PROTECTORATE JEWS GET 3 WEEKS TO LEAVE OR BE SHIPPED TO 'RESERVATION'

PARIS, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- Three weeks' notice was given to the Jews in the Bohemia-Moravia Protectorate today to emigrate or prepare for expulsion to the Jewish "reservation" in Poland, according to information received in Paris.

(The Essener National Zeitung, a Nazi organ, reported last week that the Jewish population of the Protectorate was 90,147, including 51,178 persons over the age of 40 and 10,142 under 15.)

Polish official sources reported from German frontier points that removal of Jews from the Protectorate to the Lublin and Sosnowiec regions of Poland would begin on Feb. 1 and that each Jew would be permitted to take along a maximum of 5,000 kronen and a few personal belongings, the rest of their property to be confiscated.

The Polish information added that instructions had been issued to local Nazi authorities throughout Bohemia-Moravia "to make life for the Jews so miserable that they will hasten to leave the Protectorate."

Jews in the Protectorate were subjected to Nazi raids on their homes in which all moveable property was confiscated, the report added.

BRITISH FOREIGN OFFICE WARNS AGAINST ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION TO PALESTINE

LONDON, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- A warning against illegal immigration to Palestine was issued by the Foreign Office today in the following statement:

"It is reported that certain shipping agencies are organizing the transport of emigrants from the Danubian countries to Palestine. There is reason to believe that the intending emigrants do not know that they will not be admitted unless they possess immigration certificates and that if they arrive without certificates they are liable to serious penalties and to be deported under Palestine law.

"It is furthermore alleged that the ships on which the emigrants travel at great expense are small, unsanitary and unseaworthy. The captains and crews of these ships do not appear to know that if they carry passengers not legally entitled to land they themselves are liable to arrest and heavy fine."

WAR OFFICE PROBES ANONYMOUS ATTACK ON HORE-BELISHA, JEWS TYPED ON ITS STATIONERY

LONDON, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- An anonymous letter violently abusing the outgoing War Secretary, Leslie Hore-Belisha and Jews, was being investigated today by officials of the department. The letter was typed on a sheet of official War Office stationery.

Although the letter was apparently the work of a fanatical anti-Semite who signs himself "loyal Englishman," the War Office has taken a serious view of the matter. Officials want to know whether the writer is an employe of the War Office and, if not, how he secured a piece of War Office stationery.

RUMANIA PRESSES OUSTER OF 200 JEWS FROM U.S.-OWNED TELEPHONE COMPANY

LONDON, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- It was reliably learned from Bucharest today that 200 persons are affected by the Government's demand that the Rumanian Telephone Company dismiss Jewish employes.

Discharge of the Jews is already going on systematically. Among the employes to be dismissed are some who have served the company at least ten years. No new Jewish employes have been taken on since the beginning of last year.

The company, which holds the telephone monopoly in Rumania, was founded by the International Telegraph and Telephone Co. of New York and is managed by an American staff especially delegated to Europe.

No Control Over Employes in Rumania, I.T. & T. States Here

NEW YORK, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- Kenneth Stockton, executive vice-president of International Telegraph and Telephone Company, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that he had not heard of the discharge of Jewish employes by the Rumanian Telephone Company.

Mr. Stockton said that I.T. and T. had no control over the employes of the Rumanian company. The American company operates the Rumanian telephone lines under concession from the Rumanian Government, which stipulated that all employes be governed by the civil service requirements set up by Bucharest. There are only about 10 or 12 Americans on the Rumanian staff, he said.

GOLDMANN TO SEEK UNITED RELIEF ACTION DURING 3-WEEK VISIT HERE

PARIS, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- Dr. Nahum Goldmann, chairman of the executive committee of the World Jewish Congress, and the Rev. Maurice L. Perlzweig, head of its British section, left Paris yesterday for a visit to the United States under the auspices of the American Jewish Congress. Dr. Goldmann intends to remain in the United States three weeks and Dr. Perlzweig for a longer period.

The two left for Lisbon, intending to board a Pan-American Clipper if one is available, otherwise to sail on the Italian liner Vulcania, which is scheduled to reach New York on Jan. 17. In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency before leaving, Dr. Goldmann outlined the purpose of his visit to America as follows:

(1) To discuss with the American Jewish Congress a program of furthering the world congress's work in view of the European situation;

(2) Make an effort to organize a united front in European relief work, especially with regard to negotiations with the Red Cross in Europe for delivery of food and clothing to Jews in Nazi-occupied Poland;

(3) Negotiate for creation of a united front of Jewish organizations interested in preparations for presenting the Jewish case to any future peace conference

Emphasizing that the time for a peace conference had not yet come, Dr. Goldmann declared that nevertheless an institute was being established by the world congress in Geneva to study the accomplishments toward protection of minority rights resulting from the Versailles Treaty and determining to what extent the system of minorities protection could be improved through the experience of recent years.

PERUVIAN PARLIAMENT REJECTS ANTI-SEMITIC BILL AFTER HEATED DEBATE; VOTE IS 55-24

LIMA, Peru, Dec. 28. (JTA--By Airmail) -- After a heated debate, Parliament today rejected by a vote of 55 to 24 a bill urging registration and control of all Jewish residents as a "precautionary measure" against war profiteering in commodities. The debate was the first in which Jews were the issue.

Many deputies warmly defended the Jews, while one Jewish deputy, M. Cohen, who has been inactive in Jewish circles, asserted in a spirited speech that he was a greater Peruvian patriot and had done more for his country than the author of the anti-Semitic measure.

It was pointed out that Jews played virtually no role in the Peruvian food industry, which is controlled by Italians, Japanese and Chinese.

RED CROSS SUPPLIES ON WAY TO CRACOW FROM GENOA

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- Large quantities of medicines, shoes, clothing, blankets, sheeting and surgical dressings shipped on the Vulcania by the American Red Cross for the relief of sick and wounded in German-occupied Poland have arrived in Genoa, Italy, and are now en route to Cracow, according to cabled advices received here today. Additional supplies on other ships are believed to have cleared the blockade and will be landed in Italian ports this week, the advices stated.

James T. Nicholson, of the American Red Cross mission in Europe, arrived in Berlin today where he will allocate the supplies from a Cracow warehouse in conjunction with the German Red Cross. The material will be distributed through the Polish Red Cross and other existing welfare agencies, including Jewish groups.

ADMINISTRATION MOVES TO END DIES COMMITTEE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- Administration leaders today decided to attempt to block in the House Rules Committee the proposal to continue the Dies Committee for another year.

After a conference with President Roosevelt, Rules Committee Chairman Adolf Sabath said he felt that any more money appropriated for the Dies Committee would be money "thrown away." The Committee, he said, would defer action on the resolution to continue the un-American activities investigation until Dies, who has been reported in ill health, returns to Washington from Texas.

WOMEN'S TEMPLE GROUP HOLDS ANNUAL SESSION HERE

NEW YORK, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- The executive board of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods opened a two-day annual meeting at Temple Emanu-El Community House today, discussing action on the peace program of the National Peace Conference and considering a petition initiated by the American Committee for Democracy and Intellectual Freedom calling on the House to discontinue the Dies Committee. Luncheon was served to the 60 delegates by refugees being retrained for domestic service. Speakers included President Mrs. Leon Waters and Dr. Jonah B. Wise.

WEIZMANN TO BE HONORED AT RALLY, DINNER HERE NEXT WEEK

NEW YORK, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- Dr. Chaim Weizmann, scheduled to arrive in New York on the Italian liner Rex on Friday, will be guest of honor at a meeting to be sponsored by the Zionist Organization of America next Tuesday evening at Mecca Temple. The following night, Wednesday, Dr. Weizmann and Salmann Schocken, chairman of the Hebrew University's executive council, will be guests at a dinner given by the American Friends of the Hebrew University at the Hotel Commodore. Dr. Weizmann is chairman of the university's board of governors.

LEON MIZRAHI NAMED LEADER OF RUMANIAN ZIONISTS

BUCHAREST, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- The 23rd conference of the Zionist Organization in Old Rumania yesterday elected Advocate Leon Mizrahi as president, heading an all-faction executive committee.

Former Deputy Mishu Weissman, chairman of the Zionist Superior Council, cabled Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, who is en route to the United States, asking him to convey to American Jews a message urging the strongest efforts for the upbuilding of Palestine.

SOVIET SENDS 100 UKRAINE FAMILIES TO BIRO-BIDJAN

MOSCOW, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- In accordance with a decision of the Soviet Emigration Department, 100 Jewish families from the Ukraine will shortly be sent to the autonomous Jewish region of Biro-Bidjan in Siberia to strengthen local Jewish collective farms. It is reported that new houses have already been built for them in the best collective farms of the region.

DISGUISED GERMAN GOODS SEIZED IN PALSTINE

TEL AVIV, Jan. 9. (JTA) -- An alert customs official today frustrated an attempt to bring German goods into Palestine under the guise of Yugoslavian products. The official seized several hundred electric irons marked "made in Yugoslavia" because he knew that Yugoslavia did not manufacture irons. The German labels had been obliterated.
