NEW PALESTINE ENTRY SCHEDULE ASSAILED AS "INSULT TO JEWRY"

JERUSALEM, May 11. (JTA) -- Hebrew newspapers commented bitterly today on yesterday's announcement that 770 labor immigration certificates have been allotted by the Government for the four-month period ending July 31.

The schedule, providing the lowest monthly immigration average in many years, was assailed variously as a declaration of war, a "pharaonic decree," and an "insult to Jewry."

Davar, laborite daily, said in an editorial:

"The Government has declared war and we accept the challenge. The Palestine Jewish community and all Jewry realize that the schedule shows an absolute contempt for the principle of economic absorptive capacity (nominally the basis upon which immigration is regulated) and that it purposes to throw us back into the pre-aliyah (immigration) period."

Haaretz, independent daily, refers to the schedule as a "pharaonic decree" and an "insult to Jewry, the mandate and Palestine."

"It is in every respect," the paper concludes, "as if it was intended to provoke the Jewish people."

Habokor asserts the schedule aims to "undermine the foundations of the Jewish national home," and declares, "We will fight this evil."

FRENCH OFFICIAL WARNS POLAND'S MADAGASCAR BODY NOT TO STIR FALSE HOPES

PARIS, May 11. (JTA) -- Colonial Minister Marius Moutet revealed today that he warned a Polish Government commission, prior to its departure last week to investigate colonization possibilities in Madagascar, not to "arouse illusions among certain unfortunate people."

Declaring he voiced the warning in the presence of the Polish Ambassador, M. Moutet said:

"I emphasized that the enterprise is difficult and possible only in a small experimental way with restricted numbers of healthy people possessing sufficient funds. I pointed out that experience has proved a long time necessary for Europeans to adapt themselves to colonial conditions. We favor colonization experiments in Madagascar for nations who have no colonies, but this does not mean that we wish to provoke an exodus."

The investigative commission, appointed by the Polish Government to examine possibilities for Jewish settlement offered late last year by the French authorities, includes two Jewish experts who, however, are on the commission in their private capacities rather than as representatives of Jewish organizations with which they are connected.

KING GEORGE ELEVATES JEWISH STATESMAN, PUBLISHER TO PEERAGE

LONDON, May 11. (JTA) -- Sir Herbert Samuel, former Liberal Party leader and first British High Commissioner for Palestine, is created a viscount and Julius Elias, publisher of the London Daily Herald, a baron in King George's Coronation honors list.

Sir Herbert and Mr. Elias automatically become peers, raising to eight the number of Jews in the House of Lords. The others are Viscount Bearsted, Baron Hirst, Baron Melchott, the Marquess of Reading, Baron Rothschild and Baron Swaythling.

Sir Herbert, born in 1870 in Liverpool, served in Parliament for long years beginning in 1902 and became chairman of the Liberal Party organization in 1927. He was leader of the Liberal Party in Parliament from 1931 to 1935, when he was not returned to office. He has been Home Secretary and held other Cabinet posts.

Mr. Elias, who is managing director of the Oldham Press, directs many English publications. The Herald, Laborite daily, has a circulation of about 2,000,000, one of the largest in the world.

Sir Isaac Isaacs, former Governor-General of Australia, is made a Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath (G.C.B.).

CORONATION FUND URGED TO AID JEWISH YOUTH MOVEMENT IN ENGLAND

LONDON, May 11. (JTA) -- Noted leaders of British Jewry joined today in an appeal for creation of a fund to support and strengthen the Jewish section of the National Youth Movement, as a coronation memorial.

The appeal, in the form of a letter published in the Times, is signed by Lionel Rothschild, Lord Bearsted, Sir Max Bohn and Sir Robert Waley Cohen. A goal of \$500,000 has been set for the fund, of which half has been promised for establishment of new boys' and girls' clubs.

DODD WARNS OF BILLIONAIRE'S AIM TO BACK DICTATORSHIP HERE

WASHINGTON, May 11. (JTA) -- A letter from William E. Dodd, Ambassador to Germany, warning Democratic leaders here that a "man who owns nearly a billion dollars" is ready to support an American dictatorship created a stir in the capital today.

The letter, written to Senator Robert J. Bulkley (Dem., Ohio) with copies sent to other Democratic leaders as Senator Carter Glass (Va.) urged them "to support our President even if we wish to amend some of his reform measures."

"There are individuals of great wealth who wish a dictatorship and are ready to help a Huey Long," Ambassador Dodd wrote. "There are politicians, some in the Senate, I have heard, who think they may come into power like that of the European dictators in Moscow, Berlin and Rome."

"One man, I have been told by personal friends, who owns nearly a billion dollars, is ready to support such a program, and, of course, control it."

"These dangers and their likely consequences cause me to write you such a long letter. I have studied our history for forty years and cannot help feeling that all of us who believe in our system must do what we can to support our President, even if we wish to amend some of his reform measures."

Senator Bulkley commented that there was "no possibility of a dictatorship in the United States at any time."

John J. O'Connor, (Dem., N.Y.) chairman of the House Rules Committee, said: "When anybody sets himself up as a dictator in this country, I guarantee to personally throw him out."

Rep. William Sirovich (Dem., N.Y.) stated:

"The greatest answer to dictatorship here occurred when the American public voted 64 to 2 last November for parliamentary, constitutional government." He added that "the cure for Fascism is more democracy."

Rep. Henry Ellenbogen (Dem., Pa.) said: "Nobody with a billion or 100 billion dollars could establish a dictatorship in this country. The United States has enjoyed democracy too long to permit dictatorship."

MIZRACHI URGES ZIONIST CONGRESS TO FINANCE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

ATLANTIC CITY, May 11. (JTA) -- A resolution demanding that the Zionist Congress support religious education and observances in Palestine was adopted last night at the closing session of Mizrahi's twentieth annual convention, held at the Breakers Hotel.

The resolution asked the forthcoming congress to exclude from its budget non-religious national educational institutions. The congress is also asked to revoke the rule giving the Palestine Jews the power to choose educational curricula by ballot, to create a special department in the Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine to supervise institutions connected with Sabbath and kashruth and to compel the Histadruth (Palestine labor federation) to enforce kosher laws in the kitchens of its institutions and colonies.

Other resolutions were adopted in protest against the treatment of Jews and other minorities in Germany and Poland.

"RELATIONS" WITH JEWISH GROUPS TO BE USED AGAINST SPANISH FASCIST

HENDAYE, France, May 11. (JTA) -- Documents purporting to show Manuel Hedilla, Spanish Fascist leader, had relations with Jewish organizations are expected to be presented when he is tried in Salamanca for opposing Rebel Commander Francisco Franco, the Havas News Agency reported today.

Hedilla is being held incommunicado in Salamanca prison and 1,000 Phalangists (Spanish Fascists) have been arrested, Havas said, with everything pointing to an imminent public trial. Franco yesterday removed Hedilla from the Executive body of the new Insurgent "Single" Party.

TROPER NAMED HEAD OF NEW YORK ACCOUNTANTS' BODY

NEW YORK, May 11. (JTA) -- Morris C. Troper, executive vice-chairman of the Greater New York campaign of the Joint Distribution Committee, was elected president of the New York State Society of C.P.A.'s at the fortieth annual meeting of the society last night at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

Mr. Troper has been connected with Jewish philanthropic organizations for 20 years. He served as comptroller of the Allied Jewish Campaign in 1930 and the United Jewish Appeal in 1934-5, besides his present connection with the J.D.C.
