NAZIS SHOOT 100 POLES FOR EVERY GERMAN SLAIN, NEUTRAL OBSERVERS REPORT

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- Nazi elite guards are shooting 100 Poles for every German killed, it was reported today by neutral observers arriving here from Poland. Ten Poles are executed for every Pole found with a rifle; they asserted.

The observers reported that the Nazi authorities force terrorized Polish crowds to assemble in public squares to witness the mass executions.

Officers of the German Army were said to be indignant at the excesses of the Nazi guards and were quoted as threatening openly: "The day will come when we shall get rid of these brutes who dishonor the German name."

New Anti-Semitic Films Made in Lodz

COPENHAGEN, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- New anti-Semitic films are now being produced in Lodz, Nazi Poland. The Nazi press reports that Prof. Muellerfeld, president of the Reich Film Academy, has arrived in Lodz with his entire staff to supervise production of the films.

The Stuermer, anti-Semitic weekly published in Nuremberg by Julius Streicher, demands that Germany introduce yellow badges and other ghetto measures similar "to Warsaw and Lodz" for the Jews in the Reich proper. The Reich Jews, the paper asserts, are the same as Poland's and must be similarly marked so that they might be identified by all.

Polish Diplomat Gets Report on Jewish Position

LONDON, Jan. 10. (JTA) -- A memorandum outlining the tragic position of the Jews in Nazi Poland was handed to Polish Ambassador Raczynski today by H.A. Goodman, secretary of the religious organization Agudath Israel.

In turning over the document, Mr. Goodman urged that the Polish Government-inexile issue a new declaration affirming unequivocally the equality of Jewish rights in a post-war Poland.

Raczynski promised to transmit the memorandum and Mr. Goodman's suggestions to his Government. He also promised to intervene to facilitate the entry to England of former Senstor Jacob Trockenheim and Deputy Leib Minczberg, both refugees in Wilno, Lithuania.

NAZI-SOVIET PACT SPURS ANTI-CHRISTIAN DRIVE IN GERMANY

BERNE, Switzerland, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- Large-scale anti-Christian propaganda, stimulated by the Nazi-Soviet pact, is under way in Germany, it was reported today by the Swiss Evangelical Press Service.

The service produced a leaflet, said to be widely circulated in Berlin schoolsby the "German Faith" movement, containing the following catechism: "Who is a Christian?" "No German." "Who can be a Christian?" "No German." "What is Christianity?" "Christianity is the assassination of the people under the cover of religion. The Jew Disraeli said openly what we know to be true today: 'Christianity is Judaism for non-Jews.' For 1,000 years Germany shed its blood in struggle for a foreign God. For 1,000 years Christianity represented the murder of the people.

"You, German brother, were humiliated under the cross, yet you never were Christian. Do you want to continue to vegetate in this mediocrity and mental sluggishness? Mediocrity is unworthy of a German! Become a member of the 'German faith. "

7 SEIZED IN HUNGARY AS MEMBERS OF NAZI TERRORIST BAND

EUDAPEST, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- The authorities today arrested seven persons charged with belonging to a secret Nazi terrorist organization. One of the suspects is the lawyer for Major Ferenc Szalasy, imprisoned Hungarian Nazi leader.

It was also reported that the authorities planned to have parliamentary immunity stripped from two Nazi deputies to permit their arrest on similar charges.

ANTI-REFUGEE AGITATION STIRRED UP BY GERMAN COLONY IN CHILE

SANTIAGO DE CHILE, Chile, Jan. 10. (JTA - By Airmail) -- The arrival of 500 Jewish refugees on the Italian liner Augustus in Valparaiso late last month has stirred up much controversy in Chilean circles, according to the Catholic newspaper El Diario Ilustrado.

A protest meeting of Chilean merchants and industrialists to stop Jewish refugee immigration was held in Temuco and they organized "to defend their interests against new competitors," the newspaper reports.

There are 2,000 Jews in Temuco and 52 Jewish stores established many years ago. Jewish leaders there charge that the anti-refugee and anti-Jewish propaganda is organized by the German colony in Chile. A parliamentary commission is studying the question of immigration of Jewish refugees into Chile.

A day before the arrival of the 500 Jewish refugees, a heated debate took place in the Chamber of Deputies. Deputy Benjamin Claro asked the Government to institute rigid control over refugee immigration and see that refugees do not stay in Santiago but are moved to rural districts.

Marley Urges Canada to Accept Refugees

OTTAWA, Ont., Jan. 19. (JTA) -- Lord Marley, British authority on refugees, urged in an address last night that Canada permit the entry of a small number of Jewish refugees periodically. Such a policy, he declared, would present no economic problem. Every country, Lord Marley said, recognized that the refugee problem was a Christian as well as a Jewish one.

Following his address, the reorganized Ottawa branch of the Canadian National Committee for Victims of Political Persecution unanimously adopted a resolution urging loosening of the Canadian immigration laws to permit the admission of a greater number of refugees. Practically every woman's organization in the capital was represented at the meeting, with Lady Tweedsmuir also attending.

Welsh Mayor to Aid Exiles

CARDIFF, Wales, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- The Lord Mayor announced today that he will launch a citizens' appeal on behalf of refugees.

Refugee Commits Suicide on Way Here

NEW YORK, Jan. 18. (JTA) -- A Jewish refugee from Germany, Manfred Bender, 36, haunted by memories of his experiences an a Nazi concentration camp, committed suicide while en route to the United States on the British liner Scythia by leaping overboard, his widow revealed today when the ship arrived here.

VATICAN LOCATES BOSTON JEW'S KIN IN WARSAW AFTER OTHERS FAIL

BOSTON, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- Jacob Freedman, a Boston tailor, has obtained word that his sister and nephews in Warsaw are in good health, through the assistance of the Vatican. He wrote to Pope Pius for aid after the American State Department and International Red Cross had been unable to help him.

From Cardinal Luigi Maglione, Papal Secretary, he received the reply: "La Segretaria di Stato di Sua Santita begs to inform Jacob Freedman that Mrs. Chana Frydman and her sons are in good health and still reside in Warsaw, ul Suadlecka 18."

Freedman commented to the Boston Globe: "I don't know the words to express what I feel, that they should take an interest in us with all the other things in the world to worry them. I think it's the finest, most wonderful thing. So human, so much love and humanity."

LONDON BETH DIN ACTS TO FACILITATE 'AGUNAH' DIVORCES

LONDON, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- A decision to facilitate Jewish religious divorce for the "agunah", wife who has not heard from her husband in many years, was announced today by the Beth Din, Jewish religious court.

The move, taken to avoid the same "agunah" problem which arose from the last war, provides for the signing of a declaration by departing Jewish soldiers before the Beth Din or a competent rabbi and two witnesses. By this declaration the husband, before his departure for war service, can give instructions for divorce to go into effect four or five years after the date of the declaration, if at that time there is no definite news as to his being alive or dead.

'CHRISTIAN MOBILIZER' MOVE TO HALT U.S. PROBE OF ANTI-SEMITES FAILS

NEW YORK, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- Supreme Court Justice Louis A. Valente yesterday summarily dismissed a petition by the Christian Mobilizers for an injunction to restrain the Justice Department from inquiring into its affairs and from using income tax, passport and foreign agents laws against anti-Semitic organizations. Counsel for the Mobilizers said an Appellate Division review would be sought.

POLISH JEWS' FEDERATION PROTESTS SENDING OF HALLER TO U.S.

NEW YORK, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- The Federation of Polish Jews in America today voiced its protest at the choice of General Jozef Haller, member of the exiled Polish cabinet, as good-will emissary to this country. General Haller arrived here last Friday on the Rex. The action, in the form of a resolution adopted by the federation's political committee, was based on the ground that General Haller's record was one of consistent hostility to the Jews and to democratic ideals.

FIRST ITALIAN ZIONIST SOCIETY FORMED HERE

NEW YORK, Jan. 19. (JTA) -- Organization of the first Italian Zionist unit in this country, affiliated with the Zionist Organization of America, was announced today.

The unit, named the Commander Levi Bianchini Society in honor of the man who was killed in an Arab ambush while heading an Italian naval mission to Palestine after the war, is headed by Giuseppe Bertel, president, noted radiologist formerly on the faculty of Bologna University, and Dr. Edward D. Kleinlerer, former J.T.A. correspondent in Rome, vice-president. Secretary is Engineer Luzatto, nephew of the well-known Italian Jewish scholar, Samuel Luzzatto. The society has a membership of 50.

NAZIS' ARAB ANNOUNCER ONCE WORKED FOR JEWISH PUBLISHERS

PARIS (JTA - By Mail) -- The Arab announcer of the Berlin radio station, Hassan, who translates Hitler's speeches into Arabic and whose broadcasts are part of the Nazi Near East propaganda drive, was formerly the protege of wealthy Berlin Jews and was employed by the Jewish-owned publishing house Ullstein-Verlag, it is revealed in the German emigre paper, Das Neue Tagetuch, published in Paris.

Hassan was known for his friendly relations with Berlin Jews. The poems he wrote for the Ullstein Press were sometimes inspired by his Jewish friends. Hassan, under which pseudonym he now broadcasts, was educated in the German colony in Palestine. He wrote a play based on the life of Joseph Trumpeldor and Jewish nationalistic ideas, for which Israel Zangwill wrote an introduction.
