ARABS KILL 6TH JEW IN 4 DAYS; TENSION HIGH; WAUCHOPE FLIES FROM LONDON

JERUSALEM, March 16. (JTA) -- Arab terrorists killed another Jew today, the sixth in the last four days.

Samuel Gottfried, 30, a native Palestinian, was shot dead as he entered his home in Rosh Pina.

The latest slaying, coming on the heels of five Jewish killings over the week-end, stirred new concern in Jewish and official quarters.

Tension rose to new heights since the official termination last October of the sanguinary Arab general strike against Jews and Government as High Commissioner Sir Arthur Wauchope left London by plane to resume his duties here and David Ben-Gurion, chairman of the Jerusalem executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, demanded for Jews the right to armed self-defense.

In a conference with Acting High Commissioner John Hathorn-Hall last night, Mr. Ben-Gurion said:

"We are ready to protect ourselves provided the Government allows the Jews to carry arms." He added the Jews were willing to defend themselves "if the Government is unable to protect law-abiding citizens."

According to reports in informed circles here Sir Arthur has cut short his stay in London, where he had been called by the Colonial Office, fearing renewed outbursts in the Holy Land.

SMOLAR DEPORTATION SHELVED; WAY LEFT OPEN FOR CANCELLATION OF ORDER

BERLIN, March 16. (JTA) -- The deportation order against Boris Smolar, chief European correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, was postponed indefinitely today following a conference of Gestapo officials with American Consul General Douglas Jenkins and Vice-Consul Raymond Geist. The order, originally scheduled to be carried out Sunday, had been deferred until Thursday after intervention by the American Consulate General.

The officials asserted they could not rescind the expulsion edict entirely since they did not have the dossier of the Smolar case before them. They expressed a willingness, however, to reexamine the case and decide within the next fortnight whether the order could be cancelled.

Negotiations looking toward cancellation will be resumed by the consulate with the Gestapo next week. In the meantime, Smolar will be permitted to leave Germany and return at any time.

3,000 JEWISH DOCTORS QUIT REICH IN 4 YEARS

BERLIN, March 16. (JTA) -- Official figures released today show that 3,000 Jewish doctors left Germany in the four years of the Nazi regime, but that there are still 8,000 in the Reich of whom more than half are over fifty and unable to emigrate.

The figures disclosed there are less than 150 Jewish students still registered in all German universities.

REICH JEWS PLAN TO SEND 600 CHILDREN TO PALESTINE, U.S. IN 1937

BERLIN, March 16. (JTA) -- Plans to evacuate about 600 German-Jewish children under 16 to Palestine and the United States during the present year were announced today by the Reichsvertretung, representative body of Jews in Germany.

The organization disclosed that during 1936, a total of 604 German-Jewish children were settled in Palestine and 237 in the United States.

FEW REFUGEE BIDS FOR RESIDENCE PERMITS REJECTED BY PARIS BODY

GENEVA, March 16. (JTA) -- Less than one per cent of refugees' applications for residence certificates have been refused by the Inter-ministerial Commission established in France, it was revealed here today.

The legal status of refugees in France is protected by the Geneva convention defining refugees as those who on July 4, 1936, were living outside of Germany and were no longer under German protection. These are eligible to a certificate entitling them to one year's residence in another country, but without the right to work. The convention has to date been ratified by France, Belgium, Sweden, Denmark and England.

At the present time France is harboring 8,000 refugees, of whom 2,000 are receiving assistance; England has 3,500 and Belgium 130, who until November 5, 1936, had the right to work; Holland numbers 700, of whom 220 were being assisted.

DR. KOLLENSCHER, HERZL COLLABORATOR, DIES IN TEL AVIV

TEL AVIV, Palestine, March 16. (JTA) -- Dr. Max Kollenscher, a collaborator of Dr. Theodor Herzl, father of modern political Zionism, died here today. He was 62 years old.

Born in Posen, Dr. Kollenscher played an important role in the revolution of 1905. When Posen became part of Poland, he founded the Jewish Folks Council, whose platform was national minorities rights for Jews.

Dr. Kollenscher later moved to Berlin, where he was active in Zionist and other Jewish affairs. He is the author of a number of volumes on the Jews of Posen and Germany.

NEW DISORDERS CLOSE 2 MORE WARSAW SCHOOLS

WARSAW, March 16. (JTA) -- Two more schools, the commercial and agricultural high schools, were closed today following further anti-Jewish excesses in which several Jewish students were seriously injured.

It was disclosed that Samuel Kahan, 24, son of Lazar Kahan, editor of the tabloid Warsaw Yiddish Express who is now visiting in America, was among the students injured in yesterday's clashes at the Polytechnic Institute. Both the Institute and Warsaw University were closed yesterday following the disorders.

UNITED RELIEF DRIVE FOR POLISH JEWS URGED AT WARSAW PARLEY

WARSAW, March 16. (JTA) -- A united relief campaign for Polish Jewry was urged by representatives of the entire Polish-Jewish press at a conference today with leaders of the American Joint Distribution Committee. Small, separate campaigns were termed harmful.

Speakers praised work of the J.D.C. in Poland, but asserted the money assigned to relief purposes was inadequate.

Aid will be extended at once, it was disclosed, for Jews in townships where serious excesses have occurred recently.

LABEL ALL JEWS REDS, EAST EUROPE GERMANS TOLD AT PARLEY

BERLIN, March 16. (JTA) -- Addressing a convention of East European Germans today Prof. Oberlander of Koenigsberg University urged delegates to spread charges that Jews were Bolsheviks and a danger to the countries in which they live.

JEWS MOURN PASSING OF SIR AUSTEN CHAMBERLAIN, FOE OF NAZIS

LONDON, March 16. (JTA) -- The sudden death of Sir Austen Chamberlain, 73, staunch anti-Nazi and defender of the Jews, brought sorrow to Jewish circles here tonight. He was one of Great Britain's great statesmen and former Foreign Minister.

In 1934 he declared that all the best elements in the world stand with the Jews in the face of the assault of Hitlerism upon them and asked the German people "where they expect to stand in the council of the world...if Israel in Germany is to suffer new captivities?"

In regard to the Jewish national home in Palestine, he felt the most delicate task of the British Government was "to balance the interests of the two peoples in Palestine."

LORD LAMINGTON URGES JEWS BE SETTLED IN BRITISH EMPIRE AREAS

LONDON, March 16. (JTA) -- Settlement of Polish and German Jews in underpopulated areas of the British Empire is urged today by Lord Lamington in a letter to The Times.

Lord Lamington suggests the immigrants could develop industry in those territories with the aid of funds supplied by Jewish organizations in England and America.

AMSTERDAM U. SNUBS BID TO GOETTINGEN FELE

AMSTERDAM, March 16. (JTA) -- The senate of Amsterdam University announced its decision today to reject an invitation to send representatives to the 200th anniversary celebration of Goettingen University in Germany.

NO RELIGIOUS SUPERVISION FOR MATZOTH BAKING IN MOSCOW BAKERIES

MOSCOW, March 16. (JTA) -- It was announced officially today that matzoth is now being baked in specially designated municipal bakeries.

Contrary to Paris reports, however, the baking is being done without religious supervision. Orthodox Jews, it was ascertained, are preparing the unleavened bread in their own homes.

LITHUANIA DRAFTS LAWS TO GUARD MINORITIES RIGHTS

KAUNAS, Lithuania, March 16. (JTA) -- It was disclosed today that the Government is drafting legislation, to be introduced after the Easter holidays, guaranteeing all national and cultural minorities rights.

RABBI MYERSOHN DEAD IN VIENNA

VIENNA, March 16. (JTA) -- Chief Rabbi A. Myersohn died here today. He was 78 years old.

VATICAN ASSAILS NAZI VIOLATIONS OF CONCORDAT

VATICAN CITY, March 16. (JTA) -- "Flagrant" Nazi violation of those codicils of the Concordat dealing with freedom of religious education in Germany is indicative of conditions affecting every phase of life in the Reich, it was charged here tonight by the Osservatore Romano, semi-official Vatican newspaper, according to the Havas News Agency.

After scoring the Nazis' maneuvers to force Catholic parents into endorsing of a totalitarian school system, the newspaper declared, "the scholastic struggle constitutes only the apparent conflict. The problem entails in the same terms not only the education and development of youths but the entire life of the country."

As evidence of its statements, the Osservatore pointed out that 48 confessional schools had been closed since Christmas in Bavaria, where 80 per cent of the student population was formerly enrolled in Catholic schools. By Easter 103 more Parochial schools will have met a similar fate, it added.

The newspaper cited several "significant episodes" which, according to its analysis, indicated the Reich was seeking the destruction of Christianity.

For one thing, it quoted from a letter written by a Protestant pastor charging that Reich Minister for Religions Hans Kerrl had declared it was "ridiculous" to regard Jesus Christ as the son of God.

EDITORS HAVE NO RIGHT TO BE FREE, NAZI LEADER HOLDS

MAGDEBURG, Germany, March 16. (JTA) -- Editors have no business trying to be free in matters of aesthetic criticism or anything else without deference to political necessities, according to a doctrine laid down by Capt. Wilhelm Weiss, head of the Reich Press Federation, the Havas News Agency reported.

In a speech yesterday, Capt. Weiss said the new Nazi journalism received inspiration directly from the State, as compared to former times when journalists submitted "to Jewish influence."

The new regime has enabled the Reich to re-establish its military sovereignty, continued Capt. Weiss, to reoccupy the Rhineland, and to construct roads and gigantic monuments.

NAZIS START NEW ATTACK ON U.S. BUT THINK BETTER OF IT

NEW YORK, March 16. (JTA) -- Last night's anti-Nazi rally at the Madison Square Garden focussed interest anew on the Hitler government, which is completing its fourth year in power, and brought reactions from various points.

Mayor LaGuardia, a surprise speaker at the meeting, reaffirmed his attack on Hitler and called him "satisfaktionsfaehig" -- too low to seek satisfaction from -- to the cheers of 20,000 spectators. General Hugh S. Johnson backed the Mayor's previous attack on Hitler.

In Berlin, the Nazis apparently backed down on a demand that President Roosevelt "intervene energetically" to prevent anti-Nazi "insults." The demand was contained in the first edition of Der Angriff, but dropped from all others. No other Nazi paper mentioned the rally.

German embassy officials in Washington, meanwhile, indicated they considered LaGuardia's latest attack as an effort to keep alive the controversy stirred by previous criticism. They intimated they would await instructions from Berlin before taking any action.

In London, mounting resentment against the Nazis caused a crowd of students to jostle German Ambassador Joachim von Ribbentrop, according to the Havas News Agency. The demonstration occurred while he was entering the Institute for Historical Research.

The local Nazis faced a new court threat when Major Julius Hochfelder, counsel for the German-American League for Culture, obtained in Yorkville Magistrates' Court, a summons against Fritz Kuhn, head of the Amerika-Deutscher Bund, charging him with violating State laws by publishing the Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter without filing a declaration of purposes.

LOCAL U.P.A. DRIVE FOR \$1,700,000 LAUNCHED

NEW YORK, March 16. (JTA) -- Nothing can stop the Jews in Palestine from working to keep the doors open to immigration in order to help Europe's Jews, Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, declared today at a luncheon inaugurating the \$1,700,000 New York campaign of the United Palestine Appeal.

Other speakers were Harold Jacobi, chairman of the New York drive, who presided and announced a list of business and communal leaders who will direct the campaign; Dr. Stephen S. Wise, national chairman of the U.P.A.; Samuel Blitz, executive director of the New York drive, and Morris Rothenberg, chairman of the Z.O.A. administrative committee.

15,000 AUTOMOBILES LISTED IN PALESTINE, MOSTLY U.S. MAKES

JERUSALEM (JTA) -- Figures issued by the Government, giving the first up-to-date motor car survey, show 15,000 vehicles were registered in the Holy Land at the end of 1936, most of them of American makes. About 1,500 cars were registered last year, 200 less than in 1935.

Vehicles in use, however, total only 9,000, of which 40 per cent were private cars, 25 per cent commercial vehicles, 10 per cent auto buses and the rest taxicabs and motorcycles.

There are 719 Fords, 558 Chevrolets, 147 Buicks, 122 Oldsmobiles, 139 Willys among the American makes. British cars include 372 Morris, 326 Austins, 114 Hillmans and other brands. There are also 179 Fiats and 154 Opels.
