MORE 'VENGEANCE' ON JEWS HINTED AFTER RUMANIAN ARMY SLAYS 600

EUDAPEST, July 1. (JTA) -- The German News Agency, following its report that 600 Jews had been massacred by Rumanian troops in Galati, today quoted the Bucharest newspaper Curentul as threatening further "vengeance" against the Jews for alleged attempts to cause "internal unrest."

Curentul's appeal to Rumanians was quoted as follows:

"From the other side of the demarcation line, from the occupied regions, reports reached us calculated to mobilize the greatest rage for vengeance. In Bessarabia and Bukovina Jews have dropped their mask. More dangerous is the intentionally provocative attitude of the Jews in the capital, which led to spontaneous measures of defense on the part of the Rumanian population.

"Behind this impudence there stands the maneuver of causing internal unrest. Every unrest at home means a weakening of the country. Therefore Rumanians must keep cool and ignore provocations. Let us not forget that England is under a hypnosis of fear of German attack and invasion. Rumania is for Germany a source of supply of oil. The purpose of the disturbances is the destruction of the petroleum region. Rumanians must suppress their rage and wait--our time will come."

Curentul's statement was published this morning, the German agency said, after the authorities yesterday issued instructions that "Hungarians, Bulgarians and Jews must no longer be attacked." Before that, Sunday's Bucharest papers had been instructed to publish Curentul's report about "Jewish excesses" in Bessarabia and Bukovina, the Nazi agency declared.

The Berlin radio reported approximately 600 Jews were massacred and many more wounded by Rumanian troops in Galati. The Nazi reports claim there had been "armed Jewish uprisings." According to the Nazi account, about 2,000 persons, "mostly Jews." from Galati and Bucharest who had gone to Soviet-occupied Bessarabia to seek Soviet citizenship were returned by the retreating Rumanian army.

This crowd fought Rumanian soldiers in Reni, Bessarabia--according to the German report--but was subdued and loaded onto the train. Arriving in Galati, the Nazi radio related, one man shot a Rumanian soldier and the whole group fled. Rumanian soldiers then encircled part of the town, shooting the "fugitives" with machine-guns and kept up the search for stragglers during the night.

Meanwhile, anti-Semitic agitation was growing in Bucharest. Propaganda manifestoes, apparently Nazi-inspired, were distributed in the Rumanian capital, accusing Britain and the Jews of seeking Rumania's downfall and ending with: "Down with the Jews!" Some Bucharest newspapers published the Italian account of the Soviet occupation of Bessarabia which claimed that Jews stoned Rumanian soldiers and concluded: "There is a general feeling of contempt for the Jews in the whole country."

However, the Government apparently was seeking to throw suspicion of disloyalty on the Jews by reporting that they were flocking to the Soviet area. The Government announced that 7,800 Jews had passed through Ungheni and 2,000 through Reni en route to the Russian-held territory. Many others have expressed a desire to go, and it was officially stated that they may obtain permits from local authorities.

The Rumanian Interior Minister today issued a decree declaring "it is forbidden to accommodate strangers, especially Jewish refugees, without registering them immediately with the police."

BRITAIN BARS SYRIA, LEBANON TO HOSTILE POWERS

LONDON, July 1. (JTA) -- Warning that the British Government will not permit any hostile power to occupy French-mandated Syria and Lebanon was officially issued today.

The statement of the British position said that in view of the decision of General Eugene Mittelhauser, French commander in Syria, to cease hostilities, the Government would hold itself free to take whatever measures were necessary to prevent hostile occupation of Syria and Lebanon for use as a base for attacks on the countries of the Middle East which Britain was pledged to defend.

Any action taken will not be done to prejudice the future status of the presently French-mandated territories, it was said.

Call For Volunteers Warmly Greeted in Palestine

JERUSALEM, July 1. (JTA) -- The Jewish community and the Hebrew press received warmly the Royal Air Force's call for Palestinian volunteers. According to the newspaper Haaretz, the Jewish Agency is wholeheartedly supporting the plan and is advising candidates to rush to volunteer.

Palestine-born males or citizens of Allied countries residing in Palestine who are 18 to 45 years old were yesterday officially invited to volunteer for service with the Royal Air Force or other branches of the British fighting forces. The volunteers will be subject to service wherever Britain is engaged in war, but will be used chiefly in the Mediterranean area, it was stated.

ARRESTS OF JEWS CONTINUE IN ITALY

ROME, July 1. (JTA) -- Arrests of Jews are continuing and are expected ultimately to include all foreign Jews and all native Jews whose citizenship was revoked in September. 1958.

In Trieste, a third of the male Jewish population was arrested, including all of the leaders. In Fiume and Abazzia, all native Jewish males between the ages of 16 and 60 were arrested, among them a former general.

REFUGEE PROBLEM TO BE AIRED AT PAN-AMERICAN PARLEY IN HAVANA

WASHINGTON, July 1. (JTA) -- The forthcoming Havana meeting of American republics will consider every phase of the world's immense refugee problem, Secretary of State Cordell Hull predicted today. He indicated the republics would be asked to announce what aid they could render to alleviate the refugee situation.

Consideration of the refugee problems will be under Article IV of the first section of the agenda, calling for "consideration of the humanitarian activities which can be conducted in the American republics for the benefit of victims of the European war." Hull was asked specifically whether this would include the problem of bringing evacuated European children to the Western Hemisphere and he said he believed it would.

Meanwhile, Dominican Minister Andres Pastoriza, calling on Undersecretary of State Summer Welles, said the Dominican Republic planned to accept 5,000 European children under plans now being formulated, in addition to hundreds of refugees to be brought under the aegis of the Dominican Republic Settlement Association.

James N. Rosenberg, president of the D.R.S.A., conferred with British Ambassador Lord Lothian today in an effort to speed plans for bringing to the Sosua colony several hundred German refugees now in temporary safety in Britain. These would temporarily replace the refugees who had been selected for the Dominican colony but were unable to leave because of Italy's entry into the war.

FRENCH JEWISH LEADERS ARRIVE IN LISBON

LISBON, July 1. (JTA) -- Joseph Mirkin, director of the Jewish Colonization Association, and Bernard Melamed, secretary of the HIAS-IOA Emigration Association, arrived here today after a week-long trip from France. Melamed said the whereabouts of Edouard and Louis Oungre were unknown. He had last seen them at Biarritz motoring toward the frontier.

CHILE OFFERS ASYLUM TO FRENCH INTELLECTUALS

SANTTAGO, Chile, June 25. (JTA - By Airmail). -- Foreign Minister Cristobal Saenz, has cabled to the Chilean Ambassador at Paris ordering issuance of visas to French intellectuals, including Romain Rolland, Jean Richard Bloch, Gustave Regler, Andre Malraux, and others. A similar cable has been sent to the International Red Cross in Geneva, Switzerland, as some of these French intellectuals were reported to have fled to Switzerland.

The Chilean Government in an official statement today denounced a radio broadcast by Jose Maria Pinedo, a Chilean lawyer visiting Germany, in which he attacked Jews and praised Germany's anti-Jewish measures. The speech was broadcast from Berlin and was

published in part by a Chilean newspaper. The Chilean Foreign Ministry said that Senor Pinedo "did not speak for the Chilean Government and his anti-Semitic ideas broadcast from Berlin are not shared by the Chilean population."

BUSINESS SESSIONS FEATURE SECOND DAY OF ZOA CONVENTION

PITTSBURGH, July 1. (JTA) -- The Zionist Organization of America convention today settled down to a routine of business sessions and committee meetings, with election of officers scheduled for tonight.

A cable from Chaim Weizmann, Jewish Agency President, to the convention urged American Jewry to rise to the height of the responsibilities imposed by the present situation: "In hour when most European Jewry groans under heel Nasi oppressor and when fate Palestine at stake, your convention, representing most powerful responsible organization American Jewry, assumes truly historic importance. Four years' constant attack on its structure and nine months of war have shown soudness of Yishuv's foundations, its courage and ability to continue constructive work even under most difficult circumstances."

Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner of Cleveland, presiding at a convention banquet last night, urged the lifting of the Jewish problem out of the vortex of anti-Semitism, relief and charity to "a new plane on which it belongs--the plane of statesmanship."

JABOTINSKY ORDERS PALESTINE REVISIONISTS TO COOPERATE

NEW YORK, July 2. (JTA) -- Vladimir Jabotinsky, president of the New Zionist Organization, has cabled instructions to the Palestine N.Z.O., in the event of "actual war conditions" to "leave responsibility to majority and safeguard Yishuv's unity," it was announced today by Benjamin Akzin, who said the instructions had been carried out by the Palestine N.Z.O.

The cable, dated May 21, said: "Should homeland come under actual war conditions you will leave responsibility to majority and safeguard Yishuv's unity, except partition intrigue revived or acts prejudicing homeland's national future. Delegation (in America) and administrative committee doing utmost formation Jewish army and united Jewish executive implementing Nordau plan. Ready for round-table with other Zionists as preliminary but meantime continuing act independently. Firmly believe whatever happens this world crisis will restore Jewish state."
