3 ARAB KILLED, ONE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED IN PALESTINE ARMY LEADERS CONFRONTATION

JERUSALEM, AUG. 15 (J. H. K. WIRELESS AGENCY) — REPORTED KILLED TODAY AS BRITISH MILITARY AUTHORITIES CONTINUED TO AVERT A THREATENED OUTBREAK OF VIOLENCE SIMILAR TO THE BANJULYAN PATRIOTIC UPRISING OF 1936.

ONE ARAB WAS FOUND KILLED IN THE SAKEDRA DISTRICT OF NEBRATINA. A SECOND FOUND WOUND TO THE HEAD IN THE HOSPITALS. ANOTHER ARAB WAS REPORTED WOUND SEVERELY IN THE DISTRICT OF NEBRATINA.

POLICE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY WERE ORDERED TO "STAND TO." STRONG RIFLE-ARMED PATROLS WATCHED JERUSALEM'S STREETS WHILE HEAVY MILITARY DETACHMENTS GUARDED THE ROADS. ARMORED POLICE CARS PATROLLED JERUSALEM AND TEL AVIV.

HEBREW NEWSPAPERS, WARNING NEW DISORDERS WERE IMMINENT, BLAMED THE PALESTINE GOVERNMENT. THE LABORITE ORGAN, DAVAR, DECLARED THE GOVERNMENT HAD FREQUENTLY BEEN WARNED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF DISORDERS AND HELD PEACE WAS IMPOSSIBLE UNLESS ORGANIZERS OF DISORDERS WERE PREVENTED FROM ACTING BY ARREST.

"ON THE STILL FRESH GRAVES OF THE INNOCENT VICTIMS WE AGAIN WARN THE PALESTINE GOVERNMENT," DAVAR CONCLUDED. HAARETZ CALLED FOR UNITY AMONG THE JEWS TO FACE EVENTUALITIES WITH COURAGE AND DETERMINATION.

ARAB NEWSPAPERS APPEALED FOR SELF-RESTRAINT, WARNING THE ARABS NOT TO GIVE GENEVA AND LONDON GROUNDS FOR STATING THAT THERE WAS NO OTHER SOLUTION OF THE PALESTINE PROBLEM BUT PARTITIONING THE COUNTRY.

SERIOUS VIEW TAKEN IN LONDON

LONDON, Aug. 31. (JTA) -- BRITISH NEWSPAPERS TODAY TOOK A SERIOUS VIEW OF THE RENEWED DISORDERS IN PALESTINE.

THE DAILY TELEGRAPH REPORTED FROM JERUSALEM: "THE ATTACKS AGAINST JEWS TEND TO CONFIRM ASSERTIONS HEARD IN THE PAST FEW DAYS IN ARTICLES THAT THE ARABS INTEND TO FOCUS ATTENTION BY MEANS SIMILAR TO LAST YEAR."

A JERUSALEM DISPATCH TO THE TIMES SAID: "THE RESTORATION OF SECURITY SEEMS TO DEPEND ON ESTABLISHMENT OF A FIXED POLICY BY THE ADMINISTRATION WHOSE IMPARTIALITY AND DETERMINATION WILL COMMAND THE RESPECT OF ALL THE INHABITANTS OF PALESTINE."

SHANGHAI RABBIS APPEAL FOR AID; VOLUNTEER REGIMENT PATROLS JEWISH QUARTERS

SHANGHAI, Aug. 31. (JTA) -- SHANGHAI RABBIS APPEALED TODAY FOR RELIEF FOR THE 5,000 JEWS AFFECTED BY THE UNDECLARED WAR. THEY SAID THE SITUATION OF THE JEWS WAS DESPERATE. FIVE HUNDRED WERE COMPLETELY DESTITUTE HERE AND ANOTHER 200 IN HONG KONG.

MANY JEWISH-OWNED SHOPS AND HOMES HAVE BEEN BURNED IN RECENT FIGHTING. THE KADOORIE CENTER HERE HAS EXPRESSED ITSELF AS UNABLE TO COPE WITH THE BURDEN OF ADMINISTERING RELIEF TO THE JEWS.

JEWISH QUARTERS OF THIS STRICKEN CITY WERE PATROLLED BY A JEWISH REGIMENT OF THE SHANGHAI VOLUNTEER CORPS PROTECTING PROPERTY OF THE INHABITANTS, EXTINGUISHING FIRES AND EVACUATING JEWS FROM DANGER ZONES TO THE FRENCH AND BRITISH SETTLEMENTS.

DEEDS OF EXTRAORDINARY HEROISM WERE ATTRIBUTED TO THE REGIMENT, COMPRISING 250 VOLUNTEERS GROUPED AROUND THE ZIONIST ORGANIZATION AND OTHER JEWISH ORGANIZATIONS. THE REGIMENT IS MAINTAINED BY THE MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL SETTLEMENT.

THE JEWISH COMMUNITY OF SHANGHAI, REPORTED BY ITS LEADERS TO BE LIVING THROUGH TERRIFYING TIMES, IS THE LARGEST IN THE FAR EAST. THE COMMUNITY WAS PLANNING TO CELEBRATE THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF ITS FOUNDING THIS FALL.

EXCESSES AVERTED IN TIENSIN

TIENSIN, CHINA, AUG. 31. (JTA) -- ANTI-JEWISH EXCESSES BY WHITE RUSSIAN MERCENARIES WERE PREVENTED HERE BY A JEWISH VOLUNTEER CORPS WHICH UNDERTOOK TO PATROL THE JEWISH DISTRICTS OF THIS CITY.

THE WHITE RUSSIANS DEMOLISHED THE SOVIET CONSULATE AND LAUNCHED A CAMPAIGN OF ANTI-SEMITIC AGITATION. THE JEWISH CORPS WAS FORMED IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CHINESE HAD WITHDRAWN.

LATER THE MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATION OF THE BRITISH AND FRENCH SETTLEMENT ALLOWED THE VOLUNTEERS TO DISBAND, EXPRESSING APPRECIATION OF THEIR BRAVERY AND DISCIPLINE.

MANY INJURED AS RIOTS SPREAD IN POLAND; BOYCOTT AGITATION GROWS

WARSAW, AUG. 31. (JTA) -- WIDESPREAD ANTI-JEWISH DISORDERS IN WHICH MANY WERE INJURED AND CONSIDERABLE PROPERTY DAMAGE WROUGHT WERE REPORTED HERE TODAY WHILE BOYCOTT AGITATION CONTINUED TO GROW IN MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

POLES AND UKRAINIANS DEMOLISHED JEWISH STALLS IN THE MARKET PLACE AT WIELKOCZ NEAR LWOW, BEAT THEIR OWNERS AND BROKE WINDOWS OF JEWISH HOUSES. THEY ATTACKED THE RABBI OF THE TOWN AND DESTROYED HIS HOUSE. MANY JEWS FLED IN PANIC TO LWOW IN FEAR OF FURTHER EXCESSES.

FOURTEEN JEWS WERE BEATEN IN ROZAN WHERE RIOTERS ALSO BROKE WINDOWS OF JEWISH HOMES. JEWISH PEDESTRIANS WERE ATTACKED AND ONE OF THEM SERIOUSLY INJURED IN HIELC BY ANTI-SEMITES WHO BROKE WINDOWS OF A SYNAGOGUE AND ALSO OF THE HOME OF A POLE WHO OPPOSED ESTABLISHING A "GHETTO MARKET" FOR JEWS.

MANY JEWISH FAMILIES FLED TO NEIGHBORING TOWNS FROM TOMHI IN THE BIALYSTOK DISTRICT AFTER RECURRENT ATTACKS BY ANTI-SEMITIC NATIONAL RADICALS IN WHICH JEWS WERE STONED, BEATEN AND OTHERWISE TERRORIZED. THOSE REMAINING RECEIVED LETTERS WARNING THEM TO LEAVE IMMEDIATELY.

ANTI-JEWISH EXCESSES WERE PREVENTED IN LOMZA BY COMBINED EFFORTS OF POLISH AND JEWISH WORKERS. THE SOCIALIST PARTY AND THE TRADES UNION COUNCIL APPEALED TO WORKERS AND PEASANTS NOT TO PERMIT EXCESSES WHILE THE BUND (JEWISH SOCIALIST PARTY) APPEALED TO THE JEWS AGAINST PANIC. THE WORKERS DECLARED A HALF-DAY GENERAL STRIKE IN PROTEST AGAINST ANTI-SEMITIC AGITATION, FORCING THE ANTI-SEMITES TO WITHDRAW FROM THE STREETS. POLICE CONFISCATED SOCIALIST LEAFLETS AND ARRESTED TWO BUND MEMBERS.

A JEWISH LAWYER, JOSEPH GARTENBERG, WAS STABBED IN THE TOWN OF DROHOBYCZ, EAST GALICIA. HIS CONDITION WAS REPORTED CRITICAL. DISORDERS OCCURRED IN OSMIANY IN THE WILNO DISTRICT AND ALSO IN WILNO, WHERE THREE ARRESTS WERE MADE.

IN SEVERAL TOWNS IN THE BIALYSTOK PROVINCE NATIONAL RADICALS DROVE JEWS OUT OF MARKET PLACES. IN ONE TOWN MANY JEWS WERE BEATEN BEFORE POLICE RESTORED ORDER.

TWENTY-TWO JEWS WERE BEATEN, SEVERAL OF THEM BEING SERIOUSLY INJURED, IN BYDGOSZCZ, FORMERLY BROMBERG, POMERANIA. THE ANTI-JEWISH BOYCOTT WAS INTENSIFIED IN THIS TOWN, WITH PICKETS BARRING CUSTOMERS FROM JEWISH SHOPS. SIMILAR BOYCOTTS WERE BEING WAGED IN KOZIGLOW IN THE WARSAW DISTRICT AND STAWSK IN THE BIALYSTOK DISTRICT.

FIVE JEWISH PASSERS-BY WERE WOUNDED BY ANTI-SEMITIC NATIONAL DEMOCRATS IN MARLKNIA IN THE BIALYSTOK DISTRICT. IN KRASNYSTAW, IN THE LUBLIN DISTRICT, SCHOOL CHILDREN PARTICIPATED IN ANTI-JEWISH ATTACKS IN WHICH SEVERAL PERSONS WERE INJURED AND ONE REMOVED TO THE HOSPITAL.

A NATIONAL RADICAL STUDENT, JERZI GLOWACKY, WAS SENTENCED TO A YEAR'S IMPRISONMENT AND A CHEMIST, WAZLA WAKOWSKI TO TEN MONTHS BY A WARSAW COURT FOR ARRANGING BOMB ATTACKS. ANOTHER STUDENT, MARIAN MITOUSKI, WAS ACQUITTED FOR LACK OF EVIDENCE.

1,600 SCHOLARS DISPLACED FROM GERMAN UNIVERSITIES FOR RACIAL REASONS

LONDON, AUG. 31. (JTA) -- THE NUMBER OF TEACHERS AND RESEARCH WORKERS DISPLACED FROM GERMAN UNIVERSITIES FOR RACIAL REASONS HAS REACHED 1,600, THE SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF SCIENCE AND LEARNING REPORTED TODAY.

OF THIS GROUP, THE REPORT SAID, 70 PER CENT ARE MARRIED AND TWO-THIRDS OF THEM HAVE CHILDREN. A TOTAL NUMBER OF 3,500 PERSONS ARE INVOLVED. THE AVERAGE PERIOD OF SERVICE OF THE SCHOLARS WAS 22 YEARS.

CONDITIONS OF SCHOLARS IN GERMANY ARE SO DESPERATE, THE SOCIETY SAID, THAT IT WAS UNABLE TO URGE THEM TO STAY IN GERMANY INSTEAD OF GOING INTO EXILE. DISPLACED SCHOLARS ARE UNABLE TO PUBLISH SCIENTIFIC WORKS IN GERMANY, DENIED ACCESS TO LABORATORIES AND LIBRARIES, NOT ALLOWED TO LECTURE ABROAD NOR ATTEND SCIENTIFIC CONGRESSES, AND SOME ARE NOT GIVEN PASSPORTS TO TRAVEL ABROAD.

THE POSITION OF GERMAN SCHOLARS ABROAD IS SATISFACTORY, THE REPORT SAYS. OF AN 800 TOTAL, 464 ARE PERMANENTLY AND 311 TEMPORARILY ESTABLISHED, WITH GOOD PROSPECTS OF FINDING PERMANENT POSITIONS FOR ALL.

THE SOCIETY ALSO ASSISTED JEWISH SCIENTISTS UNABLE TO CONTINUE THEIR WORK IN AUSTRIA, AS WELL AS SCIENTISTS FROM RUSSIA AND ITALY.
