5 ARABS DIE IN INCENDIARY FIRE; 2 POLICEMEN KILLED

JERUSALEM, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- FIVE ARABS DIED AND FIVE WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED TO-DAY IN AN INCENDIARY FIRE ON GOVERNMENT PROPERTY, WHILE THE AUTHORITIES CONFIRMED THAT TWO ARAB POLICEMEN OF A PATROL HUNTING ARAB TERRORISTS HAD BEEN KILLED.

AN ARAB BAND SET FIRE TO PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT STORES NEAR TULKAREM. AN ARAB WATCHMAN'S SON AND FOUR OTHERS DIED IN THE FLAMES. FIVE ARABS, INCLUDING A POLICEMAN, WERE SERIOUSLY BURNED IN FIGHTING THE BLAZE.

CONSTABLE YECHIA ALLAMI, ONE OF A PATROL OF THREE REPORTED MISSING SINCE THEY HAD BEEN SENT TO HUNT AN ARAB BAND WHICH ATTACKED A JEWISH BUS ON THE AGRE-SAFED ROAD, III-JURING THREE JEWS, RETURNED AND REPORTED HIS TWO COMRADES SLAIN. THEY WERE SERGEAUT SALIM ABU HARTUM AND CONSTABLE ATTAIL JIRIUS, BOTH ARAB CHRISTIAMS.

THE PATROL, WHICH WAS MOUNTED, WAS CARRYING ON ITS SEARCH FOR TWO HOURS BEFORE DUSK ON MONDAY WHEN CAPTURED BY AN ARAB BAND AFTER FIRING INTO THE AIR TO DRIVE THE TERRORISTS AWAY. POLICE AND ROYAL AIR FORCE PLANES, IN SEKING THE MISSING PATROL, HAD FIGURATIVELY MARKED OFF A TRIANGULAR AREA AS FAR AS THE SYPIAN BORDER.

MEANWHILE, TROOPS SEARCHING IN THE VICINITY OF SAFED DISCOVERED THAT THE VILLAGE OF ANDUR HAD BEEN DESERTED BY ITS INHABITANTS. AN EIGHT-YEAR-OLD BOY REPORTED THAT ALL HAD JOINED AN ARAB BAND. THE FIVE PERSONS REMAINING IN THE VILLAGE, EXCEPT THE MIKHTAR (NATIVE VILLAGE CHIEF) WERE ARRESTED.

A MILITARY COURT TODAY SENTENCED AN ARAB NAMED MOHAMMED SOURCE TO SEVEN YEARS IMPRISONMENT FOR POSSESSION OF ARMS IN THE THIRD CONVICTION FOR CARRYING ARMS SINCE THE ARMY COURTS WERE ESTABLISHED NOV. 18. THE GOVERNMENT WARNED ARAB RAILWAY WORKERS, ESPECIALLY ENGINEERS, THAT PERSONS COMMITTING SABOTAGE WOULD BE TRIED BY THE MILITARY COURTS.

THE SARID COLONY WAS HEAVILY FIRED UPON. GHAFFIRS (SPECIAL GUARDS) REPLIED TO THE GUNFIRE.

NEW HIGH COMMISSIONER TO BE ANNOUNCED SOON

LONDON, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- A New British High Commissioner for Palestine will be announced shortly, Colonial Secre#ary William Ormsby-Gore told Commons today, to succeed Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, who is resigning early in 1938.

THE GOVERNMENT, LIT.WAS LEARNED UNDEFLICIALLY, HAS DECIDED TO APPOINT A CIVILIAN TO THE POST IN ORDER TO AVOID CLASHES ON MILLTARY POLICY BETWEEN THE HIGH COMMISSIONER AND THE COMMANDER OF BRITISH ARMED FORCES IN PALESTINE, WHO IS NOW MAJOR-GENERAL ARCHIBALD P. WAVELL.

THIS DECISION ELIMINATES FROM CONSIDERATION FIELD MARSHAL SIR PHILIP CHETWODE, WHO HAD BEEN MENTIONED IN SOME QUARTERS IN CONNECTION WITH THE APPOINTMENT, ALTHOUGH HIS ADVANCED AGE - HE IS 68 - WOULD BE ANOTHER OBSTACLE TO HIS BEING NAMED. SIR JOHN ANDERSON, FORMER GOVERNOR OF BENGAL, IS ALSO DEEMED OUT OF THE RUNNING BECAUSE HE IS BELIEVED WORN OUT BY HIS SERVICE IN INDIA AND NEEDS RECUPERATION.

THERE IS DEEP DISAPPOINTMENT IN OFFICIAL CIRCLES AT WHAT IS REGARDED AS THE BAD DETERIORATION OF THE POSITION IN PALESTINE DURING THE PAST FEW YEARS. FOREIGN PROTAGANDA, ESPECIALLY OVER ITALIAN RADIO, IS HELD LARGELY RESPONSIBLE, BUT IT IS AN UNDOUBTED AND UNFORTUNATE FACT THAT THERE IS A FIXED IMPRESSION THAT THE "LARGE AMOUNT" OF JEWISH IMMIGRATION DISTURBED THE ARABS TO SUCH AN EXTENT THAT IT HAS SPREAD UNEASINESS AMONG BRITISH AUTHORITIES.

STUDENT SEGREGATION SEEN PRELIDE TO GENERAL "GHETTO" DRIVE; WILLNO PROFESSORS REBEL

WARSAW, DEC. 1. (JTA) -- JEWISH MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT, DECLARING INTRODUCTION OF "GHETTO" BENCHES IN COLLEGES WAS ONLY THE PRELUDE TO A DRIVE FOR A GENERAL GHETTO, AND ASSERTING THE JEWISH POPULATION WOULD NEVER CONSENT TO SUCH A MEASURE, PREPARED TODAY ON INTERPELLATION ON SEGREGATION IN UNIVERSITIES AS THE SEJM (LOWER PARLIAMENTARY HOUSE) RECONVENED.

A NUMBER OF WILMO UNIVERSITY PROFESSORS REBELLED, MEANWHILE, AGAINST INSTITUTION OF "GHETTO" BENCHES FOR JEWISH STUDENTS, ANNOUNCING THEY WOULD NOT ENFORCE THE RECTOR'S DECREE.

PROF. WILFRED KRIDL, OF THE POLISH LITERATURE DEPARTMENT, WENT SO FAR AS TO REMOVE FROM HIS LECTURE ROOM THE BULLETIN ANNOUNCING THE "GHETTO" REGULATIONS. HE TOLD JEWISH STUDENTS TO SIT WHERE THEY PLEASED IN THE CLASSROOM, DESPITE PROTESTS OF ANTI-SEMITIC NATIONALIST STUDENTS WHO HAD FORCED INSTITUTION OF THE SEGREGATION SYSTEM NOW IN EFFECT INMANY POLISH UNIVERSITIES.

THE UNIVERSITY RECTOR REFUSED TO RECEIVE A DELEGATION OF JEWISH STUDENTS TO DISCUSS HIS DECREE, WHICH WENT INTO EFFECT NOV. 26.

NEW TRIAL ORDERED IN BRZESC SLAYING; DEATH SENTENCE HELD TOO SEVERE

WARSAW, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- THE HIGH COURT TODAY ANNULLED A DEATH SENTENCE AGAINST WOLF SZCERBOWSKI, 18-YEAR-OLD BRZESC-LITEWSKI JEWISH YOUTH WHOSE SLAYING OF A POLISH POLICEMAN LAST SPRING SET OFF A POGROM IN WHICH 50 JEWS WERE WOUNDED, THREE OF THEM FATALLY. A NEW TRIAL BEFORE THE COURT OF APPEALS WAS ORDERED WHEN THE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR VOICED THE BELIEF THAT THE DEATH SENTENCE, PASSED LAST JUNE, WAS TOO SEVERE PUNISHMENT.

APPEAL OF PARIS COMMITTEE ATTRACTS ATTENTION IN POLAND

WARSAW, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- Polish newspapers are publishing the appeal recently issued in Paris by the Committee for the Defense of the Rights of Jews in Central and Eastern Europe, calling on Poland to grant Jews Equality of Rights with other citizens. The appeal was signed by Senator Justin Godart, president of the committee, and 23 other French leaders in Political, religious and cultural life.

KURJER PORANNY, NATIONALIST DAILY, POINTING OUT THAT THE APPEAL IS COUCHED IN MODERATE LANGUAGE, DECLARES ITS AUTHORS HAVE BEEN INFLUENCED BY ONE-SIDED INFORMATION. "THE JEWISH QUESTION," THE PAPER ASSERTS, "CANNOT BE SOLVED BY APPEALS. THE SIGNATORIES MUST DOBTAIN ITS SPEEDY SOLUTION IN THE INTERNATIONAL FORUM."

JEWISH LEADERS DECIDED TO PRINT 100,000 OF THE APPEAL AND TO CIRCULATE IT AMONG POLISH INTELLECTUALS.

19 TO BE TRIED FOR BUDAPEST UNIVERSITY DISORDERS

LONDON, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- ANTI-JEWISH DISORDERS WHICH OCCURRED NOV. 16 AT BUDAPEST UNIVERSITY WERE NOT SERIOUS AND WERE QUICKLY SUPPRESSED BY THE POLICE, HUNGARIAN MINISTER CONSTANTIN MASIREVICH STATED TODAY TO THE JEWISH TELEGRAPHIC AGENCY. NINETEEN OF FORTY DEMONSTRATORS ARRESTED WILL BE TRIED FOR DISTURBING THE PEACE, HE SAID.

"As regards my Government's attitude to such incidents," Dr. Masirevich declared,
"I would emphatically assure you that the Hungarian Government deeply deplore any manifestations of anti-Jewish feeling, and the authorities have strict orders to suppress any incidents and to proceed with the full vigor of the LAW against the culprits."

(A J.T.A. BUDAPEST DISPATCH SAID THE DISORDERS TOOK PLACE IN THE PHYSIOLOGICAL INSTITUTE OF THE BUDAPEST UNIVERSITY FOLLOWING A RUMOR THAT JEWISH STUDENTS WOULD AGAIN BE ALLOWED TO OBTAIN THEIR DEGREES. A DOZEN STUDENTS ATTEMPTED TO FORCE THEIR WAY INTO THE CENTRAL BUILDING OF THE UNIVERSITY, BUT THE AUTHORITIES TOOK TIMELY MEASURES TO PREVENT ANY SERIOUS INCIDENTS. MORE SERIOUS ANTI-JEWISH DISORDERS OCCURRED AT THE FACULTY OF PHILOSOPHY. THE ANTI-SEMITIC STUDENTS ATTACKED THEIR JEWISH COLLEAGUES AND SANG NAZI SONGS NINETEEN ANTI-SEMITIC STUDENTS WERE ARRESTED.)

MILNO, POLAND, DEC. 1. (JTA) -- MAXIMILIAN ROSE, PROFESSOR OF NEUROLOGY AT WILNO UNIVERSITY, DIED SUDDENLY TODAY DURING A LECTURE. HE WAS 54 YEARS OLD. PROF. ROSE WAS THE SCIENTIST WHO DISSECTED THE BRAIN OF MARSHAL JOSEPH PILSUDSKI.

NEW MACCABI HEADQUARTERS OPENED IN LONDON

LONDON, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- Maccabi House, New London Headquarters of the world Jewish sports organization, was open to the public today following ceremonies at which Lord Melchett, Hondrary president, And other prominent Britons delivered addresses. Declaring there has never been a more difficult time for Jewry than the present, Lord Melchett said no movement provided a more adequate answer than the Maccabi.

TELEPHONES INCREASE 26 PER CENT IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM (JTA) -- THE NUMBER OF TELEPHONES IN PALESTINE ROSE FROM 11,412 AT THE END OF AUGUST, 1936, TO 14,452 A YEAR LATER, REPRESENTING AN INCREASE OF 26.6 PER CENT, ACCORDING TO A BULLETIN OF THE GOVERNMENT OFFICE OF STATISTICS. REVENUE FROM TELEPHONES, WHICH ARE OPERATED BY THE GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT OF POSTS AND TELEGRAPHS, REACHED 151,685. IN THE FIRST EIGHT MONTHS OF 1937 AS COMPARED WITH E118,452 IN THE CORRESPONDING PERIOD LAST YEAR.

UNTERMYER CALLS EMERGENCY CONFERENCE AFTER APPEAL FROM POLISH JEWS

NEW YORK, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- More than 100 leaders of the New York Jewish community have accepted the invitation of Samuel Untermyer to attend a special emergency conference Sunday aftermoon at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel, to aid the American Committee for the Relief of Jews in Poland. Mr. Untermyer said in his letter of invitation, he was calling the conference as the result of an urgent plea for help cabled last week from Poland and signed by thirteen outstanding leaders of Polish Jewry.

NEW YORK, Dec. 1. (JTA) -- PUBLICATION OF THE YIDDISH TRANSLATION OF THE BIBLE BY YEHOASH, THE NOTED POET AND AUTHOR, TOGETHER WITH THE HEBREW TEXT IS BEING PLANNED BY HIS HEIRS, THE YEHOASH FARLAG GEZELSHAFT AND A GROUP OF FRIENDS.

THE FRIENDS HAVE FORMED THE YEHOASH POPULAR-EDITION BIBLE COMMITTEE, HEADED BY DR. CHAIM ZHITLOWSKY, WHICH HAS ISSUED AN APPEAL TO LEARNED SOCIETIES, CHARITY FEDERATIONS, FOUNDATIONS, NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS, RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS AND INDIVIDUALS TO AID IN THE PROJECT. THE EDITION IS SCHEDULED TO APPEAR IN 1938.
