.

No longer permitted to display the German national flag, Jowish homes and synagogues today hoisted the blue-white Jewish national flag for the first time since the new Reichstag legislation was enacted.

On the occasion of Rosh Hashomah, the Hugenberg newspapers today featured articles attacking the Jews of America, particularly of New York. They complained that the Jews completely dominate New York, so much so that all stores are closed and business activity is practically at a standstill because of the holiday.

The papers also bitterly attack Mayor LaGuardia and Samuel Untermyer, leader of the anti-Nazi boycott.

The Polish Telegraphic Agency today published the German official press agency's denial of the report in the Praha press that a Jewish football player had died as a result of injuries suffered when he was mobbed by Nazis at Ratibor, Silesia.
