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GERMAN ZIONISTS DEMAND SHARE OF ICA FUNDS

BERLIN, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Demands that a share of the millions left by the late Baron de Hirsch to the Jewish Colonization Association (ICA) be allotted for Zionist work were voiced today at the all-German Zionist conference.

Meanwhile, it became known that the ICA is ready to invest \$2,000,000 in the 40,000-acre Huleh plain in the northern section of Palestine acquired by the Jewish Agency in December, 1934.

Bitter criticism of the ICA was voiced by Dr. Georg Landauer of the Jewish Agency, addressing the delegates. His stand was supported by Dr. Siegfried Moses and Dr. Kurt Blumenfeld, president and ex-president respectively of the German Zionist Federation, both of whom declared that the ICA does not spend its funds for the right purposes.

Dr. Blumenfeld offered a resolution demanding that the ICA invest capital in Palestine.

Replying to the criticism, Dr. Alfred Klee, a member of the ICA's board of directors, disclosed that it had participated in the preparations for sending the British delegation headed by Sir Herbert Samuel to the United States to obtain support for German emigration.

Dr. Klee declared that the Association finances central German Jewish institutions and helps to settle German Jews in South America.

Earlier in the day, the delegates of the Mizrachi, orthodox Zionist organization, who had bolted the conference, resumed their seats after announcing that they had settled their dispute with the praesidium.

The orthodox delegates walked out yesterday when the praesidium ruled out of order one of their leaders who was criticizing Dr. Blumenfeld on a religious question.

Agents of the Gestapo, secret State police, continued to take stenographic notes of all speeches. The conference, which is the twenty-fifth in the history of German Zionism, is the first national Zionist parley to be held since Reichsfuehrer Hitler's accession to power.

REICH SUPREME COURT CANCELS JEW'S LEASE IN "INTERESTS OF PEOPLE"

BERLIN, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- The Supreme Court of Germany ruled today that contracts can be cancelled if their fulfillment is considered not in the interest of the German people.

The ruling was handed down in cancelling a lease granted by the City of Berlin in 1925 to Isador Neumann on a large tract of land on which a cinema was subsequently built.

Holding that fulfillment of the agreement is now impossible, the court ruled that "service to the nation is at present superior to law."

Propaganda Minister Goebbels' Der Angriff hailed the decision as bringing an end to "Jewish speculation." It expressed regrets that "it took more than two years for the German people to show this Hebrew that he no longer lives in the year 1925."

Two thirds of the clothing industry is still in the hands of Jews, Der Angriff complained, blaming the moving of skilled workers to other countries by Jewish firms for the difficulty in bringing the industry to normalcy.

ARAB STRIKE PARTIALLY HALTS PALESTINE'S ACTIVITIES

JERUSALEM, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- A one-day Arab strike in sympathy with Syrian Nationalist uprisings succeeded today in partially halting normal activities throughout Palestine.

With police guards deployed in Arab centers no serious disorders were reported. An official Government statement said that the entire country was quiet except for a small demonstration of boys at Nablus.

During the strike at Nablus, demonstrators stoned the police station and broke windows. The police restored order.

In Jerusalem a special detail of police halted three attempts of students and school pupils to stage demonstrations. Members of the Arab Youth Federation, which played a leading role in the strike, forced many Arabs to close shops and join the strike.

At Jaffa, police were stationed at the waterfront to guard the harbor. Normal activities were brought to a virtual standstill by the strike. The strike committee in that city issued a proclamation recalling the "heroism" of Arabs who rioted there recently. The proclamation asked solidarity with the Syrian Arabs.

40 NAZIS RETURN TO PALESTINE WITH SWASTIKAS FROM HITLER

JERUSALEM, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- A delegation of eighty Nazis who live in Palestine returned today from a visit to Germany bringing with them three large swastika flags. They said they had received the emblems from Reichsfuehrer Hitler himself.

The swastikas will be unfurled by Nazi units at Jerusalem, Haifa and Darna.

REPORT PALESTINIANS PAID TO FOMENT PRO-ITALIAN DEMONSTRATIONS

JERUSALEM, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- An agreement has been made for an unnamed sum of money to foment pro-Italian disturbances in Palestine, it was reported today by Falastin, Arab Christian daily. The newspaper mentioned no names in connection with the reported agreement.

NAZI MARRIAGE LAWS EXTENDED TO AUSTRIA

VIENNA, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- A Vienna court today ruled that the German law prohibiting intermarriage between "Aryans" and Jews is applicable to Jewish subjects of the Reich living in Austria.

NAZI LEADER SLAIN IN SWISS TOWN

GENEVA, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- W. Gustloff, Nazi leader was shot and killed today by unknown persons who entered his apartment in the town of Davos.

Gustloff had been frequently warned by the Swiss authorities about his Nazi activities. It was well known that he had relations with the Gestapo, secret German State police.

22 ARRESTED AFTER RIOTS IN POLISH TOWN

WARSAW, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Twenty-two persons were arrested today in disorders in the town of Przystan, district of Czestochowa, during which more than a score of Jewish-owned stalls in the market place were demolished. Order was restored.

Police in the town of Truskolas near Czestochowa today arrested Zygmunt Cerbiel for the bombing of the local synagogue on January 18. The rifling of the local church a week later gave rise to reports the action was taken in revenge, resulting in anti-Jewish riots. Subsequently, the theft was laid to the brother of the church beadle.

BRITISH AMBASSADOR GETS PROTEST ON PALESTINE COUNCIL

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Sir Ronald Lindsay, British Ambassador to the United States, has accepted a resolution protesting against the projected Palestine representative legislative council and promised to transmit it to his Government in London.

The resolution was presented to him yesterday by a delegation including Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America and Elihu D. Stone of Boston. The resolution was adopted by a conference of Zionist and other Jewish organizations on January 26.

ADOLPH ROSENBLUM, BRITH SHOLOM FOUNDER, DIES

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Funeral services will be held tomorrow for Adolph Rosenblum one of the 44 persons who founded Order Brith Sholom in 1905 and who was later instrumental in securing the order's backing for the Basle Zionist program. Mr. Rosenblum, who was 65 years old, was assistant grand secretary of Brith Sholom.

He was a leader in many Jewish organizations, including the American Jewish Congress and founded the Brith Sholom Relief Association in 1910. He is survived by his wife, four sons and three daughters.

DR. BOHN TELLS ANTI-NAZI LEAGUE GERMAN PEOPLE OPPOSE HITLER

NEW YORK, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Seventy-five per cent of the German people who opposed to Hitler, it was declared today by Dr. Frank Bohn, author an economist, in an address to more than 200 delegates at the regional conference of the Women's Division of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League at the Hotel Commodore. He called for a renewed war against Nazism.

REPORT SPICER TO REMOVE TEL AVIV POLICE AUTONOMY

JERUSALEM, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Arab newspapers stated that Roy G.B. Spicer, Inspector-General of the Palestine Police, will visit Tel Aviv, all-Jewish city, for final liquidation of the city's police autonomy.

PAPYRUS SCROLLS UNEARTHED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, Feb. 4. (JTA) -- Seven papyrus scrolls written in Greek have been unearthed at Auja, south of Beer Sheba by the American Colt Expedition. One of them contains the name of the Byzantine emperor, Flavius Justinus the Second. Experts said the discovery was highly important.
