NO CONSCRIPTION PLANNED FOR PALESTINE, JERUSALEM STATES

JERUSALEM, June 28. (JTA) -- An official statement said today that the Palestine Government did not have "the slightest intention to introduce conscription in Palestine."

The statement pointed out that an ordinance published on June 21 empowered the High Commissioner to make regulations for the requisitioning of persons and property to carry out exceptional measures to meet the war situation, but "there was no intention to conscript."

LONDON, June 28. (JTA) -- Arrest of 15 Englishmen under the emergency defense regulations was announced today.

The Manchester Guardian demands editorially, meanwhile, that the Government state clearly its policy with regard to the current round up of aliens previously considered friendly and reply to charges that the arrests were largely based on "local caprice and prejudice."

ARMISTICE CLAUSE ON REFUGEES ASSAILED BY MANCHESTER GUARDIAN

LONDON, June 28. (JTA) -- Commenting on the Franco-German armistice, the periodical New Statesman and Nation declared editorially today that no other word than "dishonor" could be applied to the agreement to hand over to the Nazis refugees to whom France had given protection. "That," the magazine said, "may involve the massacre of some of the noblest men and women in Europe."

BROAD ANTI-SEMITIC LAW SEEN FORESHADOWED BY RUMANIAN PARTY BAN ON JEWS

BUCHAREST, June 28. (JTA) -- The barring of Jews from the totalitarian Party of the Nation was believed today to foreshadow issuance of a sweeping new anti-Jewish law.

The Government intends to decree further limitations on the activities of Jews, informed quarters said. Jews may be prohibited from owning farm lands or engaging in professions.

(A Swiss radio broadcast reported that one of the demands in the Soviet ultimatum to Rumania, which resulted in cession of Bessarabia and northern Bukowina, was for revision of the Rumanian political system. The report caused speculation on the effect of such a demand on the Axis alignment of the Bucharest Government and its concomitant anti-Semitic policy.)

Porunca Vremi, nationalist newspaper, urged new anti-Jewish measures, declaring that a national policy based on racial ideas was part of the future foundation of the Rumanian State.

"Rumania could not remain a haven for the wandering Jews," the paper said. "All Europe is today burning Jewish ambitions at the stake and Rumania could not exclude herself from this development."

Constantin Bratianu, head of the former Liberal Party, is reported to have issued a circular letter to his adherents urging them to join the new party.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC BARS ALL BUT SPONSORED IMMIGRATION

CIUDAD TRUJILLO, June 28. (JTA) -- All immigration, except that under the supervision of the Dominican Republic Settlement Association of New York, was discontinued today by the Dominican Government. The measure applies to Jews and non-Jews alike.

(The Dominican Congress on June 11 passed a bill barring all immigration except of persons intending to make the Republic their permanent home. The action came as a result of internal pressure from citizens objecting to the large number of "transient" refugees who had reached Ciudad Trujillo and were waiting there to procure entry into other North and South American countries.)

Leon Falk Jr., Pittsburgh industrialist and philanthropist, who is a member of the board of directors of the D.R.S.A., left for Miami by airplane this morning after a survey of refugee settlement here. He said the Sosua colonization project looked very promising.

ASSCHER EXECUTED FOR ANTI-NAZI ACTIVITY, LONDON HEARS

LONDON, June 28. (JTA) -- The weekly news magazine Cavalcade reported today execution by the Nazis in Amsterdam of Abraham Asscher, distinguished 80-year-old Dutch Jewish leader and head of one of the world's largest diamond concerns, and his two sons. Alleged anti-Nazi activity reportedly provided the motive for the executions.

(Refugees who have just arrived from Europe yesterday informed the JTA that the report of Asscher's execution had been announced on the German radio.)

TROPER ARRIVES IN LISBON

LISBON, June 28. (JTA) -- Morris C. Troper, European director of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, arrived here yesterday from Bordeaux by way of Spain. He will leave for New York by Clipper July 18.

HEADQUARTERS OF WORLD JEWISH CONGRESS NOW IN LONDON

NEW YORK, June 28. (JTA) -- Headquarters of the World Jewish Congress have been established in London, it was announced today by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, chairman of the executive committee. During the absence in the United States of Dr. Nahum Goldmann, chairman of the administrative committee, direction of European work will be in the hands of the Rev. Maurice L. Perلزweig, who has served until now as chairman of the British section of the Congress.

Establishment of London as the chief European center of World Jewish Congress activities was decided upon following a meeting of the Governing Council of the American Jewish Congress last night. At this meeting Dr. Goldmann presented an extended report on the Jewish position in Europe, indicating the direction in which World Jewish Congress activities may turn in the coming weeks.

RABBIS REAFFIRM FAITH IN DEMOCRACY, URGE MORE AID FOR PALESTINE

DETROIT, June 28. (JTA) -- The Rabbinical Assembly of America, concluding its fortieth annual convention, was on record today with a six-point declaration reaffirming its faith in democracy, urging Americans to aid those resisting "the modern enemies of God and man," recommending increasing support for Palestine at a time when Israel was faced with "a situation as critical as the destruction of Jerusalem and the exile from Palestine," and deploring "wholesale anti-alien agitation."

The declaration, adopted yesterday afternoon in a moving scene reflecting deep devotion to faith, was directed to the Jews and other peoples of America. It was decided to publish it for wide distribution among Jews and Christians.

Conceived "in due humility," the declaration said:

1--The first spiritual pitfall to be avoided is not to be arrogant;

2--We cannot disassociate ourselves from a share in the responsibility for the present woes;

3--The greatest tragedy of all would be if we, in haste to resist the enemy, would adopt his weapon. Military triumphs, be they ever so impressive, do not transform evil into virtue. This is not the time for wholesale anti-alien agitation or indiscriminate curtailment of civil rights. We must continue to exert efforts in behalf of the needy, underprivileged and unemployed;

4--Americans must exert all possible efforts to strengthen the hands of those who resist the modern enemies of God and man;

5--We reaffirm our unequivocal faith in American democracy. Once the electorate has given its decision in the forthcoming elections, our allegiance shall be wholehearted and complete to the newly-elected Government;

6--The convention recognizes that Israel today faces a situation as critical as the destruction of Jerusalem and the exile from Palestine. This is the time to act to save what can be saved, to protect what can be protected. Institutions of learning in this country must be supported. Palestine must be given increasing support.

The convention adopted resolutions urging support for a campaign in behalf of the Yemenite Jews in Palestine, aid for the Histadruth and the Hapoel Hamizrachi and support for the Academy of Jewish Research in publishing a volume on the 900th anniversary of Rashi, Bible and Talmud commentator. The convention also decided to publish a manual for rabbis, referred to the Executive the report of the Social Justice Commission and deferred a stand on conscientious objectors.

Rabbi Leon S. Lang, Philadelphia, was elected president and Rabbi Louis M. Levitsky, Newark, vice-president.

'GERMAN JUSTICE' SLATED FOR REFUGEES GIVEN UP BY FRANCE, BERLIN RADIO SAYS

NEW YORK, June 28. (JTA) -- "German justice" will be meted out to German and Austrian refugees in France whose return the French Government promised under the armistice agreement, according to a shortwave broadcast from Berlin.

The Nazi broadcaster referred to the refugees in France as "political gangsters and "dark political criminals" who took advantage of French refuge to carry on a "campaign of hate against Germany." He added: "It is nothing more than clear justice that these criminals be turned over by the French to German justice."

10 URUGUAYAN NAZIS RELEASED

NEW YORK, June 28. (JTA) -- The Uruguayan authorities have released 10 Nazi leaders who had been held in connection with the recently-discovered plot to seize Uruguay as a Reich agricultural colony, the New York Times reported today from Montevideo. The dispatch attributed the release to pressure from Berlin and also from one of Uruguay's neighbors.

McWILLIAMS TRIAL CONTINUES

NEW YORK, June 28. (JTA) -- Trial of Joseph McWilliams, organizer of the Christian Mobilizers and "American Destiny Party" candidate for Congress, on disorderly conduct charges for fomenting race hatred at public meetings continued today in Yorkville Magistrates Court. Meanwhile, the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League began distribution of thousands of copies of a leaflet on McWilliams entitled "Who Is Joe McNazi?" discussing his connections with Nazis.

MRS. ROOSEVELT URGES GENEROSITY TOWARD REFUGEES

NEW YORK, June 28. (JTA) -- Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt declared today in her syndicated column that it was possible to show generosity to the refugees who "are in great misery and danger" while safeguarding this country. The Jewish refugees, she said, "love liberty and value it and have had experiences which may be of value to us in recognizing the propaganda methods used by totalitarian dictators."
