THIRD ITALIAN RAID ON HAIFA INEFFECTUAL

CAIRO, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- A British military communique declared today that an Italian air raid on the Palestinian port of Haifa--third in the past month--proved ineffectual.

A number of bombs were dropped, the majority falling harmlessly in the sea or on waste ground, the communique said. None fell on Haifa itself. There were no military casualties and fewer than ten civilian casualties, it was stated. Anti-aircraft artillery fired heavily on the raiders, the communique said.

JUSTICE DEPT. PLANS TO EXPOSE BACKERS OF SUBVERSIVE PROPAGANDA

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- Action to expose backers of un-American pamphlets and periodicals is being contemplated by the Department of Justice, it was learned today following the Federal-State Conference on Law Enforcement problems of National Defense, held at the Justice Department.

The conference, which ended yesterday, passed a resolution stating "the publication and dissemination of all papers, pamphlets, leaflets and other printed matter having for its purpose the undermining of American principles of government is hereby condemned."

While the resolution does not mention anti-Semitic literature, Communist or Nazi papers by name, these were discussed at the executive session dealing with espionage, propaganda and interference with civil liberties at which the resolution was framed.

The conferees, the Justice Department announced, recommended "that a thorough study of this problem be made by both the Federal and State Governments, cooperating with the legitimate press to the end that appropriate legislation may be enacted requiring those responsible for such practices to register and disclose the governments or persons in whose behalf or for whom they are acting as well as the source of the financial aid received for such purposes."

The conferees recommended further: "The governor of each State should head a committee to hold regular but informal conferences with the leading newspaper and radio men of his state. Such conferences should be concerned with keeping the American press and radio free from subversive propaganda such as the featuring of speeches by leading Nazis, Fascists and Communists, American and foreign."

The need for preventing any persecution of aliens also was emphasized.

"The joint task of the Federal and State Governments is to reassure the alien that registration is a friendly act and an effort to identify those who are friendly to our national institutions and to spare them from harassment and persecution," it was stated. "It should be borne in mind that the term 'alien' is not synonymous with 'fifth columnist' and that the Federal Government is not preparing concentration camps for aliens. All citizens should remember that all persons are entitled to equal protection of the laws."

Harrison Warns Against Persecuting Loyal Aliens

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- Earl G. Harrison, director of the Department of Justice's aliens registration, said in a radio broadcast tonight that it was the duty of Americans to prevent any persecution of loyal aliens for the "disloyal actions of any minority group."

Warning against loose and indiscriminate use of the word "alien," he said, "it may well be that there are among us some who are disloyal to America" and seek to

promote disunity among the people. "These abuses are not limited to non-naturalized residents," he declared. "All of us must see to it that loyal, law-abiding non-citizens are not persecuted or condemned for the disloyal actions of any minority group."

MANY SUICIDES REPORTED AMONG DUTCH JEWS UNABLE TO FLEE

LONDON, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- A tragic episode of the war was disclosed in a Lisbon dispatch to the Daily Express today.

The dispatch quoted the Jewish Lieut. Leonard Rodrigues of the Dutch Army, who just reached Lisbon after escaping from Holland, as reporting that 30,000 Jews massed on the docks of the Dutch port of Ijmuiden when Dutch resistance collapsed and German forces descended on the city. Many of the Jews hoped to escape aboard a Dutch liner then in the port, but British forces sank the ship in order to block the harbor entrance.

A friend of the lieutenant, who was on the docks when the ship was sunk, said the action caused frightful despair among the Jews, many of whom were-Germans. Many opened their veins with razor blades or pocket knives and others jumped off the pier and drowned themselves rather than face capture by the Nazi armed units which were advancing through the city.

Lieut. Rodrigues said, however, that up to the time he escaped from Holland the Germans had more or less ignored the Jews. Some refugees could not stand the strain of waiting and reported to Gestapo headquarters immediately. The Germans assertedly told these refugees they were not interested in them.

The Lieutenant said that Jewish newspapermen were dismissed by telephone after the German entry. "The newspaper Handelsblad gave these discharged Jews two months' pay but I do not know what the other newspapers did," he said.

Word was received here today that Numa Torczyner, president of the Belgian Zionist Federation, and David Siva, president of the Palestine Foundation Fund in Belgium, have arrived in France.

4 GOVERNMENTS LAUD JABOTINSKY; N.Z.O. PLEDGES TO CARRY ON

NEW YORK, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- Representatives of the British, Canadian, Czech and Polish Governments today paid tribute to Vladimir Jabotinsky in messages to the New Zionist Organization.

British Ambassador Lord Lothian said: "Though Vladimir Jabotinsky and the British Government have been in constant disagreement for the past twenty years one could not but admire his personal qualities and the uncompromising tenacity with which he fought for what he believed in. Nor can one forget the services which he rendered to Great Britain during the World War or his recent eloquent speeches in her favor. I have been genuinely sorry to learn of his sudden death and I hope you will be kind enough to convey my sympathy to his widow."

The Canadian Government, through O.D. Skelton, accretary for external relations, expressed "deep regret" over Jabotinsky's death. Foreign Minister Jan Masaryk of the

exiled Czech Government declared: "I shall always remember Jabotinsky's valiant spirit and unflinching courage so sorely needed in these bad times." Polish Ambassador Count Jerzy Potocki voiced "deep sympathy on the great loss of an outstanding leader."

Other messages were received from Israel B. Brodie, Prof. A.S. Yahuda, Rabbi Louis I. Newman, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Col. Spaniel, Czech military attache in Washington; Rabbi Epstein of St. Louis, the Hebrew Theological College of Chicago, Kwapiszewski, counselor of the Polish Embassy, and Mayor Isaac Rokach of Tel Aviv.

The N.Z.O. issued a statement declaring that its presidency "will continue its effort to carry out the three cardinal points of Jabotinsky's political testament—the Jewish State, the Jewish army and the unity of Jewry." The statement said that Elias Ginsburg and A. Propes have been added to the presidency, which also includes A. Abrahams, in London; L. Altman, Palestine; M. Haskel, South Africa; J. Damm and J. Mirelman, South America; Robert Briscoe, Ireland; Benjamin Akzin, Eliahu Ben-Horin, S. Klinger and A. Kopelowicz, New York.

Weizmann Pays Tribute at London Meeting

LONDON, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- Tribute was paid to Vladimir Jabotinsky at memorial services held here today under the auspices of the Jewish Agency.

After dwelling on his long relationship with Jabotinsky, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Agency, declared there was no doubt whatever that his views were guided and inspired by one great idea, to bring about a solution of the Jewish problem as quickly as possible.

The speed with which he wanted to achieve such a solution set Jabotinsky apart, Dr. Weizmann said. "History will judge whether Jabotinsky or the Zionist organization was right," Dr. Weizmann said.

"Jabotinsky was burned up by a sacred fire. In his opinion we had only a limited time in which our program could be realized. This may and may not be so. Factors and events independent of the desires of the Jewish people forced us to follow a path which may be difficult and above all slow."

Dr. Weizmann said Jabotinsky often mistook the mere proclaiming of an idea for the actual performance in Palestine, not stopping to think that the fulfillment of the idea might be a slow and painful process because of factors over which the Jews had no control.

David Ben Gurion, chairman of the Palestine Executive of the Jewish Agency, said the great tragedy of Jabotinsky, as well as the Zionist movement, was that while he clearly saw the end he failed to see the means to this end. "This failure, I am afraid, largely destroyed a great career in Zionism," he asserted.

Tribute was also paid by Prof. Selig Brodetsky, president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews, and J.K. Goldbloom, vice-president of the Zionist General Council.

Memorial Meeting in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- The death of Vladimir Jabotinsky was mourned today by M.M. Ussishkin, chairman of the Zionist General Council, at a meeting of the council's Palestine commission today. Ussishkin noted the tragic coincidence that the deaths of

Jabotinsky, Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of political Zionism, and Chaim Nachman Bialik, Hebrew poet-laureate, had occurred in the Hebrew month of Tammuz.

Representatives of the Government and of all consulates, including that of the United States, attended memorial services at Yeshurun Synagogue.

J.N.F. ACQUIRES TRACT IN 'BANNED' ZONE OF PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- The Jewish National Fund today announced acquisition of 2,250 dunams (495 acres) of land, under a mortgage, in Zone A--the area in which land transfers are banned by the Land Regulations of last March--through a special exception permitted by the Palestine Government. The tract is situated 4 kilometers from Gaza.

Total J.N.F. holdings are now 512,559 dunams, of which 39,789 were acquired in the past 10 months. Net income for the period was L471,005, of which L226,000 came from America. Eighty per cent of the entire area of workers! settlements is now under grain cultivation because the war has cut imports of grain from abroad.

The Palestine Foundation Fund directors announced that the fund's 10-month income was 1550,967, of which 1341,472 came from the United States.

HOUSE PASSES BILL TO USE U.S. SHIPS TO RESCUE CHILDREN

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- An amendment to the Neutrality Act to permit American ships to rescue child refugees from the war zone was voted by the House today after three hours of debate. The measure now goes to the Senate.

Under the terms of the bill, American vessels are permitted in war zones, provided that a safe conduct is granted by all belligerent nations and that such ships as are sent are fully identified as "mercy ships" by use of the American flag painted prominently on the sides of the vessels. Approximately 32,000 English children have been registered for evacuation, and it is estimated that 50,000 or more children may be brought to this country from the war zone if the Senate votes its approval of the measure-

BRITISH ENTHUSIASTIC OVER PALESTINE RECRUITING

JERUSALM, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- Enlistment of Palestinian volunteers for British military units has exceeded expectations, it was learned today.

The quota of volunteers for the technical units is nearing completion, with 2,000 having already enlisted. With the first two Jewish units expected to be completed in the next week, it is understood that the success of the enlistments is encouraging the authorities to continue and extend the recruiting.

The military authorities are represented as highly satisfied by the speed of the enlistments and the intelligence and other qualifications of the men.

Meanwhile, the Jewish colony of Zichron Jacob, famous as a wine-producing center, gave a reception for British and Australian units under their officers. All joined in the Hebrew toast, "L'chaim," and cheers for victory in the Rothschild wine cellars.

JERUSALEM, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- The death of Vladimir Jabotinsky was mourned today by M.M. Ussishkin, chairman of the Zionist General Council, at a meeting of the council's Palestine commission today. Ussishkin noted the tragic coincidence that the deaths of

Jabotinsky, Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of political Zionism, and Chaim Nachman Bialik, Hebrew poet-laureate, had occurred in the Hebrew month of Tammuz.

Representatives of the Government and of all consulates, including that of the United States, attended memorial services at Yeshurun Synagogue.

J.N.F. ACQUIRES TRACT IN 'BANNED' ZONE OF PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- The Jewish National Fund today announced acquisition of 2,250 dunams (495 acres) of land, under a mortgage, in Zone A--the area in which land transfers are banned by the Land Regulations of last March--through a special exception permitted by the Palestine Government. The tract is situated 4 kilometers from Gaza.

Total J.N.F. holdings are now 512,559 dunams, of which 39,789 were acquired in the past 10 months. Net income for the period was L471,005, of which L226,000 came from America. Eighty per cent of the entire area of workers! settlements is now under grain cultivation because the war has cut imports of grain from abroad.

The Palestine Foundation Fund directors announced that the fund's 10-month income was 1550,967, of which 1341,472 came from the United States.

HOUSE PASSES BILL TO USE U.S. SHIPS TO RESCUE CHILDREN

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- An amendment to the Neutrality Act to permit American ships to rescue child refugees from the war zone was voted by the House today after three hours of debate. The measure now goes to the Senate.

Under the terms of the bill, American vessels are permitted in war zones, provided that a safe conduct is granted by all belligerent nations and that such ships as are sent are fully identified as "mercy ships" by use of the American flag painted prominently on the sides of the vessels. Approximately 32,000 English children have been registered for evacuation, and it is estimated that 50,000 or more children may be brought to this country from the war zone if the Senate votes its approval of the measure-

BRITISH ENTHUSIASTIC OVER PALESTINE RECRUITING

JERUSALM, Aug. 7. (JTA) -- Enlistment of Palestinian volunteers for British military units has exceeded expectations, it was learned today.

The quota of volunteers for the technical units is nearing completion, with 2,000 having already enlisted. With the first two Jewish units expected to be completed in the next week, it is understood that the success of the enlistments is encouraging the authorities to continue and extend the recruiting.

The military authorities are represented as highly satisfied by the speed of the enlistments and the intelligence and other qualifications of the men.

Meanwhile, the Jewish colony of Zichron Jacob, famous as a wine-producing center, gave a reception for British and Australian units under their officers. All joined in the Hebrew toast, "L'chaim," and cheers for victory in the Rothschild wine cellars.
