ROUND-UP OF ALIENS IN BRITAIN COMPLETED; REFUGEE CASES MAY BE REVIEWED

LONDON, May 14. (JTA).-- The roundup of German and Austrian male aliens in the coastal districts has been completed, it was learned today. During the raids houses were searched for incriminating documents, disguises, weapons, radio sets and other means of communication. The result of these searches has been kept secret.

It is considered likely here that as soon as conditions necessitating the roundup have changed, special machinery will be established to review each case and to restore to liberty those persons satisfying the authorities that they can be released without prejudice to national security.

The great majority of the interned are refugees, of whom a large number are Jews. The press points out the hardships imposed upon refugees, the Manchester Guardian expressing the opinion that the "unfortunate refugees who suffer this inconvenience will recognize its necessity during the crisis."

The Times asserts that the measures constitute protection for the refugees who, if Hitler attempted an invasion of England, would be certainly exposed to the suspicion of the British public.

The News Chronicle declares that the harmful activities of an unknown few can be checked only by restraint over all. "Such a circumstance as internment," it said, "must not be regarded as a penalty, but as a sacrifice which friendly Germans and Austrians must make to victory."

EXPECT PRO-ZIONISTS IN BRITISH CABINET TO PRESS FOR PALESTINE POLICY SHIFT

LONDON, May 14. (JTA).-- Reconstruction of the Government and the bringing in of leading critics of the MacDonald Palestine policy is expected considerably to alter the Palestine situation. Prime Minister Winston Churchill himself fought MacDonald's policy in the House of Commons.

Major Clement Attlee and Arthur Greenwood, now members of the War Cabinet, led the Labor Party fight against the White Paper and the land ordinance, while Air Minister Archibald Sinclair, who although not a member of the War Cabinet, will be consulted as a leader of the Liberals on all Questions of policy, is also pro-Zionist.

Inclusion in the Cabinet of Herbert Morrison and Alfred Duff-Cooper brings in two outstanding friends of the Zionist movement.

It is expected here that the Labor and Liberal members of the Cabinet will press within the Cabinet for a Palestine policy more in accordance with the views of their parties.

The new Colonial Secretary, Lord Lloyd, is intimately acquainted with the Near East situation through service there during the World War as an associate of Col. T.E. Lawrence and subsequently as High Commissioner of Egypt and chairman of the British Council. Although generally considered pro-Arab, Lord Lloyd is known to consider the Jewish position sympathetically. In an article in the Sunday Chronicle of Oct. 23, 1938, he proposed a solution of the Palestine problem by assuring the Arabs of a majority in Palestine and opening the Transjordan to Jewish immigration.

"It seems generally assumed," Lord Lloyd wrote at that time, "that a solution of justice to Arabs necessarily involves injustice to the Jews and vice-versa. I do not believe that to be the case. I believe that the assurance to the Arabs of a permanent majority in their own country on the one hand, and compensation to the Jews in wider immigration into Transjordan on the other, would provide an equitable settlement and one that is administratively as well as politically feasible."

"It would not, admittedly, meet the extreme demands of either party, but it would provide for a national home for the Jews on the one side without injustice to the indigenous population on the other. On such a basis Jew and Arab could and would live peacefully side by side in the future as in the long past. The abandonment of partition in favor of a policy as above outlined will need courage. The Prime Minister (Neville Chamberlain) has never lacked this quality."

NAZIS JAIL WOMAN FOR GIVING CHICKEN TO JEWISH DOCTOR WHO SAVED HER CHILDREN

LONDON, May 14, (JTA) -- A German peasant woman who gave a chicken to a Jewish physician in Koenigsberg in gratitude for having saved her two children from death was sentenced to 18 months' hard labor for violation of the food ration regulations, and the doctor received a similar sentence, according to private advice reaching here today. The physician's name is Klein.

In rendering the verdict, the court stated that to give food to a Jew meant to assist the enemies of the National Socialist State. "The Jews have brought war over Germany and aim to exterminate the German people," the court declared.

The reports said that increasingly severe sentences were being imposed on Jews for food regulation violations. Sentencing of Jews in Nuremberg and Frankfurt am-Main to terms in prison and concentration camp was reported.

IRISHMAN WHO SLURRED JEWS SENTENCED IN LONDON

LONDON, May 14. (JTA). -- For declaring among other things that Jews should be treated in the same manner as they had been dealt with in Germany, John Webster, 26, described as an Irish Nationalist, has been sentenced to one month's imprisonment. Webster was arrested for insulting words and behavior while addressing a meeting in Hyde Park.

PALESTINE CONSERVATOIRE GETS 100 ENTRY CERTIFICATES

NEW YORK, May 14. (JTA) -- The Palestine Conservatoire of Music has received from the British Government 100 certificates of immigration, outside the quota regulations, to permit selected Jewish refugee students to study at the Conservatoire, it was announced here today.

Strenuous efforts are being made to get the students now awaiting emigration to Palestine transportation from neutral ports.

SOUTH AFRICA REJECTS DEMAND TO BAN JEWISH ENTRY

CAPE TOWN, May 14, (JTA) -- Minister of Interior Harry G. Lawrence told the South African Assembly today that the Government rejected decisively any attempt to ban Jewish immigration. He added that such a policy was rejected by the last Government and the present one stood by the decision.

EMMA GOLDMAN, FAMOUS ANARCHIST, DEAD AT 70

TORONTO, May 14. (JTA)-- Emma Goldman, famous for her unswerving lifelong espousal of anarchism died this morning at the age of 70 after an illness of several months. She had suffered a stroke in February, was confined in the hospital for several months and had recently returned to her home in improved health.

Miss Goldman's colorful career as a crusader for her cause brought her frequent arrest, imprisonment and also deportation from the United States. Born in Kovno, Russia (now Kaunas, Lithuania) on June 27, 1869, she came to the United States at the age of 17.

She entered actively into the anarchist movement after the Chicago Haymarket riots. She collaborated closely with the late Alexander Berkman. Often in trouble because of her lectures, she came into serious conflict with the Government for agitating against the army draft during the World War. She was imprisoned, fined and deported to Finland, from where she entered Soviet Russia. However, she became disillusioned with Communism and left Russia to begin open opposition to the Bolsheviks.

B'NAI B'RITH GIVES \$2,500 TO RED CROSS WAR DRIVE

WASHINGTON, May 14, (JTA)-- B'nai B'rith has contributed \$2,500 from its National Emergency Relief Fund to the new war relief campaign of the Red Cross, it was announced today.

REBECCA UMANSKI, PIONEER ZIONIST, DEAD IN ENGLAND AT 70

LONDON, May 14, (JTA). -- Rebecca Umanski, a pioneer in the Zionist movement has died at the age of 70. Mrs. Umanski was a delegate from England to the second World Zionist Congress at Basle in 1898. Born in the Ukraine, Mrs. Umanski was associated with her late husband, Dr. Moses Umanski of Leeds, in the Bilu or early Russian Zionist movement founded by students.

A.S. HIRSHBERG, ZIONIST VETERAN, DIES IN POLAND

MOSCOW, May 14, (JTA) -- Abraham Samuel Hershberg, early Zionist leader and writer in Yiddish in Hebrew, has died in Bialystok, Soviet-occupied Poland, at the age of 81, it was reported here today. He visited Palestine in his youth, wrote prolifically on many subjects and during the World War headed the Bialystok Jewish Community Council, which represented the Jews in dealings with the German authorities.

BRITISH BROADCAST DESCRIBES REFUGEE UNIT AT FRONT

LONDON, May 14. (JTA) -- The British Broadcasting Corporation has broadcast a special "dispatch from the front" describing a company of the Auxiliary Military Pioneer Corps composed of German and Austrian refugees which a B.B.C. reporter visited.

The reporter said that members of the corps were almost without exception men of culture, medical students, doctors of philosophy, men of science, several of whom had fought for the Germans and the Austrians in the last war.

Some, the dispatch said, had the Iron Cross. Today they are the British Army, "all doing hard work without complaint." The refugee pioneers work under British officers, several of whom are German scholars. The non-commissioned officers have been carefully selected for their tactfulness and ability to handle all types of men.

The result, the reporter said, is "efficient work and cooperation." Some of the men still have families in Germany but, although they have had no word from them, they do not allow their personal sorrows to dominate their lives.

The reporter said the pioneers had organized their own small orchestra and nightly concerts. One of these was recorded by the B.B.C. and rebroadcast on a special program, during which a man was heard singing "Rama-ra" in German.

PAINTING OF NAZI RAID ON SYNAGOGUE CALLED "PICTURE OF THE YEAR"

LONDON, May 14. (JTA). -- A painting by Cyril Ross bearing the title "Nazi Persecution and Sacrilege--Anno Domini 1939" is described by the Daily Telegraph's review of the Academy exhibition as the "picture of the year." The painting portrays storm troopers in a raid on a synagogue and its congregation.

WOMEN'S LEAGUE ASKS ADDED STEPS TO SAFEGUARD PEACE HERE

ATLANTIC CITY, May 14. (JTA)--The annual convention of the Women's League of the United Synagogue today urged that all possible steps be taken to keep America out of war and asked reconstitution of the world's peace machinery. The convention reaffirmed its belief in the principles of Jewish training in the school and home.

ORT VOCATIONAL SCHOOL OPENED IN ENGLAND

NEW YORK, May 14, (JTA)-- A new ORT vocational school has been opened in Leeds, England, it was announced here today by the American ORT Federation. The school's first pupils will be 105 young Jews who graduated from the ORT school in Berlin and emigrated to England shortly before the outbreak of the war.

PARLEY SET TO DISCUSS POSITION OF POLISH JEWS

NEW YORK, May 14, (JTA)-- The American Committee for Polish Jews announced today that it is sponsoring a conference on May 26 of representatives of Polish Jewish fraternal organizations to discuss the position of Polish Jewry under the Nazi occupation. The conference, to be held at Temple Emanu-EL, will be addressed by Sholem Asch, Joseph Opatashu, Abraham Goldberg, Jacob Apenszlak, Dr. Arie Tartakower, Dr. Leon Wulman, Jacob Leszczynski and others. The conference will map relief action within the framework of the United Jewish Appeal.
