RUMANIA RESTRICTS ADMISSION OF JEWS TO SCHOOLS

BUCHAREST, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- New and drastic measures restricting the enrollment of Jews in Rumanian State schools were published by the Ministry of Education today.

Only Jews in the "second category"--those whose families enjoyed citizenship rights before the World War--are eligible to State schools and universities. Jews in the other categories set up by the recently enacted Rumanian anti-Semitic legislation will be admitted only in cases of "exceptional merit" and only when the Jewish quota of six per cent for each class is unfilled.

Jews are excluded entirely from State professional and normal schools as well as from private professional or special secondary schools. The Education Minister will fix the number of Jewish students to be admitted to the country's high schools, while a quota of six per cent will be admitted to secondary State schools.

Jewish communities may continue to support their own primary schools under the direct supervision of the Education Ministry. Professors in these schools, however, will be chosen by the Ministry to teach such subjects as Rumanian language, history and geography. (A New York Times dispatch said the teachers, although "Rumanians" selected by the Ministry would have to be paid by the communities. Jewish teachers will be permitted to teach other subjects.)

School books written in whole or in part by Jews are forbidden under the new measures.

SLOVAK TOWNS PUT CURBS ON JEWS

ZURICH, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- Local anti-Jewish measures were reported today to have been adopted in a number of Slovakian towns and villages.

The measures include bans on Jews in cafes and public parks. The municipality of Zipser-Neudorf has forbidden Jews to attend the weekly market before ten o'clock in the morning on the grounds that they bought up farmers' produce at low prices and later resold it at higher rates.

POLISH JEW EXECUTED BY NAZIS IN FRANCE

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- German authorities at Bordeaux, France, announced that Leizer Karp, a Polish Jew, had been executed by a firing squad for "attacking" German army bandsmen, the Associated Press reported today in a dispatch from Vichy. Karp, the first civilian executed by the German army in occupied French territory, assertedly "attacked" the bandsmen during the raising of the Nazi swastika at the St. Jean railroad station at Bordeaux last Saturday, the dispatch said.

AMNESTY FOR ALL CONVICTED OF RACIAL AGITATION IN FRANCE

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- The United Press reported from Vichy today that the French Government had decreed full amnesty for all persons convicted under the abrogated racial defamation law.

WALLACE, IN ACCEPTANCE SPEECH, HITS NAZI RACIALISM

DES MOINES, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- A strong indictment of Nazi racialism coupled with a reaffirmation of the traditional American principles of tolerance and religious freedom was included last night by Henry A. Wallace in his address formally accepting the Democratic vice-presidential nomination.

Against the "dark and bloody faith" of the Nazis in their "materialistic religion of darkness," Wallace said the New World "set the faith of Americanism, of Protestantism, of Catholicism, of Judaism."

"Our faith," he added, "is based on the belief that the possibilities in an individual are not determined by race, social background or wealth. We believe in the maximum freedom which can be obtained without anarchy or intolerance. Democracy is the very heart of the religions which have the largest following in the United States. Democracy and Americanism are identical. Both are utterly opposed to totalitarianism, with its exaltation of might, its suppression of freedom and its claims to racial supremacy."

MOBILIZER LEADER PAYS \$50 FINE FOR ANTI-SEMITIC TALK

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- Declaring that "free speech doesn't cover a multitude of sins," Magistrate William Klapp in Harlem Court today sentenced James Downey, a Christian Mobilizer leader, to 30 days in jail or payment of a \$50 fine on a police complaint of using abusive and offensive language against Jews on the night of Aug. 14. An additional 15-day workhouse sentence was imposed but suspended. Downey paid the fine.
