PORTUGAL FEARS LOSS OF FREEDOM IF NAZIS DRIVE FOR GIBRALTAR; GESTAPO LISTS JEWS

LISBON, July 14. (ONA) -- Portugal, now celebrating 800 years of independence, is beginning to fear that she may lose her freedom if the development of the war makes it necessary for Germany to operate from this country.

Well-informed circles believe it possible that the Nazis, in an offensive against Gibraltar, may utilize the Spanish coast and also claim the Portuguese coast. The Lisbon harbor, situated between the Spanish ports of Vigo and Cadiz and only several hours from Gibraltar, attracts the Germans because of its possibilities as a naval base.

In such an eventuality, Spain would probably support Germany. With German forces now at Hendaye, on the Franco-Spanish border, and near San Sebastian, Spanish port, the Madrid Government would have little other alternative than to submit to German demands.

Nazi diplomats in Portugal, in private conversations with friends and journalists, openly boast that the Gestapo already possesses lists of Jews, and others in Portugal who will be handled as anti-Nazi elements. Whether these boasts are only aimed at frightening Portuguese statesmen and the population or whether they are true, is difficult to judge.

However, their effect is to increase anxiety among Portugal's 5,000 Jews, who have resided here unmolested for more than a century and enjoy equality of rights, as well as among the thousands of refugees who have come here from France.

French, Belgian and other refugees are alarmed over the possibility that this small, hospitable country may fall under German-Spanish domination and they are seeking ways of leaving Portugal as soon as possible. Many of them embark for England on British steamers, receiving visas without difficulty if they are skilled workers.

Refugees who have no hope of being admitted to England are seeking to reach Morocco and Algeria on small boats which go chiefly to Casablanca. However, on reaching that port, they usually find that they are not permitted to land there. The Jewish community in Tangier has succeeded, in exceptional cases, in obtaining entry for refugees, but Casablanca remains generally closed.

Numerous French and Belgian refugees are appealing for visas to Haiti, the Dominican Republic and other distant lands, hoping to get there on Greek and Portuguese steamships, while others are ready to proceed to Angola if permitted by the Portuguese colonial authorities to settle there.

Having no illusions as to its own possible fate, the Jewish community in Portugal is organizing all its forces to give maximum assistance to French, Belgian, Polish and other Jewish refugees who have arrived here from France. A special relief office has been opened by Jewish relief leaders in Lisbon to aid the refugees.

This office is financed by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and has also established an emigration section, which is financed by the HIAS-ICA Emigration Association. Representatives of this office also operate in provincial cities to which the Portuguese authorities have assigned hundreds of refugees in order to prevent overcrowding of the capital.

NAZIS PERMIT AMERICANS TO LEAVE FRANCE; FOOD PRICES LOWER AT BORDEAUX

LISBON, July 14. (ONA) -- American citizens are encountering no difficulties in obtaining Nazi exit visas, now required to leave occupied France, it was learned here today from an American who has just arrived from the Nazi-held territory.

The American reported also that the French tricolor has been replaced by the Nazi flag at Hendaye, Franco-Spanish border city through which he came. He said the French border authorities were still carrying out their functions, but German soldiers at the frontier were examining all passports for the required Nazi exit visas, while French customs officials continued to conduct the customs examinations.

Reports from Bordeaux said that food prices have gone down, a majority of the French refugees having left the city, and that there was no longer any shortage of sleeping quarters. Refugees still in the city, however, were reportedly completely without funds and in urgent need of relief.

ROMANIAN DECREE BARS MANY JEWS FROM JOBS; EXPULSION DEMANDED

BUCHAREST, July 14. (JTA) -- A decree whose effect will be to deprive thousands of Jews of jobs was published today simultaneously with an editorial in the newspaper Porunca Vremii demanding expulsion from Rumania of all Jews of Bessarabian or North Bukovinian origin.

The decree, confirming a previous decision by the pro-Nazi Cabinet, specifies that all persons barred from membership in the totalitarian Party of the Nation are ineligible to hold public office, to direct industrial and commercial enterprises and to hold employment officially or in a private, professional capacity in any organization. Jews are barred from membership in the Party of the Nation.

The editorial in Porunca Vremii demanded also that Jews who had "Rumanized" their names be compelled to return them to their original form.

Earlier, Interior Minister Popescu received Dr. William Filderman, president of the Union of Rumanian Jews, assured him that order would be maintained and asked him to instruct the Jews to remain calm and to ignore "exaggerated rumors." Popescu promised assistance to families of arrested and interned Jews.

15,000 JEWS ENTERED PALESTINE SINCE WAR STARTED

TEL AVIV, Palestine, July 14. (JTA) -- Fifteen thousand Jews have entered Palestine since outbreak of the war last September, it was announced today by Eliahu Dobkin, head of the immigration department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

Dobkin said that the Agency had an additional 6,000 immigration certificates in its possession and that 5,000 more were due from the last part of the current immigration schedule. He said the Agency was trying to arrange transportation to Palestine of many thousands of prospective immigrants, principally by land.

TYPHUS VICTIMS IN WARSAW MOSTLY JEWS, U.S. RELIEF AGENTS TOLD

GENEVA, July 14. (JTA) -- A delegation of the American Commission for Polish Relief was officially advised in Warsaw that only 8 per cent of typhus cases are Polish and the rest are Jewish, necessitating isolation of the Jewish quarter behind barbed wire, according to the Krakauer Zeitung, Nazi organ in Poland.

The paper reports that the statement was made to the delegation by Prof. Richter, medical officer of the Warsaw District, in a speech made during a reception at the home of the Governor of Warsaw.

It is learned here that the celebrated synagogue of the Rabbi of Belz has been transformed by the Nazis into a granary.

LEON BLUM IN UNOCCUPIED FRANCE

GENEVA, July 14. (JTA) -- It was ascertained today that ex-Premier Leon Blum, French Socialist leader, is in unoccupied France. He had been reported as arriving in England.

VICHY REGIME BANS JEWS FROM OFFICIAL POSTS, NAZIS REPORT

LONDON, July 14. (JTA) -- The German wireless reported in a Vichy dispatch that Jews in effect were barred from Government positions by a decree issued yesterday by the French Government.

"This decree stipulates for the first time in the life of the French State that no foreigners or persons of another race may hold French Government posts," the Berlin report said. "This amounts to elimination of Jews from Government posts.

"In the past, French high offices were occupied by foreigners who only for a few years had been Frenchmen. Native-born Frenchmen will guarantee the French nation more efficient departmental administration than hitherto, as foreigners and a racial minority are too often associated with groups other than those serving French interests exclusively."

The decree applies to ministers, secretaries of state and other high officials, who must prove five years of service to the State, in addition to French birth.

LONDON DENIES NAZI REPORTS OF SECRET ANGLO-JEWISH PACT ON PALESTINE

LONDON, July 14. (JTA) -- German radio reports of conclusion of "a new Anglo-Jewish secret pact" for establishment of a Jewish State in Palestine and evacuation of the Arabs to neighboring countries were officially denied today.

The reports are "completely false," it was stated. There have been no negotiations before or since the Franco-German armistice regarding a Jewish State in Palestine,

evacuation of Arabs or any such scheme. Palestine Jews, like a great many Arabs, are working and fighting on the side of Britain, but "any story of a secret pact with the Jewish Agency is sheer invention," it was stated.

The German reports, broadcast in Arabic as well as other languages, said the British Government and the executive committee of the Jewish Agency had signed a five-point agreement by which the Agency was recognized as the Government of a future free Jewish state, which would be a British dominion.

Reports Featured by Italian Papers

ROME, July 7. (JTA Airmail) -- All Italian newspapers give prominence to reports of an Anglo-Jewish accord for establishment of a Palestine Jewish state.

Editorial comment is sparse, however. La Tribuna calls the alleged accord the "dream of the lion," saying that "while German artillery was being directed at it from the other side of the Channel, the lion dreamed of a super-empire of which the Kingdom of Judaea will also be a part."

The Italian Government, in a statement on Feb. 16, 1938, through the publication Diplomatic Information, favored establishment of a Jewish State outside of Palestine. A solution of this sort, commented Virginio Gayda, chief Fascist press spokesman, "would legitimize, in certain ways, successive actions of different governments for the expulsion of Jews within their territories."

20 FIUME JEWS, SEIZED IN ROUNDUP OF 'STATELESS', RELEASED; 200 IN TRIESTE MAY BE FREED

ROME, July 8. (JTA Airmail) -- It is learned that 20 of the Italian Jews arrested in Fiume have been freed, including Signor Klein, president of the Fiume Jewish community, and several other officers. They had been detained two weeks ago in the general round-up of male Jews who had lost their nationality as result of the racial laws of September, 1938.

According to these laws all Jews who acquired Italian citizenship after Jan. 1, 1919, were denationalized. Since Fiume did not become part of Italy until 1924, all Jews in that city were automatically affected.

Another 200 Jews in Trieste in the same "stateless" category are still interned. However, the cases of most of them are expected to be considered favorably soon.

It is reported from Fiume that Hans Friedman, son of the late president of the Jewish Community there, who was also president of the important Adria navigation company in Fiume, committed suicide by hurling himself from his fourth-floor apartment window during the period of these arrests.

The long-postponed racial exhibit in Rome will finally be inaugurated July 16. Italian "Aryanism" and anti-Semitism will be explained at the exhibit.

LONDON, July 14. (ONA) -- Numerous trials of Dutchmen reported by the Nazi-controlled Dutch wireless prove the existence of a widespread underground opposition to the German occupation, Dutch circles claimed today.

Several cases have been reported in recent weeks of Dutchmen sentenced to heavy prison terms for inciting Dutch soldiers to escape to England to continue the fight, for instigating opposition to German commands, and for disrespect for the German authorities and army.

According to Dutch sources, the Germans, who have been trying to win over the Netherlanders by a policy of going easy, are now compelled to show an iron hand in order to force the Dutch to cooperate.

How thoroughly the Nazis are trying to cut off the Dutch from all foreign contacts is revealed by a broadcast warning of the most dire penalties for anyone permitting the release of carrier pigeons.
