SWEEPING POWERS GRANTED AUTHORITIES IN BILL CURBING FASCISTS

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Sweeping powers to crush semi-military organizations are granted to the authorities under a public order bill introduced in Commons by the Government yesterday and published tonight.

The measure, evidently aimed particularly at Sir Oswald Mosley's Blackshirts, prohibits the existence of uniformed forces with political aims and makes the wearing of uniforms by such organizations a punishable offense. Rising anti-Jewish provocations in London's East End and elsewhere forced presentation of the measure.

The bill also provides:

Organizations training to usurp the functions of the police and military forces are outlawed and their property disposable by the direction of the court.

Police are given the right to search premises with a warrant on suspicion of an offense by member of such organization.

Police are empowered to prohibit or alter the routes of processions if it is feared that disorder may be caused.

Any person possessing an offensive weapon while present at a public meeting or procession is guilty of an offense.

Any person using threatening, abusive or insulting words or behavior with intent to provoke a breach of the peace is guilty of an offense.

The bill sets penalties for summary convictions up to \$500, fine of six months' imprisonment, or after indictment \$2,500 fine or two years' imprisonment.

ARAB KINGS FORCE Milder TACTICS TOWARD ROYAL COMMISSION

JERUSALEM, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- The Arab Supreme Committee, under pressure of the rulers of neighboring Moslem nations, has decided to amend a previous decision to boycott the British Royal Commission's investigation of the Arab disorders, which opens Thursday, it was learned today.

At a meeting attended by a special representative of the Emir Abdullah, ruler of Transjordan, the committee agreed to send a delegation to the commission immediately after its arrival tomorrow. It also agreed to discontinue discussion of strikes and similar acts to signalize the commission's arrival, as a protest against Great Britain's decision not to suspend Jewish immigration.

The delegation has been instructed to explain to the commission the motives actuating the Arab proclamation, issued Saturday, not to cooperate in its deliberations.

Abdullah's representative pointed out at the meeting that it was the opinion of the Emir and the other Arab kings that the committee drop its adopted method toward the investigation.

Meanwhile, the Government prepared to issue a special Gazette granting the six-man investigative body juridical powers, such as the power to subpoena witnesses.

Last-minute preparations were made by Jewish leaders today for presentation of testimony before the commission. All-day meetings were held by members of the General Zionist Council's political subcommittee and representatives of central Palestine Jewish organizations.

G. F. Graham Brown, Anglican Bishop of Jerusalem, and Rabbis Jacob Meir and Joseph Dushinsky, tonight signed an appeal to the populace to pray for the success of the commission.

PALESTINE NOT FORCED TO DRAW ON TREASURY RESERVE IN DISORDERS

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- The Palestine Government met the financial strain of the Arab disorders from revenue without drawing on its reserves. The Times reported today in an article from Jerusalem.

To increase security, the correspondent said, the Government has started construction of a vast network of roads linking cities and colonies. The projects are also having the effect of alleviating unemployment.

The defense plan for the Jewish colonies during the disorders, the writer reported, proved reliable. (The regular constabulary guarding settlements was reinforced by Jewish supernumeraries. When attacked by Arabs, military reinforcements were called by telephone.)

According to the correspondent, Arabs and Jews both consider they passed the test of the disturbances. The Arabs, he said, are hoping for the success of the boycott against Jews, in effect since the Arab general strike was called off October 12.

An editorial in The Times today criticizes Iraq because Fawzi Bey Kawkaji, self-appointed commander-in-chief of the Arab guerilla bands which harried British forces and Jewish colonies during the disorders is a guest of the Government and is being treated as a hero.

CONCENTRATION OF POLISH JEWS IN TRADE CITED AS PROBLEM BY BECK

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Col. Josef Beck, Polish Foreign Minister who has been conferring with British Foreign Minister Anthony Eden, declared in a press interview today that the Jewish problem is a serious social question for Poland because the Jews are concentrated in commerce.

Col. Beck voiced his Government's sympathy for Jewish aspirations in Palestine. He did not reveal whether Palestine had been discussed in the conversations with Capt. Eden.

Poland has asked League of Nations aid in furthering a project to expatriate 800,000 Polish Jews in ten years. Col. Beck was expected to discuss the project with Capt. Eden with a view of obtaining England's cooperation as far as Palestine is concerned.

HITLER SLURS ON JEWS CENSORED IN PRESS REPORTS

BERLIN, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- An address of Chancellor Adolf Hitler was censored in the German press today for the first time since the Nazis came to power when anti-Jewish remarks he made addressing Nazi Party comrades in Munich were eliminated from newspaper accounts.

It was recalled that references to the Jews have been eliminated from belligerent speeches made recently by Air Minister Hermann Goering and Paul Joseph Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda and Enlightenment.

Chancellor Hitler, speaking in the Buergerbrau Keller, Munich, to commemorate the unsuccessful Nazi putsch of Nov. 9, 1923, recalled how the Nazis initiated their revolution and said that "today I am sure that a handful of Jews will not throw the Nazis from power in Germany regardless of what political changes they can make in Europe.

He described the Jews as "a stupid and insufferable nation." He said there were three kinds of nations -- the intelligent, the super-intelligent and the unintelligent. He classed the Germans in the second and the Jews in the third category.

NAZI PRESS HAILS BUCHAREST MARCH AS PROPAGANDA TRIUMPH

BERLIN, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Nazi newspapers today hailed the anti-Semitic demonstration of 280,000 members of the Rumanian National Christian Party in Bucharest Sunday as a triumph for Nazi propaganda abroad.

Propaganda Minister Goebbels' newspaper, Der Angriff, featured a report stating that "only a year ago it was impossible even to imagine that so many swastika banners would fly over the Rumanian capital."

Other newspapers, expressing elation over the march, the greatest anti-Semitic demonstration in Rumania's history, urged a German alliance with the Rumanian Fascist leaders. They featured addresses of Prof. Alexander Cuza and Prof. Octavius Goga, Rumanian Fascist leaders.

SABOTEURS OF RACIAL LAWS WARNED BY NAZI LEADERS

BERLIN, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Warning that "accounts will be settled" with those in Germany opposing racial theories was voiced today by Dr. Walter Gross, head of the Nazi Party's race department, addressing a physicians' conference in Magdeburg.

He admitted that dissatisfaction still prevailed in the Reich, even within party ranks, about Nazi racial legislation.

"All the world is beginning to recognize Germany's achievements," he said, "but there are a few elements in Germany which disagree with our racial policy and are secretly sabotaging it."

Dr. Gross was today awarded the Hamburg Senate prize in recognition of his work for the Nazi racial theory.

11 POLICEMEN WOUNDED IN CLASHES WITH ENDEKS AT WILNO

WARSAW, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Eleven policemen were injured, two seriously in clashes with Endek (Nationalist) students in Wilno demonstrating yesterday on the anniversary of the slaying of a comrade during anti-Semitic disorders several years ago.

Five students, including a girl, were arrested. The clashes occurred after Wilno University authorities had ordered the institution closed for five days to prevent disorders.

All high schools in Warsaw were ordered closed today to avert disorders arising from the observance.

ENDEKS SHOOT DOWN 4 JEWS IN ATTACK ON LODZ CAFE

LODZ, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Four Jews were seriously wounded today by two anti-Semitic Nationalists who emptied their revolvers into a small Jewish cafe here after they had smashed its windows. The assailants were arrested.

The wounded, who were taken to the hospital, are: Josef Berkowicz, owner of the cafe, Moses Weissman, Israel Wendel and Mendel Rubenstein.

OLDEST SISTER OF SOKOLOW DIES IN WARSAW AT 82

WARSAW, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Mrs. Eta Makowska, oldest sister of the late Dr. Nahum Sokolow, noted Zionist leader who died in London last May, died here today. She was 82 years old.

HICEM WINS STAY IN PARAGUAY ORDER EXPELLING 100 IMMIGRANTS

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- The Government of Paraguay has delayed execution of an order expelling 100 Jewish immigrants from Asuncion, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed today by Hicem, international emigrant aid society.

The immigrants had been ordered expelled unless they agreed to migrate into the interior of Paraguay to take up agricultural labor.

According to Hicem, a special representative of the organization obtained a stay of the order after intervention with Government officials. Negotiations are now under way with respect to the future situation of the immigrants and others who have entered Paraguay within the past two years.

FULL PRESS FREEDOM SEEN FACTOR IN PEACE

MANCHESTER, England, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Complete freedom of the press would bring nations appreciably "nearer to world peace," Sir Roderick Jones, chairman and managing director of Reuters News Agency, told the Manchester Luncheon Club, whose guest of honor he was today, the Havas News Agency reported.

"Having studied the roots of this subject in various parts of the world, and having an imperishable faith in what's best in international journalism, and in the correspondents, British, American and other, who sustain it, I am an optimist," Sir Roderick declared.

"I believe if the press had its full liberty in the lands where today it is censored and muzzled, if correspondents there were trusted we should be nearer world peace than we are, and the influence of telegraphic communications upon trade and commerce would be even more beneficial."

GUSTLOFF MURDER TRIAL TO OPEN DEC. 9

GENEVA, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- David Frankfurter, Yugoslavian Jewish medical student, will go on trial Dec. 9 in the Chur Cantonal Court for the murder last February of Wilhelm Gustloff, Nazi agent, in a hotel in Davos, it was officially announced today. The trial will last three days.

Nazis Seek Favorable Swiss Sentiment

BERLIN, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- A drive to create favorable sentiment for the Nazis in connection with the forthcoming trial of David Frankfurter in Switzerland for the murder of Wilhelm Gustloff, Nazi agent, was opened today.

National Socialist Party Correspondence, Nazi news agency, syndicated an article appealing to Switzerland to "create an honest understanding between Switzerland and Germany by exposing the poisonous inciting work of the Jewish propagandists."

The article accused the Swiss press of neglecting to protect Gustloff's reputation.

HOLDS RACE KNOWLEDGE PREREQUISITE FOR DEGREE IN REICH

BERLIN, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- A university education is not complete unless a student is able to prove sufficient knowledge of the racial theory, according to Prof. Astel, head of the Thuringia race department.

Addressing a meeting marking the installation of Dr. Johann von Leers in a new chair of racial teaching at the University of Jena, Dr. Astel said last night that no student should receive a degree before demonstrating knowledge of Nazi race precepts.

"Racial teaching should be the heart and mind of the university and should occupy an appropriate place in all faculties, whether law, medicine, science, philosophy or theology," he declared.

NAZI ORGAN DEMANDS BAN ON UNDSSET'S WORKS FOR CONDEMNING PERSECUTION

BERLIN, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Westdeutscher Beobachter, a Nazi organ, demanded today a nation-wide ban on the works of Sigrid Undset, Norwegian authoress, for publishing a book in Lucerne, Switzerland, on the danger to Christianity through "racial insanity" and persecution of Jews.

The paper insisted that her books must "disappear from all libraries and book stores in Germany," adding, "She may write for any country she pleases, but there is no place for her in Germany."

JEWS PARTICIPATE IN CEREMONY MARKING SMIGLY-RYDZ ELEVATION

WARSAW, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Jewish communities of Poland participated today in celebrations marking the elevation of General Edward Rydz-Smigly, head of the Polish Legion, to the position of marshal. His name was changed to Smigly-Rydz. Special prayers were ordered in all synagogues throughout the country. Jewish leaders expressed hope that the new marshal would follow the late Marshal Pilsudski's friendly attitude toward the Jews. The Polish Legion head has been mentioned little in regard to the Jewish question.
