ITALY WILL NOT BLOCK JEWISH MIGRATION FROM REICH

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The Italian Government will put no difficulties in the path of German Jews who wish to take advantage of the Nazi Government's offer to permit them to emigrate to Italy with 30,000 marks, the Italian Consulate stated today.

The offer, made Wednesday by the German Government, permits Jews to emigrate to Italy with that sum provided they take it in the form of a Reichsbank check to be exchanged, at a 40 per cent loss, for lira credits held in Italian banks. By such an arrangement, the German Government stands to profit, since their lira credits are of small value, the lira selling at far below parity, and the Jews must pay for them on the gold standard basis.

At the annual meeting today of the Hilfsverein (relief association of Germany's Jews), it was announced that a special representative of the organization will go to Rome to investigate the possibilities of German Jews migrating to Italy.

A report of the Central Organizations of Italian Jews, made public at the meeting, states that Italy can easily absorb several thousand German Jews with capital. It is expected, however, that only about 1,000, possessing an average capital of 20,000 marks, will go to Italy on account of the uncertainty of the war situation.

The prediction was made at the meeting that there will be a decline in the total of German Jews migrating to Palestine and a corresponding increase in the migration to other countries overseas. The prediction was based on the growing difficulties German Jews are having in converting merchandise into cash through the complicated terms of the Palestine-Germany transfer agreement. Jewish migration to all countries, it was stated will triple in January.

Max Warburg, Hamburg banker, was elected president of the Hilfsverein.

BITTER FIGHT FOR OLYMPICS ISSUE SET FOR TODAY

NEW YORK, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- With a bitter battle on the Olympics' issue expected to take place on the floor tomorrow, the Executive Committee and the Foreign Relations Committee of the Amateur Athletic Union met in closed session today to consider a resolution on the question as the critical convention at the Hotel Commodore entered its first day with committee meetings the order of business.

Inside the executive committee room, with forces known to be almost evenly divided, Jeremiah T. Mahoney, A.A.U. president, and Avery Brundage, chairman of the American Olympic Committee, disputed vigorously, the one trying to influence the committee to bring in an anti-Olympic resolution, and Brundage fighting to block such a move.

Whichever way the committee voted, it was expected a minority report would also be brought in and the issue placed squarely before the delegates.

Among the delegates, sharp battle lines were being drawn and a tense atmosphere prevailed at the Hotel as tomorrow's battle neared. There is a good chance that the convention will continue into Monday.

An unofficial caucus made by a member of the American Olympic Committee, who asked to have his name withheld, showed that 90 of the 181 regular delegates oppose participation, and 52 favor it, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned. There are also 20 delegates from organizations affiliated with the A.A.U. who remain unaccounted for.

Petitions containing 500,000 names and resolutions from organizations numbering a total of 1,500,000 members were presented to the executive committee just before it began its closes session. The delegation presenting the petitions, which were brought to the hotel in a truck, include: The German-American League for Culture, the American Youth Congress, the Move-the-Olympics-Committee, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, the Young Circle League, the Anti-Nazi Federation and the American League against War and Fascism.

With the A.A.U. convention in progress, the American Olympic Committee called a meeting for Sunday. It is reported that the committee is so short of funds that it is negotiating with the National Broadcasting Company and the Columbia Broadcasting System to obtain a commercial sponsor for a broadcast of the Olympic tryouts.

It was learned today that Daniel Ferris, secretary-treasurer of the A.A.U., has received a bulky package from the German Olympic Committee said to contain propaganda for participation. Mr. Ferris would not disclose the contents of the package.

NAZI PAPER ASSAILS LEAGUE ON REFUGEE AID

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The League of Nations was bitterly assailed today by Der Angriff, Nazi organ, for considering the extension of Nansen passports for use by refugees from Germany.

The article is based on the recent deliberations of a committee of experts in Geneva, during which various Jewish relief organizations testified as to the need for League aid to be extended to German-Jewish refugees. Although no reports about the Geneva meeting have appeared in the German press, it is obvious from the article that the German Government watched the meeting carefully.

Concluding its attack on the League, Der Angriff expresses wonder at "what moral rights these refugees have to pose as martyrs."

150 JEWISH LEADERS TO HOLD VITAL J.D.C. PARLEY SUNDAY

CHICAGO, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Invitations have been accepted by 150 Jewish communal leaders throughout the country to attend a conference at the Standard Club here Sunday under the auspices of the Joint Distribution Committee to consider emergency needs of the Jews in Germany, the refugees in Eastern Europe and plans for 1936, it was announced today.

Felix M. Warburg, honorary chairman, and Paul Baerwald, chairman of the J.D.C., declared in a statement accompanying the announcement that "problems of such grave and tragic importance to Jews throughout the world have arisen so quickly and in so many countries that the J.D.C. has wished to have the counsel of many minds in dealing with these problems."

The statement continued: "The Chicago Emergency conference will function as a sort of nation-wide council to help and advise the Joint Distribution Committee in formulating its plans in the face of the overwhelming situation with which Jews throughout the world are confronted."

50,000 POLISH JEWS FACE LOSS OF REICH LABOR PERMITS

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The revocation of labor permits held by hundreds of Polish Jews in Germany will have to stand, the labor department today informed the Polish consulate which had intervened on behalf of the Jews. The decision, it is feared, may affect 50,000 Polish Jews living in Germany.

At the Polish Embassy, it was declared today that the matter of labor permits not only affects the status of all foreigners in Germany, but indicates that extension of discriminations against Polish Jews are being planned. The Embassy indicated that it is planning to intervene with the Reich Ministry of Labor.

JAFFA BARS ANTI-JEWISH DEMONSTRATION BY ARABS

JAFFA, Palestine, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The authorities today refused a permit to the Arab Workers' Union to stage an anti-Jewish demonstration. The union had requested permission to demonstrate against Arab unemployment, against "judaisation" of the harbor and against Jewish immigration.

ARAB TERRORISTS THREATEN REPRISALS FOR INVESTIGATORS

JERUSALEM, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Britons and Jews were today in receipt of threatening letters written by Arab terrorists warning them to drop immediately their activities in investigating Arab gangs of brigands who have been terrorizing sections of the country. British Government officials who have been investigating the Arab gangs were particularly singled out by the terrorists for their warning letters.

TEMPERANCE MOVEMENT STARTED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM (JTA) -- The temperance movement has reached the Holy Land. Announcement of the formation of the Jerusalem Temperance Society "to train the inhabitants of Jerusalem to abstain from using alcohol," has just been made and Palestinians are urged to turn a deaf ear to the Society's appeal for support.

There is "a pressing need," says the Society, "for a cleaner city, a cleaner country, a more sober population, a happy family life, and peaceful relationship among young men and honest intercourse between individuals."

ANTI-JEWISH PAINTINGS IN BERLIN ART EXHIBIT

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- A group of anti-Semitic paintings are among the features of the Municipal Art Exhibition which opened today at City Hall. The paintings are included in a section called "As Artists See the Jews."

SCHACHT REBUKES NAZIS FOR MEDDLING IN COMMERCE

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- A rebuke to Nazi organizations for interfering with Jews in commerce was administered yesterday by Reichs Minister of Economics Dr. Hjalmar Schacht addressing the Berlin Chamber of Economics.

Dr. Schacht complained that too many Nazi organizations were interfering in the nation's commercial activities.

"I wish to appeal urgently to all local organizations," he said, "to put their weakness for politics in the background and to consider the necessities of the country as well as the importance of strengthening our financial system with prestige."

ANGRIFF PREDICTS DRIVE AGAINST JEWISH BANKERS

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Jewish bankers are the target of a new attack today in the Angriff, Reich Propaganda Minister Paul Joseph Goebbels' newspaper. Declaring that Jews must be removed entirely from the German banking scene, the paper predicts that "Jewish private banking is going to be slowly but firmly liquidated in the Reich." The paper estimates 4,000 Jewish bankers and their employes will be affected.

WUERZBERG STUDENTS ORDERED NOT TO LIVE WITH JEWS

BERLIN, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The German press reported today that members of the Association of Student Organizations at Wuerzberg have been forbidden to live in the homes of Jews.

MEXICAN NAZI FACES LIBEL ACTION

MEXICO CITY, D.F. (JTA) -- Col. Steinman, mining engineer and local Nazi leader, will go on trial here shortly on libel charges brought by the Jewish Chamber of Industry and Commerce.

The charges are based on statements made by Col. Steinman in El Universal Grafico, a local daily, accusing the chamber of financing attacks of Communists on the anti-Semitic Fascist organization, the Golden Shirts.

The accusations were made after a clash between workers and Golden Shirts two weeks ago.

Meanwhile, the Pro-Rasa Committee and other Nazi organizations are circulating thousands of anti-Semitic leaflets in the capital accusing the Jews of inciting Mexicans against each other.

Organized labor has decided to continue its investigation of Nazi activities in Mexico.

ENDEK LEADER IN WARSAW ARRESTED

WARSAW, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Stanislaw Gutkiewicz, Endek (anti-Jewish Nationalist Party) leader in the Nowemiaszok district, was arrested by the police today and committed to a concentration camp.

LWOW ENDEKS AGAIN OUST JEWISH STUDENTS

LWOW, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Renewed anti-Jewish outbreaks flared at the University of Lwow today when Jewish students, returning to classes in the law school after a month's absence, were driven out by Endeks (anti-Semitic Nationalists) with the aid of a group of German students.

ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS LAID TO LAXITY OF POLISH AUTHORITIES

WARSAW, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Laxity on the part of the authorities in suppressing anti-Jewish agitation and riots was bitterly condemned on the floor of the Polish Parliament today by Deputies Sommerstein and Rubenstein. Immediate action to stem the anti-Semitic incitement and the resulting attacks which have reached pogrom proportions in the last few weeks was demanded by the Jewish deputies of the Premier and the Ministers of the Interior, Justice and Education.

Pointing out that the anti-Semitic agitation covers almost the entire country, the deputies accused the authorities of failing to combat the "poisonous attacks" against the Jews.

University authorities were singled out by the deputies who charged that they had neglected precautions for the maintenance of order, although they had been repeatedly warned of the impending trouble.

The deputies assailed the university officials for their refusal to permit police to enter the university grounds to quell the rioting Endek (anti-Semitic Nationalist) students.

The deputies concluded their polemic against the authorities with a demand that adequate protection be accorded the lives and property of Poland's Jewish population.

Anti-Jewish outbreaks in various sections of the country have in the past few months resulted in the death of five Jews and injuries to several score.
