2 RED CROSS AGENTS ARRIVE IN CRACOW TO SUPERVISE RELIEF

WASHINGTON, March 4. (JTA) -- Wayne Chatfield Taylor and James T. Nicholson, delegates of the American Red Cross, arrived today in Cracow to arrange distribution of eight carloads of medical supplies and warm clothing sent from the United States for relief of the Polish population, it was announced here by the American Red Cross.

Taylor and Nicholson will remain in Cracow for two weeks. They will allocate the supplies, in cooperation with the German Red Cross, to at least six Polish agencies, including Jewish groups, which will distribute them to the civil population in the Warsaw Lublin, Radom and Cracow areas. The German Government has given assurances to the Red Cross that these supplies will not be claimed by the military authorities.

MANY DOCTORS, LAWYERS SEIZED IN NEW RAIDS IN NAZI POLAND

COPENHAGEN, March 4. (JTA) -- A new wave of arrests and increased persecution of Jewish professionals was reported today from Warsaw and other cities in German-occupied Poland.

Large numbers of Jewish lawyers, doctors and other professionals are among those detained in the notorious Pawiak prison in Warsaw. Thousands leave their homes nightly and hide in order to avoid arrest.

In the acute food shortage prevailing in the whole of the Nazi-occupied territory, Jews particularly are finding it most difficult to obtain food, not even being allowed to approach the peasant carts in the markets.

Jewish women who previously had ventured out into the streets to search for food and fuel are now afraid to leave their homes since recently women as well as young girls are being systematically rounded up by the Nazis for forced labor and accorded treatment even more brutal than the men.

MOVE FOR WELLES TALKS WITH POLISH LEADERS REVEALED IN WASHINGTON

WASHINGTON, March 4. (JTA) -- Secretary of State Cordell Hull today indicated that conversations have been held concerning the possibility that Undersecretary Sumner Welles, who is surveying conditions in belligerent countries, will talk with the heads of the exiled Polish Government in Paris. He would not say whether an interview with the Polish leaders had been arranged.

BAN ON PRESS JOBS FOR REFUGEES LIFTED IN LITHUANIA; REPATRIATION TALKS SET

KAUNAS, Lithuania, March 4. (JTA) -- The authorities today announced removal of a ban on employment of refugees in local and foreign newspaper work.

A German delegation has arrived here to negotiate with regard to repatriation of refugees and interned Poles to German-occupied Poland. From 3,000 to 5,000 persons are affected.

The Government has withdrawn its suspension of the Revisionist weekly Nayer Veg, one of six Jewish newspapers suspended because of a paper shortage.

Israel Bernstein, special representative of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society of New York, has arrived here for a stay of several weeks. He will survey the refugee situation both here and in Wilno.

CONGRESS URGED TO QUIT PRO-ALIEN GROUP FOR FAILURE TO HIT TOTALITARIANISM

WASHINGTON, March 4. (JTA) -- Mrs. Lawrence Koenigsberger, delegate of the American Jewish Congress women's division to the conference of the American Committee for the Protection of the Foreign Born, has recommended to the Congress that it withdraw its affiliation with the committee, she told the J.T.A. today.

Her action came as the result of the conference's rejection of a resolution condemning totalitarianism. The resolution was voted down by what Mrs. Koenigsberger charged were railroad tactics last night. She said that most of the delegates had left the conference. Her letter recommending withdrawal from the committee was sent to the Congress headquarters in New York.

Mrs. Koenigsberger, only delegate of a Jewish organization on the conference floor when the resolution was brought up, warned that failure of the resolution to pass would give new ammunition to those who would place new restrictions on aliens. Backing her stand in favoring the resolution were the Roland German American Democratic Society the Workers' Defense League and the Workman's Benefit Fund.

Immediately after hearing that the resolution condemning totalitarianism had been defeated, Chairman Martin Dies of the House Committee Investigating un-American Activities, announced that the organization to protect the foreign born has been suspected of Communist leanings for some time, and that certain of its members may be summoned before his committee.

The conference in other resolutions voiced strong opposition to the 100-odd anti-alien bills now pending before Congress, and urged immediate defeat of seven bills including those introduced by Representatives Starnes and Dempsey, both members of the Dies committee. Another resolution stated the committee "will actively combat and expose all organized or unorganized effort to deport individual aliens, whether they entered the United States illegally or on visitors' permits, who are in danger of death, imprisonment or torture if deportation is effected to the country of origin."

ITALIAN JEWESS GETS 4-MONTH TERM FOR GIBE AT PROFESSOR; VERDICT JEERED

ROME (JTA) -- Marcella Olschky, pretty 19-year-old junior student at the Dante Junior Academy in Florence, has been sentenced to four months' interment by a Florence court because, while vacationing on the Island of Elba, she sent her professor a postcard with a picture of the famous prison which once housed Napoleon and marked one cell "for you." The verdict was jeered by a packed courtroom.

Miss Olschky, daughter of Aldo Olschky, well-known Jewish art dealer, had believed that racial prejudice on the part of her science professor, Persio Falchi, who is also vice-president of the academy, was partly responsible for her having failed her courses last semester.

Prof. Falchi filed charges against the student when he received the postcard, but withdrew them on receipt of an apology from her. However, the court insisted on continuing the case on the ground that her act was a public offense. Miss Olschky said the sending of the postcard was an innocent joke which many of her friends had carried out without the same unfortunate consequences.

When the sentence was handed down, a chorus of jeers went up from what Italian newspapers termed "a courtroom packed as never before with students, male and female." Miss Olschky was first expelled from the academy in April, 1939, under Italy's racial laws, but was later reinstated when the regulations were altered so that the fact she has a non-Jewish mother made her an "Aryan."

SAFRAN INVESTED AS RUMANIAN CHIEF RABBI; NOTABLES ATTEND CEREMONY

BUCHAREST, March 4. (JTA) -- In a solemn ceremony attended by Religions Minister Nistor, military authorities, jurists and Jewish religious leaders, Dr. Alexander Safran, was yesterday invested as Chief Rabbi of Rumania. The ceremony was held in the Great Temple here.

Following speeches by Nistor and Dr. Wilhelm Filderman, leader of Rumanian Jewry Dr. Safran delivered an address expressing loyalty to the throne and promising to raise the spiritual level of the Jewish population. Among those present at the ceremony were president Alexandru Lapedatu of the Rumanian Academy and President D. Volanschi of the High Court.

3 ANTI-SEMITES GET JAIL TERMS IN BUDAPEST

BUDAPEST, March 4. (JTA) -- Three members of an illegal anti-Semitic organization have been sentenced to prison terms of up to one year by a Budapest court.

In pronouncing the verdict, the court emphasized that the defendants had attempted to revive the anti-Semitic "Szalasi movement" by organizing terrorist groups which distributed pamphlets threatening political assassinations and other terroristic actions. (Major Ferenc Szalasi, Hungarian Nazi leader, is serving a three-year prison term for subversive activities.)

BUDAPEST JEWS LAG IN SEEKING LISTING UNDER NEW ELECTORAL LAW

BUDAPEST, March 4. (JTA) -- Less than ten per cent of Jews or those who are regarded as Jews under the Hungarian electoral law have applied for admittance to the electoral lists, it became known here today.

The approximate number of Jews and those regarded as Jews in Budapest is 74,000. Of this number, only some 6,000 have applied under the law prescribing that only those Jews have the right to vote who themselves or whose ancestors have lived in Hungary since 1867. Many Jews are not in a position to apply for listing because of the tremendous difficulties encountered when searching for the necessary documents attesting to their status.

PALESTINE STUDENT DIES OF WOUNDS SUSTAINED IN LAND ACT DEMONSTRATIONS

JERUSALEM, March 4. (JTA) -- The first death arising from the reaction to the Palestine land ordinance was recorded here today.

The victim was Menachem Prives, 18-year-old student of the Mizrahi Teachers' College. He was injured in Saturday's demonstrations against the measure which restricts sale of land to Jews.

Hebrew University students today demonstrated outside the American consulate and presented to Consul-General George Wadsworth a memorandum appealing to the United States Government to intervene against the Palestine land ordinance.

A military court sentenced Isaac Spiegelman, correspondent of the New York Jewish Daily Forward, to six months in prison for organizing a women's demonstration of protest against the new ordinance restricting Jews in the purchase of land. Spiegelman, who has represented the Forward for 20 years, fought with the Jewish Legion which helped General Allenby wrest Palestine from Turkey in the World War. He is a reporter for Davar, Hebrew Laborite daily.

An appeal to the Archbishop of Canterbury to do his "utmost to remove a crying wrong," the Palestine land ordinance, was dispatched yesterday by Chief Rabbi Isaac Herzog following his arrival by plane from a visit to England. Dr. Herzog termed the ordinance, which restricts Jewish land purchase in Palestine, "a terrible blow to Israel, denying us equal rights, dooming us to a ghetto in the land divinely promised to Israel, and vitiating the Biblical prophecy."

Change in Mandate Seen If League Vetoes Land Act

LONDON, March 4. (JTA) -- The Palestine land ordinance is still the subject of editorial comment in the newspapers here.

The Sunday Times emphasizes the British Government's determination to carry out the ordinance restricting Jewish land purchase, stating that if the League Council condemns the ordinance the Government might have to ask for an amendment of the Palestine Mandate. "In the Government's view," the Times states, "there cannot be further delay in dealing with what is a very serious social, political and racial problem."

Writing in Reynolds News, H.N. Brailsford condemns the regulations, declaring "all that is left of Palestine now is a ghetto" and charging that the British action was "flatly illegal and in contradiction, both in letter and spirit, with the terms of the mandate."

In a letter to the Times, Moshe Shertok, head of the Jewish Agency's political department, asserts that the new restrictions are political character and designed

to crystallize the Jewish national home in the same way as the immigration clauses of the White Paper meant to crystallize it numerically. With regard to statements that further land sales to Jews threaten a "disastrous swelling of the Arab landless," Shertok points out that the Government ignored the Agency's repeated requests for data justifying such statements.

25,000 in Buenos Aires Protest Rally

BUENOS AIRES, March 4. (JTA) -- A mass meeting attended by 25,000 persons last night adopted resolutions protesting British Palestine policy, expressing solidarity with Polish Jewry and the World Jewish Congress and launching a 5,000,000-peso campaign for overseas relief and Palestine reconstruction.

Speakers included Ezra Teubal, noted industrialist, Deputy Enrique Dickman and Dr. Nahum Goldmann, chairman of the administrative committee of the World Jewish Congress, who arrived last week for a speaking tour. Messages were read from President Chaim Weizmann of the Jewish Agency, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the American Jewish Congress and Sephardic Chief Rabbi Ben Zion Meir Uziel of Palestine.

Curb Will Widen Arab-Jewish Gulf, Embassy Told

WASHINGTON, March 4. (JTA) -- A delegation including Dr. Solomon Goldman, Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Israel Goldstein this afternoon presented to the British Embassy a memorandum protesting against the Palestine land ordinance and warning that it would "widen the gulf" between Arabs and Jews.

The delegation was to have seen Ambassador Lord Lothian, but he was not available and a subordinate accepted the memorandum on his behalf. The Zionists were also to have seen Secretary of State Cordell Hull to give him a copy of the memorandum, but the appointment was postponed because Secretary Hull was called to the White House.

The 10-point memorandum declared that the Jews were supporting the Allies, but could not refrain from denouncing the infringement of their rights. The ordinance was denounced as "discriminatory" and as setting up "a pale of settlement" for Jews and a "reservation" for Arabs.

Citing passages from the Palestine mandate and the Mandates Commission report as evidence of the Palestine White Paper's illegality, the memorandum warned that it was "unwise and dangerous" to set up a system of segregation in Palestine. The ordinance was held to be detrimental to the interests of both Arabs and Jews and it was stated that there were no economic conditions justifying such legislation. The memorandum stressed the peace that had existed in Palestine since the beginning of the war.

Rally Here Calls Act 'Illegal'

NEW YORK, March 4. (JTA) -- A mass meeting tonight at Carnegie Hall under the auspices of the American Emergency Committee on Palestine adopted a declaration denouncing the "illegal act" of restricting Palestine land sales and calling on the British people to stay their Government's hand. The declaration expressed determination to "continue with the building of the Jewish national home."

Louis Lipsky said there was no justification for the ordinance on legal, moral or economic grounds. Other scheduled speakers were Dr. Israel Goldstein, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Mrs. Moses P. Epstein, Rabbi Wolf Gold and Chaim Greenberg.

A hundred Zionist youths today held a picketing demonstration at the British consulate in protest against the Palestine land ordinance, but were dispersed by police after five minutes under the wartime ordinance restricting picketing of belligerent nations' consulates.

The demonstrators carried placards attacking Britain's Palestine policy. A delegation presented a memorandum to Consul-General Geoffrey Haggard protesting against the land ordinance. The picketing was sponsored by the Zionist Youth Council comprising youth organizations including Masada and Junior Hadassah.

The American Palestine Jewish Legion, comprising veterans of the World War Jewish Legion, announced that it will sponsor a parade tomorrow from the Battery to the British consulate, where a delegation will present a protest to the consul. Other veterans' organizations are cooperating in the demonstration, it was stated.

PRATO SEES PALESTINE VISAS ONLY HOPE FOR REFUGEES IN ITALY

TEL AVIV, Palestine, March 4. (JTA) -- The only hope for the Jewish refugees in Italy is to obtain Palestine immigration certificates, it was declared today by Rabbi David Prato, former Chief Rabbi of Italy, following his return from Rome where he conferred with the authorities regarding the refugee problem.

Dr. Prato, supported by the Tel Aviv Consul General, Count Mazzolini, made strong efforts to obtain from the Italian Government permission for 5,000 refugees to continue their residence in Italy.

Vatican friends of Dr. Prato assured him that they would give any possible help to the refugees but said that "their hands were tied." The British and Polish Ambassadors also pledged their assistance, Dr. Prato said, adding that "real help" could come only from the British Government enabling the refugees to settle in Palestine.

MacMICHAEL NAMES GROUP TO PUSH PALESTINE DEVELOPMENT PLAN

JERUSALEM, March 4. (JTA) -- High Commissioner Sir Harold Alfred MacMichael today appointed a special committee to prepare a coordinated scheme for the development of Palestine in accordance with the recently announced British Government policy of expending £5,000,000 annually in developing the colonial empire, including mandated territories.

450 ARABS RELEASED FROM CONCENTRATION CAMPS

JERUSALEM, March 4. (JTA) -- Four hundred and fifty Arabs were released from concentration camps today following a general review of the cases of detained persons.

REFUGEE EMIGRATION FROM LITHUANIA TO PALESTINE SPEEDED

WILNO, Lithuania, March 4. (JTA) -- Emigration to Palestine has been speeded up to ensure use of all immigration certificates available. Transports of Polish citizens not of military age and stateless Jews of all ages leave twice weekly, all to reach Palestine before March 31, when the certificates expire.

PAULINE WARBURG DIES IN STOCKHOLM AT 91

STOCKHOLM, March 4. (JTA) -- Mrs. Pauline Warburg, widow of the late Consul General Simon Elias Warburg, is dead here at the age of 91.

Mrs. Warburg, nee Drucker, survived her husband, who was the brother of the well-known literary historian, Prof. Karl Warburg, by 40 years. On her seventieth birthday she dedicated 200,000 kroners in memory of her son for installation of a professorate of history at Stockholm University, thus laying the cornerstone for what later became the historic philosophical faculty at the university.

Mrs. Warburg also financed publication of the second volume of the history of the Stockholm Technical High School. In 1926, the State recognized her activities by decorating her with the Swedish Gold Medal for Civic Merit.

ROZENSON, ZIONIST LEADER, DIES IN LITHUANIA

KAUNAS, Lithuania, March 4. (JTA) -- Rabbi Israel Rozenson, president of the New Zionist Organization of Lithuania, died here today. He was 52 years old. Rabbi Rozenson formerly was president of the Jewish National Fund of Lithuania and of the Mizrahi, religious Zionist organization.

BOOK ON KOSHER CODE PUBLISHED BY MINNESOTA U; ANATOMIST, RABBI ARE AUTHORS

MINNEAPOLIS, March 4. (JTA) -- The University of Minnesota Press today published "The Kosher Code of the Orthodox Jew," a literal translation of that portion of the 16th century codification of the Babylonian Talmud which describes such deficiencies as render animals unfit for food. Authors of the volume, which also contains a discussion of Talmudic anatomy in the light of the science of its day and of the present time, are S.I. Levin, Senior Rabbi of Minneapolis, and Edward A. Boyden, professor of anatomy at the University of Minnesota.

An introductory note by Rabbi Levin expresses the hope that the volume will be "of use not only to theological students, but to everyone who is interested in these dietary laws and their origins in the culture of ancient Israel." A prefatory note by Prof. Boyden describes the translation as a "contribution to the field of medical history."

NOTED CHASSIDIC LEADER FLIES TO STOCKHOLM ON WAY TO U.S.

RIGA, March 4. (JTA) -- The Lubavitcher Rebbe, Joseph I. Schneerson, famous Polish Jewish Chassidic leader, was scheduled to fly to Stockholm with his family today and then sail for the United States.
