HAIFA BOMBED BY ITALIAN PLANES IN FIRST RAID ON PALESTINE; 10 WOUNDED

HAIFA, Palestine, July 15. (JTA) -- Palestine experienced its first air raid today when five Italian warplanes flashed in from the sea and dropped bombs on this important port city and oil pipeline terminus, inflicting at least ten casualties and causing some damage.

Sirens were sounded and anti-aircraft guns went into action when the raiders appeared at 9 a.m. Intense anti-aircraft fire prevented the enemy ships from flying over the city proper but numerous bombs crashed into the port area.

Four tanks of the Iraq Petroleum Company were hit. Explosives also hit Kiryat Haim, Jewish workers' suburb, causing 10 casualties at that point alone.

British airplanes soon appeared in the sky and drove off the enemy machines.

VICHY TO VOID CITIZENSHIP OBTAINED BY ALIENS BY JOINING ARMY

LONDON, July 15. (JTA) -- The Vichy Government has decided to void the citizenship of all alien Jews who received naturalization papers on joining French armed forces after the start of the war, reliable reports reaching here today said.

The reports added that the Nazis were conducting an anti-Jewish campaign in France, showing anti-Semitic motion pictures, dealing with alleged ritual murders, in cinemas in Paris and other cities.

Most business concerns in the Jewish quarter of Paris are still closed down, it was learned. Returning Jewish refugees are unable to find work.

Herr Eichmann, attached to the German Gestapo, is expected to arrive in Parissoon to supervise repatriation of Dutch, Belgian and Jewish refugees.

GESTAPO SPURS ANTI-JEWISH DEMONSTRATIONS IN DEMMARK

LONDON, July 15. (JTA) -- Nazi anti-Jewish activities in occupied Denmark are assuming increasingly serious proportions, reports here today disclosed.

Anti-Semitic demonstrations, instigated by the Gestapo, occurred during recent days at Luna Park, Copenhagen, and in other cities, it was said. An anti-Semitic delegation called on the Mayor of Copenhagen and demanded that he ban Jews from parks and swimming pools and issue a regulation compelling Jewish business concerns to post up distinctive signs proclaiming their Jewish character.

Under Nazi pressure Copenhagen municipal authorities were forced to remove memorial plaques from the houses of the late Georg Brandes, noted Danish Jewish critic and literary historian and the late Chief Rabbi David Jacob Simonsen.

Other dispatches said that Der Stuermer, Julius Streicher's Jew-baiting newspaper, was demanding the deportation of all Jews from Berlin to Holland and Belgium for forced labor on projects for repairing war damage.

HOLLAND TO BE SATELLITE STATE DOMINATED BY BERLIN, NAZIS TELL DUTCH

LONDON, July 15. (ONA) -- German occupation authorities today told the Dutch people just what their political future is to be, namely transformation of the Netherlands into a totalitarian satellite State dominated by Berlin.

This plan was revealed in radio reports of an interview granted the Dutch press by Herr Jancke, press attache of the Reich Commissariat for the Netherlands, in which he asserted that Germany wants to regulate the internal political situation of Holland by concentration of the entire Dutch people in one movement.

The German Government, the press attache added, wants to guarantee that the Dutch people will be able to live "according to their own individuality." He promised that the Dutch will be granted as much freedom as possible and said the Berlin Government is awaiting "with interest" to see what forces of the nation will emerge and develop and how the Dutch will react to the Reich gesture.

Herr Jancke, who is now in a position to tell the Netherlanders what is in store for them, is a former correspondent of a Nazi newspaper expelled from Holland before the German invasion on charges he carried out subversive activities.

Dutch official circles here believe the Nazis intend to destroy the Dutch political system and establish totalitarian rule either with the aid of Dutch Nazis or other factions with the state entirely subordinate to Berlin, functioning only within the greater Reich framework.

Other reports today said that the Nazi authorities had seized a home for Jewish invalids at Amsterdam and had converted it into military quarters. The Gestapo is compelling all Jewish shops to display six-pointed Jewish stars to identify them as Semitic enterprises.

CITIZENSHIP LAW BROADENED BY LITHUANIA

WILNO, Lithuania, July 15. (JTA) -- The citizenship law was radically altered today to grant citizenship to all who resided in Lithuanian territory, including the Wilno region, on Sept. 1, 1939. Under the former law almost half of the population of Wilno, formerly Polish area ceded to Lithuania by Russia after the partition of Poland, was derived of citizenship.

Solomon Gavenda, a labor leader, was named Vice-Mayor of Wilno today.

REFUGEES IN SWITZERLAND SELECTED FOR DOMINICAN SETTLEMENT

WASHINGTON, July 15. (JTA) -- A number of Jewish refugees in Switzerland have been selected for emigration to the Dominican Republic and are expected to sail from Greece on a Greek vessel shortly, it was learned here today. The refugees were selected by Morris C. Troper, European chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

Meanwhile, the sailing of 500 young German refugees now in England for the Sosua colony in the Dominican Republic has been delayed pending the availability of a convoy.

Sir Herbert Emerson, director of the Intergovernmental Refugee Committee, has taken personal charge of the projected sailing of Jewish refugees for the Dominican Republic.

Paul van Zeeland, president of the Coordinating Foundation for Refugees, will leave Lisbon by clipper for the United States this week to aid in the solution of refugee problems, Government officials announced here. He will attend a meeting of the President's Advisory Committee on Refugees in New York.

ORT LEADERS REPORTED IN VICHY

NEW YORK, July 15. (JTA) -- Dr. David Lvovitch, vice-president of the World ORT Union, disclosed today that he has been advised by cable from Vichy that the French ORT leaders, Dr. Leon Bramson, M. Scheftel, A. Berland, Josef Blum and Dr. I. Coralnik, are in Vichy while other ORT leaders are at the ORT farm at Chateau la Roche. The cable also said that the leaders were in touch with other ORT institutions in France.

BANNED JEWISH DOCTORS LISTED IN BUCHAREST

EUCHAREST, July 14. (JTA) -- Newspapers today published the first list of Jewish doctors barred from State service in accordance with the new decrees, under which persons who do not belong to the totalitarian Party of the Nation are ineligible to hold Government posts.

ZWEIG URGES INTERNATIONAL BODY TO EVACUATE CHILDREN FROM ENGLAND

NEW YORK, July 15. (JTA) -- Creation of an international organization of neutral nations to send ships to evacuate children from the European war zone for the duration of the war was suggested today by Stefan Zweig, the famous Jewish poet and author, here for a brief visit en route to South America for a lecture tour.

In an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Zweig, who is now a British subject, stressed Britain's determination to fight on to the end, justified the internment of refugees and stressed the need of evacuating children.

"Perhaps," he said, "a super-national organization could be created for the purpose of sending ships of all neutral nations over to bring away the children in all danger zones, not only England but also Holland, Belgium, Norway, etc., for the duration of the war. In this way the children would be protected en route.

"With this kind of noble service, in a time of inhumanity, America would be doing a memorable humanitarian deed-beyond all political consideration--one of those deeds characterized by history as more honorable than all war and victory."

Zweig urged American Jews to support the movement for evacuation of British children. "Thousands of families are seeking with understandable anxiety to send their children overseas, not alone to protect their physical beings, but to shelter them from ever learning to know the horrors of aerial warfare," he said. "Nothing is more important than that every American mother who would fear a similar fate for her children under similar circumstances should offer shospitality to these endangered children.

"I deem it especially important that Jewish families not limit their assistance and willingness to help the Jewish children alone, but aid all children regardless of religion or origin. We must be ready to serve universal humanitarian ends and it is my feeling that a beautiful counterplay is brought about in these times when America is shipping arms across the sea to meet the necessity of war, if at the same time America will bring children here from Europe, so that at least the most innocent of the innocent can be saved from this horror."

Stressing Britain's determination to go on with the war, Zweig declared: "I must say that I have never seen such determination as rules the English people today. They are determined to sacrifice everything, even to permit everything they have to be destroyed. Voluntarily they take up defense service each evening after they have completed their day's work. Every man and woman is mobilized. The waiter who serves in the restaurant, the clerk in the bank, the bus driver and the girl in the tea shop are all soldiers at night.

"The most significant act in the history of the British Parliament is the projected law putting at the absolute disposal of the State the time, wealth and the very being of every individual in the land. We who know how highly the Englishman prized his individual freedom, fought for over centuries, can understand what it must mean to him to renounce all his civil rights so that England can defend the freedom of the world. It is not an army that Germany must fight, then, but a whole nation, a whole people, from the first to the last man."

German and Austrian Jews were put in a peculiar position by the outbreak of the war, the author said. "Naturally every one of them wanted to serve with all his might the land that had given him a home. Some of them wished to enlist in the army, others to join other services. The English Government, however, could not utilize this spontaneous offer since the refugees, according to their own passports, were subjects of an enemy country—a country which had declared them as its enemies, too.

"As a precaution the English Government was compelled to effect a constant and ever-increasing supervision, not only of the Jewish but of all refugees in the land. These legal measures brought many individual hardships. But it must be said gratefully that the Government officials made every effort to ease these hardships for the individual as much as possible."
