BRITISH LABORITES DEMAND PROBE OF MOSLEY'S FASCISTS

EDINBURGH, Oct. 5, (JTA) -- The British Labor Party Congress meeting here today demanded a government investigation of the disorders in London yesterday and the activities and finances of Sir Oswald Mosley's Fascist organization.

"This conference views with grave concern," read the resolution passed by the delegates, "the tragic and deplorable events of yesterday in East London, condemns the government's unwillingness to ban the Fascist march in spite of the obvious dangers of a breach in public peace, condemns the provocative tactics of the Fascists and repeats the view that while freedom of speech must be preserved, encouragement of civil disorder, racial strife, parade of force, militarized politics and the use of political uniforms should be forbidden."

In submitting the resolution, Herbert Morrison, left-wing Labor leader, bitterly attacked Home Secretary Sir John Simon as "feeble and a coward" and asserted that the Fascist parade had been organized to provoke disorders and race war.

"If the Fascists want to have a quarrel," he exclaimed, "with members of the (Jewish) race they do not like, why should they descend upon these poor people in the East End of London rather than upon Park Lane? It will be a bad thing for East London and a bad thing for the country if that interesting part of the world becomes a cockpit for organized battles between the Fascists and Communists."

Tragedy Averted by Police Ban on Fascist March, Press Holds

LONDON, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- London newspapers were in agreement today, commenting on the Fascist disorders yesterday, that only by the decision of the police at the last moment to ban a march through the East End district was tragedy averted. Had the parade been allowed, they said, the police would have been helpless to restrain the impassioned crowds.

Several of the dailies criticize the government on the one hand and the anti-Fascist elements on the other for the rioting which caused injuries to more than 200 and arrests of 69.

The Times editorially points out that the Fascists were looking for trouble and stresses the necessity for suppressing the Fascist anti-Jewish terrorism in the East End and an even further need for Parliament to review the whole situation.

Liberty of speech does not include the right to cause a breach of the press, declares the News-Chronicle, at the same time attacking vacillation of the Home Office. The Daily Telegraph berates the anti-Nazis for menacing free speech.

The Daily Herald denounced Sir John Simon, Home Secretary, for disregarding warnings against permitting the demonstration. The parade was arranged to provoke disorder, the Laborite daily asserted, demanding that in the future the Government deal firmly with "challenges against order." The editorial charged the Blackshirts with attempting to import into England the methods and theories of Nazism.

GESTAPO RELEASES DR. MEYER, BENNO COHN, HELD 11 DAYS

BERLIN, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- The Gestapo, secret State police, today released Dr. Franz Meyer and Benno Cohn, Zionist leaders arrested on Sept. 24, and dropped charges against them, none of which had been disclosed.

The two were held in Gestapo headquarters in the Alexanderplatz for eleven days, Dr. Meyer is executive head of the German Zionist Federation and Mr. Cohn a member of the executive.

They were arrested the same week as Rabbis Emil Cohn and Max Nussbaum, Jewish leaders, both of whom have been freed.

ARAB CIRCLES SEE STRIKE'S END THIS WEEK

JERUSALEM, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Arab circles today asserted the 25-week-old general strike, which has paralyzed Holy Land economic life and taken a death toll of close to 500 Arabs, Jews and Britons, will be called off sometime between Thursday and Sunday of this week.

They declared the action would be taken following a joint appeal by Arab rulers, draft of which has already been received here and which will be published by the Arab Supreme Committee.

Ten Arabs were arrested for possession of arms and for seeking to obtain military information.

One Arab was killed and another seriously wounded at Herzlia last night when a bomb they were carrying exploded prematurely.

AVERESCU, WAR HERO, HITS AT ANTI-SEMITISM IN RUMANIA

BUCHAREST, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Jewish circles were heartened today by attacks against anti-Semitic political activities delivered by Field Marshal Alexander Averescu, Rumanian war hero, and Dr. Nicholas Lupu, vice-president of the National Peasant Party.

Marshal Averescu, addressing a mass meeting of the People's Party at Kishineff, yesterday denounced extremist parties and condemned the confusing of Communism with Judaism for the purpose of creating racial friction, "which is to the disadvantage of the country."

He declared that he respected the rights of Jews as equal citizens with Rumanians.

Dr. Lupu, addressing 40,000 peasants at Satumare, accused the anti-Semites of delivering Rumania into the hands of Germany in return for heavy subsidies.

30 SOVIET RABBIS JAILED AS ZIONIST PROPAGANDISTS, LONDON HEARS

LONDON, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- The Daily Express reported today that thirty Russian rabbis had been arrested by the Gpgu for spreading Zionist propaganda and for preaching against Bolshevism.

One of the arrested rabbis, Abraham Levy, 75, of Moscow, has been sentenced to ten years' imprisonment, the Express said.

SIR ISAAC ISAACS HONORED IN LONDON

LONDON, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Sir Isaac Isaacs, retired Governor-General of Australia, was guest of honor yesterday at a reception of the Sir John Monash branch of the British legion prior to leaving for home.

Lieut. Col. E. K. Smart, Austrian liaison officer with England, paid tribute to Sir Isaac as a "great empire builder."

STICKERS CALL JEWS "PUBLIC ENEMY" AT ENGLISH RESORT

LONDON, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- The first organized Jew-baiting in the famous resort of Brighton occurred Friday night when Jewish houses and shops were plastered with stickers calling the Jew, "Public Enemy No. 1."

RABBI RABINOWICZ DEAD IN POLAND AT 65

WARSAW, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Rev. Joshua Ascher Rabinowicz, known as "the wonder rabbi of Porisow," died today. He was 65 years old.

POLICE HALT NAZI DEMONSTRATION IN HUNGARIAN TOWN

BUDAPEST, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Police in the town of Soltvadkert yesterday dispersed Hungarian Nazis who demonstrated against the Jews, painting swastikas on the home of the local rabbi and the synagogue and breaking windows.

LITHUANIA DISMISSES 80 JEWISH TEACHERS

KAUNAS, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- The Government has ordered the dismissal of eighty Jewish religious teachers on the ground that they lacked general education requirements for teaching. Intervention by the Rabbinical Association was fruitless.

1,248 YOUTHS TRAINING FOR EMIGRATION FROM EUROPEAN LANDS

NEW YORK, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Training-centers maintained by Jewish philanthropic groups are training 1,248 young people for emigration chiefly from Germany and Poland to countries of eventual settlement, according to a report to the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee made public today.

More than 60 per cent of those being trained are of German nationality, says the report and almost 20 per cent Polish. Of the total number, approximately 70 per cent are studying agriculture.

VLADECK SEES LACK OF NATIONAL PLAN IN PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- B. C. Vladeck, general manager of the Jewish Daily Forward, declared today that lack of national plan, economically, and lack of an understanding with the Arabs, on the political side, were the chief troubles besetting the Jewish homeland in Palestine.

Mr. Vladeck, a non-Zionist, who recently returned from a survey of Jewish communities abroad, spoke at convocation exercises of the Graduate School for Jewish Social Work following addresses by Felix M. Warburg, who greeted the 50 new students for the Board of Trustees, Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, who welcomed them to the social work profession, and Dr. Maurice J. Karpf, director of the school.

While praising the accomplishments of the Jews in Palestine, Mr. Vladeck asserted that each organization carries out its plans without coordination. "In a national movement and in a national state, as some hope it will be, there is no national plan," he said.

Dwelling on the current disorders, Mr. Vladeck, who spent five weeks in Palestine, said the Arabs had no economic grievances -- and the vice-president of the Arab Supreme Committee admitted this to him -- but rising nationalism was asserting itself, and was particularly strong because it "is an new sensation to the Arabs."

He warned that although disorders might abate during the rainy season, they would break out again. The Nationalist movement could not weaken, he said, "it must grow stronger." Asserting that there must be some understanding between Jews and Arabs, Mr. Vladeck said that because none had been reached "everything the Jew has achieved is in jeopardy."

He warned the Zionists against pressing for martial law, declaring, "You can't build a homeland on the bayonets of British soldiers."

Mr. Warburg and Dr. Karpf emphasized that growing anti-Semitism was providing new problems for the social worker. Mr. Warburg urged the students to guard against the spreading of anti-Semitism in this country, declaring he "never dreamed it would grow all over the world at such frightening speed."

COPELAND SEES ROOM FOR MILLIONS OF JEWS IN PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Senator Royal S. Copeland, in the tenth of a series of articles to be published in the Hearst newspapers tomorrow, declares that there is room for millions more Jews in Palestine if the British Government "carries out the terms of the mandate for facilitation of immigration."

"Today the Jews of Palestine number about 30 per cent of the total population," he says. "By their performance they have demonstrated that there is room in Palestine, including Transjordan, for millions more of their persecuted brethren."

He declares that Jewish settlement is aiding the Arab population, citing population growths in centers where immigration is greatest. He quotes statistics to refute that Jewish settlement has caused Arab emigration or that Jews have ousted the Arabs from land.

In the ninth article, Senator Copeland praises Tel Aviv as "a living monument to individual initiative and the eternal pioneering spirit in man."

The sight of Tel Aviv's healthy-looking children was impressive, he wrote, adding that with but a handful of police, crime is almost unknown.

In the eighth of the series, Senator Copeland accused judges in Palestine of "coddling" the Arab rebels, "thereby encouraging murder, and palpably violating their oaths of office."

He blamed "the prolongation of the terror" on the judiciary, which he further accused of "sabotaging the British military in Palestine, in spite of a state of warfare."

NEWSPAPERS, OFFICIALS PAY TRIBUTE TO STRAUS

NEW YORK, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Newspapers, public officials and leaders in many walks of life joined today in paying tribute to Jesse Isidor Straus, former Ambassador to France, department store executive and philanthropist, who died yesterday of pneumonia at the age of 64.

Rabbi Samuel Goldenson will officiate at funeral services at Temple Emanu-El at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning. Many prominent persons are included in the list of honorary pallbearers.

The New York Times declared in an editorial that Mr. Straus "offered his life to his country and a better world no less truly than his compatriots who lost theirs in combat services."

His death "robs this country of a most useful man and devoted citizen, the Jewish people of a respected leader and the commercial world of a real and administrative genius," commented the Herald-Tribune.

Similar tributes were contained in editorials published in the New York American, the World-Telegram and other newspapers throughout the country.

President Roosevelt, Governor Lehman and Secretary of State Hull were among the numerous friends and associates who expressed regret at Mr. Straus' death.

BRUNDAGE SAYS AMERICA COULD PROFIT BY STUDYING NAZI GERMANY

NEW YORK, Oct. 5. (JTA) -- Avery Brundage, chairman of the American Olympic Committee, told 20,000 cheering Americans of German descent last night that the American people could profit by a study of the Hitler regime.

Addressing a German Day rally at the Madison Square Garden on the same platform with German Ambassador Hans Luther and Mayor Karl Stroehlin of Stuttgart, Mr. Brundage urged Americans to learn from the Nazis how to "stamp out Communism" and "arrest the decline of patriotism."
