ARABS WARN TEL AVIV HARBOR WILL CAUSE FURTHER OUTBREAKS

JERUSALEM, Oct. 19. (JTA) -- The Arab press launched a bitter campaign today against the newly-constructed jetty in Tel Aviv, predicting that its eventual completion as a harbor would be the cause of future outbreaks among Arabs. Utilization of Tel Aviv as a port brings it into direct competition with the predominantly Arab port city of Jaffa, where the recently ended general strike began six months ago.

Davar, Hebrew laborite daily, reported that the Arab Supreme Committee had started a drive to supply Arab bands still roving the Palestine hills with warm clothing and food.

Two Arabs were killed and two wounded in the engagement last Friday on the Acre-Safed road between rebels and British troops, it was officially reported today. A British officer and a private were slightly wounded.

4 Sentenced for Murder of Policemen

NAZARETH, Oct. 19. (JTA) -- A court today sentenced four Arab brigands to fourteen years' imprisonment for the confessed murder last November of a Jewish police sergeant, Moshe Rosenfeld, and Constable Mott, a Briton. Two others were sentenced to terms of two years each.

The six were members of Meik Kassef's gang, which for months before the current Arab disorders broke out last April, had terrorized the country. Sergeant Rosenfeld was killed at Affuleh, near the Jewish colony of Ein Charod, while searching for thieves who had been looting grapefruit groves. Constable Mott was killed while investigating Sergeant Rosenfeld's death.

Chief Justice to Visit London

LONDON, Oct. 19. (JTA) -- Chief Justice Sir Michael McDonnell, who for some time has been under fire for alleged leniency to Arab rebels, is shortly expected to leave Palestine, it was reliably reported today. *

In Government quarters it was understood that his transfer, to another post was under consideration.

SIMON TO RECEIVE LABOR DELEGATION TODAY ON FASCIST DISORDERS

LONDON, Oct. 19. (JTA) -- Sir John Simon, Home Secretary, will receive a Labor delegation tomorrow to discuss recent clashes between Fascists and anti-Fascists in the East End.

The delegation will consist of Harold Clay, Sir Alfred Salter and Herbert Morrison, and the Mayors and Parliamentary representatives of Bethnal Green, Hackney, Poplar and Stepney.

NAZI SEES WORLD STRUGGLE BETWEEN SWASTIKA AND SOVIET 'STAR OF DAVID'

FRANKFORT-ON-MAIN, Oct. 19. (JTA) -- A world struggle between "the German Socialist idea" and "the Jewish desire for capitalist domination" was pictured today by Claus Selzner, representative of Dr. Robert Ley, Labor Front chief, to the congress of the Society for the Protection of Labor, the Havas News Agency reports.

"It is symbolic that the world is dividing today under two emblems -- the swastika and the Soviet star, which is nothing but the star of David," said Mr. Selzner.

RUMANIAN PEASANTS' PARTY DEMANDS REINS OF GOVERNMENT

BUCHAREST, Oct. 19 (JTA) -- The Rumanian Peasants' Party called upon King Carol today to dissolve immediately the Tatarescu cabinet and transfer government authority to its own leaders, the Havas News Agency reports.

Speakers at the tenth anniversary ceremonies of the party's founding attacked Rumanian Fascist-inclined groups which are urging "closer relationship with Germany."

Coincidentally, the pro-German and Fascist Rumanian Front, led by former Premier A. Vaida-Voevod, at a convocation in Cradomare exalted Germany and Italy as "two powers standing for order in Europe." The Front chieftain urged conclusion of a pact with Germany.

The Peasant Party adopted the Roman salute with extended arm, similar to the Italian and Nazi salute. The gesture is accompanied by uttering the single word -- "Justice."

MME. LUPESCU AIDS RUMANIAN ANTI-SEMITES

VIENNA. (JTA) -- Mme. Magda Lupescu, 39-year-old Jewish consort of King Carol of Rumania, paradoxically enough is a supporter of the Rumanian anti-Semitic movement and is hated by friends of the Jews.

Her generous money gifts to Fascist parties have gained for her immunity from the attacks and demonstrations once directed against her by the anti-Semitic parties.

She is known in Rumania now as a "protecting angel" of Fascist groups. When their leaders get into trouble for disturbing public order, they are usually exonerated as a result of hints from "high places" -- close to the throne.

As a result of her excellent personal relations with the anti-Semitic groups, the King and Mme. Lupescu have been promised that whatever happens to the Jews, she will never be attacked, physically or verbally.

The anti-Semites, in turn, have now been encouraged to believe that they will be entrusted with the reins of government when Premier Tatarescu's term expires in 1938, or even sooner should a propitious moment arise.

While the Rumanian Nazis befriend King Carol's consort, the National Peasants, the principal democratic party of Rumania -- who are against anti-Semitism -- are strongly opposed to her. Hardly a week elapses but that ex-Premier Julius Maniu, National Peasant leader, attacks her.

That Mme. Lupescu is still assailed by Rumanian Nazis is attributable to the fact that there are some zealots whose anti-Semitism sometimes carries them beyond the dictates of party leaders.

The King's titian-haired, buxom friend, although of pure Jewish descent, has never considered herself a descendant of Israel. Her father was baptized in the Greek Orthodox religion to get a job as an army pharmacist, and when his daughter was born, she was brought up in the same faith.

When she was nineteen, she married a captain and moved in military circles which had virtually no contact with Jews. Then she met Carol, divorced her husband and accompanied her royal friend to France, where he exiled himself for her sake. In these romantic days in Paris she cooked the Rumanian dishes he likes, darned his stockings and went to the movies with him in the evening.

Thanks to a successful coup, Carol was restored to the throne in 1930. Mme. Lupescu followed him to Bucharest. Since then, until recently, she had been the butt of anti-Semites' attacks, for while the Rumanian people do not object to their king's having a woman consort, many resented a Jewess in that position.

DENMARK APPROVES CONSTITUTION OF COPENHAGEN JEWILLAH

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 19 (JTA) -- The Danish Government approved today the new constitution of the Copenhagen Jewish community which will serve to democratize communal organization control by providing for a representative elected assembly. The constitution goes into effect immediately.

EINSTEIN'S ATTACK ON 'DESTRUCTIVE STRUGGLE' DOCTRINE WINS PRAISE

NEW YORK, Oct. 19. (JTA) -- Dr. Albert Einstein's attack on the doctrine that Darwin's theory of struggle for existence justified the teaching of the necessity of competition between individuals in a "destructive economic struggle" drew the approval of the New York Times in an editorial yesterday.

"But at this juncture of the world's affairs," The Times said, "when Fascist nations are proclaiming their superiority over the rest of mankind, their readiness to prove it by force of arms, their joy in the struggle for supremacy, it is well to hear one of the great thinkers of our time picture men as something finer than Nietzsche's Superman who knew no mercy."

Dr. Einstein's declaration was made at the convocation of the University of the State of New York, at which the degree of Doctor of Science was conferred upon him.

NAZI PAPER ASKS BAN ON HEINE'S WORKS

BERLIN, (JTA) --- A demand that the works of Heinrich Heine, the German poet, be expunged from all German books of literature and anthologies and that no German publisher be permitted to reprint his works has been sounded by a Nazi writer in a recent issue of the Nationalsocialistische Monatshefte.

Citing as the underlying cause for such an action the fact that Heine was a Jew and "it is in the Jewish problem that a true danger lurks for us Germans", Dr. Wolfgang Lutz declares:

"Those demands must be carried out, however painful they may appear. Then the people abroad, too, will have to carry out the same. Our people and regard as German only what our people consider German, and this will bring about the fall of Heine from his pedestal as a great poet of the Western world as a figure of world literature."
