NEW BODY FORMED TO AID PALESTINE JEWISH SOLDIERS

JENUSALEM, Opt. 15. (JTA) -- A newly-formed welfare committee for Palestine Jewish soldiers today issued a world-wide appeal for books to form a library for the troops and decided to contact local institutions to arrange assistance for the recruits' families.

The committee, which includes Lady Edwin Samuel, Dr. Aaron Barth and others, was formed by the Jewish Agency for Pelestine and the Jewish National Council. Dr. Max Soloweitschik presided at its first meeting and Moshe Shertok and Isaac Ben-Zvi outlined plans for cultural work emong the soldiers and assistance to their families.

Meanwhile, Palestine has been considerably cheered by news that British merchant vessels are discharging general cargos at Haifa, which, it is stated, disproves Axis propaganda of Italian control of the Mediterranean.

The Jewish National Council's Social Welfare Department reported that it had assisted 78,000 persons during the past Jewish year, of whom 18,000 were children, and 40,000 workers, distributing a total of £154,000. The department also assisted illegal immigrants during detention and after release from internment camps, served as a liaison for Palestinians' relatives abroad, aided victims of the Tel Aviv and Haifa bombings and established a special research institute.

40 RESCUED FROM BOMBED JEWISH HOUSE IN LONDON

LONDON, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- By this morning, 40 persons had been extricated alive and 8 dead bodies found in the ruins of a Jewish workers' apartment house which suffered a direct bomb hit on Sunday night. The search, which had been going on all night, lit up by flashes of guns and distant bombs, was continuing today.

ROME REPORTS NEW ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS IN FRENCH MOROCCO

ROME, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- Fresh anti-Semitic riots flared in French Morocco, the newspaper Il Messaggero reported today. The newspaper said that a large crowd threatened to demolish Jewish shops at Casablanca but was kept in check by a large police force.

CHAPLIN, IN NEW FILM, VOICES STRONG PLEA FOR TOLERANCE

NEW YORK, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- Marked by the breaking of two precedents, Charlie Chaplin's long-awaited film lampoon of Chancellor Adolf Hitler, "The Great Dictator," opened here tonight at the Astor and Capitol theaters, before distinguished and enthusiastic audiences.

Those attending includes H.G. Wells, Lion Feuchtwanger, Postmaster-General Frank C. Walker, Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia, Col. Julius Ochs Adler, Joseph M. Proskauer, George Backer, Somerset Maugham, Paul Block, Senator Robert L. Wagner, James Warburg, David Sarnoff, William S. Paley, Merlin H. Aylesworth, Edward M. Flynn, Albert Lasker, Marshall Field, Police Commissioner Valentine, Trving Berlin, Deems Taylor, Arthur Hays Sulzberger and Herbert Bayard Swope.

Speaking in a film for the first time in his long career, the famous comedian, in the climactic scene, virtually steps out of character to voice what is obviously a personal and long-nurtured plea for a return to sanity and tolerance by a world ridden by war and hate.

The appeal, delivered in impassioned tones that startled an audience that had hardly become accustomed to the clipped, somewhat British-accented voice of the hitherto silent actor, brought a spontaneous burst of applause from last night's preview attendance of writers, editors and critics.

In the film Chaplin, who is of Jewish parentage, plays a dual role, that of a Jewish barber and Adenoid Hynkel, dictator of Tomania. The barber role merges into the dictator role at the moment when Hynkel's troops have overrun the neighboring land of Osterlich, affording the barber-dictator his opportunity to speak his mind.

Many of the scenes are laid in the city's ghetto and a central theme running throughout the film is the dictator's insane persecution of the Jews. A number of the scenes are concerned with "spontaneous" pogroms.

A notable achievement of Chaplin's is the fidelity with which he has reproduced the psychopathic frenzy of Hitler's oratory and the very tone and inflection of his voice. Other notorious Nazi characters lampooned in the film are Propaganda Minister Goebbels, who emerges as Herr Garbitsch, and Marshal Goering, who becomes Herr Herring. In the latter part of the picture, Hynkel is joined by Benzino Napoloni, dictator of Bacteria, a caricature of Mussolini, played by Jack Oakie. Another important role is carried by the famous Yiddish actor, Maurice Moscovich, who died several months ago, who plays the part of Mr. Jackel, a resident of the ghetto. Co-starred with Chaplin is Paulette Goddard, who plays the role of a girl of the ghetto.

Following, in part, is the speech with which Chaplin concludes the film:

"I'm sorry, but I don't want to be an emperor. That's not my business. I don't want to rule or conquer anyone. I should like to help everyone, if possible, Jew, Gentile, black man, white. We all want to help one another. Human beings are like that We want to live by each other's happiness, not by each other's misery. We don't want to hate and despise one another. In this world there is room for everyone...

"Even now my voice is reaching millions throughout the world, millions of despairing men, women, and little children, victims of a system that makes men torture and imprison innocent people. To those who can hear me, I say —do not despair. The misery that has come upon us is but the passing of greed, the bitterness of men who fear the way of human progress. The hate of men will pass, end dictators die, and the power they took from the people will return to the people. And so long as men die, liberty will never perish....

"You, the people, have the power to make this life free and beautiful, to make this life a wonderful adventure. Then, in the name of democracy, let us use that power; let us all unite. Let us fight for a new world, a decent world that will give men a chance to work, that will give youth a future and old age a security. By the promise of these things, brutes have risen to power. But they lied: They do not fulfill that promise. They never will! Dictators freed themselves but they enslaved the people. Now let us fight to free the world, to do away with national barriers, to do away with greed, with hate and intolerance. Let us fight for a world of reason, a world where science, where progress will lead to the happiness of us all."

POLES BLAME NAZIS FOR SPREAD OF DISEASE IN WARSAW

NEW YORK, Oct. 15. (JTA) -- The German total war in Poland was responsible for conditions in Warsaw favorable to the spread of disease and not the negligence of Polish authorities, the Polish Information Center charged in a statement issued today.

Citing a dispatch from Alvin Steinkopf, Associated Press correspondent, from Warsaw, in which the Nazis claimed they had built a ghetto wall in Warsaw to prevent the outbreak of epidemics supposedly existing in that part of the city, the statement said this was an example of German propaganda seeking to hide the real purpose of the wall. The action of the Germans is "reminiscent of the darkest ages of history," the statement added.

JEWS BARRED FROM SELLING SCHOOLBOOKS IN ITALY
