500 YOUNG REFUGERS SET TO SAIL FOR SAN DOMINGO UNDER BRITISH CONVOY

WASHINGTON, July 2. (JTA) -- Five hundred young refugees from Germany, Austria and Czechoslovakia, of an average age of 16, will leave England immediately for the Dominican Republic, with 500 more to follow as soon as funds and transportation can be provided, Stephen V.C. Morris, secretary of the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees, announced today.

It is hoped the first contingent will leave England within ten days. While details of their journey are held secret, since Germany has not guaranteed safe conduct for refugees, it is believed they will proceed on a British liner under convoy. Sir Herbert Emerson, director of the Intergovernmental Committee, is supervising selection of the youngsters in London.

The second group will be selected while the first is en route. Whether this group will be atle to sail depends on the immediate raising of funds totalling \$250,000. The refugees will be settled on the 24,000-acre Sosua tract donated by Generalissimo Rafael L. Trujillo, ex-President of the Dominican Republic.

Plans for evacuation of the refugees were completed today at meetings of officials of three governments and the Dominican Republic Settlement Association. Participating were British Ambassador Lord Lothian, Dominican Minister Andres Pastoriza, State Department and Intergovernmental Committee officials and James N. Rosenberg, New York, and Lean Falk Jr., Pittsburgh, of the D.R.S.A.

Permission for the children and young men and women to enter the Dominican Republic under the aegis of the settlement association was given by the Dominican Government. British-born children are not necessarily excluded from this opportunity.

Whereabouts of a "lost battalion" of refugees who were in Italy when that nation went to war and who were preparing to sail on the Italian steemship Neptunia for the Dominican Republic still remains a mystery, Morris said. Hope that they will ever reach the Dominican Republic has all but been abandoned, he said.

LANTI-SEMITIC TENSION EASES IN RUMANIA AS PRESS TONES DOWN ATTACKS

BUCHAREST, July 2. (JTA) -- Moderating of the intense anti-Semitic atmosphere of recent days was noticeable tonight after the Government's appeals for calm. The Jew-baiting press toned down its anti-Jewish articles,

(The Government issued orders to the press on Sunday to cease attacks on "Hungarians, Bulgarians and Jews.")

The Minister of Interior summoned Dr. William Filderman, president of the Union of Rumanian Jews, and requested him to reassure the Jewish population.

Iron Guardists Spread False Reports

LONDON, July 2. (JTA) -- A Daily Mail correspondent said today that unconfirmed reports of Jews attacking refugees from Bessarabia were probably being spread by Iron Guardists, Rumanian Fascist terrorists, in the hope of stirring up pogroms "as a useful safety valve."

A Belgrade dispatch to the Daily Express, describing the Galati incident which had earlier been reported by the German News Agency as suppression by the Rumanian army of an "armed Jewish uprising" with 600 Jews killed, reported that there had been a demonstration in which 2,000 Rumanian workmen participated. Four persons were killed in a resulting clash, the dispatch said, adding: "German sources, which seem anxious to capitalize Rumanian disorders, hasten to add that the demonstrators were all Jews."

The Daily Telegraph reported from Bucharest that there was "no official confirmation" of the German News Agency report of an "uprising" by Jews in Galati.

The Times reported from Bucharest that many Jews of the wealthier classes were among the refugees from Bessarabia while most of the poorer Jews in the Soviet-occupied province had elected to remain.

"Among the miserable crowd of fugitives from Bessarabia," the dispatch said, "are many blackgowned, bearded Jews of the wealthier classes who are fleeing from the tyranny of mob rule unleashed by the invaders, even though they are casting their lot with an anti-Semitic regime which still puts faith in Hitler. Most of the poorer Jews have chosen to remain."

Jews Plan to Wreck Oil Fields, Rome Paper Charges

ROME, July 2. (JTA) -- The newspaper Giornale d'Italia charged in a Bucharest dispatch that the Jews were planning destruction of the Rumanian oil fields in order to bring about defeat of the Axis Powers which are dependent upon them for their oil supplies. The dispatch said the Jews were acting upon instructions from Zionist head-ourters in London

Train Service to Bessarabia Halted

NEW YORK, July 2. (JTA) -- A United Press dispatch from Bucharest today said that the Government, acting to suppress the flight of the Jews and avoid further clashes such as reportedly occurred at Galati, had suspended train service to Bessarabia. The

.P. said the rush of Jews into Bessarabia and away from Rumania assumed "almost panicky roportions when the Russian Legation fixed a six-day time limit for the exodus.

It was forecast that Rumania's renunciation of the British guarantee of support against Germany would accelerate the exodus of Jews, the U.P. said.

ZOA PLEDGES 'UNSTINTING SUPPORT' FOR WEIZMANN; NAMES KAUFMANN PRESIDENT

PITTSEURGH, July 2. (JTA) -- Adopting resolutions of "unstinting support" for Dr. Chaim Weizmann and calling on American Jews to aid the Palestine homeland, the 43rd annual convention closed its three-day sessions in peace and harmony this afternoon after a heated contest surrounding election of Edmund I. Kaufmann, Washington merchant and philahthropist, as president.

As a peace gesture, Louis Lipsky, who had led the opposition to Kaufmann, introduced the new president, declaring: "Mr. Kaufmann's many qualities will have a refreshing and elevating effect upon our work." Kaufmann, accepting the post, insisted that Palestine's needs be met by all American Jews, not only Zionists. "They must be made to see that Palestine does not belong to any group of Jews but belongs to all Jews, to you and to me and to everyone else who feels and believes himself a Jew," he said.

A cable of greeting from Dr. Weizmann to Kaufmann was read. It said: "Heartiest congratulations and all good wishes. Look forward to closest cooperation for mobilization supreme effort united American Jewry for Palestine."

The convention rose in a moment of silence in memory of the victims of the war in Europe. A resolution was adopted declaring that "the brilliant leadership of Dr. Weizmann has proven to be a beacon of light and a source of courage and inspiration for Zionisis everywhere" and pledging him "our increasing and unstinting support."

Another resolution asserted: "The englavement of the overwhelming majority of the Jaws in the diaspora has placed a new meaning and urgency upon further rebuilding and maintenance of the Jawish national home in Palestine. American Jewry must recognize that it is the last bulwark of moral and material support. We call upon all members of the Zionist Organization of America to dedicate themselves to the concrete task of sustaining and strengthening the structure of the homeland through the United Palestine Appeal." Establishment of a National Zionist Youth Commission was called for in another resolution.

Election of Kaufmann, who was supported by retiring President Solomon Goldman, came last night at the end of a heated five-hour session during which the convention rejected a plan proposed by Louis Lipsky and Dr. Stephen S. Wise for a collegium of seven instead of a president. Lipsky was nominated for president, but withdrew in the interests of peace. However, his group refrained from voting.

Elected with Kaufmann are Prof. Harry Friedenwald and Judge Julian W. Mack, honorary vice-presidents; Dr. Goldman, Dr. Israel Goldstein, Lipsky, Judge Morris Rothenberg, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, Robert Szold and Dr. Wise, vice-presidents; Judge Louis E. Levinthal, chairman of the administrative council.

Earlier, the convention had unanimously approved a war emergency program for Palestine, presented by Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the Jewish Agency, including provision for immigration of 5,000 European refugees between now and Sept. 30 through the overland route via Syria and Turkey.

The emergency program includes these activities: (1) children's evacuation camps and special medical care, (2) overland transport facilities and other vital security precautions, (3) extraordinary measures for relief of unemployed, including workers in Tel Aviv and Haifa ports and other classes affected by economic dislocations resulting from the war, (4) establishment of public works projects for creation of increased employment opportunities, (5) absorption and training of refugees, including the 5,000 new arrivals prepared for in the period ending next September, (6) loans to small manufacturers and tradesmen.

This program, which would be carried out by the Palestine Foundation Fund and Jewish National Fund, includes provision for facilitation of commercial credits for agricultural settlements established since 1936 to provide for irrigation systems and other aids; reclamation of land, drainage and the building of roads and urban development.

4 PALESTINE UNITS TO BE ENLISTED FOR SERVICE WITH BRITISH FORCES

JERUSALEM, July 2. (JTA) -- The Government today issued a call for volunteers to form four Palestine units with the British military forces.

The first unit will comprise artisans wanted for service with the Royal Engineers. A second section will be attached to the Signal Corps. The third and fourth unit will be respectively Jewish and Arab mechanized transport companies. Officers and non-commissioned officers will be recruited from Palestinians and will include a small British nucleus.

More companies will be required also for the Auxiliary Military Pioneer Corps, it was announced.

U.S. CITIZENS SEEKING TO QUIT PALESTINE TOLD TO GO VIA INDIA

JERUSALEM, July 2. (JTA) -- American citizens intending to return to the United States were advised by the American Consul today to proceed to India to wait for American ships. There are an estimated 8,000 Americans in Palestine.

'ARYAN' PLANK IN FRENCH NAZI GOVERNMENT HELD POSSIBILITY

LONDON, July 2. (JTA) -- Commenting on a New York Times dispatch from Paris, which quoted a prediction by a former Paris Midi writer that a French Nuzi government mimus an "Aryan" plank would be formed, the Manchester Guardian today declared that exclusion of such a plank was not certain.

The Guardian pointed out that the two key men in such a Government, Interior Minister Adrian Marquet and Marcel Deat, have in the past only thinly disguised their admiration for the Nazi regime in Germany.

"In controversies with (former Premier Leon) Blum," the newspaper said, "they never failed to season their arguments by anti-Semitic insinuations."

(Marquet, a former dentist, succeeded Georges Mandel as Interior Minister when the Reynaud Cabinet gave way to the Petain transition government. Together with Pierre Laval, he is considered the main leader in the present government. He is 54 years old and has represented Bordeaux in the Chamber of Debuties since 1924.

(Deat, according to the Times correspondent George Axelsson, is scheduled to become Propaganda and Press Minister in the new government. Together with Marquet and Barthelemy Montagnon, he helped found French Neo-Socialism, program of which is summed up as "Order, authority, nation.")

ALL DUTCH REFUGEES WARNED TO RETURN TO HOLLAND

LONDON, July 2. (JTA) -- The Dutch wireless today broadcast a warning to all Dutchmen who fled Holland during the Nazi invasion to report to the authorities for repatriation. Hundreds of Dutch Jews are among the refugees in France who are affected by the order, which specifies that the refugees are to report to the repatriation commission sent to Paris by Arthur Seyss-Inquart, Nazi Commissioner for Holland.

JEWS STILL GETTING RED CROSS RELIEF IN POLAND, AGENT REPORTS

WASHINGTON, July 2.
