COMMUNIQUES DROPPED AS ORDER IS RESTORED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- The Palestine Government announced today the discontinuance of publication of communiques, which, since the middle of April, have been the official source of news on disorders,

The final communique, No. 289, said "that order has been restored and in the absence of violence and acts of terrorism, communiques will be discontinued."

The Government had been issuing communiques twice daily until several weeks ago, when it curtailed the statements to one daily.

Several colonies were reported shot at by snipers during the night. Two cases of attempted robbery and an attack on a railway patrol were also reported.

The Government has decided to deport Hassan Sidki el Dajani, Moslem lawyer and leader of the Arab Defense Party, as soon as he completes this sentence in the Sarafend concentration camp, it was understood. Several other Arab leaders are expected to be exiled to places not wat specified.

ANTI-SEMITIC DISORDERS MARK REOPENING OF WARSAW COLLEGE

WARSAW, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- One Jewish student was seriously wounded today during anti-Semitic discreters that marked the reopening of Warsaw University for the Fall terms

The disorders broke out when student Endeks (members of the anti-Semitic National Democratic Party) tried unauccessfully to force Jewish students to occupy "ghetto" benches in lecture halls. Numerous clashes occurred when the Jewish students resisted. Similar disorders last Spring forced the authorities to close the university for several weeks,

JEWISH ECONOMIC COUNCIL PROTESTS POLISH EMIGRATION PROPOSAL

WARSAW, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- The Jewish Economic Council today issued a strong protest against the Government's proposals to the League of Nations for solution of the Jewish problem by mass emigration of Jews from Poland and other central and eastern European countries.

"Polish Jews belong on Polish soil," the council declared.

The second (economic) commission of the League recently supported Poland's request that an intergovernmental conference to discuss the proposals be convoked in November under the auspices of the International Tabor Office.

UKRAINIAN NATIONALISTS DECRY ATTACKS ON JEWS

LMOW, Oot. 15. (JTA) -- A resolution denouncing recent attacks by Ukrainian peasants on Jews in Galician villages was adopted today by a conference of the Ukrainian Nationalist Party here,

The resolution warned that anti-Jewish excesses placed the people in a bad light.

FIRST "RASSENSCHANDE" COURT OPENED IN STUTTGART

BERLIN, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- The first special court to deal exclusively with violations of the "Rassensohande" or race defilement laws was established at Stuttgart today, in accordance with instructions recently issued by Reichsminister of Justice Hans Frank.

Establishment of the courts was explained as necessary "to bring unity into the system of punishment for violation of the Nuremberg laws for the protection of German blood."

Their effect will be to make more stringent enforcement of the laws which have brought fines and jail terms to hundreds of German Jews and many "Anyans" for maintaining intimate relations. States' attorneys have been instructed that all persons convicted of race defilement must be sentenced to penal servitude.

NAZIS BAN USE OF RELIEF FUNDS TO EMPLOY JEWISH PROFESSIONALS

BERLIN, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- Relief recipients are prohibited from engaging Jowish physicians, dentists, pharmacists and attorneys under an order issued today by Wilhelm Frick, Minister of Interior.

The order states that Jewish professionals may no longer be paid for their services from relief funds, except in the case of physicians called in life-or-death emergencies. Certificates signed by Jewish doctors will no longer be acceptable when presented by employees returning to work after illness, the order declares.

LABOR FRONT TO TRAIN NAZIS IN WAR ON BOLSHEVISM

BERLIN, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- The German Labor Front announced tonight the Launching of its "Winter offensive" with the opening on Oct 19 of more than 120 courses to train officials in fighting "Jewish Bolshevism" in Germany and abroad along economic lines.

More than 100 persons have registered for each course, it was stated.

Charges that Jews were responsible for divisions in Germany's economic life were made by Bernhard Kohler, director of the Economic and Poltical Department of the Nazī Party, addressing a Labor Front conference.

"The Jews are the ones who brought about the existing schism in German commerce as far as our national conscience is concerned," he said, appealing to morchants to develop a "national conscience."

BRITISH DEFENSE MINISTER ASSAILS FASCISTS

LONDON, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- Minister of Defense Sir Thomas Inskip speaking yesterday at Hertfordshire assailed British Fascists, whose demonstrations in East End last night necessitated the mobilization of 3,000 policemen.

"What right has one section of the community calling itself a Fascist body," Sir Thomas asked "to point its finger toward another section to whom we've given hospitality for centuries?

"Mosley with his friends are the people who are making Communists today."

PALESTINE MANUFACTURERS ASK PROTECTIVE TARIFF

TEL AVIV, Oct. 15. (JFA) -- Demands for protective tariffs for Palectinian industry were voiced yesterday by a conference of manufacturers here, which discussed obstacles to manufacturing in the Holy Land.

Speakers pointed out that Syria was selling heavily in Palestine, but buying very little of the Holy Land's goods.

Kingsley W. Stead, Director of Customs, defending the Government's policy, said the authorities were favoring the development of industry and declared that manufacturing would develop slowly but surely.

Ari Shenkar, president of the Palestine Manufacturers' Association, who was chairman, paid tribute to Jews who have fallen in recent disorders and aulogized Meier Dizengoff, late mayor of Tel Aviv, and Nahum Sokolow, late English Zionist leader.

Among the other speakers were Israel Rokach, acting mayor of Tel Aviv, and Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

ZIONIST POLITICAL BODY ENDS 2-DAY PARLEY

JENUSALEM, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- The two-day conference of the special political committee of the World Zionist Organization's General Gouncil closed last night after electing two subcommittees to formulate proposals on political issues for submission to the next meeting, which will be called in seven to nine days.

NEW GROUP, "INTRIA," SPURS EXPORT OF REICH JEWISH CAPITAL TO ALL LANDS

BERLIN (JTA) -- A new organization aiming to secure the export of Jewish capital from the Reich in the form of German goods to countries other than Palestine, and to stimulate emigration of German Jews to Palestine and alcohore, has been functioning for the past six months.

The organization, known as Intria, operates under the transfer agreement between the German Government and Zionist groups, whereby Jews emigrating to Palestine are enabled to withdraw capital in the form of goods, since export of currency is restricted.

The administration of Intria is drawn largely from the directorate of Haavarah, Ltd., the agency which operates the transfer for Falestine. It is seeking to extend the arrangement elsewhere by finding markets for German goods in other countries.

The company was registered in London last March with nominal capital of \$200 (about \$1,000) and maintains headquarters in London.

Intria represents an abbreviation of International Trade and Investment Agency Ltd. Its manager is Dr. Siegfried Moses, president of the German Zionist Federation, and the directors are Dr. Georg Landauer of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, Dr. Ludwig Pinner, of the Federation of German Settlers in Palestine and Dr. Aldred Landsberg, Tel Aviv lawyer.

According to its charter, Intria was organized "to act as agents and advises in respect of or in connection with the investment of capital, monies or other property in Falestine, or elsewhere, and to napital, monies or other property into effect any transaction, dealings or affairs in relation thereto, or in relation to the further-

ance of the immigration of Jews into Palestine or elsewhere, or which

ance of the immigration of Jews into Palestine or elsewhere, or which may be conducive to the investment of capital, monies or other property in Palestine or elsewhere."

A similar organization is reported to have been formed in Egypt to extend the transfer arrangement to Near Eastern countries.

IMMIGRANT DOCTORS MUST TAKE NEW TESTS TO FRACTICE HERE

NEW YORK, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- Immigrant physicians are required to pass a special licensing examination to be admitted into practice in New York, under a resolution adopted by the State Board of Regents in Albany, which became effective today.

Contrary to reports published in Berlin, the rule does not require foreign physicians to furnish evidence of sufficient funds to support themselves for a year. The latter report, according to a J.T.A. dispatch from Berlin, caused concern among Jowish medical circles, since many Jowish physicians intend to emigrate from Germany to the United States this Winter.

The Federal immigration law requires that all immigrants give evidence of having sufficient resources so that they will not become public charges.

The requirement for an examination, which is mandatory before the Regents will indorse licenses issued in foreign countries, is a departure from the previous rule, which required proof of five years practice and an English examination.

The J.T.A. correspondent in Berlin estimated that about 500 Jewish and "non-Aryan" doctors have emigrated from Germany to the United States since 1954.

AGRO-JOINT HEAD LAUDS POSITION OF CRIMEAN JEWS

MCSCCW (JTA) -- A glowing picture of the present prosperity of the Jewish collective farms in the Crimea is painted by Dr. Joseph Rosen, director of the Agro-Joint, following a return from a long tour of the region.

In an interview, Dr. Rosen Stated:

"During the past twelve years, ever since the Jews began their mass settlement on the land, their position has never been so good as it is now. The general well-being of the Jewish collective farmers is particularly striking today.

"Three kilograms of bread a day per person is usually considered quite a sufficient ration for a farmer in Russia. But this year every Jewish farmer in the larger collective farms in the Grimea received seven kilograms of grain a day and in addition ten rubles cash for every workingday."
