HUNGARY REPORTED PLANNING TO ORGANIZE MASS EMIGRATION OF JEWS

LONDON, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- Hungary's third anti-Jewish law, which is nearing completion, provides for mass emigration of all Jews under 50 years of age, the German wireless reported today in a broadcast to Yugoslavia.

The emigration will be financed by Jewish capital, which will be retained in Hungary, the report said. The broadcast asserted that Hungary had already contacted other governments desiring to "solve the Jewish problem thoroughly" by mass emigration.

ANTI-JEWISH DEMONSTRATION IN NICE REPORTED

ZURICH, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- The German wireless today quoted the newspaper Eclair de Nice as reporting that large-scale anti-Jewish demonstrations occurred in that unoccupied French city last night.

According to the report, large plate-glass windows of Jewish-owned shops and department stores were smashed by the demonstrators, who wrote slogans such as "Down with the Jews and Freemasons" in large red letters on the doors of shops and department stores.

Police arrested several demonstrators, who admitted they had taken part in the demonstrations, declaring that in their view the Jews were to be blamed for the national disaster, it was said. Police were quoted as stating that a revolver shot was fired at shop windows in two cases.

The Regence silk goods store, one of the chief victims of the demonstration, estimated it had suffered damage amounting to 40,000 francs, the report said. The demonstrators were stated to have written slogans on pavements and facades of numerous buildings, such as "The National Revolution Has Begun."

MOST OF 81 ARRESTED ALIENS AT PANAMA ARE REFUGEE TECHNICIANS HIRED BY ARMY

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- Evidence that Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson and the War Department acted hastily in the arrest of 81 so-called "foreign agents" in the Canal Zone accumulated here today as it was learned that 80 of the 81 were Jewish refugees who had been invited to work on canal defenses by Army authorities.

(Sources in New York expressed the belief that only 28 or 30 of the detained aliens were Jewish refugees.)

After hours of refusing to comment on the arrest of the refugees, who are now held on a prison island near Bilboa, the War Department this afternoon issued the following statement:

"The 81 aliens now awaiting disposition in the Canal immigration station are part of a large number of refugees who entered the Republic of Panama several months ago, where they were permitted by the Panamanian Government to remain temporarily.

"Some were given temporary employment in the Canal Zone. The papers of all refugees so employed have been examined and it has been found that 81 have no legal status whatsoever. They have been discharged and have since been held in the Canal immigration station awaiting disposition."

From other sources it was learned that 80 of the 81 held were German-Jewish technicians, including electricians and engineers who had been forced to flee the Nazi terror and held visas allowing them to go to various South American nations. When their ships were passing through the Canal their papers were investigated, and the technicians were asked, by the same Army authorities who now have jailed them, to aid in work on the new Canal defenses. They accepted, instead of going to the South American countries which were their original destinations.

When it was charged in New York newspapers that many aliens were working on Canal defenses, Army authorities in the Canal Zone were prodded into action and arrested the refugees and transported them to the prison island. Their final disposition is uncertain, since their original visas for South American nations have expired.

Asked to comment on the arrests, President Roosevelt said that he knew nothing about the status of the 81 except what he had seen in Stimson's statement of yesterday.

In distributing its statement on the Panama roundup, the War Department admitted it had referred erroneously to the refugees as "foreign agents."

REICH REPORTED PLANNING PROPAGANDA DRIVE IN U.S., TIED TO ELECTION CAMPAIGN

NEW YORK, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- Plans for a new Nazi propaganda drive in this country, directly tied in with the Presidential elections this fall, have been formulated and partially set in action by the Nazi Propaganda Ministry, it was reliably learned today.

The campaign will be openly manifested by the publication of a newspaper or magazine modeled on Der Stuermer, German Jew-baiting weekly. Staffed entirely by German writers and artists personally selected by Julius Streicher, the publication will take an active part in the pre-election campaigning, with special emphasis being placed on a violently anti-Semitic editorial policy directed at President Roosevelt and the New Deal.

Heading the staff, which is expected to arrive in the United States, either by Clipper or by way of South America, in the near future, is a cartoonist named Fipps, reputed to be the top-ranking political pen artist of the Hitler regime. Fipps is coming to this country on a diplomatic visa.

The magazine or newspaper will be geared to an already started pro-Willkie campaign which has been in evidence for several weeks in the Nazi and home-grown Fascist press circulated in New York City, particularly Yorkville.

Willkie's German-American ancestry is the basis for this drive. A whispering campaign has been started in Yorkville declaring that the Republican candidate will, because of his German background, be more sympathetic toward Germany and will be "easier to handle."

This line of reasoning has cropped out in the Nazi press in New York. The Free American and Weckruf und Beobachter, organ of the German-American Bund, has been outspokenly pro-Willkie, and published an article in German three weeks ago praising Willkie's German ancestry and predicting that he would be favorably inclined toward the German Government. During the past few weeks, an increasing number of Willkie buttons have appeared in the German areas of Yorkville and at the street meetings of pro-Hitler Joseph E. McWilliams, self-styled "anti-Jewish candidate for congress."

Another point of the Nazi propaganda in the presidential campaigns will be a concerted drive on President Roosevelt, blaming him for the prolongation of the war.

Concurrent with this campaign, propaganda designed to drum up sympathy for the Nazi Government, particularly in occupied countries, will be launched through "national groups" supposedly representing several of these countries. Present plans call for the establishment of Dutch, Norwegian, Danish, French and Polish groups to spread a picture of progress and contentment in Nazi-occupied lands--to paint these centers of oppression and ruin as lands of milk and honey.

It is expected that the personnel of these groups will also be sent over from Germany, or from the different occupied countries.

Although the top people in both campaigns will be imported from Hitler's trusted following, many of its supporters and workers will probably be drawn from the ranks of the German-Americans in this country.

In 1938 the Gestapo drew up a list of American relatives of German subjects. This list comprised more than 18,000,000 persons. These people will be one of the focal points of the Nazi propaganda drive, many of them cooperating willingly, others because of threats of harm to their relatives or other pressure devices.

VATICAN SEEN OPPOSED TO SHIFT OF PALESTINE MANDATE TO ITALY

LONDON, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- The belief that the Vatican is still opposed to any transfer of the Palestine Mandate from Britain to Italy is expressed by Sir Odo Russell, Minister Plenipotentiary to the Holy See from 1922 to 1928, in a letter published to The Times.

The letter followed reports that the Bishop of Terracina had asked for prayers that the flag of Italy be raised over the Holy Sepulchre at Jerusalem. During recent weeks

Rome has waged an intense propaganda campaign upholding Italy as the "logical and legitimate" protector of Palestine. Early in June, 50 Italian bishops sent a telegram to Premier Mussolini urging him to plant the Italian flag in Jerusalem.

In his letter Sir Odo describes a conversation he had 15 years ago when he was British envoy to the Holy See with the then Papal Secretary of State, the late Cardinal Gasparri. "When I jestingly suggested that His Eminence might prefer to see the mandate transferred to the Italian Government he held up his hands in horror and though his retort was a curt 'God forbid!' it was uttered with such vehemence as to leave me in no doubt of the Vatican's view of the matter."

A subsequent conversation revealed that the British guardianship of Holy Places was regarded with complete approval by the Holy See, Sir Odo says. "Though this opinion was given before the signing of the Lateran Treaty (between the Italian Government and the Vatican) I have a shrewd suspicion it still prevails and will continue to prevail despite the war," Sir Odo asserts.

PALESTINE PIONEER CORPS TOLD TO FIGHT ON

LONDON, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- Jewish and Arab members of the Palestine Pioneer Corps, which saw service in France, must fight on until Hitler's "abominable regime" and the Nazi "hordes of hell" are smashed, Comm. Oliver Locker-Lampson, Conservative M.P., told members of the corps at a reception in their honor at the Anglo-Palestine Club last night. Col. Josiah Wedgwood, Labor M.P., termed the members of the Corps "modern Maccabees who will show the world that Jews can fight and win."

HERALD TRIBUNE DEMANDS PROBE OF NAZI AGENTS IN U.S.

NEW YORK, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- It is high time that the United States Government find out what Nazi diplomatic agents are up to in this country, the Herald Tribune asserted today in an editorial on the activities of Dr. George Alois Westrick, Commercial Counselor to the German Embassy at Washington, who is reputedly seeking to spur American-German trade.

Stressing the secrecy which has surrounded many of Westrick's movements in New York, the editorial says that Washington, while greatly agitated over the activities of Nazi diplomatic agents elsewhere on the continent, has shown an "extraordinary calm in regard to their colleagues here."

Dr. Westrick appeared today at the office of Motor Vehicle Commissioner Carroll Mealey after he had been notified by the office that his driver's license had been temporarily suspended. The action was taken on the ground that Westrick had failed to notify the authorities of a change of address and had given false information in applying for the license.

M.D. MOSESSEHN, ATTORNEY AND PHILANTHROPIST, DEAD AT 56

NEW YORK, Aug. 2. (JTA) -- Moses Dayyan Mosessehn, attorney and philanthropist, died yesterday of a heart attack at his Fifth Avenue home, it was announced today. He was 56. The activities and technique of native as well as frankly foreign agents are analyzed by Goodrich, who states that their chief aim is to cause internal confusion on leading national and international issues, thus paving the way for Hitler's accomplishment of his boast that America can be destroyed "from within" without an armed struggle.

RESIDENTS OF LYON SEEN TURNING TO ADMIRATION OF NAZIS

(JTA) -- Many sections of the population of the important French city of Lyon are revising their opinion of Germany under Nazi control in the wake of the three-week occupation of the city by Reich forces, P.J. One of the effects of the French defeat on the population is that where formerly only blind opposition prevailed there is now a tendency even toward admiration for the Nazis, especially for the work of economic construction which has been carried out under Hitlerian rule, Philip said.
