NAZIS BOAST OF SPREADING ANTI-SEMITISM ABROAD

BERLIN, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Reichsfuehrer Hitler's newspaper, Voelkischer Beobachter, chief organ of the Nazi Party, boasted today that the German Nazis are responsible for inciting a wave of anti-Semitism abroad.

In a report featuring the "achievements" of propaganda abroad, the newspaper stated that in Copenhagen the Nazis have been successful in "putting the Jewish question to the fore with the assistance of Nazi publications, pamphlets and other propaganda activities."

This was effected, the paper said, despite the fact that "all political parties of Denmark are definitely of the unanimous opinion that the German viewpoint about the Jews is one of the Middle Ages, barbarous and disgusting."

The Beobachter's boast was taken here as partial corroboration of the charge that anti-Semitic disturbances in Poland, Rumania and other countries were due to large sums sent from Berlin to finance anti-Semitic groups with the purpose of showing that anti-Semitism is not confined exclusively to Germany.

Additional corroboration of this accusation is seen in the fact that the Nazi newspapers are featuring all incidents of anti-Semitism in other countries, regardless of their importance.

REICH LOCAL AUTHORITIES TOLD NOT TO MOLEST JEWS IN COMMERCE

BERLIN, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Local authorities were told today not to interfere with Jews in commerce until Reichsfuehrer Hitler announces a decision on the position of the Jews in the business life of Germany.

The extension of the Nuremberg race laws to the commercial field is "something which the Fuehrer still has up his sleeve," declared

Herr Posse of the Ministry of Economics, addressing a trade and industrial group.

He emphasized that as long as Hitler holds a decision in abeyance, "no invasion should be made by local authorities."

He declared that the Nazis do not intend to modify their attitude toward the Jews, adding that their final aim was not promoted by unnecessary measures against the Jews in commerce.

3,117 REGISTERED IN SAAR JEWISH COMMUNITIES

BERLIN, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- With the Nazis preparing to introduce all the anti-Jewish legislation into the Saar on March 1, when minority guarantees expire, a report from Jewish sources today gives a total of 3,117 Jews registered as members of religious communities in the Saar as of last June. The figure does not include those without religious affiliations and only a few hundred of the total emigrated since June, most of those able to emigrate having quit the Saar before.

The Nuremberg laws and other anti-Jewish legislation will go into effect March 1, Joseph Buerckel, Nazi commissar for the territory, declared in an address to foreign correspondents. He said that ninety-five per cent of the Jews there have already emigrated.

NAZIS REFUSE TO CONSIDER EXPULSION OF CORRESPONDENT

BERLIN, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Despite a personal protest from the Czechoslovakian Minister, Reich authorities today refused to reconsider the expulsion order issued against Ernest Popper, Czechoslovakian citizen, Berlin correspondent of the Frager Tageblatt and of the Neues Wiener Journal. He was given notice that he must leave the country within ten days.

It was disclosed today that some time ago Popper was arrested by the secret state police and maltreated for six days. He was released on his pledge that he would not report the arrest and was assured that he would not be further molested by the authorities.

The expulsion order charged Popper with "poisoning the international atmosphere by reports."

RUNDSCHAU DEMANDS ICA FUNDS FOR PALESTINE

BERLIN, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Juedische Rundschau, organ of the German Zionists, demanded today that the Jewish Colonization Association assign funds for settling German refugees in Palestine. The paper declared that although it is important to find other lands for settlement, preference should be given to Palestine.

BECK SAYS POLAND WILL FOLLOW OTHER NATIONS IN
PROTECTING JEWS IN REICH

WARSAW, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Foreign Minister Joseph Beck indicated today that Poland would follow the lead of other nations in according protection to its Jewish citizens living in Germany.

Replying to Deputy L. Minzberg during a debate in the Sejm budget committee, Mr. Beck stated that the protection of Polish citizens in Germany must depend on the action that other governments take in respect to their Jewish nationals. Poland did no less than other governments in this regard, he declared.

"I state emphatically," Mr. Beck asserted, "that I myself as well as the officials of the Foreign Office regard the protection of Polish citizens in Germany as our highest duty, treating all Polish citizens with the same care, irrespective of nationality or creed."

PALESTINE PRESS HITS CONTEMPLATED ENTRY CURBS

JERUSALEM, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- All the Hebrew newspapers today carried editorials sharply criticizing the new restrictions on immigration contemplated by the Palestine Government.

The regulations which, it was learned, are now being prepared, would curb entry of relatives of citizens, double the minimum necessary for entry in the capitalist category, oblige tourists to post a \$400 deposit and invalidate immigration certificates if not used within a specified period.

The editorials quoted the Jewish Telegraphic Agency report on the contemplated restrictions, stating that there are "grave indications" of the correctness of the report.

The Government had promised to issue a statement on the matter to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency yesterday, but so far the statement has not been forthcoming.

SAMUEL NAMED CHAIRMAN OF PALESTINE ELECTRIC

LONDON, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Sir Herbert Samuel, first High Commissioner of Palestine, was elected today as chairman of the Palestine Electric Corporation to succeed the late Lord Reading. Sir Herbert is leaving for New York tomorrow as one of the three members of a delegation of British Jewish leaders who will consult with leading Jews in the United States on alleviation of the situation of German Jews.

MEYER SPIELMAN, ZIONIST LEADER, DIES AT AGE OF 79

LONDON, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Sir Meyer Spielman, Zionist leader and educator, died last night at the age of 79. He was president of the United Synagogue Keren Hayesod Committee. He had previously been a supporter of the territorialist movement and held many posts in the British education system. He was knighted in 1928.

BRITISH JEWISH LEADERS TO ADDRESS WELFARE PARLEY IN ST. LOUIS

NEW YORK, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- The three British Jewish leaders, Sir Herbert Samuel, Viscount Bearsted and Simon Marks, who are sailing for New York on the Majestic from London tomorrow to consult with leading Jews on alleviating the situation of the Jews in Germany, will make their first public appearance in the United States on Jan. 25 at the general assembly of the National Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds in St. Louis, it was disclosed today by the council. The conference will be held from Jan. 25 to 27.

They are also scheduled to speak at the United Zionist Conference in Washington on Feb. 1.

MEXICAN JEWISH LEADER LEAVES FOR PALESTINE

MEXICO CITY, D.F. (JTA) -- Leon Suraski, one of the oldest Jewish settlers in Mexico and head of many Jewish organizations, has left for Palestine to conclude negotiations for purchase of a large land tract. With his brother, he has the concession for building warehouses in the Haifa harbor. Mr. Suraski was vice-president of the company, which built the Mexico-Loredo road.

MEXICAN ZIONISTS PROTEST COUNCIL

MEXICO CITY, D.F. (JTA) -- A resolution protesting against the proposed Palestine representative legislative council was adopted by a meeting sponsored by the United Zionist Organization of Mexico.

NIEMEROWER SHOOTING HELD NON-POLITICAL

BUCHAREST, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- Ground has appeared for believing that the attempt on the life of Dr. Jacob Isaac Niemerower, Senator and Chief Rabbi of Rumania, was an anti-Semitic plot. However, the semi-official statement describing Aurel Jonescu, captured assailant, as a "religious maniac" dispelled any belief that there were political motives behind the attempted assassination.

Discussing the affray, in which Rabbi Niemerower was slightly wounded by one of three bullets fired at him, his family told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that there were three assailants. The police communique only mentioned one.

JOURNALISTS RECEIVE AGENCY EXECUTIVE IN JERUSALEM

JERUSALEM, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- The Jewish Journalists Association gave a reception to the Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine. Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president, and David Ben-Gurion and Isaac Gruenbaum, members of the Executive, stressed the unity among the members of the agency.

WOMEN'S LEAGUE FOR PALESTINE TO HOLD LUNCHEON TODAY

NEW YORK, Jan. 14. (JTA) -- The Women's League for Palestine will hold a \$20-plate luncheon tomorrow at the Waldorf-Astoria. Goldie Myerson, Palestine women's leader, will be principal speaker. The League is seeking funds for building a home for refugees in Tel Aviv.

ARTISAN LAW IN LITHUANIA HELD ENDANGERING JEWISH LIVELIHOODS

KAUNAS (JTA) -- Jewish artisans in Lithuania view with concern a proposed law requiring every artisan to undergo an examination for a diploma.

The Government, which is at present drafting the law, has not invited any representatives of the Jewish artisans, although it did consult the anti-Semitic Verslininkai Organisation.

It is generally considered that the provisions of the new law aim chiefly at ousting the Jewish artisans from their present positions. Artisan certificates are to be issued to persons who have successfully undergone a special examination, and it is only those who possess such certificates that will be allowed to carry on with their trade. This regulation would make it impossible for most Jewish artisans to carry on their work.

HILAIRE BELLOC WARNS MOSLEMS AIM TO DESTROY ZIONISM

LONDON (JTA) -- A warning that Palestine is an "island" in a "sea of Islam" which is determined to destroy the Zionist experiment is sounded by Hilaire Belloc, noted author and Catholic propagandist, writing in Universe, Catholic weekly.

While paying tribute to Zionist achievements, Mr. Belloc holds that "the whole position" of Palestine is "unstable. It stands like a pyramid upon its apex, only prevented from falling if the natural effect of gravity is counteracted by some one holding up the sides."

He continues:

"The reason of this situation is mainly the attitude of all Islam towards the Zionist experiment. The boundary between Palestine and the French Syrian mandate is purely arbitrary. There is no natural frontier to the South either, and still less through the desert to the East.

"Though all Palestine were made Jewish tomorrow and all its native inhabitants deported, the new State would still be a little island crowned in a sea of Islam. For hundreds of miles in every direction there is a Mohammedan world which regards the Zionist movement

as temporary and is determined to destroy it. The quarrel is not to be appeased. It is permanent; and that is why the Zionist experiment, in proportion to its success will be an increasing anxiety to this country."

Mr. Belloc paid tribute to the achievement of Zionism in Palestine. "The Jews have a further asset," he wrote, "which is that through them the English Government in Palestine is immensely prosperous. This little state has a surplus which amounts, I believe, to something like £5 a head, perhaps more."

"It is through this ceaseless incoming torrent of money that Great Britain has been able to build the fine new port of Haifa, for instance, the only modern and secure port upon the whole Levantine coast from the Turkish boundary to Alexandria, the only large and well-equipped port, capable of fortification and utilizable by modern armed vessels in all the eastern Mediterranean except Alexandria."
