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## ARABS ASK ROOSEVELT TO RESIST JEWS' INTERVENTION APPEAL

JERUSALEM, June 21. (JTA) -- The Palestine Arabs today appealed to President Roosevelt to resist "Jewish efforts to force the United States to intervene against the Arabs."

The Grand Mufti, Haj Amin el Hussein, in his capacity as president of the Arab Supreme Committee, cabled President Roosevelt expressing anxiety over what he called attempts by American Jews to interfere with the Arabs' "rightful demands to live freely in their own country."

The message was sent as Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, British High Commissioner for Palestine, and Roy G.B. Spicer, Inspector-General of Palestine Police and Prisons, left for London, where the Royal Commission is expected to issue its report shortly seeking a settlement of Arab-Jewish difficulties.

Before leaving for London the High Commissioner received the Grand Mufti in a lengthy interview.

## Britain Bans Processions in Jewish Quarters

LONDON, June 21. (JTA) -- The British Government today announced a ban on all public political processions in the Jewish quarters of London's East End for six weeks.

The prohibition was announced in the House of Commons by Sir Samuel Hoare, Secretary of State for Home Affairs.

Sir Samuel said that a proposed march of Sir Oswald Mosley's Fascists in the East End on July 4 had been prohibited in view of the risk of serious conflicts.

PALESTINE JEWISH LEADERS OPPOSE PARTITION PLAN

JERUSALEM, June 21. (JTA) -- Jewish religious and communal leaders in Palestine, including the chief rabbis, today gave the Jewish Telegraphic Agency a statement declaring to the Jews and to the world their opposition to any proposal for partitioning the Holy Land between Jews and Arabs.

"We proclaim our definite and firm stand against any proposal intending to limit or reduce Palestine's boundaries by partition," the statement said.

"The Jewish people, during thousands of years in exile, has never yielded its rights to the fatherland and will never yield a single foot of Palestine soil. We emphatically proclaim the complete and eternal right of the Jewish people to its fatherland within its historic boundaries and reject every consent to partition or other proposals affecting our rights."

JEWS FLEE CZESTOCHOW SUBURBS AS RIOTS SPREAD

WARSAW, June 21. (JTA) -- Scores of Jews fled from suburbs of Czestochowa today before anti-Jewish attacks spreading from the Western Polish city, where serious rioting broke out over the weekend. Complete order reigned within the city today.

Jewish families sought refuge in the center of the city or neighboring towns of Bedzin and Zawiercie while rioters set fire to a Jewish-owned timber yard and attacked a flour-mill owned by Abraham Brettler and a cabinet factory.

Many Jews were injured, at least five of them seriously, and homes and shops pillaged or set afire in the disorders which followed the murder of a Polish railway porter, allegedly by a Jewish butcher.

With tension at a high pitch, the Czestochowa Jewish Community began to register damages suffered by the Jews. The five wounded Jews are Abraham Flawnor, Meilach Shapiro, Josef Czestochonski, Grillek, and Dr. Ignacy Schreiber, a high school teacher.

Reports received here listed twenty large stores and scores of smaller ones demolished during the weekend's rioting. The Yiddish daily Haint said the rioters shouted, "Long live the national police!" as they attacked Jews' houses and shops.

In an appeal to the city's inhabitants, the Mayor of Czestochowa warned them not to take recourse to lynch law to avenge the murder of the porter, Stefan Baran.

"Such regrettable incidents harm not only the name of Czeszochowa as a religious center of Poland, but the whole Polish State and people," the Mayor declared.

A check-up today showed that during the rioting, which began Saturday night, the houses of the Jewish tradesmen, Koppel and Haberman, a baker named Eilenberg and a carpenter named Weissenberg were completely demolished, even the bedding cut up and the feathers scattered.

Several large bombs were hurled at Jewish houses, including that of the industrialist, Dr. Leopold Cohn, which was damaged.

Senator Moses Schorr, chief rabbi of Warsaw, intervened with the Interior Ministry, demanding that the authorities take more energetic steps to save the lives and property of the Czeszochowa Jews, who number 26,000 in a population of 120,000.

#### POLISH PEASANT YOUTH DEMAND JEWISH EMIGRATION

WARSAW, June 21. (JTA) -- A resolution calling the Jews "alien to the Polish people and injurious to the economic life of Poland" was adopted at an all-Polish congress of peasant youth held under the patronage of Marshal Edward Smigly-Rydz, virtual dictator of Poland.

The resolution said:

"While condemning all acts of violence, which harm the spirit of the Polish people, we state that in the overcrowded Polish State emigration must be the first concern of the Jewish masses as an element which is alien to the Polish people and injurious to the economic life of Poland."

The resolution, however, expressed a wish for friendship with the Slavic minorities in Poland.

A conference of the Warsaw district branch of the Union of Polish Physicians, attended by 300 delegates, rejected by a large majority a proposal to introduce the "Aryan paragraph" barring Jews as members. Fifteen anti-Semitic Nationalists walked out in protest, shouting, "You are Jewish!"

#### ITALIAN JEWISH COMMUNITIES' EXECUTIVE WITHDRAWS RESIGNATION

ROME, June 21. (JTA) -- A crisis in Jewish communal affairs precipitated by Fascist opposition to the Zionist movement was temporarily settled today.

On the Italian Government's request, the Executive Board of the Union of Jewish Communities withdrew its resignation tendered May 2 because of a controversy between Zionist and non-Zionist members.

The Executive, which will remain in office until new elections are held in 1938, issued an appeal to the Jews of Italy for unity.

Naval Commander Federigo Jarach, president of the Jewish Community of Milan, was elected president of the union to succeed Dr. Felice Ravenna, who died last March.

#### YOUNG ISRAEL SEEKS INTER-FAITH PARLEY ON NATIONS CURBING WORSHIP

ATLANTIC CITY, June 21. (JTA) -- Young Israel, at the closing session last night of the twenty-fifth annual convention of its national council, decided to convoke a conference of all religious denominations for united action against governments suppressing religious worship and observance.

The convention declared that all Jews faithful to the Torah would refuse to recognize agreements undermining the Jewish inheritance in the Land of Israel. A resolution requested the United States Government to demand of Great Britain that it fulfill its obligations under the Balfour Declaration.

Jacob O. Zabronsky, of Brooklyn, was elected president of the organization, Mr. Rosenzweig, treasurer, and Mr. Eidelman and Edna Ascher, secretaries.

The convention decided to take the initiative in forming a committee of all Jewish religious, educational, literary and artistic bodies to safeguard the purity of the Yiddish spoken and written word on radio, stage, and in print.

Other resolutions called for mobilization against calendar reform, urged the New York Board of Aldermen to pass immediately the Inselbuch bill granting a five-day week to city employes who are observing Jews and appealing to President Roosevelt in "the name of humanity, civilization and justice" to lift immigration restrictions for victims of persecution.

#### LABORITES GET PLURALITY IN ZIONIST ELECTIONS

NEW YORK, June 21. (JTA) -- With approximately three-fourths of the votes tallied, a large plurality was indicated late this afternoon for the Labor ticket in yesterday's nation-wide election of delegates to the forthcoming World Zionist Congress.

Samuel Schmidt, secretary of the Central Shekel Board, said that 72,974 ballots had been counted of an estimated 100,000. The vote by parties was: General Zionists, 16,367; Laborites, 29,384; Miz-rachi, 15,202; Jewish State Party, 686, and Hadassah, 11,335.



REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE 1936-1937  
JERUSALEM (JTA) -- The Palestine Government had a deficit £1,396,000 for the fiscal year ended March 31, owing to decline in revenue due to the Arab general strike and increased military expenses caused by disturbances.

Revenues were £4,620,000, £1,150,000 less than in the preceding fiscal year, and expenditures were about £6,000,000, an increase of £1,753,000. A surplus of £6,267,000 reported at the beginning of the fiscal year has been reduced to about £4,989,000.

### 3,166 ENTERED PALESTINE IN FIRST QUARTER OF 1937

JERUSALEM (JTA) -- During the first three months of this year 3,166 immigrants entered Palestine, according to official figures, compared with 9,082 in the first quarter of last year. Among the new arrivals were 477 non-Jews as against 523 last year.

The capitalist immigrants numbered 354; labor immigrants, 662, and relatives of persons already here, 1,078.

### PALESTINE PRODUCTS POPULARIZED AT HAIFA FAIR

HAIFA (JTA) -- The label "Made in Palestine" is being popularized by the first industrial fair, now under way in this city.

With ninety stands, exhibiting diverse products, the fair opened June 15 and will continue until June 28. An architectural section displays the construction of a typical "Made in Palestine" home, and another section offers lectures and demonstrations on Palestinian food and cookery.

#### Anti-Jewish Riots Renewed in Czeszochow

CZESTOCHOW, Poland, June 21. (JTA) -- Anti-Jewish riots were renewed here tonight after a mob assembled outside a hospital demanded delivery of the body of Stefan Baran, railway porter shot by a Jewish butcher, and was informed by police that Baran had already been buried.

Police with difficulty prevented the mob from attacking the hospital, and after it was dispersed the disturbances began again throughout the city. Jewish houses were attacked and windows were broken.

After three hours of clashes between police and a mob of thousands of persons the situation became calmer. Rioters attacked police, crying: "Down with the slaves of the Jews!"
