JEW WOUNDED, POLICE ATTACKED IN NEW PALESTINE VIOLENCE

JERUSALEM, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- A Jew was seriously wounded in Jerusalem and two police detachments were attacked by Arab bands today in a renewal of violence that had abated with the end of the Arab strike a month and a half ago.

Joseph Hamburger, 45-year-old Jew, was shot near the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem while delivering milk in the neighborhood. He was removed to Hadassah hospital. Fifteen minutes after Hamburger was wounded, shots were fired at two aged Sephardic Jews in the Old City quarter. Neither was hit.

An armed band roaming the Tulkarem district seeking to release Arabs held in the Nur-el-Shem prison, engaged police forces. Another band attacked a police patrol between Lydda and Migdal Zedek and was routed after a half-hour battle.

Officer Schiff, commanding a detail of reinforcements, set out in pursuit of the attackers.

SHERTOK, SENATOR TO TESTIFY BEFORE ROYAL COMMISSION TODAY

JERUSALEM, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Two Government land development officials, D. G. Harris and Lewis Y. Andrews, continued testimony yesterday before a secret hearing of the Royal Commission investigating the recent six-month reign of terror in Palestine.

The commission postponed a scheduled trip to Amman, Transjordan, today for two weeks because of the illness of Lord Peel, the chairman.

Moshe Shertok and Dr. Werner Senator, of the Jewish Agency for Palestine Executive, will testify on Jewish immigration when the commission resumes its hearing tomorrow.

SOVIET PREMIER CALLS NAZIS "MODERN CANNIBALS" FOR PERSECUTING JEWS

MOSCOW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Premier Viacheslav Molotoff today denounced the German Nazis as "modern cannibals" for their persecution of the Jews in an address to the All-Union Congress of Soviets.

An ovation greeted him when he declared that "we respect and love the German people; our quarrel is only with their barbarous Fascist leaders."

Premier Molotoff, who is president of the Soviet of Peoples' Commissars, asserted:

"The Nazi leaders have well earned the appellation, modern cannibals. Their persecution of the Jews is in marked contrast to our respect for this race which gave us Karl Marx.

"Our attitude toward national minorities is one of friendliness and kindness. The Nazi attitude is one of barbarism and cruelty," he declared.

"The Fascists are the destroyers of culture and the advocates of monstrous social theories," he said.

NAZI LEADERS BLAME "JEWISH GANG" FOR COMMUNIST "SCOURGE"

GOSLAR, Germany, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- The "Jewish gang" at Moscow again was scathingly indicted here today by Air Minister Gen. Hermann Wilhelm Goering and other Reich leaders as responsible for the "scourge" of international Communism which Germany has challenged to mortal combat, Havas News Agency reported.

Agricultural Minister Walther Darre and Rudolf Hess, Chancellor Adolf Hitler's personal deputy, joined Gen. Goering in warning the Congress of German Peasantry that the Communist menace demands their complete cooperation toward fulfillment of the Reich's four-year economic plan.

Emphasizing the importance of the accord with Tokyo, Hess declared: "Bolshevism hates the Reich and has concentrated its attention on this country, which has become the main center of anti-Bolshevist action.

"The Reich knows the Comintern (Communist International) wishes to destroy the German bulwark. She thanks the Fuehrer for diminishing the danger when he signed the accord with Japan, which brought a contribution to peace.

"We wish to unify peoples, whatever be their forms of Government, against criminals who want to poison them," he said. "In Russia the Jewish gang imposed a Bolshevik strait jacket upon the people.

Minister Darre charged during his long address that "Jews dominate Russia like a cancer."

BIRO-BIDJAN IMMIGRATION LAGS; POPULATION LOWER THAN IN 1933

MOSCOW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Jewish immigration to Biro-Bidjan has lagged 30 per cent behind schedule this year, it was disclosed today, and the Jewish population of the Jewish autonomous region in Soviet Siberia is actually 2,000 less than at the end of 1933.

"Of the 10,000 immigrants who should have been settled in Biro-Bidjan this year only 6,300 have been settled," it was declared by Boris Trotzky, acting president of the Central Comzet, Government commission for settling Jews on land, addressing a Comzet conference here.

A few hundred more immigrants will probably arrive in the territory by the end of the year, he said, thus fulfilling the year's program only by 70 per cent.

He ascribed the plan's failure chiefly to slow progress in the erection of new houses for immigrants and the slow development of industrial life in the region. Officials entrusted with erection of houses have built 92 of the 900 scheduled for erection, he declared.

The Comzet has decided to take all necessary measures to carry out the 1937 settlement plan, Mr. Trotzky asserted.

Recently compiled figures show that the Jewish population of Biro-Bidjan is 23,000, or 2,000 less than at the end of 1933, although emigration from the region is reported no longer proceeding at any great rate.

KOSHER MEAT TO BE 60 PER CENT OF TOTAL UNDER NEW POLISH LAW

WARSAW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Kosher meat butchers will be provided for when the new law restricting kosher slaughtering goes into effect on Jan. 1, the Minister of Agriculture has assured a delegation from the Jewish Union of Traders.

He said that present butchers would be permitted to become partners of those who receive the Government concessions for sale of kosher meat provided for under the law.

Sausage manufacturers will be allowed to purchase kosher meat from other concession-holders, in addition to the quota allowed them, he stated. The quota of kosher meat will be set at sixty per cent of the total meat slaughtered, he stated.

WARSAW, CRACOW BAR GROUPS REJECT BAN ON JEWS

WARSAW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- The Warsaw and Cracow bar associations yesterday rejected proposals to bar Jews from the legal profession.

The vote in Warsaw was 1,000 to 400. M. Szumanski, Jewish attorney, prominent defender of the Jews in the recent trial arising from disorders in the town of Przytyk, was elected a member of the association's council.

After the Cracow bar association had rejected a proposal identical with the one offered in Warsaw, forty adherents of the anti-Semitic National Democratic Party walked out of the meeting in protest.

POZNAN ANTI-SEMITES END STRIKE IN UNIVERSITY

WARSAW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Nationalist students who had been occupying the buildings of the University of Poznan as part of a series of recent anti-Semitic demonstrations evacuated the premises last night, in accordance with stern demands made by the university authorities, the Havas News Agency reported.

The students left before the time-limit set for their departure by the authorities.

9 POLISH JEWS DEPORTED TO FRONTIER

WARSAW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Nine Jews in Mlawa near the East Prussian border, who had served sentences for disloyalty to Poland, were today deported to the frontier region for three years.

33 SENTENCED FOR FORMING NAZI GROUP IN SILESIA

WARSAW, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- A Polish court today sentenced 33 Germans belonging to a secret organization in Upper Silesia to prison terms ranging from eight months to two and one-half years, on charges of organizing a Nazi youth movement among the German minority in Poland, the Havas News Agency reported.

The German group, sentenced at Kattowice, is known as the "Wanderbund." It had been holding illegal meetings and was understood to have been secretly organizing a Nazi organization modeled along the lines of the Storm Troop sections in the Reich. The Upper Silesia section of Poland is part of territory formerly belonging to Germany.

REICH JEWS FEAR BAN ON MEETINGS DURING FRANKFURTER TRIAL

BERLIN, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Jewish circles expressed fears today over a report that all Jewish meetings may be prohibited during the trial of David Frankfurter, Yugoslavian Jewish medical student, opening early next month in Chur, Switzerland, for the murder of Wilhelm Gustloff, Nazi leader.

Such a ban would interfere with observance of the Jewish festival of Chanukah, it was stated.

S. A. Mann, organ of the Nazi Storm Troops, declared in a long article on the forthcoming trial that "Jewish journalists the world over are mobilizing to influence the Swiss court."

The paper said "the Jews are now applying the old method of shouting, 'Stop thief!', intending to save Frankfurter in this way." The Nazi organ warned against "a world offensive undertaken by world Jewry."

GERMAN FINANCE MINISTRY ORDERS EMPLOYEES TO PROVE DESCENT

BERLIN, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- The Ministry of Finance yesterday ordered all its employees to submit complete proof of their own and their wives' racial origin by Dec. 20.

The order said no official could expect promotion unless his and his mate's racial purity were established beyond doubt.

NUMBER OF JEWISH STUDENTS DROPS IN HUNGARIAN UNIVERSITIES

BUDAPEST, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- A statement showing the decline in the number of Jewish students in Hungarian universities was published today by the Union of Jewish students in connection with recent anti-Semitic disorders in universities.

"In 1932-3, the number of Jewish students in Hungarian universities totalled 1,970 while today they are only 1,180," the statement said. "Of the 538 first year students then, only 356 remain, because poverty and misery prevented one Jewish student in three from continuing his studies."

DR. MENDELSSOHN-BARTHOLDY DIES IN OXFORD AT 62

OXFORD, England, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Dr. Albrecht Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, international law expert ousted as chairman of the foreign law department of Hamburg University in 1933 because he was Jewish, died here on Friday. He was 62 years old.

Dr. Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, grandson of the famous Jewish composer and a descendant of Moses Mendelssohn, was professor of international law at Oxford University at the time of his death. He had been employed by the German Government in the Versailles peace negotiations.

ZIONIST LEADERS DEMAND BRITAIN FULFILL JEWISH HOMELAND PLEDGE

NEW YORK, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Three hundred Zionist leaders, emphasizing American Jewry's stake in Palestine's future, today addressed a resolution to the Royal Commission investigating recent disorders, insisting on complete fulfillment of Great Britain's obligation to establish a Jewish homeland.

The resolution, adopted by the National Council for Palestine at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel after a session devoted largely to discussing expansion of the United Palestine Appeal drive, declared American Jewry "committed to the role of guardian for those helpless Jews who have no protector other than America."

The council, which has responsibility for raising funds for the U.P.A. heard reports that the Jews have brought to Palestine more than \$400,000⁰⁰⁰ since the end of the war and \$1,872,500 has been raised by the U.P.A. in its \$3,500,000 drive -- the largest amount since 1928 -- of which \$1,000,000 has been sent to Palestine.

A resolution was adopted calling for a national conference of American Jewish bodies concerned with Palestine at Washington on Jan. 17. Other resolutions hailed Dr. Chaim Weizmann's testimony before the Royal Commission and urged him to visit the United States, and paid tribute to Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis on his eightieth birthday and Louis Lipsky on his sixtieth.

The Zionist leaders adopted a pledge eulogizing the 86 Jews who have fallen in recent Arab disorders. Among the speakers were Elihu D. Stone, who presided, Nathan Straus, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Morris Rothenberg, Mr. Lipsky, Dr. Israel Goldstein and Dr. Ben Zion Mossinson.

Mr. Rothenberg, co-chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, outlined the Jewish case before the Royal Commission: (1) recognition of the historic connection of the Jewish people with Palestine, (2) the pressing problem of Jewish persecution and Jewish homelessness throughout the world, (3) Jewish achievements in Palestine.

A dinner was held for Mr. Lipsky in the evening.

LABOR CONVENTION ADOPTS \$500,000 QUOTA FOR PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Declaring solidarity with the Histadruth in Palestine, the National Labor Committee for Jewish Workers in Palestine, closing its three-day twelfth annual convention at the Manhattan Opera House, today adopted a \$500,000 quota for the coming year to support labor projects in the Holy Land.

Resolutions were adopted demanding that no restrictions be placed on immigration and thanking American and British labor for supporting the Palestine workers in the present crisis.

The convention closed with a dinner at the Central Plaza tonight, at which Joseph Baratz, representative of the Histadruth, was principal speaker. Hillel Rogoff of the Jewish Daily Forward and Isidore Nagler of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union were among the other speakers. Abraham Cahan, editor of the Forward, spoke at the afternoon session.

Yesterday, Mayor LaGuardia praised the aid to organized labor in Palestine. "In helping the working people of Palestine, you are helping Palestine itself," he said, "because the welfare of the country is identical with the welfare of the body of workers." He added the labor is most easily exploited in a young community.

Other speakers at yesterday's session were Dr. Stephen S. Wise, who said, "No one could have done more for us in our hour of need than has been done by the President of the United States," Mr. Baratz and David Pinski.

DR. SOCKMAN URGES NATION TO THROTTLE RACE PREJUDICE

NEW YORK, Nov. 29. (JTA) -- Race prejudice and religious intolerance must be killed in thought and conversation before they crawl into business and politics, the Rev. Dr. Ralph W. Sockman, pastor of the Christ Methodist Episcopal Church, declared yesterday at the Sabbath service of Central Synagogue which marked the opening of its Ninetieth Anniversary celebration. "As out of the ancient Babylonian exile there was born a messianic passion," so out of the present German oppression may the Jewish race generate a new sense of spiritual mission," said Dr. Sockman.
