BRITAIN EXTENDS CURBS TO REFUGEES FROM NAZI-INVADED COUNTRIES

LONDON, May 28.(JTA) -- Home Secretary Sir John Anderson last night ordered restrictions on all alieng who have entered Britain since May 9 as refugees from territory invaded or occupied by German. This includes refugees from Czechoslovakia, Poland, Denmark, Norway, Holland and Belgium.

The restrictions provide that an alien over 16 years of age shall not travel more than five miles from his registered place of residence without a travel permit from the police. They also prohibit possession of explosives, motor vehicles, cameras, maps and certain other articles.

Col. Josiah Wedgwood, Laborite, suggested in the House of Commons today that ferman Jews not be interned with Nazis but be invited to do work of national importance during their internment. War Undersecretary Richard K. Law replied that these matters were under consideration.

In reply to a question by Oswald Lewis, Conservative, the Government spokesman said it was not proposed to form foreign legions and added that aliens, subject to examination of their credentials, would be enlisted in the regular army.

Meanwhile, conditions in an intermment camp in a northern suburb are described in a report published here. The estate, completed just before the war, consists of modern, semi-detached suburban cottages with bathrooms and various labor-saving devices.

A film producer, university professors and rabbis are among the 1,000 aliens who have already arrived there. The younger internees will be able to continue their studies in an educational center staffed by professors, priests, rabbis and parsons.

Food is provided by the Government, cooked by chefs drawn from the ranks of the internees. A concert is planned, to be staged by the film producer, who believes the camp is full of talent. Auditions are being held for artists and musicians.

People in the neighborhood and the Society of Friends have offered to provide indoor games to be placed in special recreation rooms. It is also hoped to provide better furniture. The men sleep on the floor on pallets which they fill with straw on their arrival.

Alien Doctors May Practice in Algeria

PARIS, May 28, (JTA) -- A decree published in Algeria permits aliens holding medical diplomas to practice for the duration of the war.

BOLIVIA PROHIBITS JEWISH IMMIGRATION

LA PAZ, Bolivia, May 10.(JTA-By mail) -- Immigration Commissioner Carlos Johnson has issued a decree prohibiting further Jewish immigration into Bolivia. The order was published on May 3, effective three days earlier, on April 30.

The three-point decree (1) suspends distribution of immigration permits to Jews without exception and for an indefinite period, (2) provides a 90-day period for those who received visas previously to enter the country, after which visas outstanding will be invalidated, and (3) instructs Bolivian consulates abroad to advise steamship companies not to book Jews for passage to Bolivia.

Brazil Orders 60 to Leave

SAO PAULO, Brazil, May 28.(JTA) -- The Justice Ministry today ordered more than 60 persons residing in Sao Paulo on tourist visas to leave the country immediately on pain of \$1,000 fine and deportation or a term of enforced labor in an intervenent colony. The list includes 56 Jews whose applications for permanent residence had been rejected.

FALESTINE ISSUES 2- MONTH ENTRY QUOTA

JERUSALEM, May 28.(JTA) -- The Palestine Government today issued the June-July allotment of the six-month immigration schedule of 9,000 certificates announced on April 22.

The number of certificates granted to the Jewish Agency for Palestine for distribution was increased under the new allotment to 370. Of this number 20 will be deducted for the Government's reserve.

(The April-May allotment of certificates totalled 2,050, plus additional certificates for wives and children of previous immigrants. At the time the six-month schedule was announced, it was stated that a quota similar to the April-May allotment would be issued for June-July, less the number of illegal entrants recorded in the previous two-month period. Issuance of two-month allotments was inaugurated, it was declared at that time, in order to keep a current check on illegal immigration.)

POLISH RELIEF GROUP ASKS ROOSEVELT'S AID

NEW YORK, May 28.(JTA) -- An appeal to President Roosevelt to facilitate the entry of child refugees to America, praise for the relief work of the Joint Distribution Committee in occupied Poland and an appeal for support of the United Jewish Appeal were voiced in resolutions adopted at a conference at the Temple Emanu-El sponsored by the American Committee for Polish Jews.

The conference, attended by 200 delegates from Jewish fraternal organizations and unions in the metropolitan area, in another resolution expressed the "steadfast belief" that the new Foland will be based on the principles of liberty, democracy and equality for all of its inhabitants. The resolution rejected the "emigrationist and evacuationist" conceptions with respect to the Jewish population of Poland, maintaining that it must be recognized as an integral part of the country. The conference was presided over by Abraham Goldberg.

BAN RACE INCITEMENT TO HALT FIFTH COLUMN, MISS THOMPSON URGES

NEW YORK, May 24.(JTA) -- Dorothy Thompson, in her syndicated column, urges that "we should stop the inciting of race against race and religion against religion by legislation similar to the Swiss" as an anti-Fifth Column measure. She declares that "the Nazis worked most effectively by spreading anti-Semitism." Miss Thompson returned from Europe today on the United States liner Manhattan.

COL. PATTERSON RETURNS FROM SOUTH AMERICA

NEW YORK, May 28.(JTA) -- Col. J.H. Patterson returned today on the steamship Santa Clara from a six-month tour of South America on behalf of the American Friends of a Jewish Palestine.

PLAN FOR AFRIKAANER BLOC MEETS OPPOSITION

JOHANNESBURG, May 28.(JTA) -- Efforts to establish an Afrikaaner economic bloc are strongly condemned in the Port Elizabeth United Party paper, One Land, which declares that such attempts are based on suspicion and hatred and points out that the future of South Africa depends on cooperation between races.

The paper warns that "attempts to obtain quick results by means of a bloc will result in failure and will only enrich a few Afrikaaner managers. It is nonzense to suggest that the English and the Jews form an economic bloc."

Meanwhile, Nationalist Deputy Eric Louw, who introduced an anti-Jewish immigration bill a year ago, is continuing his campaign for an Afrikaaner bloc. Addressing a meeting at Tulbach, he said that South Africa was aiming at economic as well as political independence.

"What is the use," he said, "if we obtain a free, independent republic if South Africa is enslaved to foreign exploiters." Louw referred to the Jews as the "greatest self-help society" and urged Afrikaaner country lawyers to see that the work they sent to the cities was given to Afrikaaners.

PALESTINE'S TRADE WITH EGYPT INCREASES

LONDON, May 28.(JTA) -- The periodical Great Britain and the East reports Palestine trade with Egypt increasing as a result of the war. The range of Palestine's new products happens not to compete with Egyptian industries. Experts are still small, totaling only £4,000 in March, but are expected to grow.

ENVOY SEES NEW POLAND AVOIDING MISTAKE OF ANTI-SEMITISM

SANTIAGO, Chile, May 15. (JTA-Airmail) -- Ladislaus Mazurkiewicz, new Polish Ambassador to Chile, receiving a delegation of leading Jews, declared: "I am fully convinced that the new Poland will be a democracy with equal rights for all citizens and will not repeat the old mistakes of anti-Semitic policy."
