# 5 MILLION MARKS EXPORTED IN WEEK BY REICH JEWS AT 73% LOSS

BERLIN, July 10. (JTA) -- Taking an estimated 73 per cent loss, Jewish capitalists have this week transferred abroad about five million marks, banking circles estimated today,

Anticipation of new difficulties for Jews after the Olympics is credited in informed quarters with motivating the transfers which have been accomplished with the permission of the authorities through the Reichsbank. No obstacles have been placed in the way of the capital flight in view of the tremendous Government profits from the transactions.

German newspapers today reported that Bavarian Jews alone have exported twelve militon marks between Reichstehrer Hitler's accession and the beginning of 1936. Most of this sum has gone to Palestine, with the United States the second largest receiver. No figures are available for the rest of the Reich.

The Frankfurter Zeitung, in an article headlined "Reichs Citizenship Is the Basis for Retail Trading," foresees the beginning of the elimination of Jews from retailing.

The paper reports the Reichsministry of Finance has issued instructions that newly-married "Aryan" couples must spend their marriage loans only in stores owned by Reich oitisens. (Jews were disfranchised by the Muremberg laws passed by the Reichstag last September 15.)

The order does not affect stores owned by persons of foreign citizen-ship.

### POGROMS'IN ENGLAND IF FASCISTS GO UNCHECKED, COMMONS TOLD

LONDON, July 10, (JTA) -- Warning that Fascist anti-Jewish propaganda if allowed to continue unchecked will lead to pograms in England was voiced in the House of Commons today by D. N. Pritts, laborite.

Mr. Pritt, speaking during a debate on the Home Office estimates, sharply criticized the police for permitting Fascist violence and attacks against Jows.

Citing several instances of recent anti-Jewish attacks, he read from the Imperial Fascist League organ "ritual murder" charges published therein and warned that such allegations will lead to pogroms unless curbed by the Government. He accused the police of laxity in dealing with Fascist Jew-Daiters.

Duchess Atholl, referring to the activities of the so-called National Workers' Party, founded by Seton Hutchison, warned that the anti-Jewish utterances of this party tend to create prejudice that may lead to violence,

East End Jews are living in a state of terror as a result of Fascist intimidation, George Lansbury, Laborite, declared, warning of an outburst of "terrible reprisals" unless Fascist incitement is checked.

Sir John Simon, Home Secretary, replying to the charges and warnings, defended the police but expressed concern at the developments.

Also defending the police against charges of bias, Capt. J.R.J. Macnamara, Conservative, condemned Jew-baiting but warned against restraining the right offree speech.

### 1 JEW KILLED, 4 BRITISH SOLDIERS WOUNDED BY ARABS

JERUSALEM, July 10. (JTA) -- One Jew was killed, four British soldiers wounded and five civilians injured today in an ambush of a bus and classhes between troops and Arab rebels.

A band firing on a bus convoy near Nur-el-Shem en route to Tel Aviv from Haffa killed a Jew, wounded two soldiers and slightly injured five passengers.

The first shot wounded the driver of one of the vehicles. As he lost control, the car hurtled down an incline. A military patrol wirelessed headquarters, bringing strong reinforcements to the scene.

Sharp skirmishes between troops and rebels were fought at Mount Cansan, the village of Muzeir and along the Migdal-Lydda railway.

A sergeant was wounded when Arabs fired on a military patrol near Muzeir, A private was injured in a clash between Migdal and Lydda when troops discovered a band of armed Arabs attempting to destroy sections of a railroad with explosives.

Troops pursued Arabs after a sharp engagement at Mount Canaan that began with the ambuscade of a military patrol removing a barricade from a road. Another patrol was fired on along the Jenin-Silat el Dar railway.

David Ben-Gurion, chairman of the Palestine Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, left for London by airplane today to confer with British Government officials and Jewish leaders. He had just returned from England.

Arabs today attacked the Jewish colony of Neve Jacob near Jerusalem for the seventh time in the current disorders, pouring a hail of fire into the settlement from three sides,

Watchmen and special police held off the attackers for forty minutes until troops arrived from Ramallah. The reinforcements engaged the invaders in a helf-hour battle.

Another attack was launched against Ekron from two sides, while Arabs uprooted nearby trees. Police from Rehoboth and local guards beat off the invaders.

An acre of trees was burned down at the Palestine Jewish Colonization Association forest near Birkst Batiach. An earlier attempt at arson by Arabs who threw oil-soaked burning rags from a railway train failed.

The Arab Supreme Committee adopted a resolution protesting against the behavior of military forces in conducting searches of Arabs¹ premises for arms and explosives. The committee also objected to "Jewish armament in the form of supernumaries."

Troops seeking a band of Arabs who ambushed a bus near Motza, killing one Jew and wounding five others, arrested six near Ain Kerem,

Dr. Hussein Khalidi, mayor of Jerusalem, last night declared to reporters in behalf of himself and the Arab Supreme Committee that the Arabs would not halt their general strike until demands for stoppage of immigration and sale of land to Jews were fulfilled.

He added that the Arabs would not accept temporary stoppage of immagration or any form of compromise.

## REPORT IMMIGRATION WILL BE HALTED DENIED IN LONDON

LONDON, July 10. (JTA) -- It was authoritatively stated here today that there is no basis for the Daily Herald's report that the Britsh Government has agreed temporarily to suspend all Jowish immigration into the Holy Land in accordance with Arab demands.

### CONSERVATIVE RABBIS SUPPORT PALESTINE TREE-PLANTING DRIVE

TANNERSYLLE, N. Y. July 10. (JTA) -- Resolutions supporting birth control, collective bargaining, peace movements and the campaign to plant 100,000 trees in Falestine were adopted last night at the closing session of the thirty-sixth annual convention of the Rabbinical Assembly.

Officers elected are: Rabbi Eugene Cohn, president; Simon Greenberg, vice-president; Alexander Basel, treasurer; Henry Fisher, recording secretary; Arthur Meulander, corresponding secretary, and Louis Finklestein, Rabbi M. Kaplan, Rabbi Robert Gordis, Rabbi Joel Geffen and Rabbi Laadore Singer, excutive council members.

The convention closed with a banquet in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary as rabbi of Max Drob of the Bronx and Dr. Israel Levinthal of Brooklyn. Dr. Elics Margolls presided.

Other resolutions were adopted as follows:

To formulate the official attitude of the Rabbinical Assembly toward Zionism and to implement this attitude within the framework of the World Zionist Ogranization.

To hold the next convention in connection with the fiftieth anniversary of the Jewish Theological Seminary and to exhibit literary, religlous and civic achievements of the assembly.

Announcing determination to solve the problem of the agunah (deserted wife) within the framework of Jewish law.

On recommendation of Rabbi Kahn, to instruct the social justice and education committees to prepare a syllabus for adult study groups and an anthology of Jewish social teaching juveniles.

To appoint a special committee to formulate an ideal Jewish community plan of organization.
