COUNCIL FOR GERMAN JEWS WIDENS EMIGRATION, EDUCATION AID

LONDON, June 10. (JTA) -- Expansion of educational services and emigration facilities was announced today by the Council for German Jewry in a report in which Lord Herbert Samuel, chairman of the Council's British section, depicted the constantly-increasing drive of Jews to emigrate from Germany.

"Pressure to leave Germany does not diminish and is likely to be aggravated," Lord Samuel said, "as the methodical, relentless squeezing of Jews out of the few intellectual callings and the general economic life is maintained."

The council report admitted that only a quarter of its task had been accomplished.

The training of young men, women and children leaving school must be expanded to provide for a further 2,000 boys and girls now finishing their general education, the report said.

Consolidation of existing Jewish agricultural groups in Palestine and the settlement of new groups there is to be undertaken by the council. Emigration of German Jews to North and South America will be assisted with credit facilities.

The council announced plans for another intergovernmental conference to convert the present League of Nations arrangement for care of refugees into an international convention, to enlarge its competence, and to cover refugees' rights to economic assistance and their right to work.

A financial report for 1936 showed total receipts of £259,783, with £250,000 (about \$1,250,000) to be found in 1937.

POLISH PRESS HAILS DEATH VERDICT AS "MORAL SATISFACTION"

WARSAW, June 10. (JTA) -- ABC, organ of the anti-Semitic Nara Party, today hailed as moral satisfaction for the "offended feelings of the entire Polish people" the death sentence meted out by the Warsaw District Court to Judah Leib Chatzkelewicz, Jewish ex-soldier, for the murder of a Polish sergeant.

"Three million Jews who are the enemies of the Polish State and the Polish army must be evacuated to Madagascar," the newspaper said.

The Warszawski Dzeinnik stated that the entire Polish people had interpreted the sentence as a verdict against the Jews.

Kurjer Poranny, organ of Col. Adam Koc's government party, Camp for National Unity, published the protest against the verdict issued by the Union of Jewish Journalists of Poland and declared it was not permissible to criticize the court, adding that the Jewish journalists had done no good for the Jewish people.

3 PALESTINE SOLUTIONS AIRED AT GENEVA BY BRITONS, CAIRO PAPER REPORTS

CAIRO, June 10. (JTA) -- The Arabic paper, Ahram, reports today that British representatives at Geneva had proposed to delegations from other countries three possible solutions to Arab-Jewish difficulties in Palestine, as follows:

1- Jewish immigration to be based on an understanding between Arabs and Jews under Great Britain's supervision. (The paper said this solution was unlikely because Britain did not believe in the possibility of such an agreement.)

2- Carrying out the Balfour (Jewish homeland) Declaration on new lines, the main purposes of which would be not to permit the Jews to monopolize Palestine's natural resources and to base both Arab and Jewish immigration on economic absorptive capacity. (This proposal, it was said, was not favored by the governments interested in a large Jewish emigration from their respective territories.)

3- Partition of Palestine between Arabs and Jews. (Prominent Zionists have given assurances that modern scientific methods make possible the colonization of 3,000,000 Jews in a Jewish State which would be established if the Holy Land were partitioned, Ahram said.)

Lord Plymouth Scouts Arab Report

KAUNAS, June 10. (JTA) -- The Earl of Plymouth, British Parliamentary Undersecretary for Foreign Affairs, declared to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here today that rumors that Britain was consulting the League of Nations on the Palestine problem were groundless.

PALESTINE TO GET COMMISSION'S REPORT WITHIN FORTNIGHT

JERUSALEM, June 10. (JTA) -- The Palestine Government expects to receive a copy of the Royal Commission report within a fortnight, the Hebrew daily, Davar, reports, and will have it translated into Hebrew and Arabic for issuance simultaneously with publication in London.

STATE ZIONISTS NAMED REICH JEWS' REPRESENTATIVES IN RELIEF DEALINGS

BERLIN, June 10. (JTA) -- The Labor Ministry has issued an order recognizing the State Zionist Organization of Germany as the authorized representative of the Jews in dealings with the German relief authorities.

The Union of Jewish Ex-Servicemen will continue to represent the interests of Jewish war invalids and other persons of "non-Aryan" origin in relations with the civil service authorities and, in certain instances, with the relief authorities.

REICH JEWISH SCHOOLS GET INTERIM STATE AID

BERLIN, June 10. (JTA) -- Jewish elementary schools will receive subsidies from the State until "the new legal regulations for the Jewish school system are issued," it was announced today.

STALIN TURNS ANTI-SEMITIC TO PLEASE NAZIS, LONDON POST REPORTS

LONDON, June 10. (JTA) -- The Morning Post, in a dispatch from Helsinki, Finland, a center of anti-Soviet propaganda, stated today:

"Stalin has adopted an anti-Semitic policy with the avowed intention of currying German favor and forming an alliance with Hitler to ensure an influx of German specialists to create order and progress in Soviet industry and economic life."

The Post also reported the expulsion of all Jews from the Red army and the Soviet Government.

LITHUANIA BARS FURTHER DOV HOS MEETINGS

KAUNAS, June 10. (JTA) -- The Ministry of Interior today prohibited public meetings scheduled for Dov Hos, laborite Deputy Mayor of Tel Aviv, Palestine, whose appearance at a Zionist meeting earlier this week provoked an attack by right-wing Zionists resulting in several injuries.

YOUNG "WONDER REBBE" CALLED TO ARMY SERVICE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA

PRAHA, June 10. (JTA) -- The 23-year-old "wonder rebbe," Baruch Rabinovich, son-in-law of the late Eleazar Shapiro, the "Mukacever rebbe," was called up for army service today.

Rabbi Rabinovich underwent the medical examination and was declared fit for service and commissioned in the reserve. He will serve six months in the army.

MANY ATTEND Sliosberg RITES IN PARIS

PARIS, June 10. (JTA) -- Hundreds of persons attended funeral services today for Dr. Henry Sliosberg, attorney and defender of Jewish rights in Russia before the Bolshevist revolution, who died Tuesday.

Dr. Julien Weil, Chief Rabbi of Paris, and Dr. Eisenstadt, former Chief Rabbi of St. Petersburg, Russia, officiated at the services. Among the speakers were Prof. H.A. Damard of the French Academy and Paul Miliukov, former Russian Foreign Minister.

CAHAN WINS IN LUXEBURG ELECTIONS

LUXEBURG, June 10. (JTA) -- Marcel Cahan, president of the Luxembourg Jewish Consistory, has been re-elected to Parliament in the general elections. He was the only Jewish candidate on the list of the Liberal Party.

FAREWELL RECEPTION FOR SHOLEM ASCH

NEW YORK, June 10. (JTA) -- A farewell reception for Sholem Asch, the writer, was held by the Joint Distribution Committee's Landsmanschaften and Fraternal Division at Town Hall tonight.

The speakers included Mr. Asch, Jonah J. Goldstein, B.C. Vlodeck, Jacob Fishman, S. Dingol, Chaim Groenber and Alexander Kahn. The film, "Modern Christian Gorman Martyrs," giving a picture of conditions in Germany, was shown.

RABBINICAL ASSEMBLY HITS BRITISH POLICY, BACKS ZIONIST COOPERATION

NEW YORK, June 10. (JTA) -- Continued Zionist co-operation with the Palestine government, "despite the many disappointments we suffered at the hands of British officialdom" there, was indorsed yesterday at the concluding session of the thirty-seventh annual conference of the Rabbinical Assembly of America.

The 200 rabbis who attended the three-day conference at the Jewish Theological Seminary adopted a "Pronouncement on Zionism" in which they listed many complaints against British officials, in Palestine, charging they had violated the spirit and letter of the Balfour declaration and that their laxity was responsible for violent disturbances there, but concluding with an expression of faith in "the traditional British sense of justice."

The rabbi charged the Palestine government with laxity in carrying out mandate provisions for a survey of the country, distribution of free land, and support of Jewish educational and health institutions. They advocated promotion of better understanding between Jews and Arabs, asserting that Zionist development of the country benefitted the Arabs.

Irreligion in labor organizations was deplored by the conference, which hailed the appearance in Palestine of the Hapoel Hamizrachi, religious labor movement.

The conference adopted a resolution of its social justice committee urging the United States government to explore the possibilities of an international peace-preservation parley.

Dr. Simon Greenberg, of Philadelphia, was elected president of the conference; Dr. Max Artz, of Scranton, Pa., vice-president; Rabbi Leon S. Lang, of Newark, N.J., treasurer; and Rabbis Arthur H. Neulander and Ralph Simon, of New York, secretaries.

CONFERENCE HERE MAPS DEFENSE OF POLISH JEWS

NEW YORK, June 10. (JTA) -- Two thousand representatives of Jewish organizations met at the Hotel Astor tonight to plan a program of assistance and defense of the Jews of Poland. The conference was called by the American Jewish Congress.

The meeting heard conditions in Poland denounced as a return to the Dark Ages by Jewish and non-Jewish speakers, including Dr. Harry F. Ward, Francis Biddle, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Dr. Samuel Margoshos and Jacob Fishman. Messages of support and sympathy were received from ten United States Senators, sixteen Representatives, two Governors and fifty non-Jewish religious and educational leaders.

JEWISH POPULATION OF FRANCE PUT AT 260,000

WILNO (JTA) -- Paris is the world's seventh Jewish city, an estimate by A. Menes, Jewish historian and sociologist, indicated.

The French capital has a Jewish population of between 170,000 and 190,000, Mr. Menes calculated, in an article in the May issue of the Jewish Scientific Institute's monthly magazine, the Yivo Bletter. He put the entire Jewish population of France at between 260,000 and 280,000.

This would place Paris next in rank after New York, Warsaw, Chicago, Philadelphia, Budapest and Vienna as a Jewish population center. The number includes 50,000 to 60,000 French Jews, 90,000 to 100,000 from Eastern Europe, 15,000 to 20,000 Sephardic Jews and 15,000 from Middle and Western European countries.

In the past twelve years, 35,000 Jews have been naturalized in France.

NAZI ORGAN TO PROBE "JEWRY IN RUMANIA"

BERLIN (JTA) -- The "Voelkischer Beobachter," the official organ of the Nazi Party, announces a special investigation into the Jewish question in Rumania, Czechoslovakia and Poland.

As part of this investigation it is now publishing articles from Bucharest on "Jewry in Rumania." The Nazi paper claims that Jewry has fortified its position in Rumania during the last ten years, in spite of the fact that the Rumanian people and the State are outspokenly anti-Semitic. The reason for strengthening of the Jewish position in Rumania, according to the "Voelkischer Beobachter," is that there are no individual Jewish efforts in any country, but united efforts by united Jewry in which "one branch of trade is closely connected with the other and will in time achieve a predominant position."

The anti-Semitic reaction in Rumania, the paper concludes, is older and more deeply rooted than in any other country. The Rumanian regards the Jew as an alien, and while he is ready for an understanding with other foreigners or individuals representatives of the minorities, he sees no possibility of any understanding with the Jews.

UNDER 5% OF COLLEGE STUDENTS HELD TO HAVE GOOD JEWISH BACKGROUND

CINCINNATI, June 10. (JTA) -- Less than five per cent of Jewish university students have a good Jewish background when they enter college, Dr. A.L. Sachar, national director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations reported to the second national conference of Hillel directors at Martinsville, Ohio.

The largest group of Jewish students are indifferent to Judaism upon entering college, Dr. Sachar said, while a smaller group is interested in, but abysmally ignorant of Jewish knowledge. Directors of nine of eleven of the Hillel foundations attended the conference. Alfred M. Cohen, president of B'nai B'rith, presided.

HADASSAH OPPOSES PALESTINE PARTITION SCHEME

NEW YORK, June 10. (JTA) -- Unalterable opposition to partition or cantonization of Palestine or any other measure "to whittle down the mandate that gives Jews the opportunity of creating a Jewish national home" was recorded today by the national board of Hadassah, American women's Zionist organization, at a special meeting to consider the question.
