PALESTINE PRESS SCORES PROSPECT OF PARTITION

JERUSALEM, April 6. (JTA) -- Palestine newspapers of all shades of opinion were unanimous today in assailing division of the Holy Land, which the Royal Commission is reportedly considering in London.

With the Arab press already on record as unanimously opposed to the reputed proposals, Hebrew newspapers and the country's only English-language daily, the Palestine Post, joined in attacking them.

Haaretz, independent Hebrew daily published in Tel Aviv, declares in an editorial that the proposals to divide Palestine are the best indication of the impotence of British political thought. British statesmen, it declares, "think mistakenly they will buy off Zionism for a toy called a Jewish State, possessing everything except soil."

Zionism, the paper asserts, is not a symbol, but a very serious matter to the existence of millions of Jews.

The Palestine Post in an editorial declares proposals to cantonize Palestine are the "counsel of despair."

Mizrachi Parley Voices Opposition

TEL AVIV, April 6. (JTA) -- Sharp protest against possible division of Palestine was voiced today in a resolution adopted at the concluding session of the sixth conference of Mizrachi, orthodox Zionist organization.

The resolution, declaring Palestine within its historical boundaries belongs to the Jewish people, said Jews would never agree to a division of the country.

Other resolutions authorized establishment of a separate Mizrahi employment bureau and approved continuation of the Zionist agreement with non-Zionists, whereby both are equally represented in the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

TEL AVIV TO NAME STREET FOR DEHAAS

TEL AVIV, April 6. (JTA) -- A Tel Aviv street will be named in honor of Jacob de Haas, New York Zionist leader who died March 21, it was announced here today by Mayor Israel Rokach.

POLISH OFFICIAL, IN RADIO TALK, HITS TERRORISM IN UNIVERSITIES

WARSAW, April 6. (JTA) -- Anti-Jewish terrorism at Polish universities was assailed in a radio broadcast today by Prof. Cornel Ujenski, undersecretary for education, who branded Nationalist students responsible for it as "criminal elements."

Describing attacks on helpless students by gangs of Nationalists armed with sticks, stench bombs and iron rods as acts which "fill decent people with disgust," Prof. Ujenski declared:

"A war of one people against another is conducted according to a certain code of honor. Fortunately, one has to deal only with a small group of irresponsible agitators. Poland cannot afford their dangerous game."

He concluded with an appeal to the Polish people to oppose energetically acts of the anti-Semitic groups.

The speech followed the reopening and almost immediate closing yesterday of the Warsaw Technical College when tear gas and stench bombs were thrown into a lecture room. Similar disturbances by anti-Semitic Nationalist students, aimed to force segregation of Jews in "ghetto benches, resulted in a three-week shutdown of the school.

DUBLIN COLLEGE CREATES CHAIR IN HEBREW

DUBLIN, April 6. (JTA) -- The Senate of Trinity College, third oldest university in the British Isles, announced today the creation of a chair in Hebrew, and its occupant, Dr. Jacob Weingreen, became the first Jew to hold a permanent professorship in Ireland.

Trinity College, the only teaching unit of Dublin University, was established in 1591 and ranks with Oxford and Cambridge in academic standing. Although Hebrew has been on its curriculum for several centuries, there has been no chair in this subject hitherto.

Dr. Weingreen is an orthodox Jew who formerly taught in a local Talmud Torah (Jewish religious primary school). He is widely traveled and took part in archaeological excavations in Samaria, Palestine, in conjunction with the Hebrew University in Jerusalem and with universities in England and the United States.

U.S. SPURRED INTO WAR BY JEWS, NAZI PAPER HOLDS

BERLIN, April 6. (JTA) -- The Berlin Nachtausgabe declared today that the reason the United States went to war against Germany twenty years ago today was not to save democracy but "for the profits of international Jewish financiers."

In an editorial on the twentieth anniversary of America's entry into the World War, the Nazi organ claimed to possess evidence that "Jewish financial and business interests" participated in the decision to declare war.

ENDEKS GET LIGHT TERMS FOR MURDER OF JEW

WARSAW, April 6. (JTA) -- Terms of two and a half years each were meted out by a Lomza criminal court today against two Nationalists convicted of murdering a Jewish tradesman, Chaim Landsman, in the town of Stuczyn last September. The public prosecutor appealed on the ground the sentences were too mild.

PAPAL ENCYCLICAL SEEN VEERING HUNGARY AGAINST REICH

BUDAPEST, April 6. (JTA) -- Rejection of anti-Semitism by a Catholic notable and a public denunciation of Germany's attitude toward the Christian religion by a Protestant Bishop today indicated how far the recent papal encyclical against Germany has swung Hungarian public opinion, the Havas News Agency reported.

The Rev. Father Jusztin Baranyai, a leading figure in the Hungarian Catholic world, told an interviewer that the church "wants justice for all and condemns all excesses and therefore cannot approve anti-Semitism." He recommended extreme prudence to those of his flock who belonged to the right-wing extremist parties.

Bishop Alexander Raffay said that Germany "has profoundly deceived us," and deplored the fact that "Germany has taken a position against Christianity."

15 ENDEKS SEIZED IN SOKOLOW-PODLASKI DISORDERS

WARSAW, April 6. (JTA) -- Fifteen Nationalists were arrested today in Sokolow-Podlaski for participation in recent anti-Jewish excesses and for carrying on propaganda for a boycott against the Jews in this district.

Anti-Semites demolished a number of Jews' houses in Lipka, District of Siegage. Jewish inhabitants fled to the neighboring town of Stotzek. Simultaneously, unknown persons set fire to three Jewish houses and also to ritual baths in Lochow, in the same district.

NEWSDEALER WHO 'DOESN'T LIKE JEWS' JAILED FOR DAMAGING WINDOW

LONDON, April 6. (JTA) -- The vender of a Fascist newspaper, who said he did not like the Jews, was sentenced today to six weeks' hard labor for damaging the window of a shop owned by Eliezer Karsberg in Battersea. In passing sentence the magistrate said "this sort of thing cannot be tolerated."

HIAS-ICA FOUNDS FIVE BRANCHES IN LATIN AMERICA

NEW YORK, April 6. (JTA) -- New branches of the Jewish immigrant aid service maintained by the HIAS-ICA have been established in five Latin American Republics.- Venezuela, Curacao, Panama, Guatemala and Mexico - it was announced following the return to New York of Isaac L. Asofsky, general manager of the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society. He visited these countries on a mission for the HIAS-ICA Emigration Association.

During his stay in the South and Central American countries, Mr. Asofsky conferred with local Jewish communal leaders, and particularly with those active in rendering aid to Jewish migrants. The new offices make a total of 38 HIAS-ICA offices in that many countries.

LORD MELCHETT TO VISIT U.S. NEXT MONTH

NEW YORK, April 6. (JTA) -- Lord Melchett, chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, will visit the United States next month, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, announced today. He is scheduled to arrive here on May 12 following a tour of South America.

JEWISH WORKERS PUBLISH ARAB WEEKLY IN PALESTINE

NEW YORK, April 6. (JTA) -- A cable received by the National Labor Committee for Palestine announces that a new Arab weekly has appeared in Palestine, published by the Histadruth, the federation of Jewish workers. The new weekly was decided upon at the last conference of the Histadruth held several weeks ago in Tel Aviv.

The funds for the publication were made available through American friends of the Histadruth and the Palestine Labor Campaign. The Executive of the Gewerkschaften Campaign has cabled to the Histadruth its assurances that it will continue to do all in its power to bring before American Jews the necessity for supporting the Jewish workers of Palestine in efforts to establish better Jewish-Arab understanding.
