GOERING ELEVATION OVER SCHACHT SEEN BLOW TO REICH JEWS

BERLIN, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Jewish economic circles expressed fear tonight that the appointment of Air Minister Hermann Goering as virtual economic dictator of Germany foreshadowed difficult days for the remaining Jews in industry and commerce.

They based their uneasiness on Nazi press comment on Chancellor Hitler's appointment, particularly the statement in Hitler's Voelkischer Beobachter, chief Nazi organ, that "Goering will now get rid of certain groups in our economic system."

Editorials in the Voelkischer Beobachter and the Essener National Zeitung left no doubt that Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, Minister of Economics and Finance, had been completely shelved and was no longer in a position to issue orders against Nazi molestation of Jews in commerce.

The National Zeitung stressed that Goering would soon begin issuing economic decrees, while the Beobachter stated editorially that Dr. Schacht would have no authority to question the new decrees.

"There will not be any internal fight between portfolio holders," said the Beobachter. "There is only one supreme authority on all economic questions and that is Party Member Goering."

The National Zeitung said that the execution of Hitler's four-year plan for German economic independence could not be trusted to a mere minister or economic expert, but had to be placed in the hands of a person "who has standing not only in the state but in the party."

Streicher Embarks on New Anti-Jewish Crusade

BERLIN, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Germany's anti-Semite No. 1, Julius Streicher, took the stump today in a new crusade to stimulate Nazis into active prosecution of the anti-Jewish campaign.

The crusade is featured by a travelling exhibit labelled, "World Enemy No. 1 -- Jewish Bolshevism," which he is accompanying and for which he is the principal speaker.

Addressing a crowd of 15,000 at Karlsruhe, Herr Streicher boasted that the Nazi Party Congress at Nuremberg had endorsed his campaign against the Jews. He announced that he knew more about the Jewish question than "3,000 professors."

Replying to a question from the audience, he declared the "only Jew I ever knew was so decent that he committed suicide. I wouldn't mind if all Jews were that decent."

He urged his hearers to boycott Jews and all those "imbued with the Jewish spirit."

Objects To Use of Biblical Names in Reich Schools

ULM, Germany, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- A demand for elimination of references to the Biblical figures, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in German schools and replacement by heroes of Teutonic mythology was voiced today by M. Stricker, a leader of the Nazi teachers' association, at the organization's convention.

"There is no room for these Biblical figures in German education," he said. "When education no longer gives place to deceit and haggling, but to the ideals of honor and sincerity, then we will have the proper conditions for Nazi educational work."

Premier Klagges of Braunschweig, addressing a convention of prehistoric research here, demanded that history textbooks be rewritten in the spirit of Chancellor Hitler's book, "My Struggle," and that greater emphasis be placed on racial episodes.

Sees All "Non-Aryan" Artisans Ousted In 2 Years

ESSEN, Germany, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- All branches of artisanship will be purged of "non-Aryans" within two years, it was declared today by Herr Schmidt, leader of the Nazi artisans' organization, in an address to 12,000 handicraftsmen here.

He said that Jewish apprentice schools "no longer have any place in Germany."

"Aryan" Shops Must Post Labor Front Signs

BERLIN, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- A conference of district officials of the Nazi Party, called to plan a celebration of the tenth anniversary of the party's founding in Berlin, decided today that all "Aryan" commercial enterprises must display the insignia of the German Labor Front to distinguish them from Jewish establishments.

ARAB SLAYER GETS DEATH SENTENCE; ANTI-JEWISH BOYCOTT PUSHED

JERUSALEM, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- An Arab was sentenced to death today for the murder of two Jews in Jaffa last April while an Arab boycott movement against the Jews gained ground in various parts of Palestine.

Sir Michael McDonnell, Chief Justice of Palestine, who has been under fire for alleged leniency in dealing with terrorists, bade Farewell to a group of lawyers before leaving for London in connection with his reported intention of retiring.

Reports in Arab newspapers here agreed with Arab sources in Bagdad that fifteen Jews have been killed there since April, when the current disorders broke out in the Holy Land. Dispatches from Bagdad had mentioned the deaths of four Jews.

Jews in Iraq continued to be the target of Arab animosity, according to Bagdad reports, although the Jews yesterday ended a three-day strike protesting terrorism on the promise of the Iraq Government to protect them.

The Arab boycott drive against the Jews was evidenced by pickets posted before Jewish shops in Jerusalem. Arab merchants were warned to import goods from Arab countries rather than purchase from Jews. A group of Arab capitalists, it was learned, are seeking to organize a company to finance Arab mercantile activities.

Meanwhile, the authorities continued to relax curfew restrictions. In Jerusalem, the seven p.m. to four a.m. curfew was cut to the four hours between midnight and four a.m.

All except two of a group of members of the Brith Trumpeldor, right-wing Zionist organization, detained in connection with the shooting of two Arabs in Tel Aviv last Saturday, have been released, it was disclosed today. The two were held at Ness Ziona and Haifa.

A cypress tree sent by the late King George V from Windsor Palace in London and planted in the King George Jubilee Forest at Nahalal was cut down last night.

HEINE FILM TO BE PRODUCED IN VIENNA

VIENNA, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- The Austrian Film Club, an independent motion picture concern, announced today its decision to film the life story of Heinrich Heine. Hans Barendt will produce the picture with Ernst Deutsch in the role of Heine.

HADASSAH TO RAISE \$150,000 FOR PALESTINE MEDICAL CENTER

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- The 22nd annual convention of Hadassah, American women's Zionist organization, closed tonight with a banquet at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel after deciding to raise \$150,000 during the next year to complete the \$850,000 building fund for the Medical Center in Jerusalem.

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the Zionist Organization of America, Mrs. Edward Jacobs, president of Hadassah, and Mrs. Samuel W. Halprin were on the speakers' list at the banquet, with Mrs. David de Sola Pool presiding.

The 2,000 delegates and guests from 45 states cheered the reading of a cable from Jerusalem yesterday describing the breaking of ground on Mount Scopus for the medical center. Mrs. Moses P. Epstein, Hadassah vice-president, said it would be "a Jewish gift to Palestine for all inhabitants, Arabs and Jews alike."

Eddie Cantor, stage and screen star, in a broadcast from Hollywood, promised to help raise \$180,000 for the Youth Aliyah movement by the end of the year.

Every country in Europe has a Jewish problem, declared Mrs. Jacobs. The Jews must have Palestine to survive, she said.

In a symposium on the Arab-Jewish problem, Dr. Abraham Halkin of Columbia University said that Jews and Arabs share many aspirations in common. Jews are eager to teach Arabs an enlightened conception of nationalism, he said.

Criticizing Great Britain for its handling of the League mandate, Charles Edward Russell, president of the Pro-Palestine Federation of America, urged public opinion to press toward fair play for the Jewish community in Palestine.

The convention voted \$5,000 to Miss Henrietta Szold for child placement work in Palestine and other funds to carry out an intensive tree purchasing campaign to replace 40,000 trees uprooted in Palestine during the recent Arab attacks.

An education course in the United States to include study of Arab Jewish relations was also voted.

BRITISH CABINET FAILS TO REACH DECISION ON FASCISTS

LONDON, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- The British Cabinet, restrained by a desire not to infringe on public liberties, reached no concrete decisions today regarding a possible ban on political uniforms such as those carried by British Fascists, according to the Havas News Agency.

The conference agreed, however, on the necessity for solving the problem, which has become a major one since the recent disorders between Fascists and their opponents in London's East End and increasingly sharp complaints against the Fascists by Labor groups.

The Cabinet meeting today followed a pledge to Labor groups to give "immediate and careful consideration" to the Fascist problem in England.

HUNGARY TO SEEK LINK WITH REICH AND ITALY

BUDAPEST, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Hungary will seek to tighten the bonds of friendship and collaboration with Germany and Italy, Premier Koloman Daranyi declared in a speech in the Chamber of Deputies today in which he outlined the new cabinet's program, the Havas News Agency reported.

He added that Hungary will follow the same foreign affairs groove it has adhered to up till now.

The Hungarian policy will not be directed against any particular nation or group of nations and will aim at general reconciliation and friendship. Budapest desires the amity of Great Britain and France, he said.

The Premier declared Hungary is particularly interested in the question of minorities. "The League of Nations is not equal to this task," he commented.

RYDZ-SMIGLY TO BE MADE MARSHAL

WARSAW, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Reports that Gen. Edward Rydz-Smigly, Inspector-General of the Polish armies and "strong man" of the Republic, would be named Marshal of the Polish military forces were officially confirmed today, the Havas News Agency said.

The marshal's baton will be conferred on Gen. Rydz-Smigly by President Ignacy Moscicki in an elaborate ceremony on Nov. 10, the eve of Poland's national holiday.

STATUE IN BERLIN PARK SHOWS FRITSCH CRUSHING JEW

NEW YORK, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- A park featuring a statue of Theodor Fritsch, late prophet of Jew-hatred, about to crush the Jew, who is represented as a reptile, has been opened in the Zellendorf section of Berlin, according to the New York World-Telegram.

The stone monument stands in a large square known as Theodor Fritsch Platz and its pedestal is engraved with quotations from Fritsch's writings. The major inscription reads, "There can be no health for the people until the Jews have been extirpated."

LAWRENCE MARX AGAIN TO HEAD FEDERATION DRIVE

NEW YORK, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Lawrence Marx will head the annual deficit campaign of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, it was announced last night by Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the organization's board of trustees.

Mr. Marx, who was guest of honor at a dinner at the Hotel Plaza attended by 200 persons in charity and was commended for his community services in a letter from Governor Herbert H. Lehman.

200,000 FASCISTS REPORTED MARCHING ON BRUSSELS SUNDAY

BRUSSELS, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Two hundred thousand adherents of the Rexist Party, Belgium's most militant, Fascist-inclined political faction, are organizing to march on Brussels this Sunday, the Havas News Agency said it learned today.

Coincidental with the Rexist march, the Socialists will hold a huge meeting in the capital. The danger of serious clashes between the two diametrically-opposed factions threw Brussels into a turmoil today.

Premier Paul van Zeeland's cabinet was immediately convoked in extraordinary session to consider banning both demonstrations.

The Rexist, who have shown definite anti-Jewish tendencies, have been ordered to assemble at the estate of Count Egrunne, one of Leon Degrelle's titled followers.

Link With Nazis Charged

PARIS, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Charges of direct collusion between Leon Degrelle, youthful Belgian Fascist leader, and German Nazi leaders were published here today, the Havas News Agency reported.

Both L'Oeuvre and Le Petit Parisien claimed to have absolute proof that Degrelle was in Berlin on Sept. 27 and consulted there with officials of the German Foreign Office.

HALT ISSUANCE OF PALESTINE TOURIST VISAS IN BERLIN

BERLIN, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- The Palestine Office announced tonight that the British consul is refusing to issue tourist visas to Palestine in accordance with instructions issued prior to the termination of the Arab general strike on Oct. 12.

BERLIN HEARS POLAND TO DISENFRANCHISE JEWS

BERLIN, Oct. 21. (JTA) -- Despite denials in Warsaw, newspapers here continued to report today that Poland was planning to deprive Jewish and German minorities of citizenship in the near future.

The reports said they would be disenfranchised on the ground they had emigrated to Poland, while the Ukrainians and White Russians would retain their citizenship because they are natives on Polish soil.
