200 SO. AFRICAN IMMIGRANTS FACE DEPORTATION

JOHANNESBURG, Union of So. Africa, March 1. (JTA) -- Deportation to-day faced 200 immigrants, many of them Jews, who entered South Africa after Feb. 1 on temporary permits. The Immigrants Selection Board, established under the Aliens Act which became effective Feb. 1, has received instructions from the Government to enforce its provisions with the utmost stringency.

In no instance, it was stated here, has the board thus far refused permanent permits to persons holding temporary ones.

Meanwhile the Nationalist press has been prominently displaying copies of a circular fostering immigration permits to Jews, attributed to a group known as the "Swaziland Settlement Corporation."

Questioned on this in Parliament, Premier Hertzog said the Union had no jurisdiction over immigration to Swaziland but that the Imperial Government had been apprised of the Aliens Act.

It is understood here that the British Government will cooperate with the Union on any steps regarding immigration into Swaziland, which lies southeast of the Transvaal and is governed by a Resident Commissioner under the authority of the British High Commissioner for South Africa.

JEWISH SPECIAL POLICEMEN REARMED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, March 1, (JTA) -- Jewish supernumerary policemen, demobilized since the end of the 1936 disorders last October, were being rearmed today as Arab disturbances continued on a wider scale.

An armed gang raided the Jewish colony of Mizpah, near Tiberias, firing into grazing flocks of sheep. When police arrived, they were shot at from hills surrounding the colony. While the skirmish was in progress, the Arabs drove off the sheep.

Two Jewish policemen were fired upon at Samakh. A bus carrying Jewish passengers was stoned near Haifa. A woman was reported seriously wounded.

JEWISH AGENCY INVESTS IN "BIZUR" STOCK

JERUSALEM, Feb. 28. (JTA) -- The Jewish Agency for Palestine and the Hevrat Ovdim, Ltd., a holding company for various Jewish labor institutions, announced their decision today to invest \$25,000 each in stock of the Bizur Consolidation Corporation.

Since the beginning of its activities, Bizur has extended loans totaling over \$500,000 which enabled execution of projects with a total value of about \$1,750,000. The corporation's debenture bonds bear a six per cent interest rate and are redeemable from 1938 to 1943.

LAND GRANTS MADE TO FALASHAN JEWS

ROME, March 1. (JTA) -- A Propaganda Ministry communique said today that grants of land have been made to Falashas, Ethiopian Jews, by the Italian colonial authorities.

Reporting on a survey made by Carlo Alberto Viterbo, Jewish leader, on behalf of the Jewish communities in Italy and the Government, the communique said the authorities were establishing agricultural and handicrafts schools for the Falashas.

"The Falashas," the communique declared, "are thankful to the new regime for their release from oppression and also for the improved status of religious freedom. They are ready to intensify their agricultural work and are confident they will be helped to raise the cultural and economic level,"

LONDON GROUP FORMED TO EXPORT KOSHER MEAT TO GERMANY

LONDON, March 1. (JTA) -- Establishment of a group to be known as the "Jewish Friends' Food Fund," which will engage in export of kosher meat to Germany where its production is forbidden, was announced here today.

The Berlin Central Fund for Kosher Meat, it was stated, has been granted permission to import meat if it is paid for outside of Germany. A funds campaign has been launched under the leadership of Chief Rabbi J. H. Hertz, Councillor M. H. Davis and David Sassoon.

UNIVERSITY DEAN STABBED BY RUMANIAN STUDENTS

BUCHAREST, March 1. (JTA) -- Former Senator Traian Bratu, Dean of the University of Issi, was stabled tonight by three students who waylaid him as he was leaving the university. He is in a critical condition, the Havas News Agency reported.

Political motives were believed behind the attack on the Dean, inate much as he had on several occasions taken a strongly disapproving attitude toward extreme right activities of groups in the student body,

Bratu was president of the senate during the regime of the National Peasant Party.

Following continued agitation between Right and Left parties, the state of siege and censorship established after the assassination of Fremier Ion G. Duca by members of the Iron Guard was pmlonged today for another six months.

The Government will demand full powers from Parliament to assure the maintenance of order and repression of extreme right agitation during the parliamentary vacation between April and November, it was said.

SEE COL. KOC FORCED TO SURRENDER TO ENDEK PRESSURE FOR VIOLENCE

WARSAW, March 1. (JTA) -- Col. Adam Koc, founder and chief of the newly-organized Government political party, may be forced by some of his ultra-Nationalist followers to violent action against the millions of Polish Jews, Jewish circles here fear, the Havas News Agency reported.

Col. Koc's original announcement, when he proclaimed formation of the all-inclusive political organization last week, came as something of an agreeable surprise to Jews here. At that time Col. Koc declared that there would be no pogroms, no violent anti-Semitic attacks, but that the Jews must limit their activities in accordance with Poland's cultural and economic life.

Koc's position was regarded as moderate as compared to that of his Lioutenant, Col. Boguslaw Miedzinski, who had given indictions in the Gazetta Polska that serious trouble could be expected.

The Jewish press, however, has continued to point out the dangers that lie in formation of the new group. The Polish Nationalists are far from satisfied at the concessions made to their anti-Semitism and it is feared Col. Koc may be forced, in spite of himself, to give way further to these Jew-haters.

POLISH ZIONISTS STIRRED BY ATTACK ON GRUENBAUM

WARSAW, March 1. (JTA) -- Zionist circles were indignant today over last night's attack by Revisionists upon Isaac Gruenbaum, member of the World Zionist Executive and former Sejm deputy. Gruenbaum, returning from a Zionist concert late at night, was allegedly waylaid by a group of Revisionists. His assailants escaped.

POLISH DOCTORS! UNION BARS JEWS

WARSAW, March 1. (JTA) -- The Physicians' Union of Kielce decided today to apply the "Aryan Paragraph" barring Jews from membership. The Electro-Technical Union of Upper Silesia took similar action.

JENS BARRED FROM FIVE OF EIGHT MAJOR HOTELS IN BERMUDA

NEW YORK, March 1. (JTA) -- Five of the eight major hotels now open in Bermuda, island Mecca of American tourists, bar Jews as guests, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency confirmed today.

Fred G. Heller, of Bermuda Hotels, Inc., agents for four of the five hotels, informed the J.T.A. that in the Princess, Inverurie and Cedar Lodge, and Belmont Manor and Celf Club the ban had been in effect a year at the guests insistence, while in the Coral Island Club the ban was introduced lately. The fifth hotel barring Jews is the Elbow Beach Hotel.

The three hotels admitting Jews, according to the New York World-Telegram, which featured a front-page report on the anti-Jewish discrimination, are the Bermuda Hamilton, the Bermudian and the St. George. The latter two are operated by the Furness Bermuda Line.

The hotels prohibiting Jews have accommodations for 1,600 guests as against the 1,500 who can be cared for in the other three, the Telegram said. Of the tourist influx to Bermuda, 80,000 of the annual arrivals are Americans and of these, one hotel agent estimated, 40 per cent are Jews.

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS MUST BROADEN BASE OF SUPPORT, DR. ADLER SAYS

PITTSBURGH, March 1. (JTA) -- Pointing out that high taxation now imposed on men of wealth precludes the large gifts formerly made to educational institutions, President Cyrus Adler of the Jewish Theological Seminary said today the Seminary and other educational institutions must now broaden the base of their support.

He spoke at the Golden Jubilee luncheon of the Women's League of the United Synagogue dedicated to the Seminary's semi-centennial anniversary observance. The league is holding its nineteenth annual convention at the Hotel Schenley here.

At the afternoon session Mrs. Samuel Spiegel was elected for the eleventh time as president. Mrs. Cyrus Adler, Philadelphia, was elected first vice-president; Mrs. Elias L. Solomon, New York, treasurer, Mrs. Morris Klein, New York, recording secretary and Mrs. David Kass, New York, corresponding secretary.

At a banquet tonight Dr. Robert Gordis, New York, declared that Judaism survived because, unlike other ancient civilizations, it was inseparable from religion. He added that it was the destiny of America to be a new world Jewish center and that the trend was towards Conservative Judaism as apart from Orthodoxy and Reform.
