800 SUICIDES IN PARIS ON DAY BEFORE GERMANS ENTERED, LONDON HEARS

LONDON, July 5. (JTA) -- The King-Hall Newsletter reported today that 800 suicides were recorded in the 24 hours preceding entry of the German army into Paris. Of this number 300 were reportedly Jewish refugees from Germany and Poland.

During the first 48 hours of the German occupation, the Newsletter said, there were 18,000 arrests.

An anti-Jewish publication called France at Work has made its appearance in Paris, it was reported today. It is one of several new newspapers being published in Paris.

ARANDORA STAR CARRIED ANTI-NAZIS, MANCHESTER GUARDIAN REPORTS

LONDON, July 5. (JTA) -- The Manchester Guardian said today that anti-Nazis as well as Nazis were on board the Arandora Star when it was torpedoed off the Irish coast Tuesday morning.

The newspaper charged also that deportation of aliens in category C, previously unrestricted and regarded as friendly, had been kept secret from relatives and that refugee organization officials had not been informed.

Meanwhile, George R. Strauss, Labor M.P., announced that he would ask in Commons next Tuesday whether the Arandora Star was under convoy at the time it was torpedoed, whether it had ample lifeboat provision, how many of the Germans aboard were known to be Nazis, how many came to England as refugees, when relatives and friends would be provided with the names of those drowned and whether in the future it was proposed to transport internees on unconvoyed ships.

Home Secretary Sir John Anderson today declined in Commons to make a definite statement on the Home Office policy with regard to internment of aliens. He declared, however, that in view of the "exigencies of the military situation," certain further categories of Germans and Austrians were being interned as a precautionary measure. He said measures were being taken to exempt from internment certain categories of persons whose position could be distinguished by the value of their services to the national war effort.

OVER 1,000 JEWS VOLUNTEER FOR PALESTINE UNITS IN 48 HOURS

JERUSALEM, July 5. (JTA) -- More than 1,000 Jews have enlisted for service with four Palestine units of the British armed forces, it was announced today.

The enlistments were recorded within 48 hours after issuance of a call for volunteers to serve with the units, one of which is to be entirely Jewish, one Arab and two mixed. Several hundred of the recruits were immediately assigned to active duty.

The Palestine Government announced today that, in accordance with a decree issued June 5, all police including specials henceforth will be employed for military purposes at the discretion of the General Officer Commanding, Lt.-Gen. G.J. Giffard.

Jews throughout Palestine yesterday observed a day of fast and prayers for Britain's victory.

SWIFT REMOVAL OF 500 HOLDING PALESTINE VISAS SOUGHT BY RUMANIAN GROUP

JERUSALEM, July 5. (JTA) -- Concerned over Rumanian developments, the Association of Rumanian Jews today urgently requested the Jewish Agency for Palestine to take action to speed the removal from Rumania of 500 Jews holding Palestine immigration certificates.

Included in the 500 are 185 in the capitalist category and many veteran Zionist leaders who escaped from Bessarabia to the unoccupied portions of Bukovina.

The Jewish community, meanwhile, is seriously concerned over the disruption of telegraphic communications between Rumania and Palestine, now in its sixth day.

Many Palestine citizens have received cables from Lithuania urging because of the tension in the Baltics, immediate dispatch of immigration certificates and conclusion of transportation arrangements.

MOSLEM LEADER HITS AT ITALIAN BISHOPS' DEMAND FOR PALESTINE CONQUEST

JERUSALEM, July 5. (JTA) -- The curator of the Mosque of Omar has registered a formal protest with High Commissioner Sir Harold Alfred MacMichael against the hope expressed to Premier Benito Mussolini by 30 Italian bishops that the Italian banner would be hoisted over the Holy Land.

"In behalf of every Moslem interested in the affairs and safety of the Mosque of Omar," the protest said, "we denounce through Your Excellency these evil intentions and emphasize to His Majesty's Government the readiness of Moslems to sacrifice themselves in the defense of the Moslem Holy Places."

25,000 JOBLESS RECORDED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, July 5. (JTA) -- Statistics made public today revealed a total of 25,000 unemployed Jews throughout the country. More than 26,000 children are being fed by the Hadassah, American women's Zionist organization, and other institutions, it was disclosed.

HEBREW U. STUDENTS STRIKE; SEEK AID DURING SUMMER

JERUSALEM, July 5. (JTA) -- Hebrew University students called a strike today charging that the University had discontinued support of those who, because of the war, have been cut off from their parents in European countries.

The University countered the charge with a statement explaining that it had fulfilled a promise made last September to support 250 students in this category for the duration of the year. The students were now demanding, the statement added, support during the Summer vacation period and the University has arranged assistance for one month for needy cases and is ready to help students obtain further means of support.

The University has distributed £3,500 in relief and has made exemptions and subventions totalling £5,900, the statement said, adding that national institutions had failed to fulfill promises of aid.

NAZI WOULD GIVE REPATRIATED HUNGARIANS LAND SEIZED FROM JEWS

BUDAPEST, July 5. (JTA) -- During the debate in Parliament yesterday, a Nazi deputy suggested repatriation of Hungarians from abroad, to be given estates expropriated from Jews. He admitted it would be necessary to modify the statutes for this purpose.

SLOVAKIA TAKES LICENSES FROM 1,600 JEWISH FIRMS

BUDAPEST, July 5. (JTA) -- The Slovakian authorities were reported today to have cancelled the licenses of 1,600 Jewish-owned business firms up to July 1.

A German wireless report said that 26,000 Jewish-owned businesses have been listed in Slovakia and that many of them were scheduled for early liquidation. More than 60 of the enterprises have been "Aryanized" up to June 15.

YUGOSLAV ANTI-SEMITES REPORTED REORGANIZED

GENEVA, July 5. (JTA) -- German newspapers state that after the development of events in Western Europe, the Jewish question has been revived in Southeastern Europe.

In Yugoslavia, the Nazi press reports, anti-Semites have reorganized themselves and established a weekly called Balkan.

The anti-Semitic organization Zbor, headed by ex-Minister of Justice Dimitri Ljotisch is carrying on strong propaganda and has republished a book by the notorious anti-Semite, Jascha Tomisch, former Hungarian Parliament deputy, in which he attacks British Jews, accusing them of intrigues in Southeastern Europe.

KLEE ARRESTED IN AMSTERDAM

LISBON, July 5. (JTA) -- Alfred Klee, former member of the board of the Berlin Jewish Community, has been arrested by the Nazi authorities in Amsterdam, it was reported here today.

DYNAMITE FOR FAIR BOMBING BELIEVED STOLEN FROM SYNAGOGUE; BUNDSMEN, FRONTERS SEIZED

NEW YORK, July 5. (JTA) -- Police today pressed a sweeping round-up of Christian Fronters, members of the German-American Bund and other anti-British elements as they investigated the killing of two detectives and the wounding of five other police by a bomb taken from the World's Fair British Pavilion which exploded near the Polish Pavilion while being examined.

First indication that police had any clue came this afternoon when Police Commissioner Lewis J. Valentine expressed the belief that the explosive used was part of the haul of 39 sticks of dynamite stolen on May 29 from a construction shack at the new Free Synagogue building. At the time of the theft the watchman declared one of the thieves was a tall, dark man, "apparently Irish."

As part of the police round-up, Chief Inspector Louis F. Costuma sent out orders to take into custody any known "Bundists, Fascists or members of the Christian Front" attending open-air meetings at Columbus Circle. Seventeen men were taken from Circle meetings and other gathering places for questioning at headquarters last night. In addition, a detective was sent today to Newton, N.J., where three Bund leaders were being arraigned under the New Jersey "anti-uniform law."

3 BUND LEADERS ARRAIGNED UNDER NEW JERSEY ANTI-AGITATION LAW

ANDOVER, N.J., July 5. (JTA) -- G. Wilhelm Kunze, acting Fuehrer of the German-American Bund; August Klapprott, Eastern leader and manager of Camp Nordland, and Mathias Kohler, an officer and trustee of the camp, who were arrested yesterday and spent the night in jail, were arraigned today on charges of violating the New Jersey law which prohibits wearing of uniforms and display of emblems of a foreign nation and circulation of literature inciting race or religious hatred. They were to be released in bail of \$1,000 each.

GROUP SET UP TO COORDINATE EVACUATION OF JEWISH CHILDREN FROM ENGLAND

LONDON, July 5. (JTA) -- The Board of Deputies of British Jews, after a conference with the Children's Overseas Reception Board, is establishing a central committee to deal with all matters referred to it regarding evacuation of Jewish children. The board has received offers from the Dominions to accommodate Jewish children and is maintaining contact with Jewish communities there. It has also been in touch with American Jewish communities.

121 REFUGEES BARRED FROM LANDING AT CASABLANCA

LISBON, July 5. (JTA) -- A group of 121 French and Belgian Jewish refugees who have arrived at Casablanca, French Morocco, on a small steamer after many hardships have been refused permission to land, it was reported here today. A number of Belgian Jews, including the relief leader, Ernst Torczyner, have been arrested in unoccupied France and held at St. Cyprien in the Pyrenees. About 1,000 German Jewish children, under the supervision of the OSE, Jewish health society, are stranded in Vichy, unoccupied France.
