4 KILLED, SCORES WOUNDED IN ARAB TERROR OUTBURST; JERUSALEM UNDER CURFEW

JERUSALEM, OCT. 14. (JTA) -- THREE PERSONS WERE KILLED AND AN UNASCERTAINED NUMBER INJURED TODAY WHEN A RAILWAY TRAIN WAS MINED AND SHOT UPON NEAR KALKILLIA IN A NEW OUT-BURST OF TERRORISM THAT TOOK A TOLL OF ONE ARAB KILLED AND FIFTEEN JEWS WOUNDED IN OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

THE TRAIN WAS BLOWN UP ON THE LYDDA-HAIFA LINE. THE DEAD WERE NOT IMMEDIATELY IDENTIFIED. (KALKILLIA, SCENE OF SEVERAL TRAIN WRECKS DURING THE 1936 DISORDERS, IS MIDWAY BETWEEN LYDDA AND TULKAREM.)

MOVING SWIFTLY TO COPE WITH THE NEW FLARE-UP OF VIOLENCE THAT RIVALED THE SANGUIN-ARY DAYS OF THE 1936 DISTURBANCES, THE AUTHORITIES CLAMPED DOWN A CURFEW THROUGHOUT JERUS-ALEM.

THE OUTBURST CLIMAXED A PERIOD OF TENSION AND SPORADIC VIOLENCE LEADING TO ASSASSINATION OF GALILLEE DISTRICT COMMISSIONER ANDREWS AND SUSSEQUENT SUPPRESSION OF THE ARAB SUPREME COMMITTEE, DEPOSITION OF HAJ AMIN EL HUSSEINI AS PRESIDENT OF THE MOSLEM SUPREME COMMITTEE, AND ARREST AND DEPORTATION OF FIVE PROMINENT ARAB LEADERS INCLUDING DR. HUSSEIN KHALIDI, JERUSALEM'S MAYOR.

AN ARAB PASSENGER WAS KILLED AND EIGHT JEWS WOUNDED WHEN FIVE ARABS AMBUSHED A JEW-ISH BUS PASSING MOTZA, EIGHT KILOMETERS FROM JERUSALEM, AND AFTER FIRING ON IT FROM BOTH SIDES OF THE ROAD THREW A BOMB AT THE BUS.

THREE JEWS WERE WOUNDED WHEN A BOMB WAS THROWN INTO A JEWISH BUS PASSING A HOME FOR THE AGED IN JERUSALEM. THEY WERE REMOVED TO HADASSAH HOSPITAL.

FIFTEEN ARABS ARMED WITH CLUBS AND STONES ATTACKED JEWISH PLOUGHMEN AT TIRATH-ZVI, CLAIMING THE LAND WAS THEIRS. FOUR JEWS WERE INJURED. A SPECIAL POLICEMAN FIRED THREE ROUNDS INTO THE AIR AND WAS DISARMED BY THE ARABS. TEN ARABS WERE LATER ARRESTED AND THE RIFLE WAS RETURNED.

FLAMES LIT UP THE JEZREEL VALLEY SECTION, THE JEWISH TELEGRAPHIC AGENCY WAS INFORMED BY TELEPHONE FROM BETH ALPHA, AS A HUGE FIRE BROKE OUT AT KAUKAB-EL-HAWA, NEAR THE TRANSJORDAN BORDER OF THE LOWER GALILEE. THE PIPELINES OF THE IRAQ PETROLEUM COMPANY ARE SITUATED IN THE VICINITY.

A DISTRICT OFFICER, MOUSSA KHAMISS, WAS ATTACKED AT NAZARETH BY FOUR ARMED ARABS, WHO ESCAPED AFTER HE FIRED FOUR SHOTS AT THEM.

TROOPS AND POLICE, PRESSING THE DRIVE AGAINST TERRORISTS AND AGITATORS IN PALEST-INE, SURROUNDED THE VILLAGE OF TAYIBA NEAR TULKAREM IN A SEARCH FOR ARMS AND TERRORIST SUS PECTS. TWO ARABS ATTEMPTING TO ESCAPE WERE CAUGHT BY SOLDIERS. ONE CARRYING A RIFLE WAS WOUNDED. THE AUTHORITIES WARNED THE VILLAGERS AGAINST HARBORING CRIMINALS AND THREATENED TO ESTABLISH A PUNITIVE POLICE POST THERE.

5 ARAB LEADERS BARRED FROM PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, OCT. 14. (JTA) -- FIVE MEMBERS OF THE SUPPRESSED ARAB SUPREME COMMITTEE ARE BARRED FROM RETURNING TO THE HOLY LAND, THE PALESTINE GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCED IN A SPECIAL ISSUE OF THE OFFICIAL PALESTINE GAZETTE. THEY ARE JAMAL EL HUSSEINI, NEPHEW OF THE DEPOSED GRAND MUFTI AND HEAD OF THE PALESTINE ARAB PARTY; IZZAT DARWAZE, THE EX-MUFTI'S RIGHT-HAND MAN; AUNI BEY ABOUL HADI, ARAB YOUTH LEADER; ALFRED ROCK, CHRISTIAN ARAB LEADER AND ABOUL LATIF SALACH.

SPECIAL PARLEY PROPOSED TO MAP PALESTINE JEWS' STAND ON PARTITION

JERUSALEM, Oct. 14. (JTA) -- Moshe Smilansky, president of the Jewish Farmers Association, proposed today a special conference to adopt a stand on the proposed partition of Palestine. He addressed the Jewish National Council and the Jewish Agency Executive, meeting with representatives of Palestine Jewish Groups to discuss security, political, Bodonic and Educational Problems.

THE PROPOSAL WAS MADE AFTER MENACHEM M. USSISHKIN, PRESIDENT OF THE JEWISH NATIONAL FUND, HAD PROTESTED THAT THE COUNCIL'S DELEGATION TO GENEVA HAD, WITHOUT AUTHORITY, DISCUSSED PARTITION WITH LEAGUE OF NATIONS OFFICIALS. THE DELEGATION, INCLUDING DR. A. KATZNELSON, MORDECAI ELIASH AND RABBI BEN-ZION UZIEL, REPORTED TO THE COUNCIL ON ITS ACTIVITIES.

ISAAC BEN-ZVI, PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL, EULOGIZED LEWIS Y. ANDREWS, DISTRICT COMM-ISSIONER FOR THE GALILEE, AND HIS BODYGUARD, MCEWAN, WHO WERE ASSASSINATED IN NAZARETH. TH MEETING ROSE IN THEIR MEMORY.

STUDENTS PICKET WARSAW COLLEGES IN STRIKE PROTESTING SEGREGATION

V/ARSAW, Oct. 14. (JTA) -- GUARDED BY A STRONG POLICE DETACHMENT, MORE THAN A THOUS-AND WARSAW JEWISH STUDENTS JAMMED THEIR STUDENT HOUSE TODAY AS THEY OPENED A 48-HOUR STRIK AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT-SANCTIONED INTRODUCTION OF "GHETTO BENCHES" IN THE CAPITAL'S UNIV-ERSITIES.

AT THE SAME TIME PICKET LINES WERE THROWN AROUND ALL COLLEGES. NON-JEWISH LIBERAL AND DEMOCRATIC STUDENTS, WHO HAVE PROTESTED AGAINST THE SEGRECATION OFFICE, MARCHED WITH THE JEWISH PICKETS. THE STUDENTS' STRIKE COMMITTEE CLAIMED THE STRIKE WAS 100 PER CENT EFFECTIVE.

BESIDE THE POLICE GUARD SURROUNDING THE STUDENT HOUSE IN PRAGA, A WARSAW SUBURB, A CORDON OF JEWISH STUDENT GUARDS WAS THROWN AROUND THE BUILDING, EVERY AVAILABLE INCH OF WHICH WAS CROWDED WITH STRIKERS OF BOTH SEXES. THE STUDENT GUARDS BARRED ALL STRANGERS. ONLY PERSONS BEARING STUDENT REGISTRATION CARDS WERE ADMITTED TO THE BUILDING.

ASIDE FROM THOSE ON THE PICKET LINES, A NUMBER OF LIBERAL NON-JEWISH STUDENTS PRES-ENTED THEMSELVES AT THE JEWISH STUDENT HOUSE AND OFFERED THEIR ASSISTANCE IN THE "BLOOD-LESS BLOCKAGE."

MAY HOLD HUNGER-STRIKE TODAY

THE STRIKERS, IT WAS ANNOUNCED BY THE COMMITTEE, PLANNED TO REMAIN IN THE BUILDING OVERNIGHT. THE POSSIBILITY OF TURNING THE PROTEST INTO A HUNGER STRIKE TOMORROW WAS BEING CONSIDERED.

THE JEWISH DEPUTIES CLUB, WHICH COMPRISES MEMBERS AND FORMER MEMBERS OF THE POLISH PARLIAMENT, SENT A MESSAGE TO THE STRIKERS PRAISING THEIR COURAGE IN DEFENDING "YOUR OWN DIGNITY AND THE DIGNITY OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE."

RECTORS OF THE WARSAW UNIVERSITIES ANNOUNCED A DECISION TO TAKE DISCIPLINARY MEAS-URES AGAINST THE STRIKING STUDENTS AND AGAINST ALL WHO REFUSED TO OCCUPY THE DESIGNATED BENCHES.

JEWISH AND LIBERAL STUDENTS IN KRAKOW, WILNO AND POZNAN, WHERE "GHETTO BENCHES" HAVE MOT BEEN INTRODUCED AS YET, WENT OUT ON A ONE-DAY STRIKE AS AN EXPRESSION OF SOLIDAR-ITY WITH THEIR COLLEAGUES HERE.

MME. HARAND'S ORGANIZATION PLANS WORLD CONGRESS AGAINST WAR, HATRED, POVERTY

VIENNA, Oct. 14. (JTA) -- A PROGRAM FOR A WORLD CONGRESS AGAINST WAR, HATRED AND POVERTY WAS WORKED OUT TODAY AT A CONFERENCE OF REPRESENTATIVES ABROAD OF THE WORLD ORGANIZATION TO COMBAT RACE HATRED, HEADED BY MME. IRENE HARAND, AND THE ORGANIZATION'S VIENNA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

THE CONFERENCE ISSUED A STATEMENT CALLING ON THE JEWS NOT TO BECOME DISCOURAGED AND "TO FIGHT COURAGEOUSLY FOR HUMAN RIGHTS," ASSURING THEM OF CHRISTIAN SUPPORT.

WAUCHOPE IN LONDON HOSPITAL WITH EYE AILMENT

LONDON, OCT. 14. (JTA) -- HIGH COMMISSIONER SIR ARTHUR GRENFELL WAUCHOPE HAS ENT-ERED A LONDON NURSING HOME, IT WAS LEARNED TODAY, FOR TREATMENT OF AN EYE ALMENT. SIR ARTHUR MAY BE UNDER TREATMENT THREE WEEKS, IT WAS STATED. HE HAD BEEN EXPECTED TO RETURN TO HIS POST IN JERUSALEM NEXT WEEK.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 14. (JTA) -- DR. Hugo Bergmann was elected today for the third time as rector of the Hebrew University on Mount Scopus. DR. Bergmann recently visited the University.

TOSCANINI TO ARRIVE IN PALESTINE SOON TO CONDUCT ORCHESTRA

JERUSALEM, Oct. 14. (JTA) -- ARTURO TOSCANINI IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE HERE SOON TO CONDUCT THE OPENING CONCERT OF THE PALESTINE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA, COMPOSED LARGELY OF MUSICIANS IN EXILE FROM GERMANY.

THE WORLD-FAMED ITALIAN CONDUCTOR WILL ALSO LEAD THE ORCHESTRA IN A SERIES INCLUDING APPEARANCES IN TEL AVIV NOV. 13, JERUSALEM NOV. 15 AND HAIFA NOV. 17. THE PROGRAM INCLUDES ROSSINI'S OVERTURE TO "ITALIAN IN ALGIERS"; HAYDN'S "SYMPHONY IN D" (CLOCK SYMPHONY) AND SCHUBERT'S "SYMPHONY IN C MAJOR."

A NUMBER OF OTHER FOREIGN CONDUCTORS WILL LEND THEIR COOPERATION, ACCORDING TO AN ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE ORCHESTRA MANAGEMENT, INCLUDING SIR MALCOLM SARGENT, OF LONDON, ISSAY DOBROWEN AND HANS W. STEINBERG, AND NEGOTIATIONS ARE IN PROGRESS WITH OTHERS. IT IS ALSO PLANNED TO FORM A CHAMBER MUSIC OPCHESTRA UNDER THE BATON OF MICHAEL TAUBE.

HOLY LAND THEATRE TROUPE, OHEL, MAY TOUR U.S.

JERUSALEM, OCT. 14. (JTA) -- THE OHEL HEBREW WORKERS' THEATRE IS NEGOTIATING FOR A POSSIBLE TOUR OF THE UNITED STATES, IT WAS LEARNED TODAY. H. LEIVICK, THE NEW YORK YIDDISH WRITER NOW VISITING PALESTINE, MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE NEGOTIATIONS ON HIS RETURN HOME.

GOLDMANN SEES BENES, KROFTA ON PALESTINE

PRAHA, Oct. 14. (JTA) -- Dr. Nahum Goldmann, representative of the World Zionist Executive, discussed the Palestine question in interviews with President Eduard Benes and Premier Kamil Krofta. He thanked the President for the Czechoslovak declaration on Palestine in the League of Nations Assembly, and also conveved to him the condolences of the Zionist Executive on the Death of ex-President Thomas Masaryk.
