#### ITALY'S WAR ENTRY FINDS 4,000 REFUGEES TRAPPED; DEPORTATION TO NAZI POLAND FEARED

PARIS, June 10. (JTA) -- From the Jewish point of view, Italy's entry into the war today has three major effects:

- (1) The 40,000 Italian Jews and more than 4,000 Jewish refugees in Italy are placed in a perilous position.
- (2) One of the last outlets for overseas emigration of Jewish refugees from German territories is closed.
- (5) The war area is extended to the Mediterranean, bringing the danger of war to Palestine.

The Italian preparations for war had been accompanied with mounting anti-Jewish feeling, resulting in rioting in Trieste last month in which windows of Jewish schools and synagogues were broken and several stores wrecked and ransacked. Later, Jewish stores reopened under police guard, but it was feared that today's war declaration would be followed by increased anti-Semitic agitation.

For the more than 4,000 refugees in Italy, who had been seeking desperately in the face of insufficient emigration outlets and transportation facilities, to escape before Rome entered the war, there now looms the possibility of deportation to German territory. A J.T.A. Rome dispatch on May 22 said the refugees were cognizant of the possibility of being transported en masse to Nazi-occupied Poland when war came.

The refugees in Italy include 250 from Poland for whom issuance of Palestine certificates has been authorized, another 100 German and Polish Jewish refugees with American visas and 45 with Dominican visas, who are stranded together with the several thousand, the largest group of whom are quartered in trieste, who had no immediate emigration prospects.

Italy is now also finally closed as a country of transit for refugees, although actually the Italian Government had banned refugee transit last month. There were 600 refugees with American visas and 525 with Dominican entry permits in various parts of Europe whose immediate emigration depended on being able to cross Italy, in addition

to refugees with visas for other countries. American and Dominican diplomatic officials had been making strenuous efforts to obtain a lifting of the transit ban.

With Italy's entry into the conflict, the Mediterranean is drawn into the war arena and the possibility exists of attack on Palestine. For the past several months the Holy Land has been rushing defense preparations, including nation-wide blackout, preparation for evacuation of civilians from coastal cities if necessary and other precautions. Although Fremier Benito Mussolini, in his speech in Rome today, indicated that he was trying to localize his participation in the war to western Europe, the possibility of Palestine's becoming involved must be reckoned with.

#### 8,000 Americans, Mostly Jews, in Palestine

WASHINGTON, June 10. (JTA) -- Eight thousand Americans, of whom 90 per cent are Jews, were in Palestine when Italy declared war on the Allies, the State Department estimated today.

There were more American citizens in Palestine than in either Great Britain or France when those nations entered the war.

The State Department estimated that two-thirds of American Jews in Palestine were naturalized citizens and one-third native born. By far the largest percentage of American Jews were admitted to Palestine on visas providing for permanent residence there.

The J.T.A. learned that there have been few if any requests from Americans in Palestine for aid in leaving the country and that nearly all now regard Palestine as their permanent home and will not take refuge elsewhere.

A proclamation declaring the Mediterranean a belligerent zone forbidden to American shipping, expected to be issued within 48 hours, will close one of the last outlets for emigration of German refugees from Europe.

Among the refugees stranded in Italy are 45 who were scheduled to sail for the Dominican Republic. Officials of the Intergovernmental Refugee Committee here were conducting preliminary discussions on the possibility that a new group of refugees now in England and France might be selected for the Dominican colonization project in lieu of those held in Italy.

## 170, Palestine-Bound, Stranded in Rhodes

JERUSALEM, June 10. (JTA) -- Italy's entrance into the war has stranded 170 Jewish immigrants on the liner Rodi in the harbor of Rhodes, Italian possession, it was learned today.

The immigrants, bound for Palestine, had been scheduled to arrive last Friday. A cable received this morning by the Jewish Agency for Palestine had asked for immediate transportation, citing the danger that Rhodes would be in the war zone.

# AGUDAH LEADER REACHES LITHUANIA FROM SOVIET POLAND

WILNO, Lithuania, June 10. (JTA) -- Rabbi Aaron Lewin, chairman of the world central council of the Agudath Israel, has arrived here from Soviet-occupied Poland after receiving a Soviet exit visa and Lithuanian entry permit.

#### ALIENS AGED 60-70 INTERNED BY BRITAIN; STEPS TO FREE SOME INDUSTRIALISTS TAKEN

LONDON, June 10. (JTA) -- The Government today ordered the internment of all "enemy aliens" between the ages of 80 and 70 in category B--who previously had been allowed certain freedom of movement. All in this category between the ages of 16 and 60 years already had been intermed.

Home Secretary Sir John Anderson earlier informed the House of Commons that measures were being taken for the release of internees whose efforts would be in the national interest. The action followed intervention on behalf of interned refugees who were key figures in important industries which employed many Britons and whose intermment forced closing down of the plants.

"Steps have been taken," Sir John said, "to review the cases of Germans and Austrians recently interned under general directions, where it is claimed that their release is definitely and directly in the national interest, but it will not be possible to allow the return of such persons to any protected area unless I am fully satisfied that the return does not prejudice national security."

#### RUMANTA DISCRIMINATES AGAINST JEWS IN ARMY

BUCHAREST, June 10. (JTA) -- A large number of Jewish university graduates, including doctors, lawyers and technicians, have been denied admission to the qualifying examinations for inclusion in the army's reserve of officers. No reason has been given for the discrimination. All men involved spent several months in preparatory courses for the examinations.

A number of Jewish officers in the army have not been assigned to active service following mobilization because, it is understood, the authorities did not want to place "pure" Rumanians in the position of having to obey orders by Jews.

## 25,000 JEWISH REFUGEES IN HUNGARY, SURVEY DISCLOSES

BUDAFEST, June 10. (JTA) -- An unofficial survey disclosed today the presence of approximately 25,000 Jewish refugees in Hungary. Many of these are actual fugitives from Nazi persecution; how many are merely unfortunates who lost their citizenship in the Hungarian reoccupation areas is difficult to determine.

Jewish circles believe, however, that about one-third of the so-called refugees belong in the latter category. These include persons who lived in Hungarian provinces before the World War, who were transferred to Czechoslovakia by treaty and who returned to Hungary following dismemberment of Czechoslovakia and reoccupation of the Carpatho-Ukraine and Tatra regions.

Many of these persons considered themselves Hungarians until called upon to prove their nationality, whereupon they discovered that they had none. By Hungarian law, an individual must prove that his grandfather or great-grandfather was a resident of Hungary in 1851 in order to be considered a citizen.

Thus far, few Jewish refugees or aliens have been molested by the Hungarian police, so long as Jewish friends or charitable institutions guarantee their support. But there is no assurance that the present attitude of the Government will not change at any moment and they will not be thrown into prison or sent back to sections of the Reich from which they escaped.

The few hundred financially independent refugees are being treated surprisingly well. The only restriction on their freedom is that they must all register in the same Budapest hotel reserved for refugees and report to a police officer at the hotel once a day. Otherwise they are free to live as they please, so long as their money lasts.

The poor Jewish refugees are mostly maintained in camps operated by the Jewish communities of various Hungarian cities. In Budapest, 1,200 refugees from Austria and Ozechoslovakia are maintained in seven camps. Expenses of the Budapest camps average more than \$10,000 monthly. Even so the refugees must be considered fortunate in that the Hungarian Government, for reasons of economy, has released them from police custody into camps under custody of the Jewish community.

## ANTI-SEMITIC GROUP ACTIVE AMONG INDIANS, SENATE COMMITTEE TOLD

WASHINGTON, June 10. (JTA) -- A "fifth column" directed by anti-Semitic propagandists has been unsuccessful in its attempts to enlist American Indians under the "Nazi banner," Indian Commissioner Collier told a Senate committee today. On the other hand, the Senate Indian Affairs Committee, Collier declared, has been received by "misrepresentations and inaccuracies" of the American Indian Federation. The federation, said Collier, is affiliated with the James True Associates and organizations sponsored by William Dudley Pelley and the German-American Bund.

### NAZI PAPER HAILS SEGREGATION OF JEWS IN BRATISLAVA

ZURICH, June 10. (JTA) -- The German newspaper Essener National Zeitung reports that the population of Bratislava "welcomes" segregation of Jews in the Slovakian capital and restriction of most of the city's cafes to "Aryans" only.

Three cafes, the paper declares, have been reserved exclusively for Jews. Ten others reportedly admit both Jewish and "Aryan" patrons and 15 have posted signs that Jews are not wanted.

These measures, the Nazi paper asserts, have been welcomed by the population and are in accord with demands by Sano Mach, leader of the Fascist Hlinka Guards and Minister of Propaganda. The paper declares that the entire Slovak press urges a radical solution of the "Jewish problem" in Slovakia.

## PALESTINE TRADE WITH SWITZERLAND INCREASES

ZURICH, Switzerland, June 10. (JTA) -- Commercial relations between Palestine and Switzerland have intensified since outbreak of the war, it was revealed today in a report of the Swiss Consul at Jaffa, Palestine, published by the Swiss Office for Commercial Expansion.

The report states that there was a particularly increasing demand for Swiss chemical products, machinery and textiles. Swiss exports to Palestine in 1959 amounted to 2,742,000 Swiss francs, as against 1,944,000 in the previous year. Imports from Palestine rose from 1,114,000 Swiss francs to 1,225,000 in the same period.
