PRITISH-JEWISH LEADERS TO OFFER & FLANS TO U.S. JEWRY

PERMIN, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- The three British-Jewish leaders who are salling January 15 for the United States will carry with them two distinct rlans for the consideration of American Jews, the Jewish Delographic Agency Jeaned from reliable sources today.

One plan is concerned with measures to enable Garman Jews to sattle in Palestine. Its origin is attributed to Simon Marks, Fritish chain store magnate and Zionist leader, and one of the three who will visit America on the mission.

The second plan embraces establishment of an international liquidation bank, details of which have been previously disclosed. This bank, with headquesters in London, will enable deprian Jews to emigrate to countries other than Islestine under terms of an agreement similar to that interfect between Falestine and Germany. By this method German Jews will be enabled to trensfer their capital into merokandise, the bank to handle the entire transaction and turn over to the emigrant his money in the currency of the nation in which he will settle.

In this project, Viscount Fearsted, lead of the powerful Shell Oll intercats, is reputedly interested. He is the second of the trio which will visit the United States.

Six Herbert Sammel, former High Commissioner for Falestine, and third nember of the delegation, it is undestited here, has been disease as the coordinator of both projects.

Meanwhile, it was learned in Government circles today that the Jawish leaders with lave been negotiating with the Government have prestically agreed that foreign currency shall be gaid

Recause of the foreign currency feature, it was further disclosed today, the international bank plan enjoys the surport of Dr. Hislmar Schacht.

It is understood, however, that the foreign exchange involved will represent only a small fraction of the worth of the goods. It is in this foreign currency feature that the international bank plan differs significantly from the Palestine-Germany transfer agreement. By the terms of the latter pact, Germany does not receive foreign exchange for any part of the goods taken out of the country by the Jewish emigrants to Palestine.

It was further authoritatively disclosed to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that opinion in Government circles is divided on whether it is wise to permit wholesals emigration of German Jews,

Extremist members of the cabinet are in favor of getting rid of the Jaws regardless of the ultimate cost to Germany. The moderates, on the other hand, fearing that Germany is facing economic collapse, believe that no matter how much Germany wishes its Jewish population reduced, a system of selective emigration is advisable and even necessary. These point out that there are elements in the Jewish population which are useful to the country economically and which should not be remitted to leave Germany.

The moderates in the cabinet contend further that not only is Germany losing capital which is experted in the form of goods or money, but the imrried liquidation of Jewish enterprises is already resulting in a noticeable decrease in German business activities.

That Germany is not anxious at the present time to consider any project for large-scale emigration of Jewish capitalists is indicated in an article syndicated by Fartei Korrespondenz, offical organ of the Nazi party.

In this article it is stated that Jews are not being driven from the Reich. Those who leave, it declares, do so "of their own free will."

"Thus far," the article continues, "there have been no rograms against Jews such as are occurring in neightering East European countries." (The reference is obviously to Foland, where anti-Jowish attacks in recent months have resulted in the deaths of a number of Jews and the wounding of scores nere.)

The article concludes by advising the league of Nations to examine the Jawish situation in countries east of the Reich and not to interfere with Germany's treatment of the Jawish repulation.

BRITISH-JEWISH LEADERS WILL BE HERE MONTH, GUARDIAN STATES

LONDON, Jan. 8. (JTA) -- Newspapers here continued today to devote considerable attention to the forthcoming visit to the United States of the three British-Jewish leaders, Sir Herbert Samuel, Viscount Bearsted and Simon Markes.

The Manchester dardian reports that the trio, which is scheduled to leave for the United States January 15, has no definite scheme, its mission being exploratory in nature. The group, the Guardian states, will be away approximately one month, and it is understood that one of its proposals will include a general scheme for the emigration of younger Jews from Germany and also a rian to raise a large fund for establishment of training farms to prepare them for work in Palestine.

The mission of the trio, the Guardian declares, is not connected with any arrangements reported to have been made with the Nazi Government by Jewish leaders here. Making such arrangements, the paper points out, is the duty of the Jeague of Nations.

The News-Chronicle in an editorial declares that the mission is the first result of James G. NoDoraid's letter of resignation as loague of Nations High Commissioner for Refugees from Germany. The editorial points out that, however successful may be the funds campaign to all the proposed mass emigration of Jaws from Germany, it still will not remove the root of the trouble which Mr. NoPonald described.

An editorial in the Paily Herald extends that paper's best wishes to the forthcoming campaign and points out that Reichsfuelmer Hitler would receive a warmer welcome from the comity of nations if he were to abandon medieval persecution.

In a column-long article, the London Times declares that the ferman Jews are caught "like rats in a trap," since they are unable to exist in the Reich and are unable to enigrate without capital. The article places little hope of amelicration in league intervention, declaring that the Nazi regime is unable to control the radical elements. It points out further that the regime is probably willing to permit capital export in the form of German goods providing Germany receives a small return in foreign currency. But, the Times adds, it is not in the interests of other countries to encourage derman exports at the cost of their own.

Present at the meeting at which the resolution was adopted were representatives of the Zichist Acticus Committee, the executive of the Jewish Agency, the Jewish Mational Council, the Agodath Israel, extreme orthodox group, and Mayor Meier Dizengoff of Tel Aviv.
