NAZI HAND SEEN IN SPAIN-CHILE SPLIT; AIMED AT HAVANA PARLEY, MANEUVER BOOMERANGS

SANTIAGO, July 21. (ONA) -- Chilean newspapers today charged that Spain's rupture of diplomatic relations with this country was a Nazi-instigated maneuver to split Pan-American solidarity.

According to information received telephonically by the newspaper Critica from one of the Chilean delegates to the Pan-American Conference of Foreign Ministers at Havana, the Spanish move has had just the opposite effect on the delegates.

MORE GESTAPO AGENTS SENT TO SEEK REICH REFUGEES IN PARIS

LONDON, July 2. (ONA) -- Gestapo reinforcements have been sent to Paris and neighboring districts to help round up German and Austrian refugees, according to reports reaching here today.

RUMANIAN CABINET DRAFTING ANTI-JEWISH LAWS; ZIONIST PAPERS QUIT

BUCHAREST, July 21. (JTA) -- The Council of Ministers is busy defining the principles and necessary laws to regulate the status of the Jewish element in the new Rumanian order following organization of the Party of the Nation, it was stated in an official communique yesterday.

Many Zionist papers, reviews and bulletins have ceased publication.

Interior Minister David Popescu today authorized the Jewish Community and a representative of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee to collect funds for the relief of refugees from Soviet-occupied Bessarabia and Northern Bukovina. Notice of the authorization was made in an interview with Dr. William Filderman, president of the Union of Rumanian Jews.

Categories Planned

ZURICH, July 21. (JTA) -- Jews in Rumania will be divided into different categories for the purposes of anti-Jewish legislation, the German wireless reported today from Bucharest.

"Those who fought for Rumania in the World War or have done State and other services worthy of merit will enjoy certain privileges," the report said. "Curentul

(Bucharest nationalist newspaper) purports to know that one of the first measures will be a law ordering Jews to adopt their original family names. The Ministry of Economics has published a list of Jewish officials who have been dismissed from service."

NAZIS PRODUCE FILM ON ROTHSCHILDS

GENEVA, July 2. (JTA) -- UFA, German film company, has produced a picture called "The Rothschilds," a purported history of the family describing how Jews allegedly amass fortunes in order to be able to dominate the world. The German press is giving the film tremendous publicity to build up audiences for it.

NEW BRITISH POLICY ON REFUGEES EXPECTED TO BE STATED TUESDAY

LONDON, July 21. (ONA) -- Members of Parliament who led the fight against the Government's policy of wholesale internment and overseas transportation of refugees are awaiting Home Secretary Sir John Anderson's promised statement on Tuesday, which is expected to announce radical modification of the present system, which the press has already designated as "the refugee scandal."

Meanwhile, addressing a meeting at the Ministry of Information, Parliamentary Secretary Harold Nicolson condemned rumors against refugees and warmly pleaded for consideration in their behalf. Asserting that thousands had been interned to enable a test of good faith, Nicolson reminded his hearers that the refugees "loathe Hitler as much as we do" and urged them not to forget that "we are fighting this war for the defense of human decency and kindness."

"Let us be kind to the unhappy stranger within our gates," Nicolson said, "and let us, while taking no unnecessary risks, commit no unnecessary cruelty. Let each one of us so conduct himself to refugees that when peace comes again we will have no cause to blush for any word, look or deed."

Since the Commons debate on July 10 focussed attention on the question there has been a remarkable swing of sentiment here for a more humane and satisfactory policy toward refugees. Even newspapers such as the Daily Express, which was never over-friendly towards refugees, is joining in the general chorus of denunciation, demanding utilization of the refugees' services. No day has passed without numerous questions in Commons regarding the treatment of refugees.

Despite assurances that certain categories of valuable refugees will be exempted from internment, parliamentarians complain that there is no improvement in the situation and internments are continuing without discrimination and without release of internees. It is reported that overseas transportation is continuing, even of those who are within exemptable categories.

More than 25,000 refugees have already been interned, of whom 7,500 have been transported overseas up to July 9. Among the interned are outstanding anti-Nazi leaders, writers and skilled workers who could make a valuable contribution to the war effort. There are even scientists who were employed by the Government in advisory capacities.

Scores of cases of tragedy and hardship of divided families, as well as difficulties imposed on industry by the removal of key workers, have been disclosed. At least half of the internees are awaiting United States visas.

Parliamentarians are aroused not only by the general policy of internment, but at the treatment of the refugees after they are interned. Anti-Nazis are lumped together with Nazis in camps and are transported overseas together with Nazis.

The Arandora Star muddle is vexing them particularly since, despite the official statement that there were no refugees aboard, several parliamentarians claim positive proof to the contrary and have asked War Secretary Anthony Eden to investigate.

Unless Anderson's statement satisfies the critics that sufferings, hardships and economic waste will be eliminated from the present system, then a strong all-party group headed by Major Victor Cazalet, Conservative, and Miss Eleanor Rathbone, Independent, have announced they will press for a full debate.

ALGIERS GOVERNOR REMOVED BY PETAIN; WAS TOO CLOSE TO JEWS, NAZIS REPORT

ZURICH, July 21. (ONA) -- Marshal Henri Philippe Petain, French Chief of State, has signed a decree removing Georges Lebeau as Governor-General of Algiers, the German wireless reported from Vichy today, adding: "It is understood that Lebeau had close Jewish relations and that this change had something to do therewith."

WASHINGTON PARLEY ON LAW ENFORCEMENT TO TAKE UP RACIAL ATTACKS

WASHINGTON, July 21. (JTA) -- Means of combating racial and religious attacks will be one of the points discussed at the national Conference of States on Law Enforcement Problems of National Defense to be held at the Justice Department August 5 and 6, it was announced today.

This study will be included in the session which will discuss treatment of espionage, mob violence, violations of civil liberties "and interferences generally with the effective operation of law enforcement and the national defense program."

The treatment of aliens, their registration and position in the community and industries will be another point discussed. Speakers will include Attorney General Robert H. Jackson, Governor William H. Vanderbilt, John Lord O'Brian and J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

MAX BODENHEIMER, ZIONIST PIONEER, DIES IN JERUSALEM AT 75

JERUSALEM, July 21. (JTA)-- Funeral services were held here today for Dr. Max Bodenheimer, veteran Zionist leader and retired lawyer who died yesterday at the age of 75.

The entire Jewish community was represented at the funeral, with the cortege marching past the Shaare Zadek Hospital, where he died after a short illness. National institutions flew flags at half staff. A eulogy was delivered by M.M. Ussishkin, president of the Jewish National Fund, whose daughter is the wife of Dr. Bodenheimer's son.

On the occasion of his 75th birthday last March 21, Dr. Bodenheimer was made an honorary citizen of the Tel Aviv municipality. Born in Stuttgart, Germany, Dr. Bodenheimer became one of the most enthusiastic adherents of Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of political Zionism, and in 1898 accompanied him to Constantinople and Palestine. He is survived by a son, Fritz Bodenheimer, Professor of Natural Science at the Hebrew University, who is married to Ussishkin's daughter.

DOMINICAN PROJECT SHARES LISTED WITH FEDERAL STOCK BODY

WASHINGTON, July 21. (JTA) -- A registration statement outlining the proposed public sales of 9,569 shares of common stock at \$1,000 per share to raise funds for the settlement of Jewish and other refugees in the Dominican Republic was filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission yesterday.

The securities were registered by the Dominican Republic Settlement Association Inc., of New York, which has a contract with the Dominican Republic providing for the admission of 100,000 refugees, mostly Jews from Germany and countries conquered by the Nazis. The statement, unique for the Commission since it did not promise any monetary return to those who purchased the securities, said 500 shares had been taken by Agro-Joint

NAZIS SEEN SET TO OUST PETAIN REGIME; DORIOT, MARQUET FAVORED

LONDON, July 21. (ONA) -- The belief that Germany would soon dispense with the Petain Government in France and replace it with a more pro-Nazi regime was gaining ground here tonight.

Such rightist leaders as Adrien Marquet, present Interior Minister, Marcel Deat and Jacques Doriot are expected to be included in the new government. Deat, Marquet and Barthelemy Montagnon, helped found French Neo-Socialism, whose program is summed up as "Order, Authority, Nation."

The Nazis would occupy the remainder of France, thus reducing it to a satellite status similar to that of Denmark and Norway, it was predicted here.

Despite the complaisance of the Petain Government, Nazi dissatisfaction with its attitude was revealed in German broadcasts during the last two weeks from the occupied zone which sharply criticized the regime and apparently sought to undermine public confidence in it.

The Germans' disapproval also was revealed by their apparent refusal to aid the Petain Ministry in meeting the grave problem of feeding 20,000,000 persons in a territory normally occupied by about 9,000,000 and which is entirely cut off from former sources of supply-occupied France and North Africa.

Nazi broadcasts simultaneously painted a glowing picture of the future "new order" which Germany has promised to create in Europe. A recent broadcast emanating from occupied Luxembourg appealed to French youth to join with Germany in reconstructing the continent on a new social system, which has been proven in Germany and Italy, and which, based on labor, would bring peace and prosperity to all. The broadcast said that Germany was strong and young enough to assume responsibility for establishment of this new state of affairs.

What this "new order" is likely to be was described by South African Prime Minister Jan Christiaan Smuts in a broadcast from Capetown. He said it would create a "mechanized Europe with some of the forms but none of the substance of freedom."

Petaín Rule Not Fascist, Bullitt Holds

NEW YORK, July 21. (JTA) -- Disbelief that the present French Government could rightly be termed a fascist body was expressed by William C. Bullitt, American Ambassador to France, when he arrived here by plane yesterday. The envoy said that Marshal Henri Petaín, French chief of State, was "thoroughly honest and straightforward" and was doing his utmost "to bring order out of desperate disorder."

PERU PRESSES DRIVE ON FIFTH COLUMNISTS

LIMA, July 21. (ONA) -- The Peruvian Government's drive against potential fifth columnists has gained momentum during recent weeks, leading among other things to registration of all aliens and the internment of those who cannot be deported, because of the war, in concentration camps.

The Government also has suppressed the weekly newspaper "Los Derechos" which consistently attacked the Allies and the Jews. This publication was largely financed by Italian and German advertisements.

Anti-alien sentiment has been growing here for several months and the Government's moves have generally been approved by the Chilean press and public. The fifth column scare, fanned by daily newspaper articles warning of this danger, has made every foreigner a subject of suspicion to the Peruvians.

The alien registration ruling requires that every alien have a registration card and report at least twice yearly to the Government. German refugees, who arrived here on visitor visas and now have no definite status have been particularly hard hit by this regulation.

Following its census in which every inhabitant of the country was obliged to report his or her occupation and religion, the Government temporarily forbade foreigners to start new factories or concerns in this country or obtain patents here.

Anti-Jewish factions have taken advantage of the present situation to assert that the Jews have been sent here by Hitler to engage in "fifth column" activities.

The press is definitely pro-Ally with articles attacking the Axis powers prominently featured in the newspapers. In spite of the Government action a strong German "fifth column" has reportedly been at work in the country and strict alien supervision has not stopped circulation of large quantities of German propaganda material.
