#### PALESTINE INTENSIFIES PRECAUTIONS AGAINST AIR RAIDS

JERUSALEM, June 9. (JTA) -- Air raid precautions are being intensified throughout the country as a result of latest developments in the international situation.

High Commissioner Sir Harold A. MacMichael has issued an order, under the defense regulations, listing 75 buildings in various parts of Haifa as public air raid shelters. The District Commissioner's office is compiling a register of children, aged, infirm and mothers of infants who should be the first evacuated from Haifa in the event of emergency.

The Jewish Agency's A.R.P. (air raid precautions) adviser, accompanied by a staff, is touring the country advising settlements on organization of precautionary measures, arranging for warning, shelters, fire-fighting and first aid. In the coastal colony of Nathania an A.R.P. instructor has been appointed and a coordinating committee has been set up including the local military commander, civil administration, police and communal heads.

A Jewish special constabulary of 1,000 volunteers is being formed in Tel Aviv under the command of the district superintendent of police, in collaboration with the Jewish Agency and the Tel Aviv municipality. The Government has authorized enrollment of men aged 30 to 45, of good character and prepared to assist the police in maintaining law and order when called upon. The volunteers will be given a short training course and will not be paid. The officers of the corps will also be volunteers.

More than 1,000 young men and women have completed first aid courses and 7,000 more have completed elementary courses given by the Red Shield (Jewish Red Cross), according to an announcement in Tel Aviv. The youths are all volunteers. The Tel Aviv municipality has recommended seafood wartime menus, eliminating a large proportion of the foods which have to be imported.

### HUNGARIAN NAZIS DEMAND AUTONOMY FOR ALL MINORITIES BUT JEWS

EUDAPEST, June 9. (JTA) -- The Arrow-Cross party, Hungarian Nazi organization, has introduced in Parliament a bill demanding complete autonomy for minorities with the exception of Jews and abolition of elections. The measure is reminiscent of one sponsored by Konrad Henlein, Sudeten German Leader, prior to seizure of Czechoslovakia by Germany.

#### SEES ANTI-SEMITISM IN CHILE AIMED AT POPULAR FRONT REGIME

SANTIAGO, Chile, June 9. (JTA) -- Minister of Economics Oskar Schnake said yesterday that anti-Semitism in Chile was an artificial product aimed at undermining the Popular Front Government. He expressed the hope that forthcoming immigration legislation would solve the problem of refugee entry into Chile.

Schnake made his statement to a delegation of the Poale-Zion, including Dr. S. Yuris, a delegate from Palestine, during a one-hour audience. He expressed enthusiasm over the accomplishments of Jewish cooperatives in Palestine and said the Chilean Government supported the Palestine Jewish homeland.

## Argentina Enacts Fifth-Column Ban

BUENOS AIRES, June 9. (JTA) -- At an all-night session the Argentine Chamber of Deputies, by a vote of 125 to 8, adopted measures designed to spike fifth column activities. The law, to remain in force until June 31, 1941, prohibits all tendencious propaganda and activities of foreign elements contrary to the country's institutions.

#### SHANGHAI EXPECTS NEW INFLUX OF REFUGEES, SPURRED BY SOVIET TRANSIT PERMISSION

SHANGHAI, June 9. (JTA) -- An increased flow of refugees from the Reich and German-occupied territories is expected here as result of decisions by the Soviet and Manchukuoan authorities to permit transit of refugees across Siberia and Manchukuo.

According to information received here, persons holding permits for admission to Shanghai will in the future be able to proceed via a land route. This means a considerable reduction in travel expenses, as compared with the sea journey from Italian ports, which in any case is now closed to refugees.

Prospective emigrants will also be able to buy tickets in Reichsmarks instead of foreign currency. New transit facilities may also make it possible for refugees to reach Shanghai via Vladivostok, thus eliminating the formalities connected with obtaining a Manchukuoan transit visa.

## 300 Found Haven in Palestine in 2 Months

JERUSALEM, June 9. (JTA) -- Despite restriction of admission of refugees, their immigration has continued steadily during the last few months. About 500 arrived in April and May on two large Italian steamers. They include several who had been released from Nazi concentration camps only a few days before their departure.

#### BLAUSTEIN FETED AS HE RETIRES FROM BALTIMORE CHARITIES POST

BALTIMORE, June 9. (JTA) -- A testimonial volume inscribed by prominent figures was presented to Jacob Blaustein tonight at a dinner marking his retirement as president of the Associated Jewish Charities of Baltimore after a tenure of four years. Several hundred leading members of the Baltimore Jewish community attended the dinner, held at the Lord Baltimore Hotel.

Speakers included Sidney Lansburgh, chairman of the Baltimore United Jewish Appeal; Dr. Abel Wolman of Johns Hopkins University and Director Harry Greenstein of the Associated Jewish Charities. Greetings were extended by Governor Herbert R. O'Connor of Maryland and Mayor Howard W. Jackson of Baltimore. L. Edwin Goldman, prominent Baltimorean, succeeds Blaustein as president.

## 'NO PLACE FOR ANTI-SEMITISM IN NEW POLAND,' EMBASSY AIDE TELLS PARLEY

ASBURY PARK, N.J., June 9. (JTA) -- A declaration that "in the new Poland there will be no place for anti-Semitism" was made today by Michael Kwapieszewski, First Counsellor of the Polish Embassy, before the 32nd annual convention of the Federation of Polish Jews in America.

"During the last few months," Kwapieszewski said, "Poland has learned much about the loyalty of her Jewish group and this loyalty must be acknowledged in the new State." He stressed that the new Poland was fostering mutual cooperation, as evidenced by the presence in the Polish National Council, Parliament-in-exile, of Dr. Herman Lieberman and Dr. Ignacy Schwartzbard.

A message from Vice-Premier Kot of the Polish Government-in-exile exhorted all Polish citizens "without distinction of creed or race" to work for a free, democratic Poland.

Resolutions were adopted pledging support of President Roosevelt's defense program, hoping for an Allied victory, urging Federation members to back the United Jewish Appeal, expressing sympathy for persecuted Jewry in Nazi Poland and the hope that a reconstituted Poland would take vigorous measures to prevent anti-Jewish discrimination, and pledging cooperation with the American Jewish Congress, the American ORT Federation and other Jewish groups.

Name of the organization was changed to the American Federation for Aid to Polish Jews. Benjamin Winter was re-elected president and Maldwin Fertig chairman of the Executive Council. Vice-presidents named were Harry J. Rubenstein, Dr. Samuel Margoshes, Abraham Goldberg, Mrs. A.P. Kaplan, Jacob Brown and Abraham E. Weman. Abraham I. Kandel was elected treasurer.

# RED CROSS AIDE DENIES 'NO ATROCITIES' STATEMENT QUOTED BY NAZI ORGAN

WASHINGTON, June 9. (JTA) -- James T. Nicholson, American Red Cross official, today brended as a "complete misquotation" an alleged statement attributed to him by a Washington newspaper and recently quoted by Facts in Review, German propaganda organ published in New York, declaring he knew "of no atrocities to Jews in Poland."

Gommenting on the Facts in Review story, carried in its May 27 issue, Nicholson said: ".....this statement is a complete misquotation of remarks which I made at a

press conference following my return from Poland. Reports of this conference published by other newspapers will bear me out in this." (At the conference, a report of which was carried in the April 19 issue of JTA NEWS, Nicholson had refused to comment on reported mass executions in Poland other than to say, "That's not in my parish," explaining that the Red Cross still had "to do business" in Poland.)

#### POLISH LEADER HERE REPUDIATES BOOKLET URGING EMIGRATION OF JEWS

NEW YORK, June 9. (JTA) -- Views on emigration of Jews from Poland expressed in a booklet by M.K. Gluchowski, described in a London dispatch last week as secretary of the Polish National Council in America, "are his own and do not reflect official Polish opinion," it was asserted today by Baron Stefan de Ropp, director of the official Polish Information Center here. According to Baron de Ropp, Gluchowski conducted a private information bureau in New York which was "in no way connected with any Polish Government agencies." (The London dispatch said Gluchowski, who advocated emigration of at least 1,000,000 Jews from Poland, was "director of the Polish Information Bureau, cooperating closely with the Paris official department of the same name.")

#### 2 SCHOLARS HONORED AT SEMINARY EXERCISES; ADLER EULOGIZED

NEW YORK, June 9. (JTA) -- Tributes to Dr. Cyrus Adler, late president of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and awarding of honorary degrees to two noted Jewish scholars marked commencement exercises this afternoon at the Seminary. Twenty-four students received degrees at the exercises.

Memorial addresses on Dr. Adler were delivered by Prof. Louis Cinzberg, Dean of the Faculty and Professor of Talmud, and Sol M. Stroock, chairman of the Seminary board of directors. Discussing Dr. Adler's contribution to Jewish learning, Prof. Ginzburg said to give an adequate picture of it would be "tantamount to a history of higher Jewish education in America of the last five decades." Analyzing Dr. Adler's relations to the community, Stroock said he was "at once a leader and worker in the ranks" in almost every field of human endeavor.

The honorary degree of Doctor of Hebrew Letters was conferred by Dr. Louis Finkelstein, president of the Seminary, in absentia upon Prof. Jacob Nahum Epstein of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, in recognition of his contributions to Jewish scholarship. Rabbi Israel H. Levinthal, of the Seminary Faculty and the Brooklyn Jewish Center, was awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity in recognition of his important contributions to Jewish learning and his role in strengthening "religion generally in this land."

#### FASCIST GETS 3 MONTHS FOR POSTING ANTI-JEWISH SIGN IN ENGLAND

LONDON, June 9. (JTA) -- A Fascist, E.W. Smith, was sentenced yesterday to three months at hard labor for trying to post a bill bearing Jewish names accused of dodging conscription. The magistrate stated that the bill was calculated to raise feeling against the Jews. Two hundred persons attempted to lynch Smith when he was caught trying to post the paper.
