JERUSALEM QUIET ON SABBATH; POLICE PATROL STREETS IN LORRIES

JERUSALEM, May 17. (JTA) -- Steel-helmeted, heavily-armed police patrolled the streets of Jerusalem and Jaffa in lorries yesterday following Friday's demonstrations in various parts of Palestine during which two Arabs were killed and about forty reported wounded. The Sabbath passed quietly in Jerusalem.

A cordon of police was thrown around the strip of territory between the neighboring cities of Arab Jaffa and all-Jewish Tel Aviv.

Fire early today destroyed much of the Jewish crops in Atlit. One Arab was reported shot dead by police, who arrested two others in connection with the blaze.

Other incidents reported during the day included the burning down of Jewish hmts at Herzliah, colony named after the founder of political Zionisme

A bomb was hurled at the Jaffa Hospital, but no casualties were reported.

ARAB POLITICIANS, LAND OWNERS SCORED BY LONDON TIMES CORRESPONDENT

LONDON, May 17. (JTA) -- The Times publishes today a bitter attack on Arab politicians and land owners by its special correspondent in Jerusalem, both of which groups, he declares, are losing ground in the estimation of the British.

"Much of their propaganda is unfair," he writes, "and much is incredibly mendacious. The real cause of their hostility to Zion-ism is jealousy."

The correspondent offers as a solution to the difficulties in Falestine, the suggestion that the British Government definitely fix the eventual limit for Jewish immigration,

"Whether that limit is to be fixed at seventy-five per cent of the Arab population or at equality," he writes, "wouldn't really much matter."

But some limit, he contends, is necessary in order to detach some of the forces aligned against the Government, especially the Arab passantry who "deserve some reassurance against being crowded out or reduced to economic vassalage by an ever increasing Jewish invasion,"

The correspondent concludes that the riots have proved the impossibility of establishing genuine parliamentary institutions in Palestine. "The sham parliament proposed by the Colonial Office," he says, "seems equally unnecessary."

ITALIAN AGENTS BACK ARAB STRIKE WITH MONEY, HERALD REPORTS

LONDON, May 17. (JTA) -- The Daily Herald's correspondent in Jerusalem reports today that Italian agents are contributing large sums of money to support the Arab general strike, now in its fourth week.

According to the correspondent, Arabs are receiving numerous remittances from Italian interests working through Syrian sympath-izers, He asserts that the last payment was for \$5,000 (approximately \$25,000). Bedouins, the writer alleges, have been promised about \$15 daily plus their food and all the loot they can get in attacks on Palestine Jews.

NEW POLISH CABINET BELIEVED BLOW TO ENDEK HOPES

WARSAW, May 17. (JTA) -- Hopes of the Endeks, Polish equivalent of the Gorman Mazis, that they would be given a stronger voice in the Government are believed today to have been quite definitely destroyed for the present with the naming of General Felicjan Sla wej Skladowski as Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior to succeed Marjan Zyndram Koscialkowski, who resigned Friday.

It is felt in informed quarters that the new Government will probably present a liberal alignment, and will take drastic measures to suppress the anti-Semitic Nationalists.

The new Premier, who has occupied the post of Minister of the Interior before, until now was Under-Secretary of State. A quarter-

master-general in the Polish Army, he is held to be the nominee of General Edward Rydz-Smygly, Marshal Pilsudski's successor as commander-in-chieff of the army. General Skladowski was a close friend of the late Marshal.

Colonel Josef Beck remains as Minister for Foreign Affairs. Eugen Kwiatowski continues as Finance Minister. The resigned premier becomes Minister of Labor and Antonio Roman, former envoy to Stockholm, is the new Minister of Industry and Commerce.

BRITISH A .A .A . TO ACT NEXT WEEK ON BERLIN OLYMPICS

LONDON, May 17. (JTA) -- The Amateur Athletic Association of England will decide at a special meeting next Saturday whether or not this country will be represented at the Olympic Games in Berlin mext Summor, it was announced today.

The meeting will at that time consider a resolution for withdrawal from the games, as moved by the National Workers Sports Association, member body of the A.A.A. The resolution was originally presented by that group at the annual meeting on March 21 of the A.A.A., but action on it was deferred by mutual agreement of the chair and the sponsors of the resolution, to be taken up at a special session.

"ARYAN," 63, JAILED FOR RELATIONS WITH JEWESS

BERLIN, May 17. (JTA) -- A sixty-three year old "Aryan" has been sentenced by a German court to twenty months in jail, it was learned today, for carrying on a relationship begun in 1931 with a forty-eight year old divorced Jewess.

WILL COOPERATE WITH REICH FOR PEACE, LEON BLUM DECLARES

NEW YORK, May 17. (JTA) -- Reporting from Paris a speech delivered by Leon Blum, Socialist who in two weeks will become France's first Jewish Premier, the New York Hereld Tribune yesterday said he "held out an olive branch to Chancellor Adolf Hitler's anti-Semitic Third Reich."

Mr. Blum is quoted as seeking cooperation with all countries, regardless of their internal regimes, in an effort to banish the spector of a European ware

Discussing the historic relations between France and the United States, the veteran Socialist leader, made reference to his Jewishness in the following passage of his address before the American Club of Paris, as reported by the New York Times:

"In recalling these historic facts, I would add that the political parties to whom the recent elections have given a majority, claim their direct descent from the French Revolution and, pardon me this liberty, I wish to say that I can lay claim to a double title, for if I have never bragged of it neither have I ever concealed it, that I belong to a race which owes to the French Revolution human liberty and equality that it should never forget."

ARTHUR LEHMAN, GOVERNOR'S BROTHER, DIES SUDDENLY

NEW YORK, May 17. (JTA) -- Funeral services were held at Temple Emann-El this afternoon for Arthur Lehman, banker and a brother of Governor Herbert H., Lehman,

Mr. Lehman, who would have been 65 years old on June 1, died suddenly early yesterday morning at his home, 45 East Seventieth Street, of what his physician described as a pulmonary embolism brought on by a thrombosis of a leg vein.

Mr. Lehman, a senior member of the banking firm of Lehman Brothers, was long actively identified with charitable endeavors. He was president at one time of the Federation for the support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, which he helped found.

A director in many industrial and banking organizations, Mr. Lehman also was active in educational and communal affairs of New York City. He was a member of the board of directors of the Merchants Association, a trustee of the New School for Social Research, of the Nuseum of the City of New York, of the City Housing Corporation and the Andrew Freedman Home.

Mr. Lohman is survived by his widow, the former Adele L. Lewischn; three daughters, Mrs. Richard Bernhard, Mrs. Benjamin Buttenweiser, and Mrs. John Loeb; a sister, Mrs. Philip Goodhart, and three brothers, Governor Lehman, Philip Lehman of Lehman Brothers, and Judge Irving Lehman of the Court of Appeals.

PALESTINIANS HERE ASK ARABS TO IGNORE LEADERS PROPAGANDA

NEW YORK, May 17. (JTA) -- A resolution urging Arabs to ignore the propaganda of hatred and animosity stimulated by their leaders was adopted last night at the sixth annual convention of the Federation of Palestinian Jews, organization which is made up of native Palestinians.

Stating that Palestine Jews wish to live peacefully with their Arab neighbors, the resolution said, however, that "the Jewish people will not be frightened by acts of violence carried on by groups of terrorists and murderers,"
