## REPORT ANTI-JEWISH AGITATION INTENSIFIED THROUGHOUT ITALY

LONDON, June 15. (JTA) -- Local Fascist leaders throughout Italy, acting on official instructions, have strengthened anti-Jewish agitation, which has assumed enormous proportions, the Jewish Chronicle reported today from Rome.

A number of Nazi instructors have been brought into Italy to give instruction in how to deal with the Jews, the report said.

There are about 40,000 Jews in Italy, in addition to some 4,000 refugees from Germany and Nazi-occupied territories.

## RED CROSS ACENT DESCRIBES "TIDAL WAVE" OF REFUGEES SWEEPING ACROSS FRANCE

WASHINGTON, June 15. (JTA) -- Jewish and other refugees are fleeing Paris under almost indescribable conditions, according to a cable received at American Red Cross headquarters from a representative abroad who told of what he had seen en route from Paris to Bordeaux, where the Red Cross European staff is now quartered. The cable said:

"Constituting third and fourth tidal waves oversweeping France are evacuees from Mediterranean regions and Parisian districts, crowding towns inland to Spanish border. Extreme chaos caused by Belgian Dutch and Jewish refugees fleeing Paris every possible conveyance. People fighting room on southbound trains from Faris.

"Between Paris and Bordeaux yesterday counted 57 serious auto accidents, mainly due exhaustion, sleepless driver on move three, four days, unable find rest places. Belgian, French Red Cross units along route doing magnificent work unbroken line. All roads from Paris and north filled trucks, automobiles. Woman harness to heavy high-wheeled cart whereon deathly ill fifteen-year son, bedelothing, cooking utensils, dog. Had pulled four days, two younger children walking alongside. Another wagon saw mother milking goat while six-year girl fed clover picked roadside.

"Yesterday evening saw thousands camped gypsy style with blankets, sacking as tents or sleeping under wagons with all movable equipment, live stock encircling camps. Population of Tours tripled, largely because of Belgian civilians. Around Chartres cathedral square every yard covered with refugees and possions as most other town squares. En route it was amazing to see highways jammed with panicky evacuees

while old men, women, children, peasants in fields alongside continued cultivation of crops unconcerned by tide sweeping past.

"In towns, villages of south France, civilian Red Crosses operating sanely and morale of civilians, including attempts to solve refugee problems, seems better than previously, although evident greatest civilian refugee problem French history.

"Spirit of hospitality overcrowded departments greatly improved by new crisis and most peasant-villages, towns, homes south France sheltering strangers. Enthusiastic and appreciative welcomes greet American Red Cross automobiles. We frequently hear the statement that Americans have no idea French, Belgian, Dutch appreciation for American Red Cross efforts to help us in darkest hours our life.

"The mayor of Chartres working unceasingly for fifty hours declared: Assure America that French civilians are grateful for American sympathy, material assistance. Tell them any aid, whether food, clothing, other, will enable more civilians to survive desperate situation."

The cable said that rain is increasing the misery of hundreds of thousands of the refugees and added "millions to those already fruitlessly seeking shelters."

### PALESTINE JEWISH "WAR CABINET" PLANNED; CENSORSHIP WIDENED

JERUSALEM, June 15. (JTA) -- The executive committee of the Jewish National Council, it was understood today, is conducting intensive negotiations with representatives of various Jewish parties for formation of a Palestine Jewish "war cabinet."

The "cabinet" would include Moshe Shertok, head of the Jewish Agency political department; Mayor Israel Rokach of Tel Aviv; David Remez, secretary of the Histadruth (Palestine Jewish labor federation); Dr. M. Altman, Zionist-Revisionist leader, and Rabbi Meir Berlin, Misraehi leader.

Meanwhile, High Commissioner Sir Harold Alfred MacMichael granted permission to Auni Bey Abdul Hadi, extled Arab nationalist leader, to return to Palestine. Auni Bey, former secretary of the outlawed Palestine Arab Supreme Committee, has been banned from Palestine since 1957 and has been living in Egypt.

Censorship was imposed today on inland telegrams in Palestine and to Transjordan.

High Commissioner MacMichael will make a radio address tomorrow, presumably dealing with the new situation resulting from Italy's entry into the war.

## SAN DOMINGO BARS 'TRANSIENT' REFUGEES; COLONISTS NOT AFFECTED

WASHINGTON, June 15. (JTA) -- The Dominican Congress, meeting in a special executive session on Tuesday, passed a bill barring all immigration except of those who are to make the Republic their permanent home, it was learned here today.

The action came as a result of internal pressure from citizens objecting to the large number of "transient" refugees who have reached Ciudad Trujillo and are waiting there to procure entry into other North and South American countries under their quotas.

The measure does not affect those refugees who will be chosen for settlement in the Sosua colony of the Dominican Republic Settlement Association.

Three representatives of the association left yesterday for Sosua. They are Leon Falk, Pittsburgh steel man and head of the Falk Foundations; Alfred Wagg, agricultural and economic adviser, and W. Lee, United States Department of Agriculture expert, who has been stationed in Puerto Rico.

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, June 15. (JTA) -- The Chamber of Deputies today enacted a bill dissolving all parties which take instructions from foreign countries and forbidding dissemination of propaganda of an inciting character.

The measure applies specifically to political or social groups directed by foreigners or foreign powers and those using the insignia, uniforms or symbols of foreign parties.

Aimed at checking development of fifth column activities, which have been the subject of a congressional investigation, the measure is directed against Nazi, Fascist and Falangist associations. It will eventually be applied as well to the Communist Party if the latter is proved to be directed from abroad.

Earlier, dissolution of the Nazi Labor Front in Uruguay was announced by German Minister Otto Langemann in a statement to Foreign Minister Alberto Guant. Langemann informed Guani that Julius Daldorf, so-called Nazi Gauleiter (district leader) for Uruguay and head of the Front, has turned over all records and property of the organization to the German Legation.

The editorials and the pending shift to a pro-Nazi policy has caused sharp concern among the nation's 800,000 Jews, more than 200,000 of whom recently were deprived of their citizenship under the citizenship revision law.

Their concern has been aggravated by realization of the fact that many pro-Nasi anti-Semitic Iron Guardists have recently been released from [ail, where they had been held since September, 1959, following the assassination of Premier Armand Calinescu.
