HEBREW PRESS MARKS RIOTS ANNIVERSARY; HITS GOVERNMENT'S LAXITY

JERUSALEM, April 19. (JTA) -- Today is the anniversary of the outbreak in Jaffa of the 1936 Arab disorders which between April and October took a toll of more than 300 Jewish, British and Arab lives and did property damage estimated at over \$15,000,000.

The entire Hebrew press devotes its leading articles to reviews of the outbreaks. Eulogizing the 102 Jewish victims (including 20 killed since official termination of the Arab general strike last October), the newspapers reiterate charges that the Palestine Government was responsible for the extent of the disorders, not having taken "scrious" steps to suppress them at their inception. They declare the Government failed to pacify the country and permitted the chief instigators to go unpunished.

Arab newspapers urged the day be proclaimed a Moslem national holiday.

Several kilograms of explosives and a quantity of rifles were found by police today during a search of Arab houses in Jaffa.

Jewish supernumeraries arrested five Arab shepherds found grazing flocks illegally on fields belonging to Tel Joseph, newly established colony in the Beisan area.

REICH WOULD ATTEND WORLD TRADE PARLEY, HITLER TELLS LANSBURY

BERLIN, April 19. (JTA) -- On the eve of his 48th birthday, Chancellor Adolf Hitler today announced Germany's willingness to take part in a world economic conference sponsored by Fresident Roosevelt or the head of some other great nation, the Havas News Agency reported.

A joint statement issued by the Fuehrer and George Lansbury, veteran British pacifist, after a $2\frac{1}{2}$ hour conference, declared:

"Germany will be willing to attend a conference and take part in united efforts for establishing economic cooperation and mutual understanding between the nations of the world if President Roose-velt or the head of another great nation will take the lead in calling such a conference."

Emerging from his meeting with the German leader, Lansbury declared they had discussed the international situation as a whole and that the talks had taken place in a friendly atmosphere.

SECOND ANTI-JEWISH CONGRESS TO BE HELD MAY 12 IN MUNICH

MUNICH, April 19. (JTA) -- Plans were announced today for the second anti-Jewish congress, under pseudo-scientific auspices, to be held May 12-14 at Munich University under the presidency of Wilhelm Grau, head of the Department for Jewish Research of the Reichs Institute for the History of New Germany.

Among the featured speakers at the congress will be Dr. Ludwig Bittner, head of the Austrian State Archives, whose topic will be "The Jewish Question and Archives." (A cable from Vienna reports anti-Nazi circles indignant over the announced intention of a high Austrian official to participate in the congress.)

Other addresses will include "Jewry in Natural Science," by Dr. Johannes Stark, president of the Physical Technological Reichs Institute in Berlin, and "Biological Problems of the Jewish Question," by Prof. Otmar Verschuer of Frankfurt. Eleven other lectures on pseudo-philosophical subjects are listed.

The congress will be concluded with a speech by Germany's high priest of anti-Semitism, Julius Streicher, who will inform the assembled delegates of his practical experiences with Jewry, gained in years of anti-Jewish campaigning.

Another closing speech is scheduled by Walter Frank, president of the Reichs Institute for the History of New Germany, who will give a short talk on "The Jewish Question at German Universities."

2,273 JEWS AMONG REICH'S 18,004 LAWYERS, NAZI PAPER REPORTS

BERLIN, April 19. (JTA) -- There were 18,004 lawyers in Germany on January 1, 1937, according to figures made public today by the Juristische Wochenschrift, weekly organ of the Association of National Socialist Lawyers. Of this number 2,273 were Jewish, the paper asserts.

Prussia, Germany's biggest province which includes Berlin, had 9,900 lawyers on that date, according to the periodical. Jews numbered 1,587 of the total as against 3,378 in 1934.

40 BINAI BIRITH MEMBERS SEIZED BY REICH POLICE IN RAIDS

NEW YORK, April 19. (JTA) -- German secret police today arrosted approximately forty members of B'nai B'rith in early morning raids on the homes of many members, the Associated Press reported from Berlin. Officials refused to give any reason for the raids.

Simultaneously, the A.P. said, Jewish organizations succeeded in having a recently-effected sixty-day ban on Jewish meetings raised for language courses, athletic training and performances of the Jewish Culture League approved by the Nazi special commissioner.

The ban continued for meetings of the Central Jewish Association, as well as for lectures and assemblies of laymen's religious societies.

U.S. COLLEGES TO SEND MOST DELEGATES TO GOETTINGEN FETE

NEW YORK, April 19. (JTA) -- America's universities and colleges will send the largest delegation to the 200th anniversary ceremonies of Goettingen University June 25 to 30, as they did last June to Heidelberg's 550th anniversary, which was turned into a propagandist demonstration for Nazi science, the New York Times reported today from Goettingen.

Seven American institutions accepted the invitation immediately. They are Massachusetts Institute of Technology, University of Pennsylvania, Haverford College, Ohio State University, University of Alabama, Wittenberg College of Springfield, Ohio and Idaho University.

Harvard and Yale have written that they are considering the invitation and have sent best wishes. Princeton has as yet sent no reply. Eleven other institutions have expressed a desire to send representatives if possible. This group includes Syracuse, Missouri and Kansas Universities.

LET PALESTINE REPORT BE AIRED PUBLICLY, MORRISON URGES BRITAIN

NEW YORK, April 19. (JTA) -- Herbert Morrison, British labor leader and chairman of the London County Council, today urged the British Government to publish the Royal Commission's report and "allow public opinion to express itself" before deciding Government policy.

Addressing a luncheon of the National Labor Committee for Palestine at the Hotel Commodore, Mr. Morrison disassociated himself from "unauthorized predictions" about the outcome of the Royal Commission investigation, but made two comments.

"I hope the British Government will publish the report and allow public opinion to express itself before coming to conclusions as to Government policy," he declared. "It would be, I think, unfortunate if the Cabinet committed itself in advance of publication.

"The second is: Not only British honor, but American honor and that of the European allied powers of the war period is involved in the proper observance of the Balfour Declaration for the establishment of a Jewish national home in Palestine. I assume that neither the Royal Commission nor His Majesty's Government will be parties to setting aside the undertakings that were so solemnly entered into."

Other speakers were Joseph Schlossberg, Isadore Nagler, Morris Rothenberg and Chaim Greenberg.

SEES EUROPEAN POWERS UPSET BY PLANS TO DIVIDE PALESTINE

EDINBURGH, April 19. (JTA) -- The newspaper Scotsman declares today that reports of impending partition of Palestine are almost as disturbing to European powers as they are to the Zionists.

These powers, chiefly eastern, which are anxious to send allegedly surplus Jewish populations abroad, an editorial asserts, are "almost as upset as the Zionists by the suggested creation of a small Jewish state in Palestine where hardly more than 600,000 additional Jewish settlers would find an opening."

COLONIAL OFFICE ASKED TO REVIEW PALESTINE POSITION

LONDON, April 19. (JTA) -- A statement from the Colonial Office on the present situation in Palestine was demanded in House of Commons today by David Adams, Laborite.

Mr. Adams supported his demand by citing official advices showing that slow-moving animals were moved successfully by marauders without detection, thus proving that the inhabitants were not being given adequate protection.

DRIVE TO IMPROVE GIRLS! JEWISH EDUCATION OPENS IN LONDON

LONDON, April 19. (JTA) -- "Girls" Education Week" was launched tonight by the Organizing Council for Jawish Education with a mass meeting at which speakers pointed out that girls needed but were not receiving adequate religious training.

Dr. Joseph H. Hertz, chief rabbi of Great Britain, urged a united effort to enable every Jewish girl to receive a sound education in the fundamentals of Judaism and the elements of the Hebrew language.

Dr. Selig Brodetsky, educator and Zionist leader, said that in Poland Jewish youth was starved physically, while in England and other countries Jewish youth was starved mentally and morally.

ARGENTINE NAZI LEADER SLAIN BY ROBBERS

BUENOS AIRES, April 19. (JTA) -- Police announced today that Joseph Riedel, leader of Argentina's pro-Mazi forces who was slain a week ago Sunday, was the victim of robbers.

It had been rumored that the slaying, not revealed until last Friday, was the result of a quarrel over use of party funds. Berlin Nazi sources charged Ri4del was killed by agents of the Communist International and compared the slaying to that of Wilhelm Gustloff, Swiss Nazi agent, who was assassinated by a Jewish medical student last year.

FOREIGN SCHOOLS IN TURKEY TOLD TO HIRE TURKISH MANAGERS

ISTANBUL, April 19. (JTA) -- An order compelling all foreign-language schools, including Greek, Armenian and Jewish, to employ "pure Turk-ish" assistant headmasters or managers, has been issued by the Ministry of Public Education, it was revealed today.

The order is said to threaten the existence of a number of the Jewish schools affected since, it is pointed out, they are unable to stand the increased costs involved. A plea has been made to the ministry to postpone execution of the order until October to prevent the schools from closing.

POLISH ZIONIST LEADER WOUNDS 2 ENDEK ASSAILANTS

WARSAW, April 19. (JTA) -- Aron Blum, attorney and Zionist leader, today shot and wounded two Nationalists who had attacked him on his way home. The assailants were taken to a hospital and Mr. Blum was arrested but released after a short detention. Mr. Blum is a leader of the Mizrachi, religious Zionist organization, and is a member of the Palestine Office, which directs emigration to the Holy Land.

YUGOSLAV RESORT BARS ALIEN JEWS

ZAGREB, Yugoslavia, April 19. (JTA) -- The summer resort of Kranj-skaora, it was disclosed here today, has issued a municipal regulation barring foreign Jewish visitors. Yugoslav-Jewish youth organizations which hitherto held their summer camps on sites around the resort have consequently decided to camp elsewhere.

BEN ZVI TO REPRESENT PALESTINE JEWS AT CORONATION

JERUSALEM, April 19. (JTA) -- Isaac Ben Zvi, president of the Jewish National Council, prepared today to leave for London to represent the Jews of Palestine at the coronation of King George VI next month.
