AGENCY ASKED TO SUBMIT SHORT LIST OF IMMIGRATION GRIEVANCES

JERUSALEM, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Submission by the Jewish Agency for Palestine of a short written list of Jewish immigration grievances was suggested today by Lord Peel, chairman of the British Royal Commission which is investigating Arab disorders. He said the list would enable the commission to concentrate on the high points of the Jewish case.

Dr. Werner Senator, head of the Jewish Agency's immigration department, continued his testimony on the routine involved in distribution of labor immigration certificates.

FOREIGN NATIONS FINANCED ARAB STRIKE, STORRS CHARGES

LONDON, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Sir Ronald Storrs, at various times governor of Northern Rhodesia, Cyprus and Jerusalem, told a Conservative Party meeting today that foreign governments financed the recent six-month Arab strike in Palestine.

Describing the Holy Land as "a permanent powder magazine," he demanded that the Government act on the findings of the Royal Commission now in Palestine investigating the disorders.

"We should continue undeterred by objectors, unhastled by those who wish to pour in immigrants faster than we desire," he asserted.

EMIGRATION OF POLISH JEWS PUSHED IN SEJM

WARSAW, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Approval of proposals for emigration of Jews from Poland was expressed during a discussion today in the Sejm.

Deputy Surzynski voiced satisfaction that Foreign Minister Josef Bec had taken up the question at Geneva "because it is necessary that the number of Jews in Poland, particularly in the towns, should be drastically reduced."

He emphasized that it was necessary for Polish peasants, tradesmen and artisans to migrate from Poznan, western Poland, to Russian Poland and demanded a "humanitarian" solution of the Jewish question through emigration.

Deputy Rudzinski attacked a statement of Premier Skladkowski in the Sejm yesterday for not sufficiently stressing the importance of accelerating the movement from the provinces to the towns to displace the Jews from trade and artisanship. He said the Jewish problem was most difficult, but had to be faced.

POLISH STUDENTS' UNION LAUDED FOR FIGHT ON ANTI-SEMITISM

LWOW, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- General Tokarzewski, commander of the Lwow military district corps, today expressed appreciation to a delegation from the Union of Polish Students for Defense of the Honor of Poland for their efforts to combat anti-Semitism.

HUNGARIAN CABINET MEMBERS TO VISIT NAZI CHIEFS

BUDAPEST, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- The semi-official journal Esti Ujsag reported today that Interior Minister Nicolas Kozma would go to Berlin on Dec. 9 to stay for five days as guest of Reich Interior Minister Wilhelm Frick, the Havas News Agency reported.

Diplomatic circles interpreted the visit as Germany's first move to regain influence over Hungary which was lost during recent weeks, When Premier Benito Mussolini stood forth as the champion of Hungary's Revisionist ambitions.

Various other members of the Budapest government will visit Berlin in the near future, it was predicted.

Nazi Pressure on Daranyi Cabinet

BERLIN (JTA) -- That strong pressure is being exerted by the Nazis to swing the new Hungarian Cabinet to an anti-Jewish policy is indicated by identical reports published in many newspapers and apparently emanating from the Ministry of Propaganda.

Describing a "struggle" between Nationalists on one hand and Jews, liberals and monarchists on the other, which followed the death of Premier Goemboes, the reports said:

"There can be no doubt that the Jewish problem is becoming more and more acute and it will be the fatal question for the Daranyi cabinet.

Admitting that the "National counter-forces against Jewry" are split, with 85 of 165 Government deputies classed as "radical rightists," the reports continue:

"There are no indications yet with regard to the future attitude of the Government to the Jewish problem. Without doubt the cabinet is without exception National-Christian-Conservative, and in its conception anti-Jewish. We must, however, wait to see whether the Government will find the strength to assume the leadership of the national movement and to carry out Goemboes' great national work of reform."

Hitler Seen Spurring Anti-Semitism in Poland

NEW YORK, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Charles A. Selden, London correspondent of the New York Times, describes Nazi propaganda activities in Poland and Czechoslovakia in a dispatch on the German-Japanese treaty.

He declares that "Hitler is now causing new impetus to anti-Semitism in Poland as a part of a manoeuvre to hold that country through Colonel Josef Beck, its Foreign Minister, as a German ally and to prevent its swing back to France under the influence of General Edward Smigly-Rydz, its dictator."

COMPROMISE WITH ARABS URGED BY VLADECK IN SERIES ON PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- B. G. Vladeck, general manager of the Jewish Daily Forward, who recently returned from a trip abroad during which he spent five weeks investigating conditions in Palestine, has set down his observations of the Jewish situation in the Holy Land in a series of articles published in the Forward.

His major conclusions follow, in brief:

1. While the Jews have made certain gains as a result of the Arab strike, including greater representation in various industries and fields of public employment, there were also harmful effects: building and trade were curtailed, the immigration rate dropped and Arab Nationalism was strengthened.
2. Britain cannot maintain peace by force, but must avoid recurrence of the strike and rioting by aiding understanding between Arab and Jew. To this end, accepted attitudes and beliefs should be abandoned.
3. The Arab economic grievances are not important, for the Arabs have gained much through Jewish settlement. But Arab Nationalism is gaining ground, led by an organized minority which utilizes the indifference of the masses. This minority includes the Arab youths, who give time and energy, and the merchants and rich landowners, who supply funds and prestige. They are aided by Italian and German propaganda, which aim to make trouble for Britain.

4. Jewish anti-Arab feeling and the estrangement between the two peoples breeds isolation, makes the Arab susceptible to propaganda and hinders efforts at amity. Today Arabs and Jews refuse to budge from their respective stands. England will eventually force both groups to compromise, but it would be better that the Jews make the compromise voluntarily and directly with the Arabs. "Peace cannot be achieved as long as the Jews demand a majority or possibility of a majority in the near future."

5. Only 14 per cent of the Jews are settled on land, for one reason because of high cost of settlement. Loans for settlement would be difficult to meet, and almost impossible at present high interest rates. The kvutzoth (communal settlements) are only a temporary solution; they will almost certainly not be in a position to meet financial obligations due in two or three years. Colonization costs and high price of money places further broad-scale settlement out of the reach of the chalutz youth.

6. Palestine has no economic plan; is afflicted, indeed, by "economic anarchy" which some feel necessary "to attract money to the country" and, by stimulating the speculative fever, create employment, but which, Mr. Vladeck holds, is "just as harmful to future Jewish settlement as the Arab terror, or the indifference of the Mandatory Power." Summing up, "there are well organized bodies for propaganda, for fund raising, for politics, but there are no organized bodies to build the Yishuv according to a plan and with a purpose."

BROOKLYN DAILY EAGLE WINS B'NAI B'RITH AMITY AWARD

NEW YORK, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- The Brooklyn Lodge of the Order B'nai B'rith last night presented an award to the Brooklyn Daily Eagle as the metropolitan newspaper which did the most in 1936 to promote "inter-racial amity and comity as well as goodwill among the people of the United States." Senator Robert F. Wagner, winner of the award to individuals, will receive a scroll later.

JACOB SCHAEFER, COMPOSER OF PROLETARIAN MUSIC, DEAD AT 46

NEW YORK, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Jacob Schaefer, 46, known as the father of Jewish proletarian music in this country, died yesterday morning of a heart attack in his Bronx home. He founded the Freiheit Gesangverein in Chicago in 1912, which later developed into an international organization with branches throughout the world. In 1933, Mr. Schaefer was winner of second prize in a Soviet international contest with his oratorio "Sturmvoegel," based on a Maxim Gorki poem.

SAMUEL ROSENBERG, CITY'S OLDEST VOTER, DIES AT 105

NEW YORK, Dec. 3. (JTA) -- Samuel Rosenberg, "patriarch of Chinatown," said to be New York's oldest voter, died yesterday at the age of 105 after an illness of several weeks. He was active in Jewish philanthropic and religious circles.

BERLIN, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- The Jewish Community of Berlin announced today introduction of courses in the Arabic language to prepare Jewish youths intending to emigrate to Palestine.

BECK STRESSED EMIGRATION DIFFICULTIES, EDEN DISCLOSES

LONDON, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden disclosed in Commons today that Col. Josef Beck, Polish Foreign Minister, in recent conversations in London, while expressing awareness of the difficulties in the Palestine situation, had referred to the large annual increase in Poland's population and the problems faced by the Government in view of immigration restrictions of countries to which Poles formerly emigrated.

Capt. Eden's statement was made in writing in reply to a question.

AUSTRIAN MONARCHISTS DENY PLAN TO RESTRICT JEWS

VIENNA, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Herr von Wiesner, representative of the Hapsburgs in Austria, categorically denied today that an agreement had been concluded by the Legitimists for introduction of an "Aryan" paragraph.

He said Jewish Monarchists were right in believing that restoration of the monarchy would not affect their citizenship rights.

JEWISH SCOUTS OPEN ANNIVERSARY EXHIBITION

PRAHA, Czechoslovakia, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- The first world exhibition of Hashomer Hatzair, Jewish scout movement, was opened today in Krete Maehrisch Ostrau, in celebration of the fifteenth anniversary of the Czech section and the tenth anniversary of the organization's settlement in Palestine.

The exhibition was opened by Eli Schoenfeld. Addresses of welcome were delivered by representatives of the Government and the city. The movement includes 60,000 members in 22 countries.

HADASSAH ASKS PALESTINE CERTIFICATES FOR POLISH JEWISH YOUTHS

NEW YORK, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Hadassah announced today it has sent a petition to the Palestine Government through the Youth Aliyah committee there urging the granting of immigration certificates to Polish Jewish children.

The Palestine Government has granted special certificates to the Youth Aliyah committee for transporting Jewish youths from Germany to the Holy Land.

WEIL URGES MORE FUNDS FOR GERMAN JEWS EMIGRATED TO BRAZIL

SAO PAULO, Brazil (JTA) -- The necessity of placing more funds at the disposal of Jews emigrating from Germany to Brazil was stressed by Dr. Bruno Weil, Reich Jewish leader, at the end of a three-week stay in this country.

While moderate immigration can be continued, and perhaps accelerated, "it is too much for the Jews settled in Brazil if the immigration of poor Jews only continues," he said. "The German Jews often arrive without any funds and the relief committees are not in a position to carry on relief work with their own resources alone."

He expressed pleasure over steps taken here for forming the first community of German-speaking Jews in Brazil. The number of newly-immigrated Jews was placed at 2,000 in Rio de Janeiro, 3,500 here and 200 in Porto Alegre.

He stressed the importance of a knowledge of Portuguese, "There is a superfluity of business men who bring with them a general education only," he said. "Specialists in every field can be placed."

DR. WISE SEES JEWS AS "DESTRUCTIVE FORCE" IF PALESTINE ENTRY CURBED

NEW YORK, Dec. 2. (JTA) -- Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the Zionist Organization of America, warned tonight that "if the door of Palestine be shut, wholly or in part, if the minority rights of Jews are to be trampled upon, the Jews will have become a destructive force in the world, for Christendom will have committed the crime of moral self-destruction."

in an address prepared for delivery at a dinner of the American Committee on Religious Rights and Minorities and the Church Peace Union at the Hotel Pennsylvania, Dr. Wise mentioned a similar warning by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, before the Royal Commission in Jerusalem a few days ago.

"The time has come for the public opinion of mankind, expressing itself either through the League of Nations at Geneva or through its great religious organizations, to speak earnestly and solemnly with respect to the lawless violation of the rights of many minority peoples in Europe and most especially of Jewish minorities," he declared.

The dinner was in honor of the eightieth birthday of Dr. Arthur J. Brown, president of the committee. Other speakers were Michael Williams, editor of Commonweal; Dr. William P. Merrill, and Dr. Robert E. Spear.
