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U.S. SURE TO ENTER OLYMPICS, BRUNDAGE STATES

CHICAGO, Oct. 24.. (JTA) -- The United States will positively be represented in the 1936 Olympic games, Avery Brundage, president of the American Olympic Association and chairman of the American Olympic Committee declared today in reply to persons and organizations opposing American participation in the Berlin games.

"The bitter feeling, attempted coercion and insidious propaganda," he asserted, "which are being used in the campaign against the Berlin games, largely by individuals who have never learned the lessons of amateur sport and thus do not hesitate to use methods contrary to all the codes of sportsmanship, are an indication of what may be expected if religion, racial, class or political issues are allowed to introduce in council halls of sport, where they have no place.

"Many dare not even voice their opinions," he continued, "because of social, political or economic pressure applied by certain organized minorities. However, it is safe to say that the vast and overwhelming majority of intelligent Americans realize that we have many opportunities for the exercise of our altruistic impulses right here in the United States. It would seem only proper to set our own house in order before we attempt to reform the world.

"It is notable that everyone who has visited Germany has reported courteous and hospitable treatment and that the German authorities are fulfilling every pledge made to the International Olympic Committee."

Brundage declared that, "The Olympic games belong to the athletes, not to the politicians. Knowing the temper of true sport leaders

and amateur athletes in this country, who are unanimous on this subject, I say positively that there will be teams representing the United States in the 1936 games.

"Sportsmen will not tolerate the use of clean American sport as the vehicle to transplant old world hatreds to the United States. Accepting the invitation to compete in the 1936 Olympic games; the American Olympic Committee, like the Olympic committees of 48 other nations which have accepted, does not endorse the policies of any government. The committee considered nothing but the sport and its requirements.

"Germany's political policy within or without has no bearing on the subject. The committee followed the universal and unbroken Olympic precedent of 40 years and ignored irrelevant political, racial and religious affairs. Attempts to twist and distort the unanimous decision of the committee into an endorsement of Nazi policies are nothing but barefaced effrontery.

"The American Olympic Committee, composed of representatives of more than 70 leading amateur sport organizations, after fully investigating all the charges and after due deliberation, accepted unanimously the invitation to participate in the games.

"These men, most of whom for many years, without remuneration, devoted time, thought, energy and money to the cause, know best the interests of amateur sport and have in mind the prestige of the United States. They will never allow our athletes to be made martyrs, to a cause not their own, or let amateur sport be sacrificed to a political issue.

"The Olympic Committee is the only organization which has the authority to deal with the representation of the United States in the games.

"As a result of hundreds of requests, the American Olympic Committee is publishing a sixteen page booklet covering the entire Olympic situation."

POLL SHOWS OLYMPICS BODY FAVORS U.S. OLYMPICS ENTRY

NEW YORK, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- Indications that the American Olympic Committee still supports participation in the Berlin Olympics were found in first returns of a telegraph poll of the 62 members being made by the New York Post.

The first results showed 18 favoring participation, 3 opposed and 3 undetermined.

ANGLO-JAP TREATY BARS ACTION TO HALT PALESTINE DUMPING

LONDON, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- The hope that Great Britain would be able to check Japanese dumping which is crippling Palestine infant industries went glimmering today when it was announced on the floor of the House of Commons that protective measures could not be taken because Japanese imports are governed by an Anglo-Japanese commercial treaty to which Palestine had acceded.

As long as this treaty is in force, Commander A.R.J. Southby declared today, no discriminatory action against Japanese products is possible. Commander Southby spoke for Colonial Minister Malcolm MacDonald and in reply to an interpellation by Sir Wilfred Sugden.

BRITISH CONCERNED OVER ITALIAN PROPAGANDA AMONG ARABS

LONDON, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- Italian propaganda among the Arabs in Palestine is causing concern in parliamentary circles, it became apparent today.

The question of what the government is doing to counteract the propaganda was raised on the floor of the House of Commons today by Captain Peter Drummond McDonald. Captain McDonald asked whether the Government was aware that Italy is broadcasting propaganda in Arabic.

Replying for the Colonial Secretary, Commander A. R. J. Southby declared that the matter has been the subject of discussions with the Italian Ambassador. Captain Southby also pointed out that the new Palestine radio service would soon begin operating.

Sir Josiah Wedgwood, pro-Zionist member of Parliament, asked that the Colonial Office obtain a full report of the Italian propaganda in Palestine.

CZERNOWITZ TENSE OVER KILLING OF STUDENT IN ANTI-JEWISH RIOT

BUCHAREST, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- The Jewish Community of Czernowitz was in a state of high tension today as a result of the disclosure yesterday that one student had been killed and seven others wounded following a riot that marked the end of a convention of anti-Semitic groups held there last Sunday.

The killing was the result of an attack by Cuzists, returning from the congress, upon Jews in the village of Briceva in Bessarabia. Passing through the village, which is largely Jewish, the anti-Semitic followers of the notorious Prof. Alexander Cuza attacked passersby. The entire village, led by the Mayor, rushed to their defense and forced the attacking students to flee.

News of the incident was suppressed by the authorities as a precaution against further disorders.

POLISH PRIME MINISTER PLEDGES EQUALITY FOR ALL

LONDON, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- Outlining the Government's program at a plenary session of the Sejm today, Prime Minister Koscialkowski stated that all citizens of Poland, irrespective of their nationality or religion, were expected to work in closest harmony with the State in the interests of regaining general prosperity.

The principle of justice and equality of treatment for all, the new Prime Minister declared, must be carried out by all branches of the government.

To balance the budget, M. Koscialkowski announced the increase in the income tax and the enactment of a special tax for government employes. In order to encourage agriculture, he said, taxes affecting the rural population will be reduced.

In tribute to the memory of the late Deputy Wacław Wislicki, the entire Sejm stood silently for several minutes.

MOZART 'ARYAN', NAZIS FORBID JEWS TO PRODUCE HIS OPERETTA

BERLIN, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- The Kulturbund, Jewish cultural group organized under the aegis of the Nazis, was suddenly notified yesterday that it would not be permitted to produce Mozart's operetta "Cosi fan tutte." Reason for the action was ascribed by the Nazi department for "Non-Aryan" Culture to the fact that Mozart was an "Aryan" and hence Jews should not be permitted to produce his works.

The prohibition was decreed on the eve of the operetta's premiere despite the fact that Hans Hinkel, director of "non-Aryan" culture had given his approval of the program before rehearsals started.

The Kulturbund was recently organized with the view of pushing Jews back to a cultural ghetto. Admission to their affairs is by card only and holders are required to have photographs pasted on the cards for purposes of identification. "Aryans" are not permitted to attend functions of the Kulturbund.

12 JEWS LEFT IN GERMAN COLLEGES, BEOBACHTER BOASTS

BERLIN, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- There are only twelve Jewish students left in German colleges and universities, the Voelkischer Beobachter, official Nazi party organ, boasts in an article today.

"Non-Aryans," as distinct from full-blooded Jews, the newspaper discloses, comprise only .041 per cent of the total registration. Foreign Jews, the Beobachter points out, comprise only seven per cent of the total registration of foreign students as against twenty per cent formerly.

PALMER LEAVES PALESTINE CONSUL POST NOV. 17

JERUSALEM, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- Ely E. Palmer, consul-general of the United States at Jerusalem for almost two years, will leave here on Nov. 17 to take over his new post at Ottawa, Ont. He is president of the Rotary Club here.

LEWALD REFUSES TO PRODUCE PROOF OF FAIRNESS TO JEWS

BERLIN, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- Irritated by the continued and increasing public sentiment in the United States against participation in the Olympic games, Dr. Theodor Lewald, chairman of the Nazi Olympics body, tonight angrily refused to explain to American correspondents who pressed the issue how Germany can prove that there is no discrimination against Jews in sports.

Dr. Lewald, who had previously insisted that a written invitation to participate in the Olympics had been sent to Helene Mayer, Jewish fencing star now residing in California, declared that he was cabling Miss Mayer tonight an invitation to join the German team.

Dr. Lewald admitted to the correspondents that a clash had taken place at Ratibor, Silesia, on the occasion of a Polish-German football match there recently, but denied that a Jew was killed. Previous statements by the German official news bureau denied the match had been held, that there had been a riot and that anyone

was murdered. One person was injured during the clash, asserted Dr. Lewald, admitting the person's name was Edmond Baumgartner. He said, however, that Baumgartner is not Jewish, on the contrary being a member of the Schutzstaffel, Hitler's favorite troops.

The German official news bureau interpreted the statement made in Chicago today by Avery Brundage, chairman of the American Olympic Committee, as marking the final defeat of Judge Jeremiah Mahoney's campaign against United States participation. The report carefully avoids mentioning that the final decision rests with the Amateur Athletic Union, whose certification of athletes is essential before an American team can be sent to Berlin. The union is scheduled to meet in New York in December and several delegations have been instructed to vote against participation.

STREICHER URGES CONTINUED DRIVE ON JEWS

BERLIN, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- Through the Medium of his pornographic weekly Der Stuermer, Julius Streicher, Germany's foremost anti-Semite, appealed to Nazis today not to rest satisfied with the Nuremberg laws but to organize a further anti-Jewish offensive.

Streicher's appeal, intended to be of nation-wide scope, emphasizes that members of the Nazi party who think the Nuremberg laws constitute a final solution of the Jewish problem are not good "political soldiers" since the politically conscious soldier must continue to fight against the Jews until the bitter end.

All railway officials were today ordered to display the Stuermer at stations on the grounds that that publication helped to popularize the Nuremberg laws. The Stuermer, it was stated, is not to be charged for advertising space.

PALESTINE GUARDS AGAINST ARAB DISORDERS IN GENERAL STRIKE

JERUSALEM, Oct. 24. (JTA) -- All precautions against possible disorders during the general strike of 900,000 Arabs, scheduled for Saturday as a protest against alleged Jewish arming, have been taken by the authorities the Vaad Leumi was assured today.

Assurances were given by Government officials to Isaac Ben Zvi, who sought them on behalf of the Jewish national council.

Meanwhile, a scheduled showing of the Keren Hayesod (Jewish colonization agency) film "The Promised Land" was prohibited by the authorities today until a calmer atmosphere prevails.

An organization of Arab women presented a memorandum to the Government in which it demands that Jews be made to deliver to the Government within ten days 10,000 guns, 50,000 revolvers and a million bullets.
