HOLLAND SENTIMENT RISES AGAINST ENTERING OLYMPICS

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Rising sentiment in the Netherlands against participation in the Berlin Olympic games evidenced itself today in the calling of a protest mass meeting and the decision by an important Dutch sports organization not to send a delegation to the games.

After taking a referendum among its members, The Netherlands Athletic Association decided to keep its Olympic delegation home.

The public meeting was called for Nov. 20 by the Dutch Committee for the Defence of the Olympic Ideal, an organization agitating for withdrawal of Holland from the games. Among those who will participate in the rally are H. Putters, president of the Catholic Football Association of Amsterdam and J. Sanders, former president of the Dutch Billiard Union. The Billiard Union recently decided not to participate in tournaments in which German teams are entered.

Bernhardt Vandam, president of the committee, declared to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that the committee is absolutely unpolitical. "It is Germany that has made politics of sports," he said.

PALESTINE DENIES PLAN TO BUY REICH GOODS THROUGH HAAVARA

JERUSALEM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The Palestine Government today announced officially that it has no intention of ordering goods from Germany through the medium of Haavara, organization which enables German Jews seeking to emigrate to Palestine to take their capital out of Germany in the form of merchandise.

Reports have been circulated here for some time that it was the Government's intention to purchase goods from Germany through Haavara in order to aid German-Jewish immigrants.

REPORT NAZIS DEFER NUREMBERG LAW DETAILS UNTIL A.A.U. MEETS

BERLIN, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Promulgation of the detailed regulations under the Nuremberg marriage and citizenship laws is being delayed until after the convention of the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States in New York December 6, it was learned on the best authority today. Nazi officials are anxious not to provoke further anti-German sentiment until the A.A.U. decides on participation in the 1936 Berlin Olympics, it was learned.

2 SMUGGLING SUSPECTS RELEASED ON BAIL

JERUSALEM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Two Jews of the three detained on suspicion of arms smuggling were released today on bail. They were arrested Oct. 22 in connection with the attempt to smuggle arms and munitions in cement barrels to an importer named J. Kattan at Tel Aviv. Kattan has never been found.

SEEK BIGGER HEBREW U. FACULTY TO AID EXILED PROFESSORS

LONDON, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- To make room for exiled German-Jewish professors, the British Friends of the Hebrew University will launch a campaign next Spring for increasing the capacity of the Jerusalem university's faculty, it was announced late last night by Sir Philip Hartog, president, at a meeting of the Friends.

Redcliffe Salamon and Professor Gibb of the University's School of Oriental Studies lauded the University's contributions to conciliation between Arab and Jew.

Prof. Norman Bentwich, former attorney general of Palestine, paid tribute to Dr. Judah L. Magnes, president of the University as "the master builder of the University which symbolizes our Renaissance."

AMSTERDAM GRANTS SUBSIDY TO JEWISH GROUP

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The Municipality of Amsterdam resolved today to grant a subsidy of 11,700 guilders (\$8,000) to the Jewish Charitable Association for sending weak and sickly children to the countryside.

RABBI ZIFF DIES IN LWOW

LWOW, Poland, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Rabbi Isaak Ziff, of the Orthodox rabbinate of this city, died here today at the age of 70.

PALESTINE POTASSIUM SHIPMENT GOES TO ITALY

JERUSALEM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A shipment of 200 tons of Palestine potassium left for Italy today despite the fact that this Government has invoked sanctions against her. The sanctions, announced Monday, were retroactive to October 25. Since the order for the potassium had been placed prior to that date, it was not affected by the economic penalties. A similar shipment was dispatched to Italy several days ago. Today's cargo included 1,500 cases of grapefruit.

JEWISH AGENCY STARTS MARITIME DIVISION

JERUSALEM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A maritime department has been established by the Jewish Agency for Palestine, it was announced here today. The new department will develop Jewish navigation and stimulate all maritime business.

ARAB PARTIES COOL TO STRIKE PROPOSAL

JERUSALEM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Arab parties, even the extremists, announced opposition today to the proposal of the Arab youth organization to hold a one-day general strike on Nov. 13, the day Palestine High Commissioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope arrives here from London.

Only the Falastin, Arab daily, suggested a strike, to last one hour.

Sir Arthur was supervising from London the international search for those responsible for an attempt to smuggle arms into Palestine.

GRODNO TRIAL OF RIOTERS ADJOURNED TO NEXT WEEK

GRODNO, Poland, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- After two sessions, the trial of seventeen Poles charged with organizing the anti-Semitic disturbances last June 9 was adjourned today until next week in Grodno District Court.

During the trial, attorneys for the Endek Party, anti-Semitic organization, who are defending the accused, charged that the excesses were provoked by a Jewish self-defence corps that had been formed.

Before adjournment, a thirteen-year-old Jewish boy described how his father, Gedaliah Becher, died of wounds received during the riot.

Another witness named Rubinczuk, director of the local Jewish Merchants Association, compared the excesses to pogroms in Russia under the Czars.

The principal defendants are Alfons Panasiuk, 25, and Edmund Zygmanski, 23. The indictment charges the seventeen with organizing from a dance hall the excesses in which two Jews were killed, thirteen wounded, windows broken in 183 houses and 85 stores and \$6,000 material damage done.

MAHONEY HITS I.O.C. FOR TRUSTING HITLER

NEW YORK, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Vigorous criticism of the International Olympic Committee for placing faith in Hitler "at a time when the world at large has every reason to mistrust his words and his intentions" was voiced last night by former Supreme Court Justice Jeremiah T. Mahoney, president of the U.S. Amateur Athletic Union, at a dinner in his honor in the Hotel Commodore.

He scored Avery Brundage, chairman of the American Olympic Committee; Brig. Gen. Charles H. Sherrill, American member, and Count Baillet-Latour, chairman of the International Olympic Committee for "a willingness to compromise with fundamental principles and exchange the honor of sportsmanship for worthless Nazi promises."

He pointed out that "Hitler has broken every promise ever given by him, including his promises with reference to the Olympics."

Attacking the American Olympic Committee, he held "they have completely ruled themselves out as leaders of American sportsmanship by their un-American perversion of the principles and facts relating to the Olympic games."

More than 1,500 persons attended the dinner. Among those on the speakers' list were James W. Gerard, Judge Ferdinand Pecora, Gen. John F. O'Ryan, Matthew Woll, Roger W. Straus and Mme. Sonja Branting. William Dalton, president of the New York Athletic Club, sat on the dais but did not speak.

NEW NAZI BOOK SLANDERS JEWS; WILL BE SOLD TO OLYMPIC GUESTS, ATHLETES

BERLIN, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A 416-page book, published with the sanction of the Nazi Party and replete with anti-Jewish libels, made its appearance here today. The book is called "The Black Book" and has for its subtitle "The Jews in Germany."

A preface to the volume, written by Propaganda Minister Paul Joseph Goebbels, states that it is intended not only for internal consumption but for foreign propaganda, especially for participants and guests of the Olympic Games. This preface may prove embarrassing to Reich Chancellor Hitler who was reported yesterday as having promised Count Henri de Baillet-Latour, president of the International Olympic Committee, that nothing would be done at the games to hurt the susceptibilities of persons of "non-Aryan" derivation.

The "Black Book" is hailed in an editorial in the Voelkischer Beobachter, official Nazi party organ and Hitler's personal property, as a "fundamental work," which presents Jews as "traitors, atheists, and moral criminals."

The Beobachter states that the book is "our new weapon for combating effectively Jewish misrepresentations of facts. It is written in the spirit of the words pronounced by Dr. Goebbels at Nuremberg."

The volume, the Beobachter urges, should be used "as a handbook in every German home in order that no one forgets how the Jews misled Germany for fifteen years."

An appeal is also made by the Nazi newspaper to mail as a Christmas gift "at least one good book" to Germans residing abroad in order to imbue them with the Nazi spirit.

The "Black Book" is divided into nine chapters which describe the Jews as "swindlers, criminals, leaders of political corruption, Communists, Socialists, pornographists and degenerates."
